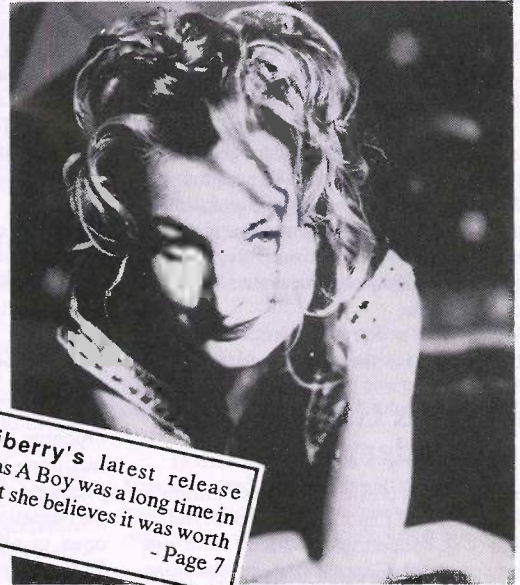

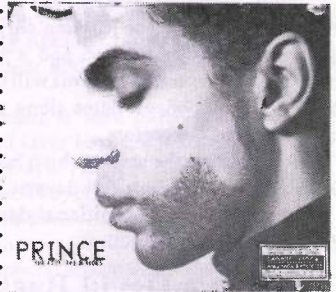

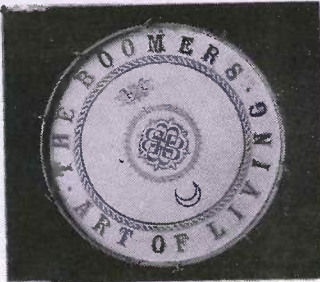

## CIRPA readies push on Canada Stand at MIDEM

The Canadian Independent Record Production Association (CIRPA) will celebrate its 13th year as co-ordinator of the Canada Stand at next year's MIDEM.

Delegates from more than 8,000 companies from every record buying country in the world are expected to attend MIDEM '94, which is held in Cannes, France from Jan. 30 to Feb. 3.

MIDEM has become an important annual habit for independent record companies, distributors, publishers and managers where they can trade publishing rights, license masters, secure distribution and patch into the latest trends from the global music community.

MIDEM also sponsors an international music film award, a radio video and equipment trade show and international legal and copyright symposiums on the same site as the music trade show.

CIRPA's program director Mary Vrantsidis explains that the Canada stand is

## Madonna's Girlie Show a huge undertaking

When Madonna's Girlie Show hits Toronto's Skydome (Oct. 12) and Montreal's Olympic Stadium (23), concert goers will be front and centre to one of the largest stage productions ever mounted in both venues.

Madonna's technical crew of more than 100 employees have been formulating plans to move more than 300,000 pounds of equipment around the world.

Four different stages are to be air-freighted in the largest Russian cargo plane ever made, as well as one and a half 747 freighters. Three sound systems will be flying to the different concert dates along with two self-contained generators.

Assembling the stage, which houses the Girlie Show, takes four full days at 24 hours a day along with one additional day for the setting up of the production.

## CMRRA's David Basskin gears up for L.A. seminar

David Basskin, president of the Canadian Musical Reproduction Rights Agency (CMRRA) is taking his expertise on the new Canadian Mechanical Licensing Agreement (MLA) on the road.

Basskin, assisted by CMRRA director of licensing Lawnia Grant, will make his pitch at a special presentation by CMRRA, at the Century Plaza Hotel in Los Angeles, on Oct. 26. This follows a successful debut of the seminar held in New York this past July.

As Basskin explains, "The new agreement was the result of almost three years of extremely intense negotiations and was signed at the end of 1992. It's a landmark in the relationship between music publishers and record companies.

"For the first time, many of the key elements in the licensing of music and royalty payment have been reduced to writing, eliminating the uncertainties of so-called (but unwritten) 'industry custom'."

funded by government and the booth participants. Registration is open to anyone in the music industry who pays the Canada booth fee of \$3,200 for CIRPA members or \$3,500 for all others. Support for companies attending MIDEM is available through the SRDP program.

The CIRPA connection provides: a discount on the trade show registration with credentials waiting on site; free shipment of promotional goods to Cannes; first priority for hotels; access to the 17 metres by 7 metres stand with four fully equipped listening rooms; semi-private meeting areas; a storage space; three knowledgeable and bilingual reception staff who familiarize themselves with the registrant's company and product; message centre; and wall display space which is dedicated to each company.

Vrantsidis, who acts as booth co-ordinator, handles all administration and trouble shoots for booth participants wherever necessary.

Promotional opportunities include a brochure outlining each company's business functions and artists; a free video montage prepared by MuchMusic and a pay-for-participation promotional video reel which is open to all Canadian MIDEM participants. The video reel will be mailed out to more than 500 international contacts prior to the show.

Steve Thomson, president of Backstage Productions International, has been attending MIDEM for 13 years. "I find MIDEM incredibly important. It's been absolutely amazing for me. The first time I went, I took the documentary on Ronnie Hawkins and I got incredible publicity for Ronnie. There are journalists from all over the world. There was an article on the screening in Playboy just after MIDEM. So you never know who's going to be there. The publicity factor is great from a media standpoint.

"From a licensing standpoint, MIDEM opens the door to make contacts all around the

The MLA runs until the end of 1997. As Basskin points out, the agreement brings improved rates and royalty reporting to CMRRA's more than 25,000 affiliated music publishers and the songwriters the organization represents.

"Most important, it makes unprecedented and vital inroads into the use of 'controlled composition' clauses, typically used by record companies to 'cap' their royalty obligations to songwriters and their publishers."

Basskin further points out that these limitations on controlled compositions "are the heart of the agreement, and have no equivalent in the U.S. It's vital that we have the chance to meet our many American clients face-to-face and have the chance to bring them up to date on these matters, as well as giving them a report on CMRRA's recent growth and activities."

A similar seminar is being pencilled in for Nashville over the next few months.

world. Through my yearly visits to MIDEM, as well as making calls throughout the years, these contacts have remained solid and very helpful."

Thomson's involvement with the CIRPA showcase at MIDEM has added to his overall international profile, which has led to his acquiring important contracts for other shows.

Lindsay Gillespie, president of Kinetic Records, made his first trip to MIDEM last year. "It was my first time and it was a little overwhelming in terms of scope, but I did make some good contacts. This year I think I'm going to actually be able to do some business, some selling and buying. I now have the label set and I've got some acts to sell and I'm also in the position to pick up artists."

Vrantsidis also points out that for a delegate to attend MIDEM without the benefit of the booth, it would cost approximately \$2,300 Canadian. That cost only provides a MIDEM guide and a mailbox.

L'ADISQ offers a similar booth for the French-language (Quebec) market.

## EMI Music Publishing sponsors tours by bands

EMI Music Publishing has lent its support in sponsoring a cross-Canada tour for two of its independent bands, Twilight Rituals and Sweet Jones.

The 30-day tour was launched in Hamilton on Sept. 14. The bands will play dates in 15 cities including London, Winnipeg, Calgary and Vancouver, winding down in Ottawa on Oct. 14.

The bands have rented a 28 ft. motorhome to take them and their gear across the country.

Michael McCarty, president of EMI Publishing, points out, "It's highly unusual for a music publisher to send bands out on a tour, especially ones without record deals. However, they're both on the brink of being ready for major record deals and we are sure that when they return, they will be the two hottest unsigned bands in the country."

Both bands released CDs earlier this year. This will be their first tour together.

Entitled On The Farm, the special was shot at Greg Keelor's farm, where the album was recorded, and at Toronto's Horseshoe Tavern.

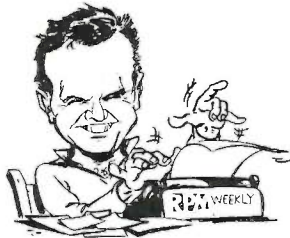

"It's a combination of CHR, AC, AOR, CAR, Dance, Mix, Energy, Pop Adult, Alternative, Easy Listening and Classic Rock formats." Those are his words, just in case you're confused. Sure, we could have a separate chart for each one of those formats, but Tim doesn't think it would be any more valuable. He does give programmers a lot more credit than some in the industry. The Hit Tracks chart lists the Top 100 most popular records in Canada. It's up to each individual station to decide which songs fit their own format. Now, we know the chart was never meant to be a bible of exactly what's happening, it's merely a guide to what's popular in this country, and only in this country. (*EC: Sounds right on to me!!!*)

**Single sales . . . ???** Well, there's one major that's taking a realistic look at singles sales, and we just might be able to finally lay this tired old thing of the past to rest. How can you get a proper reading on singles sales when retailers aren't selling singles . . . and that

means cassettes and CD singles? Once in awhile, when a major releases a single by a super SUPER star and it's available at retail, there will be sales, but there's not enough to compile a chart. Keeping tabs on single action is still in the domain of radio. (*EC: Right on!!!*)

**We were there!!!** "WHATEVER YOU DO . . . DON'T stop using those pages and photos from the past." We've heard that from our readers, over and over. We're reminded that RPM has a history of what happened from 1964 and we have documented the evolution of the industry. We'll continue to document the history of Cancon and continue to spell it correctly. (*EC: If you can't spell it . . . why pretend to be doing it???*) C-a-n-c-o-n!

## Siberry's work with Eno and Gabriel was rewarding

There were four years between Jane Siberry's *Bound By The Beauty* and her new Reprise album, *When I Was A Boy*, but she certainly wasn't idle in the interim.

"There were a lot of strange things that happened," Siberry says. "I wrote a record and then threw it out and then wrote a whole new record."

**Go to hell!** It appears that's just what thousands of people did. Meatloaf's *Bat Out Of Hell II: Back To Hell* proved how very wrong the doubters were. It enters the Albums chart at No. 2.

**A double shot.** The first release from *Bat Out Of Hell II*, I'd Do Anything For Love (But I Won't Do That), makes a big jump into the Top 20 on the Hit Tracks chart. It climbs 27 spots to No. 15. Meatloaf could become the first artist with a food name since the '70s to have a No. 1 hit. Name the two artists in the '70s to accomplish that feat. Hint: In both cases, the food is from the fruit family.

**A great start.** John Mellencamp is off to a flying start with *Human Wheels*. The title track is the biggest mover on the Hit Tracks chart with a 37-position rise to No. 16, and the album debuts at No. 7. It's amazing when you consider his last album, *Wherever We Wanted*, entered at No. 51 and never made it as high as No. 7.

**The purple one.** Not Prince. There's a new king of purple! Yes Barney the wuvable dinosaur has made the Albums chart. Barney's Favorites debuts at No. 56.

**A passing comment.** With the ever-fragmenting radio formats, the Hit Tracks chart is becoming more and more valuable. The chart is comprised of CHR, AC, AOR, CAR, Dance, Mix, Energy, Pop Adult, Alternative, Easy Listening and Classic Rock formats. Individual stations can easily check to see where to find the songs and determine which one are appropriate for their format.

**Just like a PM campaign.** Every week, I talk to retailers from coast to coast. Almost every one has a cheery outlook. Doug Meale is no exception. He reports from the Sam's store (also known as Cooper Records) near Yonge & Eglinton in Toronto. Here are the Top 10 sellers at that store. 1. Meatloaf 2. Dance Mix '93. 3. Lenny Kravitz 4. Billy Joel 5. Sleepless In Seattle 6. U2 7. Cypress Hill 8. Pure Energy 9. The Bodyguard Soundtrack 10. R.E.M.

**A tough one!** There haven't been many artists with a food name to record a No. 1 song. With a little creative editing, you could come up with Fleetwood Big Mac, Olivia Fignewton-John and Tuna Turner, but they don't count. The two artists from the '70s that qualify are Peaches & Herb and Chuck Berry. The closest thing in the '90s was Mr. Big (it is a candy bar).

"When it was all done the record company just didn't know what to do with it. I was afeared for its life so I told them I'd write a couple more songs, partly because there was a front door to the record missing. So I did it for myself, hoping that they would also finally be enthusiastic about something. And that's where *Sail Across The Water* came from."

*Sail Across The Water*, the most commercial sounding song on *When I Was A Boy*, is the album's first single. It's the result of a collaboration between Siberry and renowned producer Brian Eno, who had contacted Reprise and told them how much he liked *Bound By The Beauty*. Siberry, 37, says working with Eno was both an honour and an eye opener.

"Brian Eno is very wise, so when he looked at my stuff he would guide me more towards doing songs that seemed to come more from my heart than wherever else, which I think would be a surprise to people. I thought he would be more excited by the stuff that I do that's more musically complex."

"He's very intense and very easily frustrated by anything that slows you down. He's a hugely productive person and, even during my project, he was releasing three of his own records, popping off to David Bowie's wedding, designing a perfume, negotiating with the ministry of culture in Barcelona and going through the tapes of all the people who wanted to work with him."

While Siberry enjoyed working with Eno, as well as Canadian producer Michael Brook, she produced seven of the album's 11 tracks

## Q107 takes on banner of Canadian Rock Awards

Originally developed as The Toronto Music Awards, the annual event will now fly the banner of Q107 Canadian Rock Awards.

The first presentation will take place at The World in Mississauga on Dec. 1.

Removing Toronto from the title obviously leaves the way open for the event to provide a wider platform to support Canadian artists from coast to coast.

Voting in each of the categories is fan-based. Winners will be chosen through a public poll. Ballots will be available in the greater Toronto area from Oct. 15 through mid-November.

One of the highlights of the evening will be the induction in to the Hall of Fame by veteran recording band Triumph. The trio will regroup for a live concert set, their first in Toronto since 1988.

Considered one of Canada's most successful exports, Triumph has delivered eight platinum and 11 gold albums, which represents worldwide sales in excess of 10 million units. As well, their entire catalogue continues to be active.

The awards show will be syndicated for telecast by CHCH-TV and simulcast nationally through Westcom's Rock Radio Network.

herself and was quite pleased with the results. "I think this is the first time I've sent out a record with my total blessing."

"It's more subterranean, yet connected to the rest of the world. It's introspective but also uses the word 'we' more than I've ever used it."

Siberry had almost completed recording *When I Was A Boy* when she was invited by Peter Gabriel to his Real World Studios in Bath, England last August for his annual songwriting workshop. "Being in Bath was a bath for all the senses," she says of the experience.

"You would be set up with a combination of different musicians from all over the world and a producer would sort of direct you and create an improvised piece that you would all collaborate on. So I was in heaven. I love doing that and it feels very natural to me. It expanded the palate that I feel I can draw from."

Drawing is just one of the projects keeping Siberry busy at the moment. She's also working on a film score, developing an idea for a film, preparing an album of hymns, undertaking a children's book and learning graphics programs for computers. With all that on her plate, it's no wonder that she's not yet prepared to go out on the road in support of *When I Was A Boy*.

"I'll tour if I can see it," she says. "I can't see it right now, it doesn't feel right. When it feels right I'll be there 100 per cent, and that will make it a tour worth doing."

Sheppard will be in Edmonton the first week of October, at which time he will preview the remixes at a special nightclub appearance (to be announced shortly). He will also conduct a seminar on the different techniques utilized in the remix procedure for Edmonton and area engineering and audio production personnel.

Sheppard and his associates, Hennie Bekker and Greg Kavanagh, have gained international recognition with their productions, particularly with For Those About To Rave .. We Salute You, which spawned a #23 international dance chart listing for Living In Ecstasy. Their most recent project, Dream Catcher, has been released on the Quality label.

Five Sheppard-produced albums: Chris Sheppard Presents The Techno Trip, Techno 2, Sheppard's Revenge, Techno 3, Still Tripping, and Trip To The Moon, have sold more than 100,000 copies in Canada.



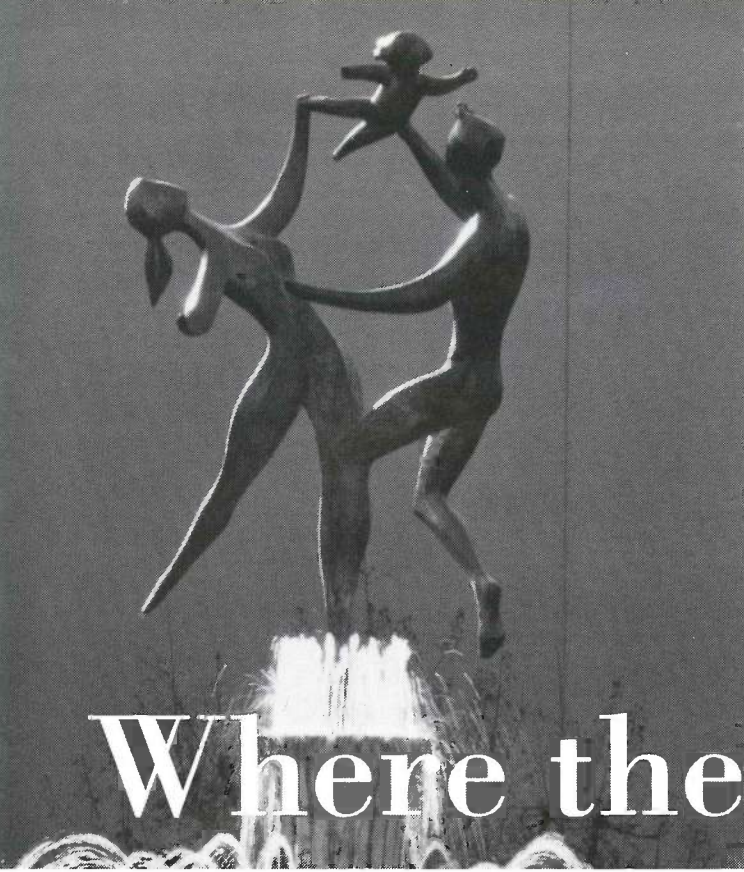

There are apparently no plans for a new album this year, although there had been rumours of a Christmas album. It's expected however, that he will begin working on a new studio album for a release early next year.





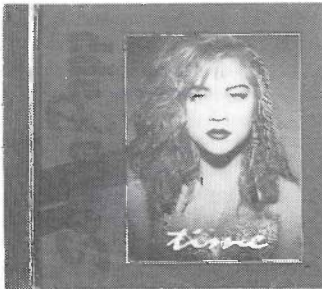

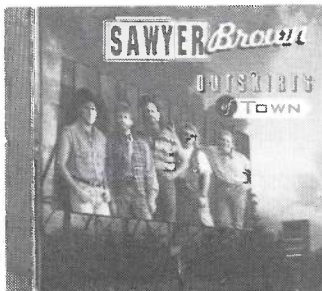

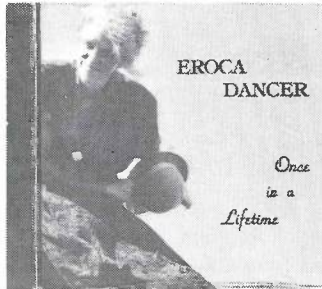
**SONYA PAPP** - Dance  
Time  
Isba - ISCD 2042-H

It's obvious what this Edmonton native, has been doing since her last release in 1989, Sonya Papp has been co-writing and writing material for this impressive dance recording. Six of the eleven cuts were co-written by Papp and My Heart Stands Alone, a moving ballad, was penned by Papp. Her debut album *Destiny*, was received favourably by dance jocks across the country and the single *Undercover Lover* went to #7 on the RPM Dance chart in June of 1989. The first single from *Time* is *The Mexican*, which was originally recorded by Babe Ruth in 1973. Also included on this effort is a chico mix of *The Mexican*. All the material is noteworthy, however, *My Heart Stands Alone* is the strongest track both lyrically and vocally, which could very well result in heavy AC airplay. - SL



**SAWYER BROWN** - Country  
Outskirts Of Town  
Curb - 77626-F

Through its energized management team, Sawyer Brown is one of the more high-profiled country bands in the business. They have become favourites of country programmers. With this release and with the heavy concentration on its first single, *Thank God For You*, written by producers Mark Miller and Mac McAnally, the band is now receiving its full recognition. Retailers have suddenly discovered this country band of all sorts. They ramble, they rock, they philosophize, they come close to immortalizing country. Programmers can have a lot of fun with listeners by serving them up *Farmer Tan* and get them a little emotional with *Drive Away* and *Hold On*. The title track and *Heart Break Highway* will also attract. Front rack this one. Radio has finally come through for these guys. - WG



**EROCA DANCER** - Jazz  
Once In A Lifetime  
The Jumpin' Jazz Co.-001  
There's some pretty serious jazz, blues

and pop tracks here that should attract AC programmers. *Dancer* has a natural, adult-contemporary fix on soul rendering with a delightful twist of pop and jazz. Her vocals are unattached, as if in deep thought as she ponders each lyric line, which adds that note of spontaneity rarely heard today. Labeling *Dancer* as a jazz singer might throw up barriers, which would be unfair. Her vocals are pillow-soft at times and hard edged when needed. Most of the album was recorded live at Studio 56 in Langley, B.C., which adds yet another entertaining factor. Don Thompson (guitar, synthesizer), produced, arranged, mixed and engineered the album. He is also heard on guitar and synthesizer along with well known jazz-fusion group, *Skywalk*; reedman and flautist Tom Keenlyside, bassist Rene Worst, keyboardist Miles Black, and drummer Daryl Bennett. *Cry You An Ocean* and the title track, written by Thompson are key, but don't overlook *Nervous Breakdown*, a *Dancer* original or the Monk/Williams/Hanighen penning of *Round Midnight*. There is no information as to the Cancon properties, although it's safe to assume all tracks qualify. - WG



**GEORGE ST. KITTS** - R&B/Funk  
Siam  
GQ Records-001

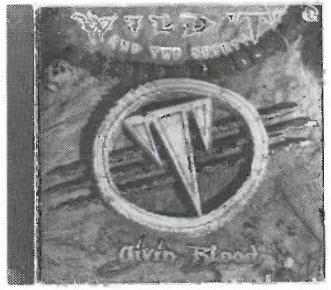
It's unfair to pigeon-hole a talent like this as R&B/Funk, although that's probably the best catch-all description of what he has to offer. His vocal purity encompasses an entertainment pattern that fashions his own distinctive design around R&B, jazz, pop, hip hop, rap and rock. He does better with ballads, where he expresses a rare soulful spiritualism, particularly on *All I Need* and *One More Chance*. Also key is *Love Train* and the title track. Superb instrumental backing with sax work by Rick Morrison, trumpet inserts by Tony Carlucci, keys by Mark Luciani and Lance Anderson, John Palussi and Lou Bartolomucci on guitars, and Lou Mele on bass, with Aubrey Mann and St. Kitts supplying background vocals. St. Kitts, Morrison and Palussi produced. All tracks are Cancon. Available through 1-800-Joe Radio. - WG



**CLAY WALKER** - Country  
Giant - 24511-P

This bright new talent out of Texas had that magic ingredient with his debut single and video of *What's It To You*, written by Curtis Wright and Robert Ellis Orrall, to break quickly and move steadily up the charts. His vocals are hot and his video, displaying a mouthful of teeth and a personality to go, moved into heavy rotation at most country music channels. Unfortunately the teeth and the personality are missing from his album artwork. Nevertheless, Walker's contemporary country approach has that rootsy edge that should ease him into further chart prominence. Produced by Giant president James Stroud, this album should be at least four more singles deep. Priority should be given to *Dreaming With My Eyes Open*,

*I Don't Know How Love Starts*, *Money Can't Buy (The Love We Had)*, and *Next Step In Love*. But don't overlook *Live Until I Die*. Walker has a lot going for him, but he needs to be seen and promoted heavily. - WG



**WILD 'T' AND THE SPIRIT** - Rock  
Givin Blood  
WEA - CD 93522-P

Tony Springer is *Wild 'T'* and he's long been acknowledged as one of Canada's most talented and flashiest guitar players. This is the second album from Springer and drummer Danny Bilan, while South African bassist Nazoem Lakey makes his recorded debut with the band. The rhythm section is rock solid behind Springer's guitar pyrotechnics. Springer co-wrote the songs on *Givin Blood* with producer Arnold Lanni of *Frozen Ghost* fame. The first single and video is *Freedom Train*. Springer is a blues disciple and *Every-thang* is a blues/metal tribute to Muddy Waters. *Telephone Freak* was originally recorded by Johnny 'Guitar' Watson and, although Springer and Lanni rewrote the music to the song, the lyrics were kept intact. *Wild Frontier* and *Lovesick Woman* should appeal to the rockers. But *Givin Blood's* best hope for cross-over commercial airplay is the poppy *Loveland*, which reflects lightly on Springer's Trinidadian roots. - SM

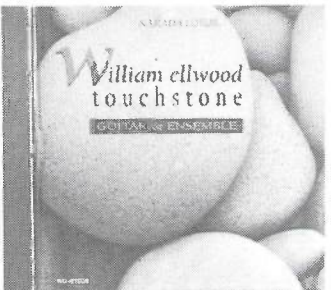


**VARIOUS ARTISTS** - Country

Savannah/Sony Kids-9843-H

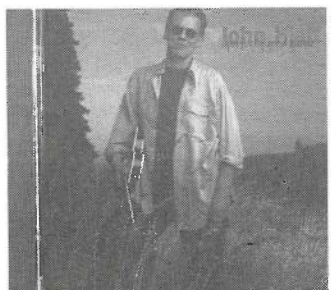
With country music soaring to greater heights, getting the younger generation interested should be a priority. Savannah's Special Products division has done just that, tapping some of Canada's best known country recording artists. There's a different side to these artists when their audience is in the three to ten year old range. The lyrics are superbly crafted to inform and be fun. The *Good Brothers*, as always, are excellent with three tracks: *It's A Rodeo*, *Video Stars*, and *Mom's Songs/You Are My Sunshine*. Michelle Wright is heard on *Reaching For The Stars* and talking about *Help Me Make It Through The Night* and other songs she sang when she was five. Gary Fjellgaard who knows a thing or two about lyrics that communicate, is in with five tracks: *Once Upon A Time*, *Ten Years Old And Barefoot*, *Santa Claus Comes By Boat*, *Children Of The Street*, *Two Gun Kid*, as well as talking about *Two Gun Kid* with Dave McCormick. Terry Carisse is heard on *It's No Secret*, and with *Nev Walls* on *Family Bible*. The husband and wife team of Anita Perras and Tim Taylor are perfectionists on *Three Little Words*, as is Terry Sumson on *Shenandoah*. For the little older, perhaps even the adults, *Elvis Is Alive And Well* and *Playing Santa At Sears*, by Barry Bowman of Victoria's C-FAX and Rick Preston, is well down, and apropos, considering the loonie sightings of Elvis. Toy stores should get on this one it could be a big seller over the coming Christmas season. - WG

**WILLIAM ELLWOOD** - Instrumental  
Touchstone  
Narada Lotus-61038

Strange and wonderful releases sometimes sneak through Customs, and this one is exceptional. Ellwood, a lifelong resident of Hamilton, Ontario, has a unique picking style, which came from teaching himself to play on a warped, hand-me-down guitar. This is his fourth recording for the Milwaukee-based Narada label, known for its class "A" releases. With this release, Ellwood (guitars, keyboards, percussion), and Ron MacDonald (acoustic and electric bass, percussion), are down to what is described as "the essentials". Acoustic music allows for another thought dimension, giving the listener a bit of space, a plus factor in the field of recorded music. Ellwood



is without question, a guitar virtuoso. He has the gentle touch of the classical guitarist with a pop and yes, even, a rock edge that demands attention. These are all Ellwood originals, with the exception of the John Phillips/Michelle Gilliam penning of *California Dreamin'*, an extraordinarily beautiful version of this old war horse. *Gypsy Wind*, *Whispering Moon*, *Sundown* and *Dreamwalk* are also rare gems of instrumental expressions. Produced by Ellwood and recorded at Hamilton's Vision Productions. MAPL logos haven't been used, but it's safe to say that all tracks, are Cancon. - WG



**JOHN HIATT** - Pop/Country  
Perfectly Good Guitar  
A&M-31454-0135-Q

The name John Hiatt should rekindle some good memories of a few years ago; three solo albums for A&M and a hitch with the *Little Village Band*. The voice is as strong and personable as when he first began cultivating a following. In keeping with the fast-paced competition however, Hiatt surrounds himself with some fresh new talent, and it's pretty obvious. Included are: producer/guitarist Matt Wallace; guitarist Michael Ward; drummer Brian MacLeod; and John Pierce on bass. Although the first focus track, *Buffalo River Home*, is being targeted to country radio, Hiatt can sit comfortably in the AC slot as well with a very impressive vocal spread, particularly on *Straight Outta Time*, the title track and *Permanent Hurt*, but don't overlook *Loving A Hurricane*. Hiatt has also been on the club crawl with good reviews to boot, which should add to the consumer interest, certainly with his many fans. - WG

# COUNTRY

**Sawyer Brown, who jumped to #1** last week after only 10 weeks of charting, holds at the top of the chart. Their album has also caused a stir at retail where the album was given front-racking importance.

**Cassandra Vasik** is the biggest gainer, jumping to #39 from #50 with her Epic release *Roll Like A Wheel*. Radio has been very supportive with this release which was written and produced by Tim Thorney and Erica Ehm. This track was taken from her *Feels Like Home* album and is also included on Sony CD compilation 315.

**Charlie Major** is on a roll as his new release, *I'm Somebody*, gets the most adds nod and enters the chart at #75. Major topped the chart with his Arista debut, *I'm Gonna Drive You Out Of My Mind*, (Sept 4), a position he held for two weeks. This single is now slowly descending the chart (#9).

**Suzanne Gitzi** is ready with another single, *The Runaround*. The new release is the follow-up to *The Test Of Time*, which enjoyed six weeks of national charting. Al Rodger was the writer of the new song which was taken from her *Fallen Angel* album. Released on the Tomcat label, the album was produced by Rodger and Simon Kendall.

**Tanya Tucker's new video**, *Soon*, almost didn't make it. After Nashville's television people saw it, they apparently weren't too pleased with what they saw. In fact, the message was that if she couldn't edit it so as not to offend the bible-belters, they wouldn't put it on any kind of rotation. She did, and apparently everything is on track. *Soon*, which is also the title track of her new Liberty album, was written by Casey Kelly and Bob Regan. The album was produced by Jerry Crutchfield.

**Lisa Brokop** is off on a whirlwind tour of southern Ontario, which is part of her promotional trip east for the CCMA awards. The Liberty recording artist played Peterborough's *Badlands* (Sept. 19-20), followed by Ottawa's *City Slickers* (21), Toronto's *Sante Fe* (22), *Rodeo's in Sarnia* (23), *Lulu's in Kitchener* with *Stompin' Tom*,

which has posted Sold Out notices (24), and a live radio show for *Today's Country* (25). Brokop's *Country Girl* single, taken from the *Harmony Cats* soundtrack, continues to gain strength and bullets up to #22 after only 10 weeks of charting. The album is released on the A&M label.

**Kevin Collins** strengthens Newfoundland's thrust into the recording world with his CD release, *Follow The Wind*. The album is distributed by Royal Marketing in Corner Brook, which is homebase for Collins. The album was produced by Collins and Bobbe Seymour and recorded at Seymour's studios in Nashville. Missing from the album is a label and its Cancon properties. Collins co-wrote all the songs with family members, so it would appear that all tracks are three-part Cancon (MAL). Two-Step Productions of Corner Brook is handling press for the release.

**The new single from Ron Hynes** will be *Man Of A Thousand Songs*, the follow-up to *Cryer's Paradise*, the title track of his debut album for EMI Music Canada. The new single, a Hynes original, is one of the more countryfied tracks on the album, produced by long time friend Declan O'Doherty, and should gain chart recognition shortly. *Cryer's Paradise* is now being targeted to AC programmers.

**Tim Thorney** hits the charts with his new Epic release, *Fortunate Home* (#88). This is another Thorney and Erica Ehm penning and the lyrics should hit home with young parents. The track was taken from his *Some Other Time* album, which the team produced as well.

**Royalty's Chris Nielsen** makes chart news with her release of *Able Bodied Woman* (#91). The single was produced by R. Harlan Smith and is included on *Royalty* CD compilation 9.

**Greg Paul, also on Royalty**, makes a bid for attention with his latest release, *If It Hadn't Been For You*. This is a Paul original, produced by R. Harlan Smith. Paul was honoured just recently with an Alberta Country Music Award as Best Country Male Vocalist. An album is currently in production in Edmonton and Paul is off to Nashville later this month to complete music beds on this, his third album. The new album is being scheduled for an early 1994 release. CBC television aired an in-depth interview with Paul that was aired Sept. 16 at 6:45 p.m. to close the Alberta News portion of their broadcast. The interview was scheduled for national airing a week later. Paul added to his national stature as a co-presenter of the Country Male Vocalist award at this year's CCMA awards show.

**Laurie Thain**, who releases on her own Pure Pacific Music label, has put the finishing touches on *Stages*, her new album. Thain was nominated this year for a Big Country Award as Outstanding New Artist. Based in Mission, B.C., Thain is an outspoken supporter of Canadian talent, and writes regularly in *Pacific Music News*. Her most recent broadside is titled *Living In The Shadow*, which appeared in the Summer edition. Thain was also active during Canadian Country Music Week '92 in Calgary where she organized a writer's showcase called *A Focus On Our Finest*. She

hopes to stage a similar event next year when the focus is again on Calgary.

**Montreal-based Bourbon Gautier** follows his debut chart single, *I Can't Complain*, with the release of *Your Shadow Dances On The Wall*. The first single was the title track from his debut album release.

**Folk balladeer Valdy** shows his country side with the barn burner release of *Link In A Chain*. The single enters the chart at #90, a good start for this veteran of the '60s and '70s folk era. The track is included on his new Peg Music album, *Heart At Work*, produced by Bill Henderson and Bill Buckingham.

Guesting on the album are *Chilliwack's* Bill Henderson, Shari Ulrich, Sue Leonard and producer Forbes, who supplies background vocals and guitar work. 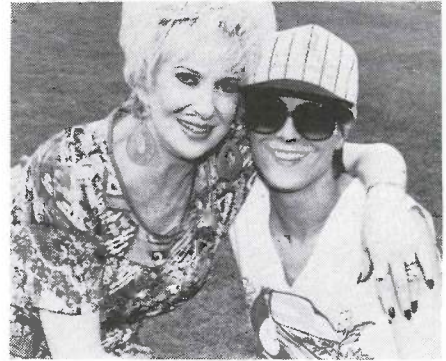

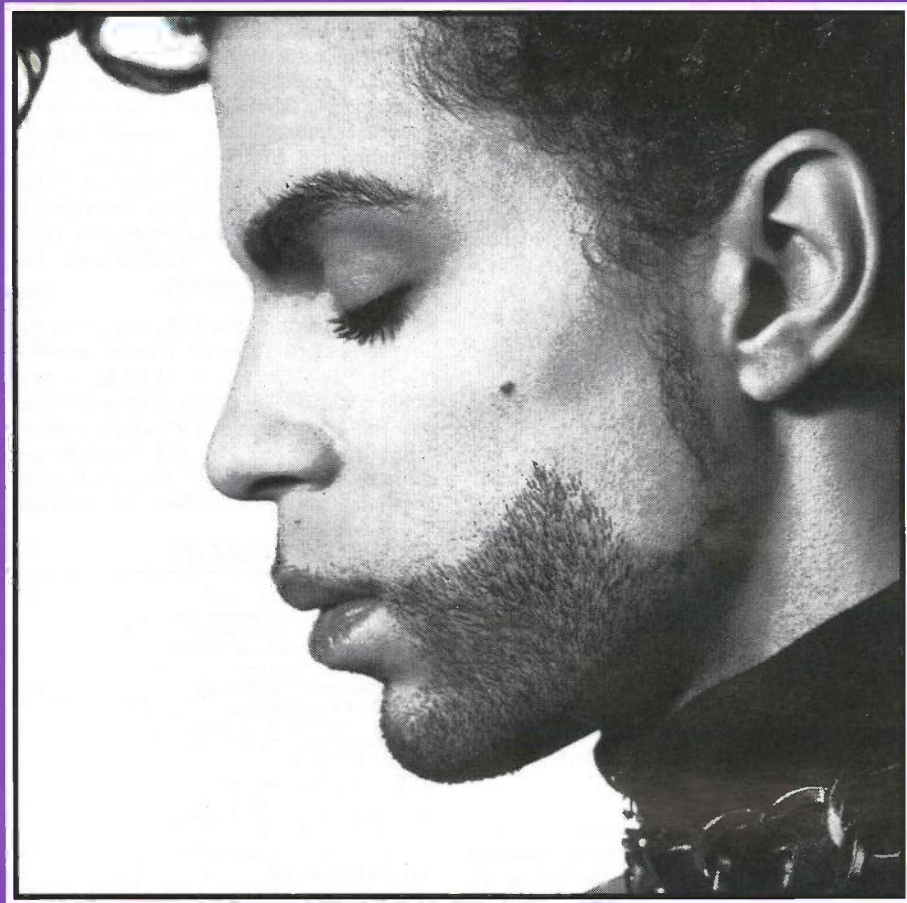
