Adams breaks UK record set by Slim Whitman

Slim Whitman held the record of having been No. 1 on the UK charts the longest. His 11 week stranglehold on the charts with Rose Marie in 1954 has been shattered by Bryan Adams. Adams' A&M single (Everything I Do) I Do It For You held firm for the week of Sept. 23, after 12 weeks in the No. 1 position. According to A&M, the single has shipped 254,340 in Canada. Adams single has also broken a record in Canada, the longest a single has ever held onto the No. 1 berth on both the RPM 100 Hit Tracks and AC Chart; a total of nine weeks.

As well, there have been 31,745 units shipped of his follow-up single, Can't Stop This Thing We Started, which is at No.3 on the RPM 100 Hits Tracks this week. Adams was replaced by Rod Stewart's Motown Song.

Dan Hill and Quality pact worldwide recording deal

Russ Regan, President and Chief Operating Officer of Quality Records, has announced the signing of Dan Hill to a worldwide multirecording contract. Hill, a well-known Canadian singer/songwriter and winner of five Juno Awards, was signed to the label on Sept. 16 in Los Angeles. His initial release is pencilled in for mid-October.

It had earlier been reported that Quality was returning to front-line label activity (RPM Sept. 21/91), and that a major signing would shortly be announced.

In making the above announcement, Regan enthused, "Dan Hill is one of the great talents in this business... I believed it when I signed him at 20th Century Records and he has proven it over and over again."

Hill made international news with his 1977 single release Sometimes When We Touch, which entered the RPM Top 100 Singles chart at No. 82 on Sept. 17, 1977. The single topped the chart on March 18, 1978, and contributed to Hill winning three personal Junos that year as Male Vocalist, Best Selling Album for Longer Fuse, and as co-composer of Sometimes When We Touch. Sometimes When We Touch and Longer Fuse also won Junos for Hill's producers McCauley and Mollin. Hill was also nominated for a Grammy for Sometimes When We Touch.

Hill has also written material for Celine Dion, George Benson, and Jeffery Osborne.

Vancouver office, reports that Adams' three Wembley Arena (London, England) shows, scheduled for Nov. 6, 7 and 8, "were sold out in three hours," adding that "it won't be easy to drive to the country to get tickets for Bryan's fans, as Belfast, Dublin, Aberdeen, Whitley Bay, Sheffield and Birmingham sold out within hours as well."

Blake also reports that in Adams' hometown of Vancouver, A&B Sound opened at 6 am (Sept. 23) so fans could pick up his new album (Waking Up The Neighbours), early. "Over 400 people were in line when the doors opened," says Blake, "and many had camped out the night before." Blake also revealed that Adams was so overwhelmed that his fans would get up that early, "he went down to the store unannounced and signed autographs for over an hour."

Gordon Lightfoot returns to Toronto's Massey Hall

After 23 years, the love affair between Massey Hall's patrons and Gordon Lightfoot continues as Lightfoot will be performing six nights on two consecutive weekends, Nov. 14-15 and Nov. 21-23 at the venerable old Toronto institution.

As welcome as Indian summer, Lightfoot's annual stint at Massey Hall is somewhat of a Canadian institution in itself. Performing songs from a recording career that began in 1965, Lightfoot has a rich, vibrant repertoire that has stood the test of time and one that will be bringing fans back for an amazing 24th consecutive year.

Toronto rockers Slik Toxik signed to Capitol Canada

Slik Toxik, a young, aggressive hard-rock band from Toronto, have been signed to Capitol Records.

Initial release, set for Sept. 27 in Canada with a US date to follow, will be a CD5 entitled Smooth And Deadly. Four original tracks will comprise the release.

A full album has been scheduled for release, the first of the year, in both Canada and the US.

Independent labels not scared of U.S. legislation

Major labels may be less inclined to sign Canadian bands in the face of the new US Immigration Act ("IMMACT90") which poses a serious threat to the ability of performers wanting to enter the U.S. on temporary work visas.

However, bands shouldn't despair, according to Jeff Burns, president of Justin Records, an indpendent label distributed by MCA Canada. "Bands can still make money by signing with an independent label. If we do an advance pressing of let's say 5,000, and if it sells then both the band and the label can make some money.

"It's an opportunity for a band to get some national exposure and distribution. You don't have to go to the U.S. There's plenty of opportunity in this country."

Odds debut new album at Vancouver launch

The Odds, made their official debut in their hometown of Vancouver at the Roxy (Sept. 4) in what has been described as a "multiflavoured" showcase. The showcase was used to launch their debut BMG/Zoo release titled Neopolitan.

Ironically, it was like coming home for the Odds, who, as Dawn Patrol, played over 700 performances at the legendary club.

Rebuilding retail traffic critical to industry future

Bryan Adams has been holding the No. 1 position on both the RPM 100 Hit Tracks and the AC charts for an unbelievable 13 weeks in Canada with a record that has a lot of roll but very little rock. The single has some record watchers, and executives wondering what's next. This is not a turntable hit. (Everything I Do) I Do It For You, which has been No. 1 on the charts of 16 countries for several weeks, has sold close to 6 million copies worldwaide, and could end up being the largest selling single in history. Not bad for a Canadian, and he did it without the Cancon crutch.

Also creating a buzz in the industry is the success of, the Natalie Cole album. The album topped the RPM 100 Albums chart on Aug. 17, a position it held for four straight weeks, no mean feat for a decidedly middle of the road, AC and/or easy listening artist. It's obvious from the sale of Cole's Unforgettable With Love album, there's more to the record industry than rock 'n roll.

However, Stan Kulin, President of Warner Music Canada, assumes a somewhat cautious

approach. "Sure, we've sold double platinum on Natalie Cole, but at the same time we're on the verge of 400,000 for Black Crowes. Both Skid Row and Van Halen are certainly selling equivalent to Natalie Cole, and Metallica is well beyond even that. So rock music isn't dead." He does suggest that with the success pattern of the Natalie Coles and Anne Murrays and Rita MacNeils, "maybe as an industry we've been ignoring this kind of music. But it doesn't mean that the other product has stopped selling totally."

A check of retail outlets, particularly in the downtown core of Toronto, certainly suggests there is a predominance of the 30 plus buyer, which might even present an intimidating factor with the younger buyers. It's also fairly obvious with the advent and growing popularity of the compact disc, that the real record buyer, the audiophile, has returned to the mainstream stores. Jason Sniderman of Roblan, supplier to the giant Sam The Record Man chain, has seen a swing toward the 30 plus age group. He stresses however, "We always tried to make our stores comfortable, so they would appeal to everyone, as opposed to one certain group."

Other intrusions into the once dominated rock charts include albuims by Harry Connick Jr., who has been on the chart for 36 weeks, Celine Dion, now enjoying 64 weeks of charting with her double platinum album, the Canadian cast recording of Phantom Of The Opera also over double platinum and on the chart for 38 weeks, and the list of intruders goes on; Garth Brooks, Wilson Phillips, Blue Rodeo, Amy Grant and more.

Paul Burger, President of Sony Music Entertainment, is also aware of the older buyer, "but we know the CD penetration has passed a certain threshold and it's obviously the critical mass threshold we're hitting now." Burger also cites the price wars, particularly on the Yonge Street (Toronto) strip, as a factor in bringing more customers into the stores. Prices range anywhere from \$19.99, which is now the high, down to \$11.99 for new release CD product. "Some of the prices on Yonge Street are shockingly low and any good consumer, no

matter what age, is going to try and get the best possible price."

Burger also believes that the boredom of being stuck in a recession for the past couple of years is bringing the customers back to the store. "People are starting to realize that music is one of the best value buys there is," says Burger "and the artists who are selling attract a wide demographic of buyer." He continues with, "We've been doing tremendous business with artists like Michael Bolton, Mariah Carey, Stevie Ray Vaughan and Harry Connick, which shows a much more varied consumer on a very broad demographic basis. I'm talking platinum and double platinum artists here. There's certainly a development to increase the consumption of music at all levels, some of that is direct consumption and some through other music programming whether it be on television or even a movie like The Commitments."

One artist who doesn't regularly chart, but who is one of the top selling artists in pop/ country music, is Anne Murray. "Basically since 1986, the year we had our last big hit (Now And Forever)," says Leonard Rambeau, who heads up Balmur Ltd., Anne Murray's mangement firm. "Anne has been averaging over a million albums in catalogue sales each year. We may not be selling hordes of Anne's latest album to show high on the charts, but we've always had that 30 plus audience. So, through the last five or six years, without that big radio hit, we've been selling well. I think because of Natalie Cole, and for that matter Rita MacNeil, the industry has perked up to the fact that the 30 plus age group are into buying, and they're buying the Natalie Coles, the Rita MacNeils and the Anne Murrays. I think if the industry catered more to that market, there would be an increase in sales of this type of product."

Ron Michael-Scott, Director of Marketing for Capitol Records-EMI Canada, believes it is critical for the labels and the retailers "to make the product easily accessible for the casual older consumer... easier for them to get in, find the product or get serviced and directed toward the product. That's important, because then we can start to develop return traffic and make them very comfortable with that shopping experience. If they come into the store and have a hard time finding what they want, it literally discourages them from coming back. It encourages them to pick up the phone or write away for it, and obviously we want to generate retail traffic and

-habitual buying patterns."

It has been suggested that charts, for the most part, haven't reflected the increase in sales of titles that interest the 30 plus age group. "If you look at the trades in both Canada and the US overthelast ten years," says Kulin, "the emphasis has been on rock music. The charts, to a certain degree, reflect what is selling, but they have never been accurate. The public interprets charts as sales. We in the industry say they are made up of a combination of radio play and sales. I don't think the public sees it that way. When they look at the Top 10 they assume that's the Top 10 sellers."

Country music, traditionally catering to an older demographic, is also taking a larger share of the market. Steve Tennant, MCA's Vice President of Marketing, hasn't seen too much of a swing to the older demographics on mainstream product, but he has been encouraged by the increase in country sales. He credits MCA's catalogue of country titles. "Mark Chestnutt is almost gold and Trisha Yearwood, who was No. 1 in both Canada and the US with her debut single, is halfway to gold. As well, George Strait, Lionel Cartwright, Reba McEntire, among others continue to sell very well." Tennant is also impressed by the attitude at retail, pointing out that "Retailers are giving more space to country releases. Sam has been very supportive and A&A, as they are getting back into the game, are supporting country product, particularly in Western Canada."

"It's no longer small time sales for country music," says Kulin. "We've sold over 600,000 of Randy Travis' last album in Canada, and we consistently go well over platinum with Dwight Yoakam, and Travis goes well over double platinum on all his releases. Hank Williams Jr. goes gold, Highway 101 has had a couple of gold albums, not to mention other artists like Garth Brooks and Alan Jackson." These sales

are accomplished in spite of the resistance or, in some cases, ignorance of the sales potential of country music by retailers. Chides Kulin, "I'll venture to guess that if you went into most record stores today, you wouldn't find any of these artists in the front rack. It's interesting that a new Randy Travis comes out and there's no excitement in the trades. A new Red Hot Chili Peppers comes out and people are already talking about it."

It has been suggested that the recent recession has been a factor in the shift in consumer buying power to those in the 30 plus age group. Many believe this group are key to stabilizing the retail trade and rebuilding its traffic. "We have to start addressing the older demographics," says Kulin. "We have to be open to change. There are so many misconceptions in the business. The fault lies on both sides, with the manufacturers and the retailers, and, even with the media. None of us are perfect. So I think every now and then it's a good idea to pull back from the business and look at it from a distance and admit that because things are always done this way doesn't necessarily make it right."



If there's a theme running through the collection it's if women want some satisfaction then get out there and work hard for it. And for men, you better treat her like a lady and with a lot of respect, a philosophy Aaron has followed throughout her career.

"Sure it was tough when I started out. I mean, there literally were no females singing hard rock. It was unheard of. And I had to work really hard to be accepted and prove that a woman can do it just as good as a guy."

Chiarelli was chosen as the best band by the panel of distinguished judges made up of the Jeff Healey Band, Lee Aaron, Glen Stace, Colin James and surprise guest Stuart Copeland. According to Healey, "it was a tough decision, all the bands had a lot of talent and deserve to be rewarded, but we all found Rita's voice very impressive."

In a close call, Chiarelli won out over The Blazers from Pilot Butte, Saskatchewan and Rogues Gallery from St. John's. The three bands were chosen as "the best in their region" after competing in homegrown contests sponsored by local radio stations and promoted by Molson Breweries across Canada

Chiarelli will receive \$15,000 worth of Peavey musical equipment, will have a four song extended play recorded at Metalworks studio in Toronto, produced by Gil Moore, and have her video single produced by Revolver Film Co. Chiarelli will also be showcased as part of the 1992 Juno festivities.

BRYAN ADAMS - Rock Waking Up The Neighbours A&M - 75021 5367-2-Q

What can one say about an album that has a single that has set records for being No. 1 on charts around the world (I Do It For You), and another song that's bulleting up the charts (Can't Stop This Thing We Started), except to say, "right on Bryan!" It's taken four years for the perfectionist Adams to finally deliver this album and the wait has been worth it. Every song is first rate, from the writing to the production to the musicianship. Over four years Adams must have built up quite a song collection as he gives the buyer his money's worth with 15 tracks to listen to. Two of the best are Hey Honey - I'm Packing You In and If You Wanna Leave Me (Can I Come Too?). These and other tracks have single potential, so one can expect Adams will be waking up the neighbours on the radio and at record stores at least for another year or so. (CD reviewed)



TOM COCHRANE - Rock Mad Mad World Capitol - C2-97723-F

Cochrane sans Red Rider was a little difficult to get into, but a bit more concentration revealed a somewhat new, perhaps bluesy direction for this West Coast artist. Being recorded In Memphis and produced by Joe Hardy (except All The King's Men), which was produced by Cochrane, obviously didn't hurt. Hardy has done the same for ZZ Top, Colin James and Steve Earle. Cochrane's buying public and his airwaves buddies haven't found any negatives with this album nor with Life Is A Highway, the first single, now bulleting up the charts. By the way, that's Molly Johnson (Infidels) and John Cody on backing vocals. The vocal power and projection, not to mention the intensity in lyric Interpretation are unmistakably Tom Cochrane. These ingredients are most prominent in the title track and particularly on Sinking Like A Sunset, which was written by Annette Ducharme, who also supplies

backing vocals. Also, don't overlook Brave And Crazy, which features Kim Mitchell on guitar. (CD reviewed) - WG



GUNS N' ROSES - Rock Use Your iliusion I and II Geffen - GEFSD-24415/24420-J

Record execs tried to convince G N'R to release just one album and after listening to all 30 tracks on the two discs, it might not have been a bad idea. While there are some excellent rockers throughout, especially the songs written by rhythm guitarist, Izzy Stradlin, ultimately there's too many songs that sound the same spread over two discs. You Could Be Mine and the ballad Don't Cry have the most radio play potential. mostly because almost all the other songs have four letter words. The most obnoxious offender is Get In The Ring. a childish four letter word rant against specific rock mags. TIN MACHINE - Rock/R&B Tin Machine II London/Victory - 828 272-2-Q

As the follow-up to the 1989 self-titled debut, David Bowle, Reeves Gabrels, Hunt and Tony Sales continue their evolution of rock with a sprinkling of R&B. With this set however, the lyrical punch is much more tantalizing and the rock a little more comfortable where defined. Australia as a production base perhaps, had an overal influence on the bandmembers, who admit to the vastness of the country and which might have contributed to a much greater expression of lyric and song freedom. The first album was recorded in Montreux, Switzerland, which by its very geography lends itself to confinement. Unlike their debut, when they were comparitive strangers before recording, with this album, they had known each other for a couple of years. They had also worked solidly together on 20 live dates on their Sound & Vision tour before completing the set. Key are You Belong In Rock And Roll, Shopping For Girls, and One Shot, taken as the first single and now moving up the RPM 100. (CD reviewed) - WG

YES - Rock Yes Years Atco - CD-91644-P

As box sets go, this 4-CD, 46-track package of almost five hours of practically everything Yes did and then some, is perhaps one of the best buys on the market. There are understandably, a few weak tracks where the band was out of its depth. These include the Lennon/McCartney covers of I'm Down and Every Little Thing. On the plus side however, are the 8 1/2 minute Roundabout and Close To The Edge with a time of 18 1/2 minutes, plus Owner Of A Lonely Heart and Rhythm Of Love, Mood For The Day with Steve Howe on Spanish Guitar, and Ritual, where Rick Wakeman's keyboard work is outstanding. A treasure trove of Yes classics. Of particular note is the original cover art by longtime Yes artist Roger Dean. A 34-page full colour booklet featuring an exceptionally impressive historical look at each of the bandmembers, is also included, which is highlighted with rare photos and illustrations. ROBBIE ROBERTSON - Rock Storyville Geffen - GEFSD-24303-J

Robbbie Robertson declares, "that everybody needs to go to New Orleans some time." And If one can't, his Storyville album is a good replacement. Robertson says he has always wanted to do an album dripping with the flavor of New Orleans and on Storyville he succeeds. What About Now is the first single, as well it should be, as it is the album's standout track backgrounds vocals from the father/ son combination of Aaron and Ivan Neville. Night Parade and Day of Reckoning are two other tracks that grab the listener by the ears. This is a perfect disc to slip into the player for those upcoming crisp, cool autumn

JACK DIAMOND - Country The Diamond is Back Roto Noto- RCS-20110

The Diamond is Indeed back. Money In My Pocket, described as "radio friendly," has been taken as the next single (Roto Noto compilation CD Border De-Fences) from this debut album by Diamond. Also contains Diamond's past single releases. Key are the Rita Chiarelli penning of Someone To Lean On, produced by Diamond and Randall Cousins, and the Hotchkiss. Terry penning of Heartwreck. LUCILLE STARR - Country Songs Of Love Intersound - CD1-9101



CJVR celebrates 25 years in the broadcast business



CHARTS

What! A new No. 1? It may seem strange, but Bryan Adams' (Everything I Do) I Do It For You is not the No. 1 song in Canada. After nine weeks, it has been replaced by Rod Stewart's The Motown Song. It becomes Stewart's sixth chart-topping song. Over his career, he has been at No. 1 a total of 15 weeks. That puts him seventh on the list of artists who have spent the most weeks on top of the RPM charts.

After only one full week! Since it is basically being sold as one package, the Guns N' Roses' Use Your Illusion I & II are listed as a double album. With a full week on (but mostly off) the shelves, it captures the No. 1 spot on the Albums chart. Name the last album to make it to the top in just its second week. Hint: It debuted at No. 6 Oct. 22, 1988.

Getting back on track ... After dropping one spot on the Albums chart last week, due to three other hot albums, Rush rebounds two places to No. 11. A few weeks ago Rush had the top adds on both the Albums and Hit Tracks charts. A trick that hadn't been turned in over two years. Another Canadian act did it in February 1989 when Brighton Rock's One More Try and the album, Take A Deep Breath, were the top adds.

The fall rush is on! No less than five albums debut in the Top 40 this week led by Mariah Carey's Emotions at No. 14. Tom Cochrane's Mad Mad World enters at No. 19. With not much time on the street, Bryan Adams still bows at No. 23 with Waking Up the Neighbours. Albums from Tesla and Ozzy Osbourne round out the list entering at No. 32 and 40 respectively.

Extremely rare . . ! He isn't at No. 1 any more but Bryan Adams has two songs in the Top 10. I Do It For You dips to No. 3 while the followup, Can't Stop This Thing We Started, bullets to No. 10. The last time that occurred was in January of 1988 when Tiffany's Could've Been was at No. 4 and I Think We're Alone Now was at No. 7. Before her, Madonna did it in June of 1985. Crazy For You was at No. 4 and Angel at No. 6.

No. 1 in 2. Roy Orbison's Mystery Girl reached the top of the Albums chart in its third week in 1989, but the last album to make it in its second week was U2's Rattle And Hum. It hit the top Oct. 29, 1988.

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
