Newsstand For The Blind goes to air in February

A new national audio network, bannered as the National Broadcast Reading Service (NBRS), will go to air in February (date to be announced later). The NBRS is Canada's first national audio information service for the blind, visually imparied and print handicapped. A similar Quebec-based French language reading service that has been operating for four years, will also be delivered nationally.

Dr. Gerry Dirks, Chairman of the Board of Directors of NBRS, points out that the primary purpose of the new reading service "is to provide access to print material, mainly newspapers and magazines, that are not normally available to people with visual disabilities." The service, which will use

Cochrane touring in support of Sessions LP

Capitol reports that Tom Cochrane's new release, The Symphony Sesssions (recorded live with The Edmonton Symphony Orchestra), is shipping several thousand units each week.

White Hot, the first single from The Symphony Sessions, will be followed-up (Feb. 14) by Leonard Cohen's classic, Bird On A Wire. Until now, this song was only part of Cochrane's concert repertoire. Also included on the Sessions LP are Boy Inside The Man, Lunatic Fringe, Good Times and a new studio track, The Next Life, a tribute to Roy Buchanan.

This past year has been a memorable one for Cochrane. He had two major album releases, Victory Day (now double platinum), and Symphony Sessions. As well, he toured Canada and Germany and had a spot on the David Letterman Show and won a Juno as Composer of the Year.

Cochrane will be touring Ontario during February before going back into the studio to record another album. His Ontario tour begins at the University of Guelph (12), followed by the North Bay Arts Centre (13), Ottawa Congress Centre (14), Newmarket Arena (15), Peterborough Arena (16), Hamilton Place (22) and Oshawa Arena (23).

volunteer readers, has been described as "a newsstand for the blind."

The service, which will have a full-time staff in Toronto of only five or six, will rely heavily on volunteer readers, some of them professional actors or broadcasters.

Communications Canada has committed \$600,000 to the project to cover start-up and a portion of operating costs for the first five years. Additional revenues will be raised through corporate contributions and donations from individuals.

CBC Newsworld has made available, at no cost, a spare satellite sub-carrier for transmission of the service to cable services across Canada. The Montreal-based TV5 has donated a sub-carrier for delivery of the French reading service. Cable systems are being asked to distribute the service on the audio band of alpha-numeric television channels, as well as their cable FM services.

FACTOR has announced a revision to the New Talent Demo Award Program. The program, designed to assist Canadian recording acts who have released no more than ten songs to produce a demo tape in a quality facility, was established in 1982.

There are now two methods of support to choose from, but it is stressed that "One of the following options must be selected at the time of application."

Option A: Successful applicants taking this option will receive 25 hours in a studio that sponsors the program. FACTOR will place the artist in the nearest available sponsor studio and there will be no opportunity to change the facility once the artist has been placed. FACTOR will reimburse the studio for 50 percent of the value of the time used to a maximum of, \$1500.00 The grant includes the services of an engineer and a new roll of 2" recording tape.

The English-language reading service will produce up to eight hours a day of original programming, which will be repeated twice to cover 24 hours.

Sutton stresses that although its studios and offices are located at the Canadian National Institute For The Blind headquarters in Toronto, "the NBRS is a totally separate, independent, not-for-profit corporation established last spring to operate the reading service." 

All other costs incurred are the responsibility of the applicant. The artist is under no obligation to use the studio for future projects.

Option B: Applicants choosing this option will receive a cash grant of up to 50 percent of eligible production costs to a maximum of \$1500.00. The demo may be recorded at a studio of the applicant's choice. No funding will be provided by FACTOR until the demo is completed and a copy of the master as well as copies of all cost documentation are supplied to and approved by FACTOR. A maximum of 25 hours of studio time and costs for the engineer, tape, musicians, vocalists and rentals will be accepted by FACTOR.

Applications for the New Talent Demo Award Program are available through FACTOR's offices in Vancouver and Toronto. The next deadline for submitting applications is Feb. 28, 1990.

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Soviet rock at home and abroad

No one needs to be told that the majority of young people in the USSR are into the rock scene. Any lingering suspicions that this applied only to the major cities were soon dispelled when the Leningrad magazine Avrora held a demo-tape competition and turned up a good number of original bands from rural areas.

As far as big cities go, three have already come forward as leading centres of Russian rock: Moscow, Leningrad and Sverdlovsk. In non-Russian areas, there are thriving rock scenes in the Baltic republics of Lithuania, Latvia and Estonia. The latter is usually strong in festivals and home-grown bands. Unfortunately, since the Baltic republics prefer to sing in their native tongues, nationwide success has so far eluded them, although it's worth mentioning that as soon as the Estonian outfit Meditsinskaya Sestra (Nurse) turned out a song in Russian their popularity soared.

Soviet rock displays certain trends, the predominant of which is pop-rock. This category has a large following, is often on show at concerts and has no trouble getting TV airtime. Least adventurous musically, it is also the most successful commercially. This is no cause for raised eyebrows since market demand in showbusiness often takes precedence over musical integrity and credibility.

The next category is also fairly wide-ranging, and can be lumped in under the heading "hard and heavy." There are several such bands already making a name for themselves in the USSR and abroad, such as Cruise, Shah, Master and Black Coffee.

The third category, which commands a fair amount of support, is alternative rock. Leaders here are Agata Kristy, Kabinet and Volopady (Waterfalls).

The final and most interesting is experimental rock, which includes post-punk, jazz-rock and electronic-experimental. Examples are Akvarium, Brigada S and the unique Zvuki Mu ("Sounds of Mu"). I reckon that this is the most promising form of music for the following reason: for a long time, and until quite recently, Soviet rock concentrated on lyrics, conveying a social message and showing more daring in doing so than the staid press. Now things have changed, as journalists wake up to themes that musicians have long been dealing with on stage. Rock has thus lost the social initiative and been forced to pay more attention to the other part of a song, the music.

There has been little success so far in Soviet rock's attempts to extend its horizons and break out onto the international scene. The main difficulty is communication; Soviet musicians need to be able to speak to their audiences abroad in the local language.

Another limiting factor is the specific nature of the <u>social</u> problems that Soviet bands sing about. There's a ready domestic market for this kind of thing, but much of it does not concern foreign listeners, the huge interest in our country from perestroika and glasnost notwithstanding.

Finally, Soviet rock is let down by its quality. I'm not just talking about equipment limitations but the quality of the actual music. Much of it is amateurish and slap-dash, with musicians unable to keep the beat. There's plenty of work yet to be done in this respect.

But it's not all gloom. Boris Grebenshikov, Zvuki Mu and Cruise have had successes in the West, and Shah's latest disc has just hit the shops in West Germany. Centre, Auktsion, Kina and others have had releases in various countries and Soviet rock musicians have performed at numerous international festivals in the U.K., West Germany, Belgium, Holland, Spain and Finland.

Soviet metal outfits like Shah, Cruise and Black Coffee have caused stirs in West Germany and Spain, while British innovator Jggy Pop liked Zvuki Mu so much he signed a contract with them.

So, there is interest in what Soviet rock has to offer, but it's up to us to take it from here. In any case, Soviet rock's lengthy apprenticeship has at last ended - our imitation of Western bands has given place to a style all our own.

I'm optimistic that we will see gold plus sales from at least ten of these Canadian artists.

Executive Director Foundation To Assist Canadian Talent On Records (FACTOR)

While reflecting on the '80's it is very clear that FACTOR's role in the Canadian recording industry has continued to increase. In 1982 when FACTOR was formed by members of CIRPA, CMPA, CHUM Ltd., Moffat Communications Ltd. and Rogers Broadcasting, it was an annual budget of \$200,000 for funding for two programs. Today FACTOR offers just over \$3 million for funding of seven programs - Direct Board Approval, FACTOR Loans, New Talent Demo Awards, Professional Publishers & Songwriters Progam, Video Loans as well as International Tour and Showcases and Radio Syndication.

FACTOR has seen many developments within the organization that has contributed to this growth. Some of the highlights include:

- 1982 saw FACTOR with three Sponsoring Broadcasters; today there are twelve.

- 1985 found FACTOR merging with Standard Broadcasting's Canadian Talent Library to create a greater pool of funds for Canadian recording artists.

- 1985 also found FACTOR opening a branch office in Vancouver and assisting in the launching of its sister francophone organization MUSICATION.

November of 1986 saw the launching of the Department Of Communications (DOC) five year, \$25 million Sound Recording Develpment Program. FACTOR and MUSICATION annually administer \$3.7 million dollars of these funds for DOC.

This is the first time in the history of Canada that a private organization has administered federal funds on behalf of the Government of Canada. On April 1st 1990, FACTOR will enter year five of this five year agreement. It is important that FACTOR and the industry ensure that the DOC understand the important role of the SRDP Program and the need for the renewal for at least another five years. Presently there is no written commitment, however, key people with DOC have indicated they expect the program to be renewed.

A crucial challenge FACTOR faces in the 1990s is the immediate need for increased funding for its existing programs; funding for the marketing and promotion of completed projects as well as the need for funding for domestic touring. FACTOR will endeavor to meet these challenges and ask for any constructive input you might have in accomplishing these goals.

Anne Murray Centre wins an EDDI Award

At the recent EDDI Awards Night sponsored by the Exhibit and Display Association of Canada, J & O Exhibits took the Special Projects Award for the Anne Murray Centre, which is located in Murray's hometown of Springhill, Nova Scotia. The event, which recognizes "excellence in exhibition design", attracts entries from top professional designers of displays and exhibits from across Canada.

Murray officially opened the non-profit Centre last July (RPM - Aug 12/89). The exhibit is a maze of Murray memorabilia from Snowbird and her first RPM Gold Leaf Awards (now the Juno Awards), to her RPM solid walnut, gold and platinum awards that recognized "outstanding sales" of her albums and singles. There are also her Number One Awards as well as the many Big Country Awards she has won over the years.

Since opening, the Centre has logged more than 25,000 visitors in its first halfseason of operation, with visitors coming from as far away as California, Europe and even South America.

As the Centre's Executive Director, Shelagh Rayworth, points out, "Since one of the Centre's aims is to document the ongoing achievements of an active performer, plans are already afoot to update the exhibits for 1990." Rayworth has apparently already been in touch with Leonard Rambeau, President of Balmur Ltd., Murray's management company, about acquiring mementos from the Capitol star's most recent accomplishments.

The Joints scores airplay with debut cassette

Described as "Toronto's newest original pop/rock band," The Joints have attracted sales and airplay with their unique 2-song cassette, Let's Talk and Inside You. After the cassette was aired on Toronto's Q107, "Cassette sales increased dramatically," says Jami Hollywood, who handles lead vocals and guitars for the band. The cassette is available at Sam The Record Man's Yonge Street Store and at G's Mini Mart in Rochdale.

Hollywood and band member, guitarist Steddy, have been writing songs as a team for four years. While in Europe this past summer they met two European musicians, bassist Paul 'Captain' Abreu and drummer Rui Fernandes, and formed The Joints. They toured the continent for several weeks, where they reportedly garnered excellent response and an impressive following.

Hollywood and Steddy have now returned to Toronto where they are recording material for an upcoming album, produced by Glen Jessamy, who has worked with Ray Charles, Aretha Franklin and Def Leppard. The Joints currently release on Bud Music but are actively shopping a major deal.

After the release of their album in the spring, the band will return to Europe for a spring/summer tour.

Vogen taking businesslike approach to success

Vogen, as we now know them, deserve congratulations if not praise for their newest release, Berlin Wall. Vocalist Kevin Vogen and guitarist Don Le Roux have self promoted and methodically worked towards this deal. They managed to make all the right moves, make all the right contacts, and effectively work within the industry until which time they had matured sufficiently to fall into a major contract.

Building their foundation in the Vancouver street music scene under the name The Shape (which was again changed to Naked Ape prior to the Vogen headline), Vogen's energetic live presence and commercial writing talents landed the band a position on four (Spotlight '86, CFMI, CFOX, and CKXY) homegrown albums. Clearly the band's faith in such paths is strong. "These things are great for young bands!", Le Roux admits. "We basically won all the recording time that made this album. Two of the songs on Berlin Wall were financed by the band and the rest were financed by the homegrown contests. Yeah, we're avid supporters!"

From the beginning the band's approach has been a premeditated and highly businesslike proposition. Their awareness of the reality behind making deals and records seems to have tempered their attitude as well as made them favourable candidates for a major contract. Their maturity and understanding of self-promotion certainly must have brightened their appeal to WEA's A&R department. Vogen added, "Vancouver has a great support system. Some really cool people involved in the business side have been very helpful. People like Tom Harrison and Ra McGuire (who produced Berlin Wall). The first homegrown that we played on was called Spotlight '86. We met Tom Harrison

and Ra McGuire at the first gig that we played there, and they have been very close contacts with us over the last four years. They've been very helpful. They're there to pat us on the back, give us support, and good business advice. They're really good contacts."

Tom Harrison not only nurtured the band through their early years, but has also interviewed Vogen on his Demo Listen radio program, and helped spread their word across the map. Harrison's involvement in so many areas of the music business, not to mention having a WEA recording act of his own in Bruno Gerrussi's Medallion, has spawned a flurry of questions involving the potential for a conflict of interest. Le Roux explains, "Tom looks at that issue more than anyone else in the business. He's so careful about it. When we first sent away our submission for Spotlight '85, we weren't even a band at that point - just a demo by Kevin and I, we also sent him a t-shirt. Tom said one of the reasons we didn't get in is because he didn't want to accept the t-shirt as kind of . . . you know." Vogen interjects, "It was only a t-shirt about supporting local music. It didn't say 'Hey, pick us!'. Yeah he really is careful." Le Roux continued by adding, "People ask him these questions all the time and he's gotten to the point where he's thinking 'I really don't care what people think'. I mean he knows he's doing the right thing, and I know he's doing the right thing. He's really concerned about only giving people what they deserve. I could see the conflict being more important out here where you have some kind of division between Toronto and Vancouver. But in Vancouver he is such a multi-media individual, this conflict of interest is not really seen this way. He is so actively involved in everything, it's


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like -'Hey Tom's involved in something else!' It's great!''

It seems that Vogen has gained a good deal of ability to deal with the political aspects of the business as well. Their vision is also clear in their approach to the sound that they feel most suits their talent. Vogen has never been shy about their popish slant, nor do they feel that is a bad thing. La Roux commented, "There really is a pop void that needs filling, and we're hoping to bridge a little bit of why people like alternative within the pop music framework. Just make it more accesssible to the entire market." This area of the musical realm can be a tough ticket to sell in the midst of Vancouver's strong alternative base of fans. That accounted partially for their early name change from The Shape to The Naked Apes. As Le Roux explains "Mostly for club stuff because Vancouver has really good support for alternative bands and we were having problems drawing, People were considering us a mainstream band. The name change worked really well for what we were doing, but it didn't suit WEA's needs when the time came."

Vogen has made an almost textbook climb over the biggest hurdle facing any young band, and have luckily remained aware of what has brought them. "I thought the business would be full of people I didn't want to deal with," adds Le Roux. "But everyone we've surrounded ourselves with has been so supportive and so helpful that I'm really proud to be part of it." Vogen concluded with, "I think our goals are a little bit on the flexible side at the moment. Our main goal has been to get to where we are right now."



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MCA Canada and Justin finalize distribution deal

Justin Entertainment Inc. and MCA Records Canada have announced the finalization of a three year Canadian distribution agreement. Veteran industry executive Jeff Burns is heading the newly formed Justin label, to further his commitment of discovering and developing Canadian artists.

Throughout Burns' 25 year career in the industry he's worked with Canadian artists and is recognized as one of the most successful supporters of domestic talent. From 1968 to 1979, Burns was the Vice President of A&R and Promotion at GRT Records, giving him the opportunity to be instrumental in the signing of and guiding the careers of notable Canadian artists Dan Hill, Prism, Ian Thomas and Lighthouse.

Over the next decade Burns held the rein as Vice President of A&R at CBS Records in Canada, where he continued to develop more domestic artists on the CBS roster. Burns' days at CBS witnessed the success of Gowan, Loverboy, Platinum Blonde as well as platinum selling artists Harlequinn, Queen City Kids and Kick Axe. Shortly before Burns left CBS one of his last projects was Barney Bentall And The Legendary Hearts whose

platinum debut earned them the Most Promising New Act Juno Award in 1989.

Obviously excited about the signing and his new label, Burns points out, "I've spent the last 25 years in this industry developing domestic talent and, as President of Justin Entertainment Inc., it is my intention to

continue that mandate. To that end, we have signed six Canadian artists, and are now making final plans for release." Burns concludes with, "I am looking forward to a long prosperous relationship with MCA Canada."

Ross Reynolds, President of MCA Records Canada, shares in Burns' excitement stating, "It's very exciting and I look forward to working with Jeff again. He's proven over and over that he has one of the best pair of ears in the business."

Another member of the Justin team, (RPM - 51 No. 10), Kim Zayac also formerly of CBS adds to the industry experience behind the new label. When approached about a release from the new label Zayac explains, "The first release on our label will be a Kenny MacLean album," continuing with, "the title track Don't Look Back will be the first single and will be serviced to radio on February 5, with album scheduled to hit the street February 27."

There must be some merit behind the signing of MacLean, because both Burns and Zayac have worked with him before. Zayac informs, "I worked with Kenny many years ago when I was with Capitol and he was with the Deserters and when I was with CBS MacLean joined Platinum Blonde." With the Blonde's new member Burns had his chance to work with MacLean.

In addition to this already closely knit family, it was Tony Tsavdaris, co-manager of Platinum Blonde, who signed MacLean on as a solo project. To add to the family, aside from the long list of guests on the album, Don't Look Back was helped along by Claus

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





Sklar's TVer airs Gospel show



It's interesting to note that the top variety spot on CBC-TV is also held by Murray for Anne Murray's Greatest Hits Volume II. That special, which aired this past fall, garnered 2.5 million viewers.

Says Reynolds, "Murray has, therefore, established two new ratings records; it's not only the first time an artist has clinched the top two variety specials in the same season, it is also the first time a re-run has grabbed the number one spot for the week on CBC-TV." (Last year, the re-run of Anne Of Green Gables was number two on the network for the week of its run).

"To say I'm pleased," says Sandra Faire, producer of both specials, "is the understatement of the decade, but then it's un-Canadian to appear too enthusiastic. I can say, however, that I'm not surprised. Anne's the consummate artist, on record; in concert; on television; and I've seen, first hand, the incredible respect she gets from musicians and engineers during recording sessions, not to mention the crews in the television studios." Faire concludes with, "Anne Murray is number one for a reason...she's the best... I know it ... her peers know it ... and the public knows it."

"What a great way to start off the '90s," said Leonard Rambeau, co-executive producer of both specials and President of Balmur Ltd. "It proves that Canadians will watch . . . and indeed, prefer to watch, Quality Canadian shows like Anne's specials, the CBC Family Hour and Degrasssi High."

In conclusion Reynolds notes, "Anne Murray brings in all viewers; kids, teens and adults. Am I going to ask her to do another special? You bet." to the establishment of a permanent nome for the Canadian Country Music Association's Hall Of Honour." The CD has been sent out to over 2,000 radio stations across Canada, the U.S. and Europe.


