

Walt Grealis Day proclaimed by Ottawa

When RPM publisher Walt Grealis arrived in Ottawa (Mar. 21) he was under the impression he was going to attend the Jubilee celebration of The Esquires (see RPM Mar. 7 & 21/87), a concert at the Civic Centre flying the banner of Rock 'n' Roll 'n' Remember. Little did he realize he was going to be part of the celebration.

It was the intention of Jim Durrell, the Mayor of Ottawa, to proclaim Mar. 21, 1987 as Esquire Day, in view of the recognition this Capitol recording group had brought to Ottawa in the early '60s. The Esquires thanked the Mayor for recognizing their efforts, but asked that the honour of such a prestigious event go instead, to Walt Grealis.

In a letter, penned to the Mayor, The Esquires wrote: "As we were contemplating this honour, we began looking at our roots, and have come to the conclusion that The Esquires and many other Ottawa pop groups of the '60s would not have achieved success if it were not for the efforts of one man, Mr. Walt Grealis, who, in our opinion, pioneered the

I am proud to take this opportunity to thank Mr. Grealis on behalf of all musically minded Ottawans. On this day of Rock, Roll and Remember, we are pleased to call this day in Ottawa, Walt Grealis Day."

Axe bows national distribution for indies

Greg Hambleton, President of Axe Records, has announced the formation of Axe Distribution. Using his own catalogue as a launch for the new service, Hambleton has already opened accounts with many major rack wholesalers, which are being serviced by sales reps, Hector MacNeil and Blair Moody in Ontario. The western provinces are being handled by Alta Distributors of Calgary.

There is a new spirit in Canada'' says Hambleton, ''and I perceive a changed attitude to indie labels and fresh original product.'' He continues with, ''It's a myth that only major record labels can sell records. Records are sold by the quality of product and consumer demand generated by exposure on television and radio. If you have a hit, it's easy to distribute product.''

Hambleton has had much success with his catalogue over the years, a major factor in forming his distribution service. Among the best sellers in his catalogue are the self-titled Sattalites album, Professor Piano With The Canadian Aces (Modern Primitive), Greatest Hits of Gary And Dave, 20 Irish Favourites, Thundermug (Strikes), Walter Ostanek (German Beer Drinking Songs and Canada's Polka King), and The Band of The Third Military District (Marches Old & New).

The Sattalites follow-up, Live Via Sattalites, which was recorded live at Toronto's Bamboo in September of last year, is now shipping.

Axe was formed in 1971, "and is probably the longest established independent in Canada," says Hambleton. Those labels looking for national distribution, or artists who are label shopping should contact Hambleton at 416-924-5781.

PolyGram seeks more rock success with Cult LP

The Cult's latest album, titled Electric, currently prefaced by the single Love Removal Machine, will enjoy a full scale marketing campaign from the PolyGram label worldwide.

A limited edition 12" single of Love Removal Machine contains 4 other songs not found on the album and included in the gatefold package is a 24x24 full colour poster, which comprises the initial thrust of the campaign.

The single is also available as a 12" DJonly sampler, a 12" commercial disc and the 7" version.

Produced by Rick Rubin, although originally produced by Steve Brown, the album contains 11 tracks, including a cover of the Steppenwolf classic Born To Be Wild and PolyGram certainly is hoping to capitalize on the success of rock breakthrough act Bon Jovi.

The Cult, once known as The Southern Death Cult, went platinum in Canada with their previous release, Love, which was produced by Brown. As explained by guitarist Billy Duffy though: "Ever since we'd done Love, we decided that the next album was going to be 10 or 11 tracks of rock, no ballads, just straight ahead rock music."

Evidently Brown's production effort was not aggressive enough, "too mushy," in fact, Hence, after hearing Rubin's work in Toronto during their last tour, the band decided to radically change the sound of their new album and re-record the entire piece again at New York's Electric Lady studios.

CASBY Awards' show firmed for June 19 & 20

The CASBY Music Awards 1987 will be held at the Toronto Convention Centre on June 19 and 20. A special one-hour radio broadcast featuring winners from this year's show will go to air on the 21st.

The Awards Ceremony will take place on the 19th, immediately prior to a gala dinner. Video highlights, including acceptance speeches, will be incorporated into the activities for the following evening. The CASBY people will mount a live musical show on the 20th at the Toronto Convention Centre Theatre. This will include Canadian and international talent, including past and present CASBY winners. The entire show will be recorded live-to-tape to be packaged as a two-hour television/radio simulcast Superspecial.

David Marsden, Executive Producer of the CASBY Awards, has also announced that this year "we will be introducing the new CASBY double ballot procedure, emphasizing two ballots, in which the Canadian Artists Selected By You (CASBY), will be truly a people's choice awards."

Major newspapers across Canada are featuring the first ballot on a weekly basis, which began mid-March and will run through mid-April. The ballot asks that readers provide one name in each category from the sug-

Shaw to executive post at FACTOR/CTL


Duff Roman, President of FAC-TOR/CTL, has announced the appointment of Mel Shaw to the position of Executive Director.

Stranglers still struggle for radio recognition

Consistantly over the past decade, British "post punk" band, The Stranglers, have struggled to attain the lofty heights of rock stardom. Their new album, which took 9 months to fully record, serves as a reminder that this is one band where quality takes precedence over quantity.

Not often do Strangler songs make the airwaves however, their first single, Always The Sun, taken from the Dreamtime album, did make significant headway in most major markets.

Although the band's Hugh Cornwell emphatically boasts, "It's the best album," they've released to date, adding it isn't any more commercial than any album previously released.

"None of us receive grants from the government," he is quick to point out. "So, everything we do is commercial, because if we didn't sell records we wouldn't be able to do it in the first place.

"If you're an artist (in England)," he

Molson's dates extend to Vancouver and Montreal

Coming off an extremely successful rock sponsorship year in 1986, Molson's Breweries have extended now into the Vancouver and Montreal markets, according to Don Antle, Manager of Promotions.

The brewery will not only be sponsoring events at Vancouver's PNE, but also B.C. Place - a major coup following their competitor's involvement with Expo last year, relates Antle. As well, Molson's will be sponsoring Edmonton's Klondike Days, Calgary's Stampede, Toronto's CNE, Ottawa's CCE, and Montreal's La Ronde shows.

The success of sponsorship has clearly been indicated by several analytical studies conducted, and expansion into the music and brand indentification fields will be undertaken this year, says Antle. continues, "you can apply for grants to support yourself while you're doing your art, but unfortunately that opening isn't available for modern musicians. We don't have any chance of that . . . and none of us have any private income . . . so we'd better record commercial records."

The actual recording process unfortunately, was somewhat lengthy. The band began production in Belgium with Aural Sculptures' producer Laurie Lathan at the helm, but in Cornwell's own words, "It was a fiasco," and the band returned home to start again.

"Unfortunately, we didn't do much preproduction," he elaborates. We turned up the first day of recording with all these ideas that weren't really songs and Laurie had the terrible task of trying to piece together some sort of order out of it.

"And we hadn't made any sort of deci-

sion over which ideas to work on, or which ones to discard, because we really didn't mind working on any of them. So, we thought 'let's let Laurie decide.' We were just too lackadasical in our attitude."

After several months of work with Latham, the band called it quits, returned to England, and slipped into a "local" studio in Cambridge to complete the project. However, one track did survive those Belgium sessions: Shakin' Like A Leaf.

"The reason why that one came out successfully," Cornwell relates, "is because we'd been playing it live for the six months previously. But it was a very unsatisfying period for everybody. We decided the best thing to do was to come back to England."

The Stranglers are currently preparing for several dates in Canada: Toronto (Apr. 9 & 10), Montreal (11), and the release of the new single.

Radio reaction, so far, has been "disappointing," says Cornwelll, adding however, "anything less than a No. 1 is disappointing."



Bon Jovi's Slippery When Wet is now sextuple platinum in Canada with over 600,000 copies sold! The next single from the album will be Wanted Dead Or Alive. The initial pressing run of the 7" comes in a limited edition picture bag.

The single - backed with I'd Die For You, also from Slippery - features the 5:07 album version of the song, but it's prefaced at radio by 7" and 12" DJ-only samplers, both containing the LP version and the radio edit.

Judging by early reaction, this single (which follows their two consecutive gold singles) could be another monster. AM106 in Calgary, for example, reports that the song was the undisputed No. 1 champ on their nightly showdown feature for a solid week and then on the evening of March 18, it went head-to-head against the new Brian Adams single. The result? Listener response made it

PMIA releases series of cost-sharing recordings


The Pacific Music Industry Association (PMIA) has released a 4-song, 7" single, titled Sneak Previews, featuring 4 performers brought together through the efforts of this Vancouver-based non-profit society (see RPM Mar.28/87). This is the first in what is hoped will be a regular series of recordings, manufactured on a cost-sharing basis by the artists involved, and packaged and distributed to the media by Pacific Music volunteers.

It was pointed out by Jessica Gihon, a Pacific Music volunteer, who is also a publicist and artist manager that the performers invited to participate by a PMIA committee, "provided finished masters and split the costs of manufacturing, packaging and postage, taking advantage of discounts solicited by the committee." There were 1000 records pressed, 400 of which were mailed to the media across the country. The remainder will be allotted to the performers, record personnel, and the Pacific Music membership.

The performers on Sneak Previews are Rona Good, a recent runner-up in Vancouver's Write-On '86 songwriting competition. Here, she showcases On The Borderline, recorded by students at the Trebas Institute, with herself on vocals and guitar, keyboardist Basil Karahalios, bassist Tony Moser, and drummer Paul Dwyer. Blue Wave Studios in Vancouver was the setting for the production by Basil Karahalios.

Duane O'Kane, is well-known in Vancouver, and is also responsible for the cover graphics on the cleverly designed single jacket envelope. His showcase production, Voices In The Night, is from his FACTORsupported self-titled independently-produced album. His session people were Paul Garay (keyboard bass), Sean Vedova (drums) Glen Smith (lead guitar), ID Guiness (keyboards), and Trevor Hoffman, Jane Reed, Jodie Bronson, and Leslie Harris on background vocals. The session was produced by Ken Spence at Ocean Sound.

Tony Papa, has been hailed as "one of the most talked about up-and-comers on the coast." He is known to New York audiences, having been a member of Pigeons Of The Earth, and boasts major international video production credits (Dire Straits and Huey Lewis). His vehicle for Sneak Previews is Don't Stop, a Papa original, taken from his upcoming album. Papa produced this session at Bullfrog Studios with himself on guitars

Participants are "free to seek sponsorship and print their sponsor's logo."

IRS to release R.E.M. compilation on A&M

Although R.E.M. have recently entered the studio to begin work on their fifth album, their label reports a compilation of B-sides and previously unreleased material for release. The package will be available through a one-time only distribution deal with A&M Records, in late April.

R.E.M.'s new album is being produced in Nashville by Scott Litt, known for his work with Patti Smith, Katrina & The Waves, Beat Rodeo, and Robert Gordon. The release date is set for the fall and details were unavailable at press time.

Titled Dead Letter Office, the compilation was only previously available to owners of singles and imports. Liner notes provided by guitarist Peter Buck reveals: "Nobody listens to (a B-side) anyway, so why not have some fun.





quite clear that the boys from New Jersey had the runaway favourite over the Adams' track!

Just arriving is Eight Seconds new single, Where's Bula, in the form of die-cut gatefold 7" package containing a bonus disc with previously unreleased material from the Almacantar sessions. The first single, Kiss You (When It's Dangerous), following its No. 1 position at radio in Quebec, is now approaching gold status.

Already Top 20 across the board at CHR radio in the U.S., Hipsway's first single, The Honeythief, is now finally starting to make significant chart gains in Canada too.

The Cult's new single Love Removal Machine is just being received at radio and the forthcoming album from which it's culled, Electric, ships April 1. The album is being supported by a heavy, multi-phase marketing campaign which, in its early stages, will include the release of a "videosingles" package containing four clips from Electric - at a great low price too.

Of course there will also be an extensive Canadian tour of major and secondary markets, and the word from the U.K. on their ongoing European tour dates is that they are bigger (literally) and better than ever before.

The Mission also has a special video package slated for commercial release, tentatively for the first week of May. The video, entitled Crusade, captures the band live during their late 1986 Crusade tour of Britain and Europe.

Wasteland, the first single from their album, God's Own Medicine (now gold in the U.K.), has just been shipped in a special edition 7'' sleeve. In the wake of the recent announcement of the band's forthcoming Toronto gig, another concert date has been added to the ikinerary; they're now confirmed to appear April 18 at the Spectrum in Montreal.

Robert Cray's Canadian gold album (and a very strong CD seller), Strong Persuader, is not only rebounding back up U.K. charts, but our AOR is digging deep. Two cuts are making tremendous inroads: Right Next Door (Because Of Me) and I Guess I Showed Her, while the lead single Smoking Gun is still burning up the CHR charts.

Therefore, add to this list new product from The Style Council, Anna Domino, Cinderella, Deep Purple and Youssou N'Dour (to name a few), PolyGram is indeed set to have one of our best quarters.

On a final note, programmers should check out N'Dour's version of The Spinner's classic Rubberband Man . . . it has enourmous possibilities.

Franklin & Michael top MuchMusic's Top 30

Aretha Franklin and George Michael's I Knew You Were Waiting (For Me) moves to the No. 1 position on the MuchMusic Top 30 (Mar. 27).
