BMG's Wright settled in after baptism of fire

When Carol Wright took on the awesome responsibility this past March as Director of Artist Marketing for BMG Music Canada, she admits to having some trepidation. Asked what her greatest fear was, she has a one word answer, "volume." Prior to joining BMG, Wright was Director of Marketing for Island Records. "We release as many records every two weeks at BMG as Island did every year," she confides.

As well, her responsibilities with a major label are far more reaching and complex then what she experienced with a distributed label. She recalls that when with Island "I could present my ideas and plans to the distributor and it would be their staff that would make it happen at street level ... now, it's our staff, a different perspective."

Wright also points out that her department is demanding, "a very creative department with four to five people coming at me from all angles for decisions. They've decided what they want

to do and they want a decision on some kind of strategy."

This is no nine to five job, as Wright explains, "I'm working serious hours... getting our Christmas plans in place." As well, with BMG's commitment to its Canadian signings, the workload has been increased with releases by Crash Test Dummies, Big House, Prairie Oyster, and the latest signing, two girls who go under the name of Love & Sas.

"That's four domestic projects, all happening at the same time, which requires arranging the photo sessions, the videos, the artwork, all the advertising campaigns as well as the tour strategies. Just doing the domestic part keeps me very busy."

Wright began her career in the music business in 1976 at Phase One Studios. After a couple of visits to MIDEM, she took a job in the British music industry, of major importance to her and her developmental years in the business.

Standard stations launch substance abuse program

Gary Slaight, President of Standard Radio and Toronto Mayor Art Eggleton, recently launched a month long campaign on Substance Abuse. The campaign was revealed at a press conference and live broadcast held earlier this month.

Over and above the month long on-air public service support, Standard Radio presented five recognized charities dealing with substance

abuse with \$5,000 each.

Slaight pointed out that "By helping people understand and approach the problem and by spotlighting the many brave groups and individuals who are taking a stand and making a difference, CFRB 1010 and The MIX 99.9 are helping mobilize the people of our city both on a personal and community level."

The five organizations who received the \$5,000 donations were: First Stop, an information and referral kiosk/service operating out of the downtown bus depot; Ambassador School, an alternative school for youth who have dropped out of the mainstream school system; The Substance Abuse Program, a division of Adolescent Medicine at the Hospital for Sick Children; Beat The Street, an established and effective literacy program for street youth in downtown Toronto; and the Salvation Army Drug Awareness for Inner City Youth.

She explains, "In England you put out a single on Friday, on Tuesday you have a chart number and three weeks later you're working on something else. Here, you put a record out and a month later you're still calling people to see if they've got it yet."

After close to two years in England, Wright returned to Canada where she joined Virgin Records and, later, Island. Now, with her position at BMG, Wright is utilizing some of the methodology she picked up from her British connection.

Reporting to Wright are marketing managers and publicity personnel.

Can independents survive US Immigration Act changes?

There are a few independent label owners who do not regard the proposed changes to the US Immigration Act as a threat to the Canadian recording industry. Jeff Burns, President of Toronto-based Justin Entertainment, believes the ruling could be of benefit to Canadian acts.

Burns can sympathize with his counterparts who have expensive productions out in the market and in the can. "You can pretty well rule out a lot of the people who have finished masters, who raised money independently or who had FACTOR or government funding, and who are beginning to panic a bit now about the new attitudes coming. They aren't going to have a lot of places to go, but there aren't a lot of places to go anyway.

"Let's face it, we're in an iffy situation anyway in Canada. If someone offers a finished master and if the forecast reveals a potential of 5,000 to 10,000 units, I don't think too many of the multi-nationals would be interested. There has to be an outlet for new artists, and Justin Entertainment has the where with all to accommodate them."

In the year and a half since Burns launched Justin Entertainment he has released 23 albums, a fairly hefty figure for a new company. The plus factor for Burns' operation is the fact he has national distribution through MCA.

There are people out there willing to take a risk, with their own or private sector money," says Burns. "If we can supply them a release label and national distribution and if we are able to sell 10,000 units, we'll all make money. That also gives us a better chance to promote the act internationally, and I'm not just talking US promotion, much can be accomplished in Europe, Australia, New Zealand and Japan."

Burns is also confident that with the proper promotion and, hopefully, acceptance by radio, that low end scale of 10,000 units could double ortriple. "I'm amazed at the number of calls I've been receiving from band's and solo acts, who have the finances to record and even promote a new album. All they need is a release label. Perhaps we've set our goals too high in this country and it's time to get back to basics and the reality of the business

A 1961 \$300,000 purchase launched Sniderman empire

Thirty years ago, the day after Labour Day 1961, to be exact, Sid and Sam Sniderman moved into an old furniture store at 347 Yonge Street in downtown Toronto. That day heralded a change in record retailing that has effected the entire entertainment field to this day.

It was Sam Sniderman who, in the late fifties, first introduced "discounting" to the record business. The carefully planned marketing strategy turned the Sniderman's Music Hall, located on College Street near Shaw in Toronto's west end, into a mecca for record buyers.

Although the move to downtown Toronto was inevitable for Sid and Sam, as Sam explains, "It was A&A that brought us down to Yonge Street, because they used to cut our advertising out of the newspapers, cut our name off and put it in their windows." A&A was effectively matching the discount prices at Sniderman's Music Hall.

The move downtown however, was gradual. They took space in the basement of Yolles Furniture Store, two doors south of Dundas on the east side of Yonge. That gave them a Yonge Street location in what still is the busiest section of Toronto. It also allowed them the opportunity to scout the territory properly.

An old furniture store at 347 Yonge, came up for sale. Although it was two doors south of

A&A's (Steele's Tavern was squeezed in between A&A's and the furniture store), the Sniderman's were interested. Sam conferred with his mother, who thought it was a good idea. He recalls however, being a little apprehensive. "I said 'Ma! I can't open next door to this competitor... he's one of the biggest competitors around.' My mother calmed me down with, 'Son, does Eaton's worry about Simpson's?' That really convinced me."

Adams still shattering records on British charts

Bryan Adams has not only broken an all-time chart record in England with his single (Everything I Do) I Do It For You (RPM - Oct. 5/91), where he remained at the top of the charts for 13 straight weeks, he has set yet another milestone. The triumphant Vancouverite has topped the British charts with his new album Waking Up The Neighbours.

Kimberley Blake, of Vancouver's Bruce Allen Talent, reveals that "only a handful of artists have simultaneously reached the top of both the singles and the albums charts, the last being British singer Jason Donovan in 1989.

Blake also reports that Adams album has now reached platinum status in the UK and "is outselling the second place Dire Straits album four to one."

Adams begins his Waking Up The World tour in Belfast Oct. 24.

He then met with the owner of the furniture store, who wanted, "Something like \$300,000," recalls Sam. "That was a lot of money in those days. The owner said, 'You want it, or you don't want it.' I said okay, and then worried about paying for it."

Sniderman remembers looking at the main floor of the new location and said "Oh my gawd, we'll never use all this space." The rented quarters upstairs remained rented and Sam The Record Man set up shop on the main floor. Their was no basement at that time, so the warehousing and retail space was contained on the one floor.

The College Street store remained open for one year after the Yonge Street launch. "I wanted to do a million dollars the first year on Yonge Street," says Sniderman, "but unfortunately, all we did was \$995,000. But we did the million the next year." The College Street store did \$600,000 in its last year of operation.

The Yonge Street location was expanded a few years later when the Snidermans bought

Steele's Tavern, moving them directly next door to A&A's. The property was further expanded with the purchase of a Gould Street property that gave the store access to the nearby Ryerson College complex. Sniderman, just this year, purchased the Toronto Dominion Bank at the corner of Gould and Yonge. When renovations are completed, Sam The Record Man's 347 Yonge Street flagship store will have at its disposal, an estimated 45,000 square feet of retail space, which could make it one of the largest record stores in North America.

The Sniderman retail chain, now spread across Canada, has become a multi-million dollar family business. "That's the key to our success," says Sniderman. "We have always run our business as a family venture and my son Jason continues in that fashion. He knows the business inside and out. He's been a part of it since he was a child. Record retailing is in his blood."

Sniderman doesn't believe retailing has changed that much since the sixties, but he believes "there's a lot more respect for it now," concluding with, "Retailing is the backbone of the economy of a nation, much more so than the industrial plants."

A&M/Island gather for annual national meeting

National and regional personnel of A&M/Island Records gathered at the Rocky Crest Resort in Ontario's Muskokas for their annual meet. The theme for the five day meet (Sept. 3-7) was Grand Slam '91, apropos, in view of the product success the two labels have experienced this year.

The timing couldn't be better as Bryan Adams was making triumphant chart gains throughout 16 countries with his A&M cassette single (Everything I Do) I Do It For You, no edging the worldwide sales mark of six million. There was also much to do about the successes achieved this year by Sting, Amy Grant, Extreme, Aaron Neville, Paula Abdul, Lenny Kravitz, Enigma, Maestro Fresh-Wes, Dream Warriors and more.

Delegates were also treated to the fall lineup of releases, including the new Bryan Adams album Waking Up The Neighbours as well as selections from Achtung Baby, the upcoming U2 release.

A surprise visit by Extreme was one of the highlights of the meet. After their performance they were presented with double platinum awards for their chart-topping Pornograffitti album, which gained the NO. 1 berth on the RPM 100

Queen Street diva shifts gears, becomes an Infidel

Molly Johnson, lead singer of the Infidels, has a great answer for a rock writer inquiring about her age. "Just say too old to be in this business, but I can't help it because I love it too much."

After 10 years of being a jazzy kind of group known as Alta Moda, Johnson and guitarist/producer Norman Orenstein are shifting gears in a big way with their group Infidels. Their collaboration has produced an excellent self-titled debut album of rock/pop that could break big across Canada and the US.

"Norman and I have known and worked with each other since high school. We were shopping songs around when Paul Orescan, (President of I.R.S. Canada) really liked what he heard and got Miles Copeland (Chairman of I.R.S.) to come see us live in Toronto."

Copeland was sufficiently impressed to sign the duo to an eight album deal, guaranteeing them a worldwide release and commitment from the label. "I can't say enough about what I.R.S. has done for us. Paul has been just fantastic. I drop by the office after rehearsals and be hoarse from singing, but Paul is hoarser from yelling into the phone.

"I love their marketing strategy. Instead of blowing all our money in the studio, we got it made for \$50,000 at Wellesley Sound in Toronto. Of course having Norman produce it saved us a lot, but now the label can turn around and put the savings into marketing us properly."

When jokingly asked if they got their name from the Bob Dylan album of the same title, Johnson grins, "how'd you know that? It was time for a name change and we couldn't decide on anything. I was thinking of something totally Canadian, like Medicine Hat. But a lot of people didn't get the humour. Then I saw an article on Dylan's 50th birthday with a quote from Murray McLauchlan praising his Infidels album. I thought that was as good a name as any

and Norman agreed."

Album completed, the Infidels are set to hit the US market hard with showcase dates in major cities throughout October. Canadians can look forward to seeing Infidels in November as the warmup act for Tom Cochrane's cross Canada tour. Johnson sings backup vocals on Cochrane's latest release, Mad, Mad World.

"That was a lot of fun to do, although it took up more time than I expected. I first met Tom at the wedding of Denise Donlan and Murray McLauchlan, which by the way, was the most magical wedding I've ever been to. It was held up in cottage country north of Toronto on a lake and it was just perfect."

If the Infidels are a success, a move to cottage country may be in the cards for Johnson who has lived above the Cameron St. Pub on

However the Winnipeg band still maintains its Top 10 status after 21 weeks of charting. The album has now shipped in excess of 200,000 copies in Canada.

In the US where the album has passed the 100,000 units sold mark, the flag is up to bring this album home. Trade ads indicate the label isn't giving up and that a major push will continue to break the album.

Yet another in the Top 20! The Cult's Ceremony blasts onto the Albums chart at No. 18. It marks the fourth album in the last three weeks and ninth overall in 1991 to debut in the Top 20. Compare that to last year when only six albums debuted that high all year.

Bob Seger takes over. Up from last week's No. 4 spot, The Real Love vaults into the No. 1 position. It joins Mainstreet (1977) and Shakedown (1987) as Seger's No. 1 songs. He needs one more to join an elite group. Only 31 artists have had four or more No. 1 songs. Of those 31, only four have had 10 or more. Pick any seven artists and see it you can come up with those four artists.

A streak come to an end... The Real Love replaces Rod Stewart's The Motown Song after just one week at the top. Each of the previous six songs had managed to maintain the No. 1 spot for at least two weeks. It was just the fourth time six songs in a row had managed to repeat at the top. It never happened between 1964 and 1978 but occurred in 1979, 1981, and 1990. The only time more songs in a row repeated was in late 1987/early 1988 when eight straight songs held No. 1 for at least two weeks.

Another streak also ends! The Motown Songs only lasting one week at No. 1 stopped an even more impressive streak. The previous three songs had held the top spot for at least four weeks each. That is something that had only been done once before. In late 1981/early 1982, Jon & Vangelis' Friends Of Mr. Cairo, Olivia Newton-John's Physical and The J. Geils Band's Centrefold were at No. 1 for five, four and four weeks respectively.

Robertson edges into top add...John Mellencamp's Get A Leg Up enters the Hit Tracks chart at No. 31, which tied it with Bonnie Raitt's Something To Talk About as the highest debut of the year. However, it didn't even get the top add of the week. That honour goes to Robbie Robertson's What About Now, which debuts at No. 28.

Havoc at the top. Despite dropping in points from last week, Hole Hearted, Shiny Happy People, and Time, Love & Tenderness all rise on the chart. How is this possible? It's because The Motown Song, The Promise Of A New Day and I Do It For You all dropped faster and none of the songs behind them gained quickly enough to overtake them. Look for that to change next week.

BRUCE COCKBURN - Folk/rock Nothing But A Burning Light True North - TNK 77-H

in this 12-song, quiet, folk/rock collection Bruce Cockburn again shows that he is one of rock's best singer-songwriters with a social conscience. Kit Carson in a few well-chosen words speaks volumes about the rape of the land. Indian Wars, which includes Jackson Browne on guitar & vocals, is as excellent song ever written about the plight of the North American Indian. But it's not all doom and gloom. Great Big Love and Child Of The Wind offer rays of hope "for this little round planet in a great big universe." Booker T. Jones on organ plays his usual superb, lessis-more fills throughout. It's great to see Cockburn burning a light that many have let go out. (CD reviewed)



ANDY SUMMERS - Jazz World Gone Strange Private Music - 01005-82088-2-N

Wonderful elevator music from the former Police guitarist. Andy Summers proves he is a terrific guitarist with very nice, understated playing throughout the 12 instrumentals on the disc, but oh, is it dull! The title track and Ruffled Feathers are the two tracks that standout amongst all the blandness. This is great music for radio stations to play between guests on talk shows. (CD reviewed)



THREE STAND OUT - Pop This Game Of Life Axe - CDE-00532

The press release tags this album, as

"a fresh new sound," and after a couple of listens, it fits. The freshness belongs to Jennifer Noble, a standout vocalist, who has the confidence of a seasoned performer. Although Nobel commands the vocal side, partner Tim Chipman, can take a bow for the "sound". He produced the album with Noble at his Tempest Studio, digitally recording and playing all music tracks using the latest in Midi equipment. There's a sixtieish feel here with both the production and Noble's vocal methodology, all in with today's keeping requirements. This fits in nicely with what radio programmers are looking for. Soft and melodic and sometimes airy, certainly not a detriment. Chipman tries his hand at vocalising on the track This Game Of Life. Key are Nothing Is Stronger Than Love, the first single, and Love And Affection. All material written by Noble, Chipman and veteran producer/writer Greg Hambleton. (CD reviewed)



JOHN LEE HOOKER - Blues Mr. Lucky Virgin/Pointblank - CDV 3128-Q

Don't fix what's not broken is apparently John Lee Hooker's idea behind his latest release Mr. Lucky. After the Grammy and chart success of The Healer, an album that had Hooker worshippers like Bonnie Raitt and George Thorogood, Hooker has again culled the best players from today's blues scene to make another fine album. Johnnie Johnson contributes some great boogie piano on I Want To Hug You and This Is Hip. Van Morrison's soulful vocals are heard on I Cover The Waterfront. Johnny Winter is in great form on Susie. Keith Richards plays the blues on Crawling Kingsnake and John Hammond Jr. plays some mean acoustic slide on Highway 13. Highly recommended. (CD reviewed)



PRAIRIE OYSTER - Country Everybody Knows RCA - 61013-2-N

A major Cancon release for RCA and BMG has pulled all stops to bring this album home, which shouldn't be too difficult. The word is out, this is the hottest country band in Canada, and they have a number of awards, Big

Country, Juno, and CCMA to back up this claim. With the success of Different Kind Of Fire, Prairie Oyster has taken a bit more licence here, spreading out to encompass all that makes country. country. They do it with a little unabashed honky tonk, two-step, a bit of traditional hurtin', but a lot of fun. Did You Fall In Love With Me, taken as a single, is now making excellent chart inroads, another example of the writing talentofawardwinningkeyboardist Joan Besen. Also key and a Besen original Will I Do (Till The Real Thing Comes Along), which also has single potential. Lead vocalist Russell deCarle shows he's no slouch when it comes to writing either, with his penning of Can't Say Goodbye. Also don't overlook Jack DeKeyser's I Think That We Did Something, and Les Emerson's Goodbye Lonesome (Hello, Baby Doll). Produced by Richard Bennett and Josh Leo. (CD reviewed) - WG

LOU PAUL - Country This is Lou Paul Music Connection - DMT-91-006

The producers, session musicians and background vocalists reads like a who's who of Canadian country music. Three of the tracks were produced by Mike Francis and key here are the Glenn Worf penning of The Love In My Lady's Eyes from the team of Leslee and Ray Hawthorne. The rest of the tracks were produced by Dennis Charney with Gerry Dere and Wayne Saunders receiving co-producer credits. Key are the Dick Damron penning of Raining In The Country and Billy Simard's I'm Getting Suspicious. Although Paul only connected with country music in 1985 through the Canadian Country Music National Finals, he has the vocal control and confidence of a seasoned performer. Anyone of the tracks mentioned are singles potential.



GARY FJELLGAARD - Country Winds Of October Savannah-CD-9837-P

This is Fjellgaard's sixth album, which, at one time was an impossible dream for a Canadian artist. Perhaps it's a little trite to say that this is his best, but even that could be an understatement. A true environmentalist, Fjellgaard continues to lend his insightful songwriting talent and pure and simple vocal projection to the disappearing natural surroundings that are an on-going threat. Fjellgaard is a West Coast cowboy and he has that laid-back, give-a-damn approach that demands attention. Drifting Cowboy, the first single, is already charting. The accompanying video was shot in Merritt, B.C., a perfect storybook setting to highlight the changing times of our cowboys, also an endangered species. Key are Hartbroken Hero, the title track, Island In The Storm and Never Say Goodbye. Great cover artwork. Produced by Howie Vickers. (CD reviewed) - WG

BAD BIG KING - Roots/Rock Bordello

Although there's a homemade feel to this melange of sometimes roots and alternative rock collection of original material, there's also an overriding clutch of talent, both vocal and instrumental. This talent shouldn't go unnoticed. This is the kind of professional intent that A&R people are looking for. The band comprises S.W. Shaw (guitars), Ross McKle (vocals), and Hu Bissett, who is credited with "talkin". Adding to the session were Sarah Harmer of The Saddletramps on vocals, Ken Horne of both Cottage Industry and The Saddletramps on drums, and Cottage Industry's Neil Ross on bass and slide guitar. Doug Gamage provided the mouth harp inserts. Instrumental backing is excellent, but a little overpowering at times, which is costly to the vocal performance. A package of entertainment that should develop at the cult level and could act as its springboard into the mainstream. Great potential. Key are Overseas, Pumpkin and Carcass. Produced by Shaw, Bissett and Ross and recorded at Killing Room Studios and Lucy's Acoustic Kitchen. (CD reviewed)



JANE BUNNETT QUINTET - Jazz Live At Sweet Basil Featuring Don Pullen & Billy Hart Denon - CAN-9009

Bunnett, a perfectionist on the flute and saxophone, has been hailed as one of the bright new lights on the jazz scene. Her first album, In Dew Time, was reviewed in RPM in the February 13, 1989 issue, an album that received praise for its "jazz exuberance". Bunnett maintains this "exuberance" with her latest release on the Denon label. Ironically, this album was recorded at the Sweet Basil club in Greenwich Village as part of the Jazz Festival in August of that same year. Bunnett's husband, Larry Cramer on trumpet and keyboardist Don Pullen, principals on the In Dew Time album, were joined here by drummer Billy Hart and Kieran Overs on acoustic bass. Bunnett also turns in an exceptional performance on pan flute, along with soprano sax and flute, both of which have become her signature instruments. As jazz continues to attract new fans, Bunnett's unique, energized approach to this much maligned music form should contribute to the fan base. Key are Don Pullen's penning of Double Arc Jake and Hole In One, a Bunnettoriginal. Retailers should front-rack this package. (CD reviewed)

The Stoker Brothers make a return with their Comstock 7" vinyl single release of Love On The Run, an original written by the brother team. The album was produced by Rick Whitelaw and Mickey Stoker.

Alex Bowie makes a move on the charts with his latest single, Western Swing, available on RDR Countrypak #6. This is his follow-up to Hello Walls, which gave him a solid base to work his new single, which was produced by Larry Wayne Clark, who was the 1991 BCCMA Producer of the Year, and engineered by Alan Rempel, who was nominated BCCMA Engineer of the Year 1991. The single was recorded at Vancouver's Bullfrog Studios. Bowie, on electric guitar, was backed on the session by keyboardist Michael Creber (formerly with k.d.lang and the reclines), John Lacey (Patricia Conroy, BCCMA Instrumentalist of the Year 1991) on pedal steel, Frankie Rogers on "twin" fiddles, Charlie Hase (Gary Fjellgaard) on lap steel, bassist Dennis Nichol, drummer Dave Jonsson, LWC on acoustic guitar, and on background vocals, One Horse Blue's Gord Maxwell and Rock Bowie wrote Western Swing as a tribute to Bob Wills & The Texas Playboys "because their music has been a big influence on me both musically and personally," explains Bowie. "Just look what George Strait has done to the popularity of western swing. It's great because that music is still so important to what country music is all about, and I should really thank Larry (Clarke) for putting his magic touch on the co-writing of the song. Bowie performed both Western Swing and Hello Walls with Bing Armstrong & The Lonesome Steve Band at the recent CCMA Country Music Week at Hamilton's Gore Park.

Murray McLauchlan's latest tapings for CBC Radio's Swinging On A Star, got underway this past Thursday to Sunday (Sept. 19-22). The Whispertones (Shirley Eikhard, Cheri Camp and Gwen Swick), were in for the first taping, followed by Sylvia Tyson and Pat Temple (20), Colleen Peterson and Washboard Hank (21), and Richard Thomson and Tamarack (22). These tapings will be aired Nov. 2 and 23. The series goes to air Saturdays at 11:05 am on CBC Stereo 94.1 FM and 4:08 pm on CBC Radio 740 AM.

Justin Entertainment, a Toronto-based independent, heavily into country music recently picked up Clinton Gregory's album, If It Weren't For Country Music, I'd Go Crazy, for distribution in Canada. Gregory's first Canadian single release, One Shot At A Time, has made impressive chart gains. Justin Entertainment is touting the track with a unique promotion campaign. The label shipped custom made mixes of the song, tailored specifically for Canadian country stations. Koenig likes Nashville for recording sessions

Calgary's Mark Koenig has some sage advice for any aspiring country artist hoping to make it big in Nashville.

"Keep your ears open and your mouth shut," Koenig says.

The singer-songwriter should know what he's talking about as he recently recorded half of his debut, The Lonesome Kind, in country music's capital.

"I love Nashville. There's a real sense of community there and if they see you're serious and dedicated about it they'll try and help you. I really enjoy it and find it a place to inspire me to try and improve my craft."

Recording in Nashville was a bonus for Koenig as he got to utilize the talents of ace producer Miles Wilkinson, whose credits include Willie Nelson and Emmylou Harris, plus top studio session players like Mark O'Connor and Jerry Douglas.

Raised in logging country up north near Prince George, B.C., Koenig has been a logger and a truck and cab driver. The songs on the Lonesome Kind reflect the places and people he's seen and met. Songs like, She Looks a lot Like you, Don't She Get Lonely and Pretty Eyes are culled from years of playing the honky tonks and travelling the highways with the likes of Willie Nelson, Ricky Skaggs and George Strait.

While Koenig makes his home base in Calgary, thanks to the city's excellent country scene, the summer of '91 has seen him burning up the road. His band has performed with Garth Brooks, Marty Stuart, Ian Tyson (for whom Koenig served as band leader from '83 to '86) and Dwight Yoakam.

Upcoming performances on the Tommy Hunter and Joan Kennedy shows, plus an appearance on Murray McLauchlin's Swinging on a Star show which will air on Oct 19th, guarantees a bright future for Mark Koenig.

Check into the archives!

I read with interest that Gilles Godard broke a record by having four of his productions in the Top 100 Country chart for Sept. 28/91. In the past I just let a lot of these things slip by and said "that's showbusiness."

But in reflecting, I wonder if I should have let these things pass by without comment. Well, now I am commenting.

If you will check RPM issue dated Aug 2/80, you will find the above is not altogether true. My productions in that issue of the Country Top 50 went this way. No. 1 Carroll Baker (Hollywood Love), No. 12 Jerry Palmer (A Picture's Worth 1000 Words, No. 31 Kevin Wara (The Beginning Of The End), and No. 33 Frank Jones (The Hitch-Hiker).

To go on, the RPM chart of Dec. 20/80 revealed Carroll Baker at No. 1 with Still Falling In Love, No. 43 Jerry Palmer (Not Living Not Dying), No. 46 Wayne Faulconer & Stoneridge (Sweet-Eyed Satin Lady, No. 47 Kevin Wara (I Can't Waste Another Moment), and No. 49 Frank Jones (This Old Guitar And Me).

When country product wasn't cool and record sales were less than 5000 units, my productions on Carroll Baker product sold like this: Carroll Baker (RCA 171) platinum plus, I'd Go Thru It All Again (RCA 227) 32,734, Sweet Sensation (RCA 233) 48,215, If It Wasn't For You (RCA 285) 29,151, Hollywood Love (RCA 332) 22,390, 20 Country Classics (TV Records TA 1080) over platinum, and Hymns

musical entertainment with their slick, well-honed and highly professional country cum pop stylings with a touch of bluegrass banjo. The husband and wife team are currently on release with Streethearts, a track produced in Nashville by Tony Migliore and included on Gilles Godard's Bookshop CD single series. The song was written by LeRoy and Cyril Rawson. PR for the Arcadian Court Room is being handled by Gino Empry.

Hooked On Country is the latest from K-tel's Hooked On series, distributed in Canada by Era International with offices in Don Mills (Toronto). For this special release, Rickey Wood of The Wood Brothers (Opryland Favourites) got together the top musicians in Nashville for the sessions. Taking part in the sessions were Martin Parker, Glen Duncan, Roy Husky Jr., Terry Crisp, and Greg Galbraith. Six of the medleys pay homage to country legends old and new, including Randy Travis, Willie Nelson, George Strait, Marty Robbins, Johnny Cash, and Merle Haggard. The four other medleys are about trains, waltzes, parties and love.

The Chuck Wagon Gang makes a return by way of Era International. The legendary traditional country/gospel group has been selling albums for over 50 years. Jubilee is an album that expresses the Gang's gospel roots, while Keep On Keepin' On, although inspiration, leans much more toward their country side.

Of Gold (Tembo/Quality) over platinum.

You might also consider that my productions won 14 consecutive No. 1 records for Carroll Baker, 5 more by various other artists, 18 Top Tens by various artists, and 60 in the Top 50 by various artists.

Politics being what they are in the music business, I have yet to win an award for producer. Those who do, most times fail to even sell 20,000 pieces of merchandise. I brought my cheques to the bank. The politics didn't interfere with the deposits.

Winning awards when the sales are there are great. You deposit the cheques and hang up the award.

Major record companies in Canada don't pay too much attention to producers who record good selling product. They go with the politics and work with producers who sell very little but they go with the winners.

Someone told me at the country convention in Hamilton, "they only hear you when you blow your own horn." End of quote.

So now I'm blowing it and hope someone of importance in this country is close enough to hear it.

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So much for the bull and politics in Country Music Canada.

Don Grashey Producer/Golden Eagle Records Thunder Bay, Ont.

(Perhaps we should have qualified Gilles Godard's chart accomplishment as recent history. We have also discovered that R. Harlan Smith, a veteran producer had four singles on the RPM Country chart on July 14, 1979. They were No. 14 Laura Vinson (Mes Amis O Canada). No. 30 R. Harlan Smith (Ding-A-Ling Debbie), No. 36 a duet by R. Harlan Smith and Chris Nielsen (Stolen Moments), and No. 38 Chris Nielsen (Everyone's Laughin' But Me). It should also be noted that Don Grashey is a highly respected member of Canada's country music community, and is now guiding the career of Manitoba's multi-award winning Cindi Cain. It was in front of a packed house during Big Country of 1980 when Don was inducted into the Canadian Music Industry Hall of Fame, a fitting tribute to his dedication and devotion to country music in Canada - Walt Grealis)

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
