Vancouver: The Foundation to Assist Canadian Talent On Records (FACTOR) reports that Western International Communications Limited has become their latest sponsor and eighth for the 1983/84 period.

Hal Davis, Director of Research and Program Development for WIC, was recently at Vancouver's Pinewood Recording Studios to receive a set of "FACTOR" recordings along with sponsorship certificates for each of the seven radio stations operated by the company.

"As a company we are happy to be associated with FACTOR," he said. "The broadcasting industry, represented by the sponsors of FACTOR, is backing this free-enterprise approach to increasing Canadian content recordings and we think it's a great thing. We plan to be involved with FACTOR over a long period of time."

Toronto: Dave Evans, president of Capitol Records-EMI of Canada, has announced a sales and distribution agreement with the Montreal-based Vampire Productions who also have the Vamp label.

Jointly directed by Andre di Cesard and Gilbert Morin, the production company most recently experienced success with the Ballroom Orchestra, yielding two gold LPs and platinum single. Under the agreement, all albums released on the label are to receive national distribution.

"We believe Vamp's product has great credibility in the French Canadian market," said Evans. "We are pleased to be able to come to an agreement with the company and are especially pleased to be doing business with people such as Andre and Gilbert."

"We are very happy to be with Capitol and we are hopeful that we can give them a tremendous year," said di Cesare.

Slated for mid-October, forthcoming releases from the Vamp roster include those by Patsy Gallant, Melody Stewart, Danielle Licari, Michel Louvain and Richard Huet.

Only ten certifications for month of August

Toronto: The Canadian recording industry saw few certifications for the month of August. There were only ten in all, headed by a triple platinum from the Flashdance Soundtrack from PolyGram.

Three LPs were certified platinum for the month - Keep It Up from Loverboy, Pictures At Eleven by Robert Plant and Synchronicity from the Police.

Gold went to Loverboy for Keep It Up, Celine Dion for Tellement j'ai d'Amour, Robert Plant for Pictures At Eleven, and to The Kinks for State Confusion.

Only two singles were certified for August - platinum for Every Breath You Take by The Police and gold for Time (Clock Of The Heart) by Culture Club.

Irwin Steinberg to speak at CIRPA annual meet

Toronto: Irwin Steinberg, former Chairman of the Board of PolyGram Record Operations, is scheduled to be the featured speaker at the annual meeting of the Canadian Independent Record Production Association, set for Sept. 21, at the city's Royal York Hotel.

It was Steinberg, who in 1978, predicted that the key companies in the recording industry would become fewer in number creating "an oligopoly, which would eventually affect the diversity of music available."

At the meeting, Steinberg is expected to continue the examination of the theme and discuss the consequences of the industry's present structure, as well as explore positive approaches for the future.

Steinberg, one of the founders of Mercury Records in the U.S., held the post as Chairman of the Board of Record Operations for the PolyGram until 1981. He recently helped establish Compleat Entertainment of Nashville. Steinberg is also President and owner of Domilin Films.

CKFM firms exclusive for Ringo's Yellow Submarine

Toronto: CKFM has firmed exclusive Toronto broadcast rights for Ringo's Yellow Submarine, a 12-week, 25-hour anthology of the Beatles presented by Ringo Starr. The series features the group's music including several songs never heard before as well as Ringo's personal anecdotes regarding the group's climb to fame.

CKFM will premiere the series, Sunday, Sept 25th from 12:00 noon to 2 pm. The series will continue each week in the same time slot, with the final program winding down in a three-hour special from noon to 3 pm.

The series, distributed by Telemedia Broadcast Services, will also be broadcast in over 85 markets throughout Canada plus 350 markets in the U.S.

CKFM has also arranged for a limited edition poster to be designed in conjunction with Ringo's Yellow Submarine. The posters will be made available throughout the city with all monies being donated to the CKFM Children's Fund for Toronto's Children's Hospital.

RCA twin-pack by Powder Blues

Toronto: RCA releases a new package from Vancouver's Powder Blues, a two-record set titled Red Hot/True Blue which features a "live on the floor" studio recording.

Group leader and guitarist Tom Lavin reports that they geared the recording to catch the same live energy the band provides in concert, which was also prevalent on their album, Uncut.

"It's a high energy album," said Lavin who produced the LP at his Blue Wave Studios in Vancouver. "It's going to take people to the drunken party stage pretty fast, then the tempo slows down on the last side so they can fall into bed."

The brass-oriented rock/blues band is expected to embark on an extensive Canadian tour early this fall in support of the new album. The Farmer John track is being released as the first single with Pushy on the flip.

The double album package features originals as well covers of such members as Chuck Berry's Roll Over Beethoven, Marty Robbins' Sugaree, B.B. King's You Know What I Mean, Joe Turner's Stoop Down Baby and Paul Butterfield's Born In Chicago.

Red Hot/True Blue features 18 tracks in all and each side contains a different sub-title - Side One is named Ice Breaker, Side Two, Party, Side Three, Hustle and Side Four, Bedtime.

Beatles' documentary exclusive to CKEY

Toronto: CKEY's President Doug Trowell has announced an exclusive for the station, The Beatles, The Days In Their Life, a thirty-hour chronological study of the famous four, which was produced by David Pritchard. The station will begin the series Sept 19 at 8 pm, continuing each evening Monday through Friday over six weeks.

During the first 24 programs, every song, every record by the Beatles will be aired, including several never released. The final six hours of the show reveals the direction each of the Beatles took after they broke up in December, 1970.

The series will be heard on 55 Canadian radio stations as well as several U.S. stations.

Pritchard has been collecting tapes and interviews of the Beatles for 20 years, from the time he first introduced Toronto listeners to the group with a three-hour special on CKEY in 1963.

"We think this very special music documentary fits in with the kind of adult contemporary music the station is now playing," notes Trowell, continuing with "The 15-year olds who were listening to the Good Guys (CKEY on-air personalities) play the Beatles on CKEY in 1963, are 35-year olds today and are probably a large part of the station's audience still."

The Beatles' special will also give notice to Toronto listeners that CKEY has moved its direction from primarily a talk format to much more music programming.

Listeners will also have the opportunity to win a Beatles Discography - a complete set of all Beatle albums ever released in Canada.

The Hawk readies battle against muscular dystrophy

Toronto: Rockabilly giant Ronnie Hawkins assists in the battle against muscular dystrophy by teaming with the Sheraton Centre, Mac's Convenience Stores and Carling O'Keefe in a benefit dinner/dance to raise money for the fight against the disease.

Scheduled for Sept 17, the benefit will be held in the Grand Ballroom of the Sheraton Centre. Besides the many door prizes, a grand prize of a seven-day cruise of the Caribbean with Hawkins & The Hawks is being offered, donated by Halycon Days/Sun Venture Travel.

The Hawk is celebrating 25 years of rock and roll in Canada and during his annual CNE engagement at the Carlsberg building the Team & Wagon Room was the setting for a giant celebration. Brought in for the event were several big names including Bo Diddley, the Crystals and Belmonts, all of whom

shared the stage with Hawkins in front of capacity audiences.

Hawkins' manager Steve Thomson shoots down the persistent rumour that Hawkins is moving back to the U.S. "Although Ronnie was born in the U.S., he still considers Canada to be his home," says Thomson. "I think a lot of people felt Ronnie didn't want to go anywhere else. Naturally Canada still has his biggest following and he has a strong cult following in Europe, followed next by the U.S. through his old circuit in Arkansas. We're now getting a lot of work in the U.S. The doors are opening for him in the U.S."

Moss Music Group in deal with Celluloid

Toronto: The Moss Music Group, whose major thrust has been in the classical music field, makes moves into the contemporary music field through a distribution deal with Celluloid Records, a label with offices in both Paris and New York.

The deal, signed by Celluloid's Jean Karakos and MMG's Ira Moss, gives MMG the right to distribute all Celluloid product in the U.S. and Canada with the exception of Elektra pickups of product by Material and Alan Vega.

Initial releases are two rap 12 inchers, produced by Afrika Bambaata of Soul Sonic Force, Time Zone's The Wildstyle and Shango's Shango Message. Expected shortly is a 12 inch of Fab 5 Freddy's Change The Beat, which was produced by Material, plus two jazz albums, Billy Bang's Outline No.12 and a self-titled album by the Yankees. The latter comprises guitarist Derek Bailey, Trombonist George Lewis and reedman John Zorn.

Anvil embark on first worldwide tour

Toronto: Anvil have launched their first world tour, in support of the international release of their third and latest album, Forged In Fire.

The heavy metal assault will take the Attic group to England, Ireland, Holland, Belgium, France, Japan, Australia and the U.S., as well as Canada.

"Well, all I can say is we'll finally be able to meet a lot of the fans who've been writing us from all over the world," said group lead vocalist Lips. "The thought of playing Japan especially, is a dream come true.

"Just the thought of being able to perform Mothra in Japan is getting me wired for this tour. This Japanese tour will be the first time we've headlined major halls, so I hope we can get some live recordings happening too."

The Toronto group has already played the Reading Festival in Britain, filmed for the BBC-TV for later telecast and also made a headline appearance at London's legendary Marquee Club.

Anvil is currently considering an offer for an Australian tour in October where Forged In Fire has been released on The Mushroom label. If accepted, the band will be in the U.S. by November and Canada in December.

Spruced up Palais for MIDEM '84

Paris: MIDEM '84, the 18th International Record and Music Publishing Market, has been scheduled to take place in Cannes in the New Palais des Festivals from January 23, to 27, 1984.

The opening gala and all other shows will be announced at a later date. The MIDEM Classique will take place simultaneously.

The organization admitted that despite the advantages of increased floor space, the new Palais des Festivals had some drawbacks, which they pointed out are to be eliminated this year.

The exhibition hall is to be carpeted throughout and enhanced with an improved lighting system. Improvements are also to be made to the stairway leading to the Grand Auditorium, with a direct access tunnel to parking areas.

Western showcase tour underway by Orphan

Toronto: The Winnipeg quartet Orphan is currently on a Western Canada showcase tour in support of their debut portrait album, Lonely At Night.

The LP is currently the focus of a national push by CBS, who distribute Portrait. A single Saved By The Bell with Night Parade on the flip, has been taken from the album.

The album release was preceded by a 12" radio-only single of What Kind Of Love Is This. A video was also produced of the title track by Paul Vanderlinden of Quest For Fire fame. The LP was produced by Lance Quinn and Tony Bonjiovi.

Western dates included Brandon, Saskatoon, Regina, Edmonton, Red Deer, and Calgary. More tour dates will be announced at a later date.

Powerhouse releases set for Chrysalis fall assault

Toronto: MCA Records Canada, which has just picked up distribution for the Chrysalis label, is gearing for the release of several key albums.

One of the highlights will be the re-release of the self-titled Billy Idol album with the addition of Dancing With Myself which wasn't on the first release.

Another key release will be a live album from Pat Benatar titled Live From Earth which will also feature two new studio cuts - Love is a Battlefield, which will be the single and Lipstick Lies.

Other additional releases include Sport from Huey Lewis & the News with Heart and Soul as the single, Back It Up from Robin Trower, Manoeuvres from Greg Lake formerly of Emerson Lake & Palmer, the mini-LP Fresco from Icehouse, and the reissue of the Fun Boy Three album Our Lips Are Sealed.

MCA will also be picking up the Spandau Ballet album True. The title track is the first single release from the LP which is presently climbing charts across the country.

CBS readies campaign on Paul Young debut

Toronto: CBS Records has launched a national campaign in support of No Parlez by British artist Paul Young.

Young, a former member of Streetband and the Q-Tips, covers such numbers as Joy Division's Love Will Tear Us Apart, Booker T. Jones' Iron Out The Rough Spots and Love of The Common People, plus the single, Marvin Gaye's Wherever I Lay My Hat. The latter reached the number one spot in the U.K. along with the LP.

A video has been produced of the single to be available on the next CBS compilation. AOR sampler of Come Back And Stay has been released along with an extended version of the cut on the flip.

The album has been shipped and is already registering positive signs.

Tell & Montanaro finalists in Yamaha song fest

Tokyo: The Yamaha Music Foundation reports that Quebec singer/songwriter Diane Tell along with Stephan Montanaro have been named as finalists for the 14th World Popular Song Festival.

The duo were chosen for their composition A Distance, which was performed by Tell. Tell and Montanaro were the only Canadians to make the finals.

Altogether, there were 21 finalists chosen from 16 countries for this year's event. Yamaha, sponsors of the yearly song festival, reported that selection of this year's finalists was made all the more difficult owing to a record-breaking number of overseas entries. The Festival was first introduced in 1970 gaining international-acclaim very quickly.

The event is scheduled for Oct 29, and 30, at the Nippon Budokan Hall in Tokyo, and is to be televised on a nationwide network. The first day titled International Day, features international acts, followed by Grand Prix Day, which includes Japan's entries.

The winner of the Grand Prix is awarded \$10,000 plus a gold medallion. Awards are also presented for outstanding songs and most outstanding performance.

The Headpins - a part-time project gains star status

For the Vancouver-based hard rock quartet the Headpins, it was an innocent beginning. The Solid Gold label recently released the band's latest album *Line Of Fire*, which shipped gold, an indication of their rapid popularity growth. The *Celebration* cut was taken as a single.

The group's debut album *Turn It Loud*, a raw, gutsy studio production that managed to capture the live feel of the quartet, went on to surpass the double platinum mark and even gave well-established big name acts a run for the top chart positions. The LP was boosted by the single *Don't It Make Ya Feel*.

From the outset the Headpins made it clear they weren't just fooling around when it came to their first album. Even the very title, *Turn It Loud*, reflected the quartet's raw image.

Strangely enough, even though they've gone on to become one of the country's biggest, the band began as just a part time project. From the outset, part of their development was shrouded in mystery, but it would serve to help boost the group's career. Later, all would be revealed, although many Vancouverites knew what was going on.

Late in '79, Chilliwack members Brian MacLeod and Ab Bryant were apparently prevented from performing by record company litigation.

In need of a creative outlet and means to return to the intimacy of a live performance, the duo linked up with Loverboy's drummer

Attic readies Kamahl's second album release

Toronto: This *Love We Share*, the second Kamahl LP for Attic slated for a Sept 29, release, features some of the country's top musicians, four Canadian compositions and liner notes contributed by Ken Taylor, former Canadian Ambassador to Iran.

Tour dates for Kamahl include Kitchener (Oct 31), Winnipeg (Nov 3), Saskatoon (8), Edmonton (9), Vancouver (10), Victoria (11), Calgary (12), Regina (13), Ottawa (18), and Toronto (21).

Matt Frenette, and singer Denise McCann of the R&B Allstars to form a temporary club act to tour the Vancouver circuit.

Although all were seasoned artists, it was Mills who turned out to be the key figure and focal point of both their live performances and on record. Critics quickly looked for singers with which to compare her searing vocals.

In the summer of '81, a live version of the Headpins *Breakin' Down* was included on the CFOX-FM Vancouver *Seeds Two* album. The song went on to become the most requested track in Vancouver, but most importantly attracted the attention of record labels.

Solid Gold signed the unit, releasing the successful *Turn It Loud*. Although MacLeod

Production of 12" discs consistent with last year

Toronto: According to the advance report on the Canadian record industry for July from Statistics Canada, the production of 12" records increased less than one percent when compared with July of last year, a nearly stable result.

However, according to the report, there was an eight percent decrease in the production of 12" discs for the year to date. The good news is that shipments for July of 12" records increased 12 percent with a modest two percent increase for the year to date.

7" records took a different turn. Production for the month was down three percent while there was also a nine percent decrease in production for the year to date. The net shipment of 7" discs dipped 9 percent for the month, but there was a healthy 16 percent increase in shipments for the year to date.

All categories of pre-recorded cassettes continue to show sharp increases according to the report. Production was up 63 percent for the month and 48 percent for the year to date.

Net shipments of cassettes rose 60 percent for the month and 46 percent for the year to date. Pre-recorded cartridges continue to fall. Production for the month was down 71 percent and 65 percent for the year to date. Shipments were down 77 percent for the month and 58 percent for the year to date.

The net value of sales from both 7" and 12" records for the month showed a 12 percent increase and a slight 3 percent rise for the year to date. For cartridges and cassettes combined, there was a 54 percent increase in net sales for July and 37 percent rise for the year to date.

RPM contacted Canadian Recording Industry President Brian Robertson about the latest Stats report.

"The trend over the last couple of years

and Bryant wrote and performed for the LP, they were only credited as producers since both were still committed to Chilliwack.

The Headpins quickly developed into a headline act and won six categories in the West Coast Music Awards.

Following the recent Junos, it was publicly revealed that MacLeod and Bryant had parted with Chilliwack to join the Headpins. RPM recently spoke with Mills.

"We had to keep it a secret that both were in the band although many in B.C. knew it," said the vocalist. "They're 100 percent mine now and it feels great. A lot of pressure we were under is now off."

"The new album is about five times better than our last. The material hasn't suffered but has matured. And it's still raunchy and rocks hard. I didn't feel we were going to have difficulty following up our first album. After recording the first, we listened to it, thought it sounded good, released it and hoped it did well."

Mills believes that Canada is still short on hard rock bands with the increase in the popularity of new music and funk.

"I don't think there's been a hard rock revival at all. It's always been there. If we had to listen to the same styles all the time it would get pretty boring. The new hard rock bands seem to be coming from Europe."

The Headpins are presently on tour in the East opening for Loverboy.

has shown cassette increases," he said. "As this continues, you see a softening in the sales of the 12" configuration. There's been more penetration of tape hardware and my view is that there's going to be a penetration in the compact disc that will re-balance things. I see a major growth in that area.

"Summer's traditionally not the strongest selling period of the year, but I think the whole industry is looking more positive compared to last year," he said. "There's a much healthier glow about it."

"The new report reflects a significant growth in cassettes, not only in sales but in configuration as well. By the end of the year we're expecting a 50/50 ratio between albums and cassettes."

The CRIA president noted that pre-recorded cassettes are a major growth format and that the organization is trying to maximize the growth in this area. This includes cassette merchandizing and one standard cassette format. At present, some come with a standard box while other have additional packaging.

"What we're also endeavouring to do is supplement Stats Canada's information with some of our own. Some of their information has been curtailed because of budget problems and some programs were eliminated. The Stats Canada information is invaluable and we had to make a strong case to retain this information, so we were fortunate to keep this."

Robertson explained that the plan is to combine Stats Canada's information with CRIA's own report as a joint venture.

The CRIA president said the first report from the organization can probably be expected for November or December.

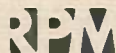

on their own Target label, is titled *We Are The Cowboys*, written and produced by Tom Saull, who plays guitar and banjo, the Cowboys are lead vocalist Wayne King; bassist Tom Charles; drummer Sean Fitzsimons; steelman Bob Lucier; keyboardist Dominic Morrissey; and Richard Landman, on guitar and harmonica. Charles and Landman provide background vocals along with Joel Feeney. The latter, son of Jack, has built quite a reputation in the jingle/commercial field and has played the club circuit as well.

Happy birthday Harold

Harold MacIntyre tried to sneak into Moncton without telling anyone it was his birthday. Roger Dupuis, one of Canada's top country promoters would never let an opportunity like this pass by. Sept. 6, the day before Harold's big day (described as 29 and holding), the Urban Corral was decked out for a big bash with Bob Barry hosting the evening. CFQM and host Rick Gordon presented a one-hour live special featuring Harold & 705, direct from the Corral. CBC came to life with a ½ hour special on Harold and his music, and Audiograph Records pulled all stops in promoting Harold's new album. *Tragic Romancer*. To cap the evening the Corral presented Harold with the Golden Microphone Award, the first of its kind, which will be presented semi-annually to country entertainers, considered "tops" in their field by the Corral and its audiences.

MICK JAGGER In His Own Words Compiled by Miles \$9.95 - 128 pages Stoddart Publications

As Mick Jagger grows old the interest in his life never wains. Miles has put together an exceptionally interesting look at rock's first bad boy, the rebel who parlayed his pompous strut and disregard for the norm into one of the more interesting in the entertainment business. He admits to having a "working class Mum" and a "bougeois Father", which would put him in the category of being "an average English school kid," who hated school. He doesn't like organized sports and says "Even now, you couldn't catch me going to watch a football game," a statement that would no doubt draw the ire of millions of English soccer fans. Through photos and snippets of conversations, Miles traces Jagger's life from his early teens to the present, covering his lifestyle, fame, sex, women, marriage, drugs and money. He even discusses Keith Richards' drug bust in Toronto. "Yeh, it was irresponsible, and what happened was totally inevitable." The decline and finally the death of Brian Jones, "We felt like we had a wooden leg. We wanted to go out and play but Brian couldn't. He didn't have any desire to go on stage and play." On his brush with Margaret Trudeau. "I think she was just a very sick girl in search of something. She found it - but not with me. I wouldn't go near her with a barge pole." Jagger shows his prudish side as well, which makes him not such a bad guy after all. "I

don't like the way sex has become so open, so blatant and unprivate. Americans are obsessed with sex." In *His Own Words* is a must for Mick Jagger/Rolling Stones fans and an eye opener for those who really didn't understand this rock phenomenon.

BABY BELUGA BOOK

Raffi
\$9.95 - 48 pages
McClelland & Stewart

Raffi is one of the most successful writers of children's songs in the business, having chalked up sales of half a million copies of his five children's albums. His young audience has grown like topsy and has been referred to by one observer as a "modern day Pied Piper". Concerned about the environment, ecology and endangered species, Raffi made his views known through his fourth album release, *Baby Beluga*. Said Raffi, "When I first met a beluga whale at the Vancouver Aquarium, it was love at first sight." The *Baby Beluga Book* contains all the words to the songs from the album with colourful illustrations by Jane Fernandes, Franklin Hammone, Vldyana Krykorka, Maryann Kovalski, Barb Reid and James Tughan. The songs include the traditional *This Old Man*, *Kumbaya*, *Day-O*, *To Everyone In All The World* (with French translation by Lise Poitras) and *Oats and Beans and Barley Grow* as well as Raffi's *Thanks A Lot*, *Malvina Reynolds' Morningtown Ride* and *Joshua Giraffe* written by Pat Godfrey and Dennis Pendrith and, of course, the title track co-written by Raffi and Debi Pike. This is a fun book with games and readable facts - an important learning vehicle for the young and impressionable mind.

for Eastman. A major promotion is being launched by Cousins to bring Eastman back to the charts. The Godard track is included on Eastman's album, *Intimate Strangers*, which was released in April of last year, and qualifies as three-parts Cancon (MAL).

The Jarvis single was produced by Cousins at Nashville's Woodland Studios, using many of Music City's top session people including steelman Lloyd Green, pianist Pig Robbins and guitarist Pete Wade. Back-up vocals were supplied by the Nashville Edition, a popular group seen weekly on the Hee Haw TVer.

The team of Larry Boone and Erik Thorson were responsible for writing the A side of the Jarvis single. Cousins met Boone by accident in a Nashville shopping centre, which he now refers to as "not unlike stumbling into a gold mine." He was so impressed by the Boone-Thorson material that he will be using several of their compositions on releases over the next six months.

The flip of the Jarvis single, *I See Somebody Else*, was written by Elaine's father Willie, who introduced the young singer to the music business by allowing her to sing in front of his own dance band when she was 16. Cousins tags this side as being "honky-tonk country."

A native of Brampton, Ontario, the 25-year old Jarvis has chalked up much experience through performing on the club circuit, festivals and on television.

NEW ALBUMS

POWDER BLUES - Pop

Red Hot/True Blue - RCA KXL2-0518-N
 Fresh from their European tour, which included highly successful dates at the Montreaux Jazz Festival and the North Sea Jazz/Blues Festival, this highly-polished rock 'n blues unit make their strongest bid for international recognition with the release of this two-record set. Produced by lead vocalist Tom Lavin at his Vancouver Blue Wave studios, Lavin describes the 18 tracks as being recorded "live on the floor." What Lavin has accomplished is, in fact, a very energized "live" session that does come quite close to what they do in concert. The energies are high and the mix obviously in the red from Chuck Berry's Roll Over Beethoven to B.B. King's You Been Mean, and a powerful cover of Paul Butterfield's Born In Chicago. Lavin is no slouch when it comes to writing either, and the band do a nice job on his penning of Pushy. The four sides are conveniently sub-titled to provide a full evening of entertainment beginning with Ice Breaker, followed by Party, then Hustle and finally Bedtime. Says Lavin, "The album is going to take people to the drunken party stage

pretty fast, then the tempo slows down on the last side so they can fall into bed." Also standout are Roy Head's Treat Her Right and Porter Wagoner's Tore Down.

PAYOLAS - Rock

Hammer On A Drum A&M SP-4958-W
 Continuing with the same rock power that gained them a lengthy stay on the charts with their No Stranger To Danger album, this Vancouver rock quartet have cultivated somewhat of a cult following in the west and it's spreading eastward quickly. Effective front racking at Vancouver's A&B Sound and the Mister Sound stores throughout Alberta has paid off at the cash register. Heavy airing of Never Said I Love You, taken as a single, has resulted in excellent gains up the RPM singles chart. The album has made impressive leaps up the RPM 100, much quicker than their previous release, an indication of their growing popularity. Produced by the Payolas and Mick Ronson. The latter also supplies additional keyboard work and background vocals. Also guesting are Carole Pope and Ian Hunter. The Payolas are Paul Hyde (vocals), Bob Rock (guitar), Christopher Livingston (keyboards) and Chris Taylor (drums). Hyde and Rock are the writers in the group. Other standout tracks are Wild West and Where Is This Love. Lyrics included.

STRAY CATS - Rock

Rant 'N Rave - EM America SO-17102-F

What surfaced as a left-field trio of rockabilly honky tonkers, three saucy Americans who had to go to England to be recognized, the Stray Cats have obviously found the right mix to bring them back across the pond: Their Built For Speed album topped the RPM 100 Feb 19 of this year with Stray Cat Strut peaking at No. 3 on the singles chart a month later. There was a bit of a slow period for the Cats (in between hits) and then they released (She's) Sexy And 17, taken from this set and the whole process began to build once again. Both the single and album are now holding impressive numbers at the top end of RPM's charts and with retailers giving front rack priority to the album, the Cats will probably surpass the sales of Speed. They are really a weird and rare breed of musicians: guitarist (folk and Hawaiian) Brian Setzer; Lee Rocker (doghouse bass) and the screamer (vocalist) Slim Jim Phantom and they've added a new dimension to the hits of today. They really haven't revived rockabilly, but rather have introduced their own and very unique sound that gets the nod from CHR and AOR programmers and even the mild poppers. Setzer is the heavy in the writing department. Produced by Dave Edmunds. Also choice are Take A Look At That Cadillac, Hotrod Gang and TooHipGottaGo.

THE MOODY BLUES - Rock
The Present - Threshold - TRLS-1-2902-Q

After only three weeks of chart action, this Moodie treasure has literally created another invasion of the North American market, vaulting up the RPM 100 to No. 19 this week. It's been a long time since their Go Now single of the mid-60's. They've sold more than 30 million copies worldwide of their twelve albums, most notable being their "comeback album of the '80s", Long Distance Voyager, which was certified triple platinum (300,000 units sold) in Canada. Pip Williams, who produced Voyager, did the board work here as well. The Moodies: Justin Hayward (guitars, vocals), John Lodge (bass, vocals), Ray Thomas (flutes, harmonicas, vocals), and Graeme Edge (drums) have been together since 1966. The new addition is keyboardist Patrick Moraz, who joined the band for the Voyager session in 1981 replacing Mike Pinder. This set contains ten brand new selections, all being choice. Lodge's *Sitting At The Wheel*, has been issued as a 7" and a 12" single. Includes Hayward's penning of *Blue World and Running Water*, and Edge's *Going Nowhere*, plus a couple by Thomas, *Sorry*, and *I Am*. Lyrics included.

SOUTHSIDE JOHNNY AND THE JUKES - Rock
Trash It Up
Mirage/Atco 79 01131-P

Produced by Niles Rogers, who also supplies additional guitar and who produced David Bowie's current chart riser, *Southside*, minus *Ashbury* but still holding fast with the Jukes, hasn't strayed too far from what is expected. The horns are still very important, although somewhat subdued, supplied by Mark Pender and Al Torrente on trumpets and saxman Frank Elmo. There's much more emphasis on synthesizers however, and the dance crowd should get off on several cuts. *Southside* is still very much R&B with a powerful rock base, which should please his large following, and add to the retail value, if front raked. Longtime Juke guitarist Billy Rush supplied eight new songs, the title track being choice along with *Slow Burn*. One of the most notable is the old Rascals' hit *Ain't Gonna Eat Out My Heart Anymore*, which was co-written by Pam Sawyer and Laurie Burton. The title track is to be taken as a single. Lyrics included.

**CRYSTAL GAYLE** - Country
Greatest Hits - Columbia FC-38803-H

Now with Warner Bros where she is enjoying both pop and country popularity, the past hits of Crystal Gayle, packaged in this *Greatest Hits* package, should serve to draw even more interest from buyers if given prominent rack position. Produced by Allen Reynolds, this set is a compilation of what the Columbia people believe are the best from the three albums she released

for them. Contains *It's Like We Never Said Goodbye*, *If You Ever Change Your Mind* and *Too Many Lovers*, all three of which topped the U.S. trade charts and would make for excellent programming now. All three of her albums are still active. They are *Miss The Mississippi*, *These Days* and *Hollywood/Tennessee*. Also includes *The Woman In Me*, *The Blue Side* and *Too Many Lovers*.

**WILLIE NELSON** - Country

With Willie Nelson's popularity still on an upper, this *Greatest Hits* package could be an important front rack item. All selections were previously released. This reissue was produced by Bill Haynes. Contains *Both Sides Now*, a Cancon item for those music directors looking to add to their domestic roster. Most of the cuts are Nelson originals including *Rainy Day Blues*, *Hello Walls* and *Funny How Time Slips Away*. Also includes Floyd Jenkins' penning of *Pins And Needles (In My Heart)*.

WHISKY HOLLOW - Country
We Know Better - Shotgun JM-83106

Produced by Steve Beach at the Brantford, Ontario studios of Shotgun, this popular country group graduate from a host of singles to a very impressive album release. Contains their current single release, *Old Trains*. Other choice tracks are *Heart Of Dixie*, penned by the group's Len Wilde (vocals, keyboards, synthesizer, guitar, mandolin and jaw harp), Ross Allen's *Denver* and *Keep On Tryin'*, written by Whisky's Guy Wilkes (vocals, guitars). They also do an excellent job with the old *Bo Jangles* hit. The remainder of the group comprises Joe Allain (vocals, pedal steel), Jerry Ammerman (drums, vocals), Pat Brousseau (vocals, bass) and R.J. Nellzy (electric fiddles, violin, violactra). Yvonne Murray's first solo album is an effective showcase of her talents that are more pop than country but should serve both music formats. Born in Ireland and now living in Toronto, Yvonne is managed by the aggressive Meloche Communications Group who are mounting a heavy promotional campaign to tie in with this release.
