

PolyGram/Warner merger cleared by L.A. judge

New York: The Federal Trade Commission in the United States has failed to prove that the proposed merger between PolyGram Records Inc. and Warner Communications Inc. was in violation of anti-trust laws, according to a ruling by the Chief Judge of the Federal Court of Los Angeles.

Accordingly, the judge denied the FTC's motion for an injunction, therefore clearing the way for the merger.

Mr. Martin Payson, Executive Vice-President and General Counsel of Warner stated: "We are gratified by the court's decision and by its prompt action in clearing the way for the merger. The court's decision vindicates Warner's position that the transaction

Out of the box response to new Nash the Slash LP

Toronto: Local electric mandolin player and new music artist Nash the Slash is receiving strong initial reaction to his new album, American Band-ages and the single from it, 1984.

The LP, on the Quality label, produced by Michael Waite with engineering by Glen Johansen, also marks the first re-union recording of the original F.M., a Toronto progressive rock trio that made waves with their gold album, Black Noise.

The other F.M. members are keyboardist/vocalist Cameron Hawkins and percussionist Martin Deller. Both will also be supporting Nash on his forthcoming tour, now in preparation.

The strong out-of-the box response to the LP and 1984 can partly be attributed to F.M.'s well-received appearance at the latest U-Know Awards, presented each year by local new music radio CFNY-FM.

The LP contains the cream of American rock classics, most of which come from the 60s. But there's also the Nash adaptation of the Cancon number, Born To Be Wild, penned by Mars Bonfire and originally a hit by Steppenwolf. Other tracks include Who Do You Love, Hey Joe, Psychotic Reaction, American Band and others.

"For a number of years I've been known for doing covers," said Nash. "But I've always wanted to do a U.S. concept and some of the numbers that are more obscure. In some ways, it's a psychedelic adaptation of them. We're all Spirit fans, but when we recorded 1984, we never intended it to be the single, however it was the best dance number."

"Initial response to the album has been very favourable. We seem to have hit a nerve with the programmers and music directors because they know the tunes. For some, it's also a discovery of material. It's considered hip to re-record 60s stuff today."

Quality is supporting the album and single, released both in a picture sleeve 7" and as a 12" with the radio version and dance version, with posters, album jackets, buttons, print ads and more. A video has also been produced of 1984.

Dates already confirmed include Markham April 13 & 14, Mississauga (18), Calgary (23-28) and Edmonton (30-May 5). with PolyGram is pro-competitive and will benefit consumers."

Mr. Guenter Hensler, President of PolyGram Records, praised the court's decision, saying that it permits PolyGram to become a more effective and competitive factor in the industry.

M. Jackson frenzy turns Yankovic's parody gold

Toronto: The current Michael Jackson mania both in Canada and the U.S. due to the smash success of the monster smash LP, Thriller, now at the double diamond mark in Canada, has helped turn the Weird Al Yankovic parody of Beat It, titled Eat It, to gold in the country.

The single, the music of which is written by Jackson, has become one of CBS' fastest selling singles this year, surpassing the gold mark in just a month. The success of the single, supported by a humourous parody video, has also fueled the popularity of the LP entitled In 3-D.

The album, produced by U.S. guitaristproducer Rick Derringer, also contains the parodies, The Brady Bunch, I Lost On Jeopardy, King Of Suede, Theme From Rocky XIII (a take-off on Eye Of The Tiger), and Polkas on 45, containing music from such songs as Hey Jude, Hot Blooded, Every Breath You Take and more.

In 3-D marks Yankovic's second album. Last year the master of satire established himself with his poke at the hit, Mickey, titled Ricky. There are also some originals on the album for which Derringer has assisted on guitar.

The event featured performances by a number of artists, among them WEA Canada's recent signing, Messenjah, and singers Boyo, and Jimmy Reid. A highlight was Delroy Hall's routine, a free style dance done to Michael Jackson's Beat It.

Co-host Newton-Davis is known for his work in productions such as Toronto, Toronto and Ain't Misbehavin'. The show was opened by the Zodiac Breakers, an energetic group of young men who ran through several amazing routines for the appreciative audience.

More than 50 awards were presented including Best Reggae Band, which went to Messenjah, and Best Roots Artist, won by Eddy Grant, who was in attendance, an arrangement made by CBS Records Canada.

As predicted Michael Jackson swept the international category.

Many industry people were in attendance, including executives from major labels as well as musicians and technical personnel.

City Limits: Christopher Ward's nocturnal video trip

Toronto: At 34, Christopher Ward has lived several lives, as writer, actor, musician, and currently in Toronto as host of CITY-TV's all-night video program City Limits. Along the way, radio experience was achieved through a stint in campus radio at Ontario's Trent University located in Peterborough. Until now, he has probably been best known as Christopher Ward, performer, writing songs and touring on the road with his band after signing with Warner Bros., and subsequently Sounds Interchange studio in Toronto, writing some of the more popular jingles heard on Canadian radio and Television.

In time, the City Limits job was offered by CITY-TV producer John Martin, and the prep was only one week, with the admonition to Ward being "think for yourself".

RPM was invited to CITY-TV recently to watch the show being produced. The rapport among the crew is evident, with there existing an obvious sense of family and mutual respect. Project coordinator Anne Howard and director Jim Shutsa establish a pace which doesn't lessen to any extent until three or four in the morning.

Other personnel on the program include associate producer Michael Hexdon, cameraman Luke Avison, audio technician Ron Stitt, and production assistants Peggy Rennie, Sherry Greengrass, Simon Evans and Terry Holowezenko. The show receives literally hundreds of calls and letters, in fact, in the course of one of our conversations in the studio, a production assistant fielded five telephone requests for Michael Jackson's Thriller.

A personal goal for Chris Ward is to eliminate the "camera barrier." He wants the audience to feel that a "real" person is doing the show, someone to whom they

Observers say black music gaining more airplay

Toronto: Canadian music industry observers have indicated that black acts and music are definitely gaining more radio play, citing such causes as Michael Jackson and the British new music and videos.

"There seems to be an increasing softening up in the attitude of radio," said Daniel Caudeiron of Cheer Enterprises, the organization responsible for the annual Canadian Black Music Awards. "It's particularly apparent on CFTRand CHUM, but I see this as another trend like when Donna Summer emerged and other artists jumped into the disco craze."

Caudeiron, who also hosts Black World on local Channel 47 TV, cited such artists as Michael Jackson, Marvin Gaye, Prince, Lionel Richie, Rick James and even U.K. new music artists David Bowie and Nile Rodgers' R&B influenced guitar licks, for encouraging radio to air more R&B.

"When you seen something happening in a wave it becomes a trend," he said. "But they're still not playing totally unknowns. It's still the superstars. The white British groups have also been bringing us the music and putting it on the charts here, although it's a recycled sound."

Caudeiron believes that it was CKOC in Hamilton that was the leading Top 40 station for exposing R&B in the Southern Ontario market followed by CFTR in Toronto. He also cited CFNY-FM for helping to establish reggae, noting that no stations are yet playing pure reggae and other forms of black music.

"They're still not programming the

"Canada is still conservative. They're too racially conscious. The population is generally insecure. If stations were to give in too much, the charts would be dominated by black artists. Programmers labour under the illusion that Canada is still a white population. In radio, only a few people make the decision what listeners should hear and they're out of tune."

Caudeiron also indicated his disappointment with local record companies, with the exception of WEA. "Only Bob Roper of WEA comes out to see these black acts," says Caudeiron. "Aside from the signing of Messenjah, I see no more interest, concern or support from others."

"Have you ever noticed that anytime dance music is in, the industry improves." said Bruce Bradley, Managing Director of Toronto record distributor, D.J.&B. "It wasn't Jackson who broke everything."

Bradley pointed to Prince's album, 1999, with its four singles as an early example, noting that the album, released

WEA Music releases Messenjah follow-up LP

Toronto: Messenjah, who scored as winners in the Best Reggae category of this year's Black Music Awards (March 28), are looking good with their follow-up album, Session. The album was produced by group member Rupert "Ojiji" Harvey and the group at San Diego's Circle Sound Studios.

WEA has taken Jam Session as the first single from the album, which also includes Reggae Party, Kung Fu Man, Abraham's Children and Rastaman Say.

Besides Harvey, who is lead guitarist and vocalist the Messenjah sextet comprises Errol Blackwood, bassist/vocalist; "General" Raymond Ruddock, drummer; Hal "The Saint" Duggan, keyboardist/vocalist; Eric "Babyface" Walsh guitarist; and percussionist/vocalist "Scrapa" Tony King.

Most of the Messenjah members are Jamaican-born but raised in the Kitchener, Ontario area. They independently released their Rock You High album in 1982 and after being signed to WEA, the album was re-released one year later.

WEA has also issued four re-mixed cuts from the album, on a mini-album, titled Root Up.

Shotgun Records signs Ellis Family Band

Brantford: Shotgun Records of Brantford, Ont., has announced the signing of Prince Edward Island's Ellis Family Band. The group has enjoyed two hits recently with "Easy To Love" and "Back On The Bottom Again."

"There's a wider acceptance of black music in white audiences," he continues. "as a result of airplay, front racking, clubplay and more. I still don't think an artist like Jimmy Cliff would have got charted without UB40."

"It's safe to say that dance music is making a comeback," says CHUM AM Music Director Brad Jones. "It was just a matter of timing. It was time for a change. There's a real good variety of tunes being released. A lot of what's happening I feel has to do with the new music coming from Britain and radio's going more pop.

"Look at Sherry Kean. That's dance music. I don't think it has a lot to do with black music. More new music is being played and it's opened the door to everything else. All this wasn't planned, it just happened."

When asked if CHUM would have played this material a year or more ago, Jones answered, "I don't think so. I wouldn't have guessed that we would go this far. But we don't see this lasting. There's so many good tunes out there that it's too good to be true. It reminds me of '78 and '79 all over again and that worries me a bit."

"We certainly have to give Michael Jackson credit for getting black videos on MTV," said Quality label manager Larry Macrae. "But if we were to look back to the '60s as an example, when white artists began playing the blues, there was a resurgence in black artists. Again, the British artists are bringing us re-makes."

Macrae noted that not only has CHUM returned to a Top 40 format, but that black music is finding wider acceptance coast to coast, noting that both in the mid-West and on the West Coast, it had previously been difficult to gain airplay with a black artist, even if the song sounded white.

"These black artists wouldn't want to admit they sounded white," continues Macrae. "Now, a lot of the new wave stuff has taken its roots. I think Michael Jackson brought this music back to mass appeal and there was a chain reaction. It's taken this amount of time to break down the barriers." P.M.

Savvy Records releases two new singles

London: The Ontario label Savvy Records has just issued two new singles, one of which is a cover of the 60s hit, Henry The Eighth from the London rock quartet, '63 Monroe.

The single, released in a picture sleeve, was produced by Davin deKergommeaux, Rob Nation and Joe Vaughan at EMAC Sound. The band is comprised of vocalist Steven R. Stunning, guitarist/vocalist Marky Burnaway, bassist/vocalist Pete Dekoker and drummer/vocalist Jeff "Rooster" Rooth.

The second single is on the Sage label distributed by Savvy and comes from Gary Rice. The song, (If There's Ever Been An Angel) Baby It's You, is composed by Rice and produced by Tom Fahy at Studio La Shedde.

Buder and Vincent: The art of video post-production

Toronto: Housed in comfortable thirdfloor offices just off Cumberland Avenue, Champagne Post Production is an integral part of a company just over one year old. The two principals, David Buder and Wendy Vincent, formerly worked together at Schulz Productions, a commercial production house. Their involvement in the making of a video begins at the production meeting, attended by director Robert Quartly, producer Michael Rosen, the production manager, and Buder. "Pre-production allows you to get a feel for the musical direction," explains Buder, "as well as what the artist or band expects." Champagne embodies the teamwork concept with all relevant parties joining in the conceptualization of the video and its development through to the final process of preparing it for viewing.

Buder and Vincent deal with an underpublicized yet crucial aspect of the making of a rock video, which is the edit or postproduction function. Vincent concerns herself with prepping all the film, and knowing the whereabouts of any given frame at any time.

Initially, 2,500 feet of film are taken from the "rushes", and the process begins with an initial assessment. Vincent then selects the footage to be used. Colouring for effect has been discussed in the preproduction meetings, however discussion pertaining to other effects such as dissolve, or the length of certain shots in the video is left until after the shoot. The two are very busy considering the amount of time they've been in business, with most days beginning at 9:30 a.m. and continuing into the night. Sound effects such as footsteps or handclaps are added to enhance the video/music combination. Vincent notes, "Admittedly, the process is made more expensive and complicated, but it makes for a better result, and adds to overall production value."

Buder, who has cut every video for Champagne Pictures with the exception of Blue Peter's, says, "The pace of the

Grottybeats release single on independent Grot label

Toronto: After four years of college onenighters, club apperarances, and high school dances, the Grottybeats have taken their first step into the realm of recording. Love Games is the first single from this band, originally formed as a Beatles 'tribute' band in 1980.

Produced by studio veteran Bob Gallo, who includes Aretha Franklin and James Brown among his credits, the single is an important milestone for this young and determined band.

Grottybeats comprises Martin Gladstone (guitar/keyboards/vocals); Gary Lanz (bass/ keyboards/vocals); Chris Brooks (guitar/ keyboards/vocals); and Gary Kaufman, (drums).

Manager Evan Adelman indicates good domestic as well as American interest in the band, and anticipates an album sometime in August.. edit is determined by the music . . . the idea is to bring to the music the correct mood."

If he is emphatic about one thing, it is that the video as a marketing tool is highly underestimated. "Platinum Blonde might be the best example," continues Buder, "They're perfect for the screen. The two videos (Doesn't Really Matter and Standing In The Dark) would appear to have hyperaccelerated their exposure, especially in the adolescent segment."

Buder is concerned that not enough money is available to go up against videos from other countries where budgets are larger. "There's just not enough money available," continues Buder, "to properly compete with product from England for example, or L.A. In this market we're still limited to mostly new acts."

Buder's ambition is simple: "To take the medium to further levels; to expand it as many ways as it can go . . . as long as the public will accept it, there's no limit."

Vincent is equally optimistic. "Rock videos incorporate the best elements of film and video. They encapsulate the best moments, bringing two weeks work down to four minutes. It's a new area of thinking, and we're only at the beginning."

"We're developing Lou as a country artist, and we're currently negotiating with several majors with an eye to a contract fairly soon."



Preservation Hall Jazz Band at Massey Hall

Toronto: The Preservation Hall Jazz Band will present an evening of original New Orleans jazz at Toronto's Massey Hall April 17.

Members of the band appearing in Toronto are: Willie J. Humphrey Jr., clarinet; Percy G. Humphrey, trumpet; Frank Demond, trombone; Allan Jaffe, bass horn; James Edward 'Sing' Miller, piano; Narvin Henry Kimball, banjo; and Frank Parker, drums.

There can be no printed listing of the numbers to be played in this concert because the musicians improvise as they go along. Each concert is an original that will never be reconstructed in exactly the same way. On working in the studio, Chapman explains, "Eugene (Martynec) was an organizer. Pukka thrives on chaos and he's the exact opposite. We needed someone who could 'finish' the songs and basically put the whole thing together in an appropriate form. He and Peter (Mann) did a terrific job."

Pukka's self-titled album includes a rendition of Tom Robinson's Listen To The Radio, which has been taken as the first single. A Pukka original, Cherry Beach Express, has created quite a stir as well, although for different reasons. The song is a satirical version of certain events, according to Graeme Williamson, with a basis in the stories of some people with whom he is very close.



Starting April 14, Joe Lewis' Folk Music and Folkways program will be lengthened one hour to include an added "Blues Hour." Open College producer John Valenteyn will join The Blues Hour as co-host and coproducer with Lewis.

"The program will not only provide a wide range of blues music, but will feature also present interviews with visiting blues artists, provide a regular feature on a blues musician and his music, and carry information listings on blues activities in the city," explains Lewis.

Lewis and Valenteyn have followed the activities of the North American blues music scene for more than 20 years, and together have collected more than a thousand blues albums that will be available for use in the program. The program is heard Saturdays from 12 noon to 3:00 p.m.

Parachute Club releases to be issued in Europe

Toronto: Following a recent agreement, Magnet Records is scheduled to release the self-titled debut album from the awardwinning Toronto band The Parachute Club for Europe, as well as both a 12" and 7" release of the hit single Rise Up.

The European launch kicks off May 11, with the release of the single, while the LP is to be rush-released.

Meanwhile, on April 7, the Big Time Record label issued Rise Up in Australia, New Zealand and Hong Kong. The LP is set to ship April 21. The Big Time label also releases Rough Trade's product for these countries.

After dominating the recent U-Know Awards where they won four awards, the Parachute Club is currently preparing for their summer tour. Dates confirmed so far include two Toronto dates — Harbourfront June 1, and Ontario Place August 13.

The group is scheduled to re-enter the studio shortly to begin work on their second album. In addition to the U-Know win, just before, the band also picked up four awards at the Fifth Annual Canadian Black Music Awards.

Bamboo garners label interest with showcase

Toronto: DJ's was the setting for a recent showcase arranged by the ATV Music Group in association with Wide Object Entertainment. Turnout was heavy, with virtually all the major labels represented along with several independents.

Bamboo comprises vocalist Mike Langford; guitarist and principal writer Alex Stangle; Jim Smith, keyboards; and drummer Max Styles - all from Peterborough with the exception of the latter, who is from Toronto.

Best categorized as new music, the band delivered a set of energetic material to an enthusiastic industry audience.

Creative manager Michael McCarty was quite ecstatic about the reaction to Bamboo. "We got strong feedback right across the board; as a result, we're currently talking to several companies." McCarty credits the industry reaction to the band's demo tape. "The singing and songwriting are really strong, with the songwriting, of course, being of particular interest to our company."

Meetings with executive assistant Vicki Walters and president Frank Davies are now underway to determine direction for the band in conjunction with their management firm.

This showcase was of singular interest in that it is fairly rare for a music publishing concern to participate to this extent in bringing an artist or group to the attention of the record labels.


ACCESS services to be delivered by satellite


