Armadale takes over Praxis operation

Praxis Technologies, Canada's first Compact Disc manufacturing facility, has announced "strategic management and shareholder structuring."

Michael G. Sifton has assumed the position of President, with control and all shareholdings reverting to Armadale Enterprises Ltd.

Armadale is involved in broadcasting, publishing, aviation, and property development, to name just a few of its activities.

Sifton expects the new plant will be operational the end of April. Says Sifton, "Like any new operation, we expect this facility to take a little time to gear up - but we're confident that our plant will meet all our expectations."

Oolo's HealthWave being shopped in L.A.

At the height of the "wives" prominence in today's music, Dr Allan Oolo, noted Toronto-area musician and practicing chiropractor, has decided to take his HealthWave concept to Los Angeles.



Oolo says his HealthWave music is designed "to create a counterbalance to the much-publicized and mentally-regressive rock music of today." He stresses the it does not "condone anything other than overindulgence" and "it is also not preaching in any way."

His music emphasizes "conscious moderation" and the movie (starring Dr O.) depicts how rock stars tend to deviate from "ConMod." The soundtrack he has developed and recorded, with back-up band The Features, was completed in his own studio: Dr Sound.

Currently shopping Oolo's idea (Dr O. -The Movie and Soundtrack) is lawyer Clark Miller. However, Oolo sees a deal "as just another means to an end...I want to be a rock 'n' roll star. Hopefully they'll choose me for the lead role."

Dr. Oolo mentions that he will be appearing in the forthcoming Variety Club video that has been scheduled for an international release (May 24). I Am Your Child, which was written by Barry Manilow, is also reported to feature Honeymoon Suite, Belinda Metz, Lee Aaron, and Kim Mitchell.

compact disc manufacturing, in view of its reported high rejection rate, Sifton noted, "It's not like we've entered into a completely new method of manufacturing compact discs. There has been much accomplished over the short haul since the introduction of CDs. It's like jumping into the game after the pioneers have opened the way." He continues with "Like any operation it all comes down to people, and we've got an exceptional team of professionals on board."

Besides Sifton, the other members of the management team are Al Alias, Senior Vice President, Sales & Marketing; Trevor Johnson, Vice Pesident, Operations; and Gregory Hill, Vice President, Systems.

Prior to the official opening of the Praxis plant, an "on-site" press reception will be held - the date to be announced shortly.

WEA Canada focuses in on campus/retail power

In view of the ever increasing power of the campus media, WEA Canada has stepped up its communication with campus radio and press. They now provide information and promotional material to campus media through The Only Alternative, a bi-monthly publication, as well as regular mailings.

With an increase in touring artists to Canada this year, WEA is quite aware of the swing by some of these acts to what they describe as "mainstream attention," pointing out that others "are the darlings of an ever improving system of campus media which is more and more capable of creating its own stars."

In March alone of this year, Canada has seen tours by The Jesus & Mary Chain, Jonathan Richman, Violent Femmes, Lloyd Cole & The Commotions, Simply Red, The Church, and The Replacements to name a few. As an example of WEA's "stepped up coverage," The Violent Femmes played to sold out crowds in Toronto, Montreal and Vancouver, and stayed over in Toronto for a 2-day media blitz and in-store autograph session. Obviously the accessibility of this band, and others, increased interest at retail and at the campus level. WEA held a special Campus Press Conference with The Violent Femmes in Toronto, prior to their concert. There were more than 30 campus press and radio people on hand to talk with the band about their tour and new album, The Blind Leading The Naked.

Traditionally, underground bands have more often offended the media with their lack of cooperation, which has somewhat been reversed. Many of these bands are now making extra efforts to meet with press and retail, and as a WEA spokesperson points out: "Dream Academy is gold in Canada, INXS has just gone gold and the latest Cure album is not far off the mark, proving that cross over and large sales are possible from any of these 'so-called' alternative bands."

CARAS places emphasis on artists for Board

CARAS President Peter Steinmetz has announced changes in its 16-member Board of Directors, including adding Vancouver artist/songwriter/producer Bill Henderson of Chilliwack. The election of Henderson brings the total artist representation to 3 on the Board. Other recording artists currently serving as Directors are Gil Moore of Triumph and singer/songwriter Ian Thomas. Moore is also Chairman of the Juno Talent Committee.

Steinmetz points up the importance of artists becoming actively involved in CARAS, noting that "the addition of artists to the Board in the last 2 years has brought a fresh, creative perspective to the Board in dealing with such areas of responsibility as show production, talent acquisition, nominating and voting procedures and membership services." He continues with "By no means are artists serving as token figures on the Board. They are taking a direct, hands-on involvement in all of these areas."

Also elected to the Board are Don Kollar, General Manager RCA/Ariola; Gerry Lacoursiere, President, A&M Records Canada; and Donald Tarlton of Donald K. Donald Productions, Montreal. Lacoursiere will also serve as Chairman of the Juno Nominating & Voting Committee.

Retiring from the Board are Stan Kulin, President WEA Music Canada; Norm Perry, Vice President Concert Productions International; Joe Summers, Senior Vice President A&M Records Canada; and John Watt, Director of Film, Sound Recording & Publishing Policy Division for the federal Department of Communications. The latter will continue his CARAS involvement as a member of the Advisory Board.

Outgoing Directors were presented with mini-Junos at a special luncheon (Apr. 7).

Trebas sets May 10-11 for Vancouver/L.A. meet

Canada's Trebas Institute has planned for Vancouver's industry professionals to meet their Los Angeles counterparts in a 2-day seminar to be held in Vancouver May 10th and 11th. Musicians from both centres are being invited to participate.

Being billed as The Vancouver/Los Angeles Connection, the meet will be held at Vancouver's York Theatre. Speakers will include publisher Jim O'Loughlin; the founders of the BMI-sponsored L.A. Songwriters Showcase, Len Chandler and John Braheny; Billboard's Tom Noonan; Arista's Rich Esra; and Neil Portnow of EMI-America.

Allexendra Franklen, who is producing the event for Trebas, explains, "We want to give our local talent more exposure to the L.A. music industry." The seminar will cover the songwriting craft and music business topics.

Factor/CTL amendment for new talent funding

Changes made known by the Factor/CTL board has resulted in the decision that no longer will aspiring Canadian musicians receive cash awards to assist with the production of their demo tapes. The decision apparently came about because of criticism raised from within the music community, concerned with the quality of previous product.

The New Talent Award now consists of contracted studio time. "What was happening in the past," explains CIRPA's Julie Thorburn, "is that groups would take the lump sum payment (\$2,500) and instead of producing a high quality demo tape, they would have a poor quality record manufactured."

CIRPA President Earl Rosen agrees, adding, "We don't mind funding albums, but these bands deserve a decent shot, and that takes more money." He continues with "The money we would have channelled into the award system will be made available through loans."

Hopefully alleviating this mis-use of appropriated funds and "making better use of the resources," continues Thorburn. "We have contacted about 40 studios across Canada, and they have provided blocks of time enabling a band to produce at least 3 or 4 songs."

Those studios participating, stretch from Vancouver to Halifax, but not Quebec where musicians are currently working with the MusicAction program. "Previously," sug-

gests Rosen, "funds were obtained from broadcasters and repaid loans however, this presents the opportunity for the studios to share in the development of talent as well."

Having received approval for an award, a group is then "designated" a studio by CIRPA, who administer the fund. The only

Sold Out date for Chubby Checker at RYH

No sooner had it been announced that Chubby Checker and Gary U.S. Bonds would be appearing at the Imperial Room of Toronto's Royal York Hotel, the switchboard was flooded with calls. The result has been one Sold Out date (Apr. 28), and several more on the way to being sold out.

The nostaligic package will be playing the prestigious room from Apr. 28 through May 3.

Checker, who was born Ernest Evans, got his name from Dick Clark's wife, and it was shortly after this name change when he hit with The Twist, the only record in history to become No. 1 in 2 different years. Checker has released 22 albums and 40 singles in his career, his latest being the 1982 release of The Change Has Come. There is no information as to who carries his product in Canada.

Gary U.S. Bonds was born Gary Anderson. He changed his name after the impact of his first single, whose sleeve sent out the message "Buy U.S. Bonds."

cash outlay being provided for out-of-pocket expenses incurred by the studio are for tapes and engineering costs. "Groups can now record their demos in a Manta Sound or a Little Mountain studio as opposed to someone's basement," says Thorburn.

Projects intended for commercial release are ineligible for the New Talent Award, yet the loan system is "quite successful," says Rosen. Perhaps the best example of how successful the program is, would be Kim Mitchell's last release, akimbo alogo. After repaying the original loan, the Factor/CTL fund is continually and substantially bolstered with each album's subsequent sale. Kim Mitchell is actually contributing to the development of further Canadian talent.


Cats Can Fly and Epic pact deal for U.S.

CBS Canada has announced that Cats Can Fly have been signed to the Epic label in the U.S. Their self-titled album is slated for release in the U.S. this summer.

"I love the songs," says Frank Rand, Vice President A&R for Epic. "They are a great live band, and we really hope to have success with them in the U.S."

Also on tap for the Cats are several dates as openers for Level 42. Canadian dates include Montreal (Apr. 20), London (22), and Toronto (23 through 25).

Following these dates they will warm the stage for the Beach Boys: Halifax (May 3), Moncton (4), and Fredericton (5).

Times have been lean for Mental As Anything

Having achieved considerable success in Australia and yet only marginal success elsewhere, Mental As Anything have continued recording - and they have persevered. Since their 1981 release, Cats And Dogs, from which the hit single, If You Leave Can I Come, was culled, times have been lean.

The band signed to CBS International this past November, and now have an album, titled Fundamental, which was released worldwide, simultaneously. As the title implies, and which Andrew "Greedy" Smith agrees, their approach to making music is "to have fun while doing so."

For this reason, Richard Gotterer was employed to handle the production duties. He had previously produced the Go Go's, Blondie, and Joan Armatrading. He was chosen for his "simple" touch.

"Our last album was too hard to play live," complains Smith, "so this time we set out to make an album that was really easy to play." The first single released is Smith's own Live It Up, which the keyboardist admits "isn't doing too well in North America."

However, in Australia, that track last year, "was the 3rd most popular song at year end," Smith points out, continuing with "The only records to beat it were Madonna's 'AA' side, and the We Are The World single." Therefore, he is understandably perplexed as to "why the record isn't doing well here."

Yet, chartnumbers and sales figures don't seem to bother the rather flippant musician. "It's an attitude thing for us," Smith asserts. "A lot of people say we're wacky and zany. Well, it's not that we're that serious, I guess it's just that we don't take ourselves that seriously."

Smith continues with, "We started off playing for friends in pubs, and getting signed to a label was really an afterthought. Someone wanted to start up a record company and use us as a guinea pig - so we did it for a laugh. We really had no ambitions of being a recording band."

Fortunately they did - and over the duration of 5 albums, none of which have sold through outside of Australia, they have managed to maintain a sense of humour. "Because you've got to enjoy what you're doing," he suggests, and cites touring as an example. "It's really a working vacation for us - we don't make any money - but we have lots of fun."

Mental As Anything are currently touring with Robert Palmer, yet Smith remarks, "Laziness is an important part of having fun," explaining that this lends itself easily to their live shows. "It means that everybody is singing different songs and that means everybody doesn't do too much singing either."

He points up "That's how we do things

RPM - designed for programmers who are too busy to track one record at a time in the studios too. We all take turns. It's like 'right, I've done mine, now it's your turn,' and we all have fun writing songs. Then we do our video and we must hold the world's record for the most videos - we have at least 25. We get a lot of friends of ours to do them and it works out well - not to mention it's cheap too. At least we get different senses of humour into them - the videos."

By taking such a laizzez-faire attitude, Smith was asked how that would affect the attitudes at the record company level. "Well, if their smart, they'll ignore us," replies Smith. "It's just that these days, if you're not that serious, it's like people can't handle it. I know that might make it hard for our record company, CBS, but I think they're doing a great job for us."

Smith continues with "It's funny how bands in Australia aren't about to throw themselves under trucks if they 'don't make it'. Take England, no Australian band is going to 'make it' there. Sometimes it's not worth the trouble." he contends. "It's harder to make records today - it's difficult to sound competitive or whatever. We went

through a lot more trouble on this album - it was harder getting it to sound easier, but that's the name of the game."

In the course of discussing the Australian music scene, Smith reveals, that "It's not that tough to break down there. The big thing is that bands can work - in the pubs, and everybody's out in the pubs looking at bands.

"That's were bands get their start," he explains, and his simple theory for maintaining an exciting and thriving music scene is to have "more pubs". There is a degree of logic to his assertion that the more pubs there are (hiring bands), the more bands will be needed and the more exposure a band receives (due to their popularity) then better are the chances of getting signed.

An interesting similarity was found: Australia's government has imposed content quotas on radio stations. Smith assures that these are however, easily met. "Quotas aren't that high - 25 or 30 percent - and in the past 5 years Australian bands haven't had much trouble making it into the Top 40. In any given week there are at least 3 or 4 songs in the Top 10. But that's not because of the quotas," says Smith. "Radio stations are playing more than the quota because they are the most popular songs - which goes to show it can be done."

a broader note, the upcoming months are going to be busy and exciting for Duke Street, with 4 acts constituting our priorities: Chalk Circle, Eye Eye, Manteca, and Scott Merritt.

April Fool, Chalk Circle's debut single was a Top 3 add at CHR last week, and the No. 1 AOR add across the country. This action, although expected, is very exciting and provides an excellent barometer for the forthcoming months. The band are absolutely "killer" live, and must be seen. They are currently touring Quebec and should be moving out nationally soon.

They were caught last year opening for Aztec Camera, Corey Hart, and The Waterboys. Their video is in rotation at MuchMusic, and we're looking for a very strong reaction. Expect The Great Lake, their mini-LP by May 5.

Next: Eye Eye. They have already generated a strong buzz on the street through

their association with John Oates. Their album, titled Just In Time To Be Late, will be shipped to radio May 26 and to retail one week later. Produced by Terry Brown (Rush), the LP's first single, Out On A Limb, will be shipping Apr. 28.

The accompanying video was directed by Champagne Pictures and was shot at the Casa Loma in Toronto. These Q107 Homegrown winners, with solid management behind them, are going to do well, and we are hoping for a lot of support.

Another project, certain to keep us on our toes, is the new Manteca album, No Heroes. Despite the adversity surrounding instrumental tracks, we feel we have a good crack with Danceteria. The band has strong core support, and we'll build onto that base. Key will be to generate a huge response at club level, to follow with plenty of retail action.

Last but not least: Scott Merritt. His new album, as yet untitled, is the most exciting record to come out on Duke Street since Jane Siberry. The man has the depth, the quality material, and a very strong audio-visual presence - all key assets with our artists.

Scott is managed by Steve Berkowitz (tour manager for The Cars and Tom Petty), who is based in Boston. Since hearing Serious Interference, he was willing to commit himself. Scott, like Jane Siberry, is going to demand that same commitment and intensive promotion.

Yes, Scott Merritt will crack it . . .

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AN ANNUAL REPORT TO MEMBERS
AND TO THE CANADIAN MUSIC INDUSTRY

Every year, CAPAC publishes the figures relating to its operations on behalf of over 15,000 members, and the members of other performing rights societies with which we have reciprocal agreements.

The overall picture for 1985 is a mixed one. The decision of the Copyright Appeal Board to approve a commercial television tariff which effectively "froze" CAPAC's 1985 fees at the 1984 level was a costly one for composers, notwithstanding the continued growth of the television industry, of which copyright music forms an important part.

Had the Copyright Appeal Board reapproved the tariff rate in effect for many years, it's estimated that the composers, lyricists, songwriters and publishers of music in CAPAC's repertoire used on Canadian commercial television in 1985 would have earned some \$1,000,000 more than they did.

Overall, CAPAC income from licence fees (and interest earned prior to the distribution of income to members and affiliates) increased from \$27.1 million to \$28.2 million. Especially notable was the increased use of CAPAC members' music abroad – for the first time, foreign income exceeded \$3 million, for a total of \$3,005,194 (up from \$2,466,188 in 1984).

CAPAC's membership continued to grow; 1985 saw almost 1,000 new writers and publishing companies join our organization, and this additional repertoire adds to the wide range of music the society represents.

In 1986, there are continuing pressures on CAPAC from segments of the entertainment industry which seek to limit, or even reduce, the income earned by those who create and market music, the most universal and most popular of all the arts.

And CAPAC, needless to say, will continue to oppose these pressures, and continue to seek a fair and equitable financial return for composers and publishers whose music plays such an important part in Canadian life.





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
(1) CAPAC licence fees and interest (a)




(3) Totals distributed to foreign affiliates




(5) Totals distributed to CAPAC writers

Instrumental backing is supplied by Al Bragg (steel), Jon Park-Wheeler (lead guitar), Randall Prescott (bass and harmonica), and Bill Carruthers (drums).

Carriere and Prophet were recently in Toronto where they opened Norman's Place. a new country showplace, on Rivaldo Road in Weston. The owner of the club, a Frenchman (France), is a longtime fan of Prophet's, and spent over \$300,000 in renovating the old club.

Carriere is currently on release with her RCA single. Changes, which was written and produced in Nashville by Ray Griff. Prophet is making chart progress with his RCA single, Stealer Of Hearts, which was written by Tim Nichols and Gilles Godard, and produced in Nashville by the latter.

The Family Brown's chart entry, What If It's Right, a Barry Brown original also released on RCA, is the title track from their current album, the second single taken from the album. The Family Brown are also experiencing impressive U.S. action, where What If It's Right has scored good numbers on trade charts. They open their U.S. tour with a May 4 date at Buffalo's Utica Club.



Q: Will there be meetings and conferences tied into this event in the future?

A: No, we feel there is a great deal of that going on now, and there's no further need for additional conferences.

O: Isn't \$100 per person a little too expensive for a banquet?

A: Actually it isn't. That price is all-inclusive. Once you pay the \$100 you have paid it all. There are no other charges: for parking, coat check, drinks, or dinner wine. Everything is included. The evening will be a very posh affair in a very elegant setting - something


