Danny Goldberg to keynote CMW '98

Just in: Danny Goldberg, the newly appointed chairman of the Mercury Group in New York, has been firmed to keynote next year's Canadian Music Week to take place in March of next year. Goldberg, whose emphasis will be on the state of the global music industry, will be bringing nearly twenty years of industry insight into topics such as pirating, copyright protection and the technological revolution, fans and the Internet, superstars of the future and a forecast on the next ten years of record retail around the world.

Goldberg has, throughout his lengthy career, served as a journalist for Billboard, Rolling Stone and Circus, and handled publicity for The Moody Blues and Led Zeppelin. He has also acted as vice-president for Zeppelin's fledgling Swann Song label. Goldberg also ran his own publicity company

The second annual Music Therapy Trust Fund Luncheon, held in Toronto on Dec. 5, raised more than \$100,000. Although the house was sold out at \$125 a pop, it was the post luncheon silent auction where the crowd got down and dirty in their bidding.

The star of the auction was MuchMusic's general manager Denise Donlon. She was on the block as Temp for the Day and the bidding began, reaching a frenzy with Sony bettering all bids, taking the popular lady home for \$30,000.

The charity also benefited from the first annual Weaselpalooza, which was held a week earlier and which raised more than \$11,000. The event was organized by record promo supremos Rob Chubey, Steve Coady, Warren Copnick, Melanie Hurley, Tony Szambo and Pete Watson (RPM - Dec. 8/97).



in the late '70s and formed a label to release Stevie Nicks' albums before founding Gold Mountain Management in the mid 1980s. He became chairman of Warner Bros. Records in 1992, only to leave in a massive corporate shakeup in the summer of '95 to join Mercury Records. He has presided as the label's chairman since last September.

Joining Goldberg on the panel following his keynote address will be Nicholas Garnett, the director general and CEO of the International Federation of Phonographic industries (IFPI) and Phil Hardy, editor of Music & Copyright. John Glover, who heads the International Managers' Forum will also join the panel which will be moderated by Hilary Rosen, president and CEO of the Recording Industry Association of America and Brian Robertson, her Canadian counterpart of CRIA.

CMW organisers are also planning a private breakfast meeting of the heads of almost 20 different Canadian music industry associations. According to conference organiser Neill Dixon, the meeting will allow for the exploration of a wide variety of issues that face the music business.

"This is a group of people who are really a task force for our business," commented Dixon. "There has not been an opportunity to meet in this way since the Department of Canadian Heritage convened a similar gathering two years ago."

CMW will be held at Toronto's Westin Harbour Castle Hotel March 5-8 next year. Sir George Martin has already been announced as the subject of the conference's annual celebrity interview and this year, CMW will place a special emphasis on the Latin American music market and introduce the new awards show by the Canadian Association of Broadcasters. Murray is seen on the front cover of RPM this week, in concert at the gala opening of the brand new Living Arts Centre in Mississauga on Dec. 15.

Diana Fund receives 50 million from John single

A cheque equivalent to \$50 million was presented to the Diana, Princess of Wales Memorial Fund by Elton John from proceeds of the artist's record breaking single Something About The Way You Look Tonight/Candle In The Wind '97. John and his label, PolyGram Records, expect to make further "substantial payments" in the new year.

Purportedly all profits from the sale of single are being donated to the fund and further monies are expected after tax clearances and international particulars are cleared up. The single, which shipped over 33 million units worldwide, was confirmed as the most successful single of all time by the Guiness Book of World Records.

"Everyone at PolyGram is so proud to have been associated with this record," said Alain Levy, president and CEO of PolyGram. "There's been a tremendous effort from our marketing, manufacturing and distribution people, from retailers all over the world – many of whom are donating profits to the fund – and from everyone involved in helping us make this such a success and raise so much money for this very worthy cause."

Helmut Lotti firmed for Roy Thomson Hall Jan. 9

Helmut Lotti, the Belgian popster with a classical bent who recently became a media sweetheart in Quebec and Ontario (RPM - Dec. 1/97), has been firmed for a concert at Toronto's Roy Thomson Hall on Jan. 9. The concert is to be presented by Piet Roelen Productions and produced by Fogel-Sabourin Productions of Montreal.

Lotti's latest album, Helmut Lotti Goes Classic, has sold more than a million and a half copies in Europe and was certified platinum in Canada a few short weeks after release. It was during the launch of his album at Centro in Toronto when he was presented with his CRIA platinum award by Belgium vice-counsel Herman Opgenhaffen. The video of the same title has been certified gold in Canada.

For his Toronto date, Lotti will be backed by the all-Canadian 40-piece Golden Symphony Orchestra and a 12-member choir conducted by Maestro Andre Walschaerts. The PBS TV network debut of Helmut Lotto Goes Classic, his concert which was originally taped at Antwerp's Elizabetzall, has been widely aired across the U.S. and into Canada.



The time is right for a Radio and Music Team Canada

They sat at two separate tables in a small, cramped room across the street from CRTC headquarters in Hull, Quebec. The table separation was measured in feet (metres?). The ideological, separation in miles (kilometres?)

At the Radio table, the Canadian Association of Broadcasters (CAB), represented by eleven of Canada's best minds in radio and one Yankee (10 per cent U.S. content) who had come up to Hull to provide first hand testimony about radio consolidation.

At the Music industry table, the Canadian Independent Record Producers Association (CIRPA) represented by the music industry's best (well, certainly most colourful) lobbyist, Brian Chater "the relentless curmudgeon".

Squeezed between them (but a little to the side), thirteen referees and linesmen representing the Canadian Radio and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC).

The object of the game from the music industry's perspective? Higher Canadian content (Cancon), of course.

The object of the game from radio's perspective? Consolidation of radio (duopolies).

The rules of the game? Well . . . that's what we're all here to figure out.

The name of the game? A review of the Commission's policies for commercial radio.

Decisions made as a result of this "hearing" will be among the most important since the hearings that earlier brought us music Cancon and, later, FM regulations. The latter inflicted hit ratios, foreground programming and a myriad of, now mostly extinct, regulations that I prefer to forget about.

The timing for the hearing is interesting. For almost ten years, Radio and Music have been fighting, perhaps, their bloodiest battle of all. Neighbouring Rights. When the smoke cleared, Music emerged victorious, Radio was bloodied. The wounds have not healed.

From the beginning of the hearing, it was clear that this version of the CRTC was uncomfortable in their traditional role refereeing Radio and Music. This CRTC wants to be a "marriage counsellor".

The CRTC set the tone right off the top by

taking the unprecedented step of structuring the first two presentations so that each side appeared on the playing field together. Neither side seemed to take the hint. The CAB spoke to the CRTC. CIRPA spoke to the CRTC. Rarely did they speak to each other. If you've ever been in marriage counselling, you'll get the picture.

I won't bore you with the details of the two presentations. You can likely find them on the Internet. You'll likely also find details from subsequent presentations trotted up by various radio groups, publishers and record labels. Amazingly, after all these years, there was still evidence that Radio was dumping Cancon out of prime time hours and, in at least one instance, editing records. Apparently, too, music directors were still telling label reps that their Cancon "quota" was filled. Is it any wonder that Music is trying to increase the Cancon level?

What I found most significant (and disturbing) was that the working relationship between Radio and Music is no better than it was twenty-five years ago, perhaps worse. Pity! Because they have shown in the past that when they work together, as with the creation of FACTOR, their combined energies can create a lot to the benefit of both . . . and to Canada.

As one of the CRTC "marriage counsellors" said, "unless we go together, we go nowhere." Amen!!!

The creation of FACTOR in 1982 was the closest thing to a "wedding" Music and Radio ever had. It was the first time that Radio as a whole, created a co-operative initiative with Music that was not imposed on them by government. As one of the architects of FACTOR, I would argue that FACTOR has not realized its potential, but nevertheless, Music and Radio would be far weaker without it.

The good news out of all this is that, at the end of the hearings, the CRTC orchestrated a "round table" discussion featuring representatives from most of the participants. A short time later, everyone agreed to set up a task force that would explore ways to work together. It's a good first step. The "marriage counsellor" was obviously pleased.

But the leadership from both Music and Radio have got their work cut of for them. The real

problems exist on the bench. The "quarterbacks" had a meeting on "the field" and now must take the message to the players on the sidelines.

A huge culture shift must be achieved so that program directors, music directors and announcers come to celebrate Cancon. And labels, managers and musicians come to celebrate the creative power and accomplishments of Radio. They must become their own best friends. warts and all. I hesitate to bring forth what many may find to be an unpleasant analogy, but imagine the U.S. Congress legislating the predominantly white ownership of U.S. radio to play music performed and produced by blacks. Forty years ago it might have come to that. And it might have come to that in sports as well. Some would argue that Warren Moon playing quarterback in the CFL, sparked a huge culture shift in the NFL.

The fan acceptance of black musicians and athletes eventually forced ownership to "play" them based on the quality of their performance. I suspect that Canadian music fans would revolt if we took all Cancon off radio today. Having said that, the U.S. model still has a long way to got, but the Canadian model, in many ways has further still. But I digress.

Today, Radio is the most local of media. Tomorrow, it may become the most national of media as well. Canadian music on Canadian radio, even more so than today, will be among the most unique and defining of those national voices.

Success in the millennium will be closely tied to the ability of a business to drive consumers into its "store". Like it or not, Music and Radio share much of the same "shelf space" in the same entertainment store. But there are now many other entertainment stores that have little to do with either Music or Radio. And they are moving in on the same "street". Music and Radio created FACTOR to improve the quality and quantity of The Product. They must now work together to find a way to improve the marketability of that product from both a sales and time spent listening (TSL) standpoint.

The game is moving into the playoffs on the international stage. It's time to put the old animosities aside and play as Team Canada.



Watch for a major record exec to take on two jobs. Now there is one and he will run . . . BOTH!!!! Watch for an award show to make for a bigger and better Cancon star system. Watch for "King for Life" to be dethroned! Goodbye! Too bad! Good riddance! Take the lady with you!!!!!

Crystal ball gazing!!! I see a major exec, yet again, announcing his long impending exit. Again and again and again! I see a new leader of the pack as the industry goes through some traumatic times. I see a new sound. I can hear it now. If you thought rock and roll and disco got bad press, wait for this one. On a sad note. I see a new king of Cancon and from here on in, it will be smooth sailing! I see a big Cancon male vocalist . . . emerging. (Gosh!)

No ECMA PR this year??? The ECMA conference and awards show is coming back home to Halifax where it all began. But there's something lacking. Ironically, the musical is based on Puccini's La Boheme, very loosely, that is, but author Larson, who unfortunately died days before Rent championed Broadway, experienced what he created here. He lived the downand-out, squeegee kid, sort of existence and fashioned this fascinating look into a world of AIDS/HIV horror, drug abuse, and kids who aren't understood or wanted by their own flesh and blood. Rent sends out a powerful message that should introduce a new demographic to musical theatre. The cast is exceptional, each with their own energy level that never peaks. Rent serves up a generous helping of conscience-pricking, of tolerance, understanding and most of all, love. (EC: Something we can't get enough of!!!)

Scandinavian's Aqua takes North America by storm

Even in Aqua: Dif and Rasted are still well grounded

While in Toronto last week doing that promotion tour thing and giving their second Canadian single Lollipop a push at retail and radio, Universal recording act Aqua met with myself and Rod Gudino at the Cambridge Suites downtown. Rene Dif and Soren Rasted were as accommodating, as a no name band looking for some ink to get them notoriety. The open forum and relaxed atmosphere turned into a 45-minute free-for-all that encompassed a wide-spectrum of dialogue ranging from their multimillion selling album to their day-to-day lives before they became international pop stars.

Although Aqua wouldn't be the first band to come up with a commercially viable tune that catches on at radio, Rasted and Dif feel they have the substanance and drawing power to keep the Aqua sensation alive for more than just one album and are eager to dispel the novelty song theory.

When the question of whether they were surprised with the apparent sudden success of Aquarium was poised both Dif and Rasted laughed "No not at all - we expected all of this." If anyone thinks Aqua was an overnight success they are mistaken, the band has been working on Aquarium for three-and-a-half years and have already had three number one singles in their home Scandinavia. Admittedly, the last year has spawned the most recognition for the band with number one singles

throughout the world.

Rasted summarizes the last year with a fairytale like enthusiasim "Yeah, it started last September when we released our first single, Roses Are Red, in Denmark. It took quite a while for that one to get to number one, a couple of months or something like that. We were like 'wow' when it happened, then we released our second single a song called My Oh My and it went straight to number one.

With two number ones under their belts in Denmark, Aqua was ready to unleash the whole package, Aquarium, Rasted explained "When we released the album we knew there was a certain demand for it and people were aware of Aqua in Scandinavia. It was great!! Our success started in Scandinavia, then exploded in Asia then America and Canada."

Rasted reveals: "We had done everything ourselves, I mean you couldn't really expect this to happen because we wrote the songs ourselves, we produced the album, everything in our credits is something we've done ourselves."

Although Universal (America) and Mattel are spending their days in civil litigation over the #1 smash hit Barbie Girl, Aqua's down to earth band members take no credit for sublimal songwriting or trying to create controversy in order to bring up the bottom line. Dif asserts "Its not like we made a deal with Mattel or something like that, definitely

Rasted continues "When we write songs in Aqua we do it with a lot of humour and a lot of irony. It was just a good duo Barbie and Ken and it was a fun universe to go into. When we write songs, it's not the usual love songs that you hear, especially in pop music. We rather want to create some kind of illusion or universe within the song. Barbie Girl wasn't written about the Barbie Doll but a Barbie Universe, the glamourous world like Baywatch, the kind of lifestyle that people believe is 'living the life'. It's not a criticism, it's just a fun song... there's nothing more to it. There is little seriousness in every ironic thing."

Along with the new found fame comes the brutal invasion of privacy from the media and Aqua has garnered their share of headlines lately. The most interesting being that Lene Grawford Nystrom died from a herion overdose. The rest of the "star" attention, fans autographs, and interviews seem to be still intriguing to Dif and Rasted, but the press have them a little annoyed as Dif comments on the Nystrom overdose rumour "We all died four times last week, plane crash, car crash. People just sit around with nothing to do, but make this stuff up!

"But it's not funny, our parents open the newspaper and if we haven't talked to them in a couple weeks, and the only thing they see is that members of Aqua went down in a plane crash, or two from Aqua are dead in a car crash or something like that. It is really irritating. If we haven't phoned home they get worried. Why do people do that, they can't possibly do that for fun, well they might think its funny. If any rumor starters are reading this story "I'm going to kick your ass".

At 23 years of age Mark Ekins makes an impressive entrance into the country arena with a powerful package of entertainment that should move him quickly into prominence. The title track, which he wrote on the tailgate of his old pickup truck in Bear Creek Provincial Park in Kelowna, BC has been taken as the first single, and is already catching the attention of country programmers. Ekins weaves a different tale with each of his plots, and all tracks are original, revealing a rare talent of perception and understanding. sometimes appears that he has a hidden agenda, taking his listener down a path that reveals sub-plots and intriguing conclusions. Ekins is a master storyteller with a warm, pleasant vocal property and an intense delivery that demands attention. He honed his writing and performing talent as an entertainer on the Royal Caribbean cruise ship The Monarch of the Sea. performing in front of 2400 guests each week. He's still cruising which should be an invaluable vehicle for sales of this album. There are a number of key tracks, including Barstools, Doin' Time and So Far. But don't overlook Fiction and 2000 Miles. As well, Cowboy Dream could be a leftfielder. Kudos also to a great lineup of session people who have cultured that pure country sound. 
JEREMY GREENHOUSE - Pop 'n Folk Unraveled



JOHN CHIASSON - Pop 'n Jazz Here In The Moonlight Fedora-07282

Chiasson gained recognition as the bass player for The Rankins, but he is far, far removed from those Celtic influences as he presents a very definitive study in jazz with a pop feel. A student of classical music and jazz, Chiasson is in a class of his own. The title track, which he wrote with George Antoniak, is the only original on the album and one hundred per cent Cancon. This is a key track and very radio friendly. What follows is a treasure of simple yet beautifully-arranged standards, any one of which will attract the attention of A/C listeners. Chiasson's vocal property is comforting and very pursuasive. He wraps his own tonal quality around these wonderful standards as if they were his own. He is exceptional on Errol Garner's Misty with a generous vocal assist by Raylene Rankin, and on Billie Holiday's God Bless This Child, Hoagy Carmichael's Stardust, and Johnny Green's Body And Soul. And there's more, not a clunker in the bunch. That extra touch of instrumental class was provided by drummer Scott Ferguson, Dave Staples on keys, guitarists George Antoniak and Mark Alcorn, and, of course bassist Chiasson who also doubles on guitar. DAVID CLAYTON THOMAS - Blues **Blue Plate Special**

Forget Blood Sweat and Tears and Spinning Wheel, well, not really, but the creator of these incredible nostalgic utterances, is back with a blues package that defies description. What's most obvious is that DCT hasn't lost his vocal arrogance and his natural feel for the blues. He's down and dirtier than ever . the original street kid without the squeegee. What he does to Ray Charles' Hard Times borders on being sinful, it's so typically DCT. The same goes for Willie Dixon's Hoochie Coochie Man and Henry Glover's Drown In My Own Tears. That's them, but when you patch into DCT's originals, that's when the real listening begins, with Suzy Got Her Big Hair On, Lucretia MacEvil (and there must be a hidden message here), We Were The Children, and Wish The World Would Come To Memphis, all of which are threepart Cancon (MAL). Percy Mayfield's Danger Zone is also key with additional lyrics by Thomas. The album was produced by Thomas and recorded live at Ornette Coleman's Harmolodic Studios in New York City. David Clayton Thomas is on the attack again and with this powerful package he should bring that old familiar musical signature into the mainstream once more.

ALANA DAVIS Blame It On Me Elektra 62112-P

"I think music is our most important form of communication," says Alana Davis. "It crosses all boundaries and has the power to affect people's lives -- both the songwriter and the listener." To wit, the young singer songwriter has gone on to craft her debut effort, a twelve song release titled Blame It On Me. The title of the album ought to tip you off to the fact that Davis is wholly responsible for everything you hear; in her own words, she felt the need to resist any inclination to collaborate. The decision was a wise one, Blame It On Me remains a slow mo cinematic flourish of Davis' blossoming talent. Hers is a particular talent; of developing folk based pop songs with pertinent, substantive narratives that reveal sensitivity beyond her twenty years. All songs are originals with the exception of 32 Flavours, an innovative cover of Ani Di Franco's scruffy song of

BABYFACE MTV Unplugged NYC 1997 Epic 68779-H

Correct us if we're wrong, but is this the first time an R&B artist has tried this sort of thing? If it is (and we're thinking it is), then Babyface is certainly the man to give the unplugged trend some currency with yet another format. And we think he will; the results of this MTV Unplugged show are wholly captivating, as Kenneth "Babyface" Edmonds glides through a series of very, very big songs. The opener features backup

by Eric Clapton on the "phenomenal" Change The World and Talk To Me; Shanice Wilson joins in for Breathe Again and a host of people, including K-Ci and JoJo, Melvin and Kevon Edmonds make an appearance on I Care About You. Stevie Wonder lends vocal on two closing tracks, wrapping up an unforgettable 60 minutes of live music. The little niggling point we have is that unplugged in this case means very much plugged just... er... toned down somewhat. Now what could that possibly mean? We think that audiences by and large aren't too concerned with the

particulars of bringing electricity into the deal, rather, the point is to make live albums commercially viable. As such, Babyface Unplugged is the cream of a still developing crop. Also includes Whip Appeal, I'll Make Love To You/End Of The Road and The Day (You Gave Me A Song).

What sounds like a Voodoo rite at the Witching hour pitch introduces this debut, before mellowing to a quietly hypnotic track called Snake. It's an odd development, that conjointly furthers ominous lyrics and a classical flair between the twin acoustic guitars which plod the song forward. And we have to state for the record that despite our tangled initial impressions, we have never heard anything quite like An Acoustic Sin before. The group develop their debut in like fashion, exploring quasi-mythical territory in the intimate theatre of bonfire music and a participating audience sporting a requisite star glazed mind. Perhaps this is why ... Erase The Sky occasionally loses footing in its endeavour to maintain our interest, and also why at times the lyrics sound like they've been lifted from Black Sabbath's catalogue. Nevertheless, there are more than enough songs here that convey a singular aesthetic, even power, particularly on Here Comes The Sin and The Appraisal, both of which paint impassioned pictures with intelligent, controlled strokes. An Acoustic Sin could be a fad and it could be an invention, but either way you slice it, their album deserves a sitting down and a significant -- if not thorough -- listen. If you feel a little lost by it all, then put on the third song, dim the lights and enjoy the story.


If Summer's Over for Moe Berg, we're left wondering when the hell it ever began. Maybe never, if the geeky frontman for The Pursuit Of Happiness is going to feel wintry about putting out a solo effort. And just to properly contextualize this, Berg's album is -- on the outside -- about as significant as Mark Knopfler putting out his. Check out the song titles: White Boy Blues, She's So Shallow, Angelique Is A Free Spirit, Drunk Again, Bates Milk Bar, Temporary Girl. Nothing really new so far. Once we tear off the wrapper and have a listen, surprise, surprise we do find some new sounds (White Boy Blues, Here's The Story, Introducing The Solution), shuffled in amidst uninspired rock songs (Pray For Heaven, She's So Shallow, Drunk Again). The kitschy mall music that pokes its head here and there could be an in-joke or it could be a bona fide musical interest, but either way it just rams the point home that

Summer's Over is way too megalomaniacal to really do anything commercially. Mind you, the way these things go, we wouldn't be surprised that one or two of these ditties worm their way into radio anyhow. Berg's no stranger to the mighty pop sensibility, and try as he might, his attempts at telling it from the gut only serve to disfigure that inbred inclination. In this age, that might mean a new kind of alternative... for the alternative so to speak.

CHAD RICHARDSON The Legends Of Brud Aquarius 00582

You know Chad Richardson from his current gig in that amazing musical that is currently breaking hearts in Toronto. But Richardson is fighting the good fight on two fronts—saide from his role in Rent, he is also pursuing a musical career, the first taste of which you have access to with his debut release, titled The Legends Of Brud. The music is staple rock pop, but with unusual twists that make any number of these twelve songs fascinatingly wiry. The writing is there—a lot of balance and a lot of gut instinct for what belongs and what doesn't—in this sense Chad Richardson proves himself to be a consummate songwriter. Oh and did we mention that he has an incredible singing voice and fingers that have a tendency and ability to riff and roll? Really, if there is any justice in the world, this



album will be a sleeper breakout for the new year. If it takes Richardson's role in Rent to get you to notice him then so be it, but don't keep yourself from half the picture by leaving it at that. Get thee to wherever you need to go to appropriate Legends Of The Brud. It is interesting, it is cleverly written with lots of musical spontaneity, great rock and roll moments and nary a miss. It is, as we in the critical space like to say, nothing less than a smokin' piece of work.

Moncton warms the hearts of the East Coast industry





Over the course of the year 4,700,000 people passed through the turnstiles, generating a 50% increase in net revenue from the 165 event days in 1990.


Universal Music Group celebrates Grammy wins

phenomenon precisely to francophone Canada, who had an early jump on the group before the label formally began promotions. "A lot of the credit for getting this thing out in Canada and really getting us to get behind it fully and step out and go ahead of America goes to CKMF and CKOI in Montreal.

They're the ones that brought in the import CD single and started banging it." revealed Kane.

BMG's The Backstreet Boys followed with the number 2 spot after 25 weeks on the chart after a slight two week dip out of the Top Ten.

Sony's Rick Camilleri among Top 40 Under 40

The Financial Post magazine published the names of the finals in the Second Annual Survey, The Top 40 Under 40 which celebrates extraordinary performances outstanding individuals under 40 years of age. Under the banner of "Spin Master" the nod went to Sony Entertainment Canada president Rick Camilleri, who is 37.

When Rick Camilleri stepped into the top job at Sony Music four years ago, he had no qualms about rocking the staid subsidiary's world. A 25-word mission statement ending with the sentence "our success is in our attitude."

The River releases second Hockeytown charity CD

Hope In Hockeytown II, featuring three Canadian bands was released by The River (CIDR 93.9 FM Windsor) and the Detroit Red Wings. This is the second instalment in a benefit series produced by Number Five Music. All net proceeds go to benefit Big Brothers Big Sisters of Metro Detroit. The Odds contributed Someone Who's Cool, Driving Blind lent their Fly track, and Sleepy Maggie was offered by A&M artist Ashley MacIsaac. The first Hope In Hockeytown CD, released in March of 1996 has sold more than 3,000 copies, and has raised over \$13,000 for The Big Brothers Big Sisters.





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

Adams latest release breaking records in UK

While nay-sayers continued to talk down mediocre sales of Bryan Adams' 18 'Til I Die, the Canadian export continued to break records overseas. Adams set an attendance record at the Newcastle Arena followed by sold-out shows in Australia and Japan.

Adams added new accolades with a Help A London Child Award he received beating out George Michael and Michael Jackson and a Favourite Male Classic Rock Award at the Blockbuster Entertainment Award where he was nominated with John Mellencamp and Tom Petty.

The U.K./European leg included five dates at London's Wembley Arena to coincide with the release of Adams' single 18 'Til I Die in the U.K. and Europe.



A&M's Soundgarden calls it guits after twelve years

Seattle grunge band pioneers disbanded after twelve years when members decided to "amicably and mutually... pursue other interests," according to an A&M press release. The band concluded a vibrant music career of five albums and 20 million albums sold world-wide.

Cultural sector targets Senate to pass Bill C-32

There were 27 professional associations representing Canadian creators, publishers, performers, musicians and sound recording producers, urging Senators to pass Bill C-32 amending the Copyright Act "as is" and "with utmost urgency."

A letter addressed to all members of the Senate was released on (April 7) at an Ottawa press conference. Robert Pilon of Association Quebecoise de L'industries du disque, du spectacle et de la video (ADISQ), in his message stressed that "Three generations of Canadian creators, artists and producers have been frustrated in their efforts to encourage successive governments to enact significant copyright reform in this country."

David Basskin of the Canadian Music Publishers Association (CMPA) added that Bill C-32 does not deal with matters relating to new technologies and new distribution systems like the internet.

Canadian Music week ties with London Music Week

Neill Dixon gave his highly successful annual Canadian Music Week Conference & Trade Show another international boost by hosting a CMW exhibit booth at the first London Music Week.

Billed as Britain's largest international music event the industry conference and exhibition took place from April 26 through May 2 at the Business Design Centre in London's Islington District as well as 35 festival venues across the city.

APRIL 21

Zbitnew steps in as Alofs departs for Disney

After a whirlwind 19 months at the helm of BMG Canada, President Paul Alofs resigned his post. Stepping up to General Manager was Lisa Zbitnew, the label's marketing VP since her arrival at BMG six months prior.

"Before I even recruited Lisa into BMG I knew that I wanted her to join and that she would be the person that I would recommend to take over for me" Alofs commented.

Alofs headed off to a seven figure pasture of the Walt Disney Company, assuming the position of general manager for Canada, the U.S. and Puerto Rico.

Zbitnew, who joined BMG as Group VP of Marketing in October of last year took over operations on July 1st and remains committed to maintaining the companies policies introduced in the past year.



"You can expect that we will continue on our plans as we've discussed them over the past six months and largely that's about maintaining our trend towards increased market share and increase in sales. Obviously, the Vik label was very critical and remains very critical," said Zbitnew.

Bush gets eXed at publicity junket

Canada finally joined the rest of the world in referring to Interscope/Universal artist Bush X by their correct namesake (sans the X) now that the Canadian legal rights have been given over to the British band. Bush was joined by Domenic Troiano, a founding member of the 1970 Canadian rock band whose name caused the original trouble, the members of Bush X took the stage of a press conference to officially remove the pesky X.

"It was a matter of misunderstanding," commented Troiano after several minutes of deliberating, who would deliver the news. He added that it was never his now defunct band's intention to stall the development of Bush's biggest per capita market, but only a matter of legal wrangling that was instigated and pursued by legal necessity.

During the conference it was revealed by Bush lead man Gavin Rossdale that he took on the task of getting hold of Troiano and getting the unfortunate situation resolved. A commendable effort considering Bush X was selling through the roof in Canada and Rossdale was more interested in settling the situation on a personal level rather than any legally complex matter.

Official launch for Country 95.5FM

Canada's newest country music radio station went to air Friday March 14, 1997. The official launch took place at Outriders, a popular Lethbridge nightclub.

Mary Gunderson, the station's Program Director, reports that the lights in the club turned out and Country 95.5FM was born. The first song to air on the new band was Alan Jackson's Gone Country in appreciation and recognition of their success in country music.

The station is described as a adult-oriented personality driven, featuring contemporary country music.

APRIL 28

The compilation business comes of age

Twenty years ago, the business of mass marketing hit singles was relatively

simple. You took whatever singles that were burning up the charts and put them together in a handsome compilation package. The philosophy being that radio listeners marry themselves to a song rather than to an artist. The idea seemed to have worked well for some time, the generous sales coming in for strong radio promotion and record labels gaining a chance to recoup on one hit wonders.

The present climate has changed dramatically from those days, however, making the modern compilations a different entity, far from recouping on lost sales. Today's compilation packages vie substantially against releases from major artists. Sales figures as high as one million in Canada for Quality Music's Dance Mix '95 for example, are well



within the scope of the market, with other releases from dance, country and pop and specialty product from slow jam to love songs and retro music hitting multi-platinum sales figures.

Our Lady Peace, Tea Party to head Edgefest

Initial dates on a cross country tour and a working line-up were announced for Edgefest, one of the principal concert events of the summer. The festival which kicked off Saturday June 28 at Molson Park in Barrie checked into Montreal's Blue Bonnets-Hippodrome de Montreal on June 29.

The idea was to take it on the road and create a Canadian Festival," said Steve Herman, Senior VP Universal Concerts Canada, who took over Edgefest this year from CFNY which introduced and maintained the concept until last year.

Three of the headlining acts Our Lady Peace, The Tea Party and Collective Soul will be supporting new albums during the tour while a banner year for I Mother Earth and final gigs with the current line-up will heighten interest in the band.




June 2 CMW '98 turns sights on Latin America
