

Roy Lott named president and CEO of Capitol Group

Ken Berry, president and CEO of EMI Recorded Music, has announced the appointment of Roy Lott as president and CEO of the newly created Capitol Records Group. He will also continue as president



of Capitol Records.

EMI Music Canada under president Deane Cameron will report to Roy as will the flagship, Capitol Records, together with Capitol Nashville under president Pat **Ouigley**, Virgin Nashville under president Scott Hendricks, EMI Latin under president Jose Behar, and Christian Music Group under president Bill Hearn. Angel Records and Blue Note Records under president Bruce Lundvall are already part of the Capitol Records Group. Lott is quite

familiar with the Canadian territory, having been instrumental in the early beginnings and breakout success of Sarah McLachlan as well as the American signing of the Jeff Healey Band.

Lott began his career in the music business in 1979 as a junior lawyer with Clive Davis' Arista Group, moving up to his number two as executive vice-president and general manager. He joined EMI in March of 1998 as deputy president of EMI Recorded Music North America. In July of that year he assumed the presidency of Capitol Records and now heads up the Capitol Records Group.

Lott was only three years out of law school when he joined Arista, but prior to that he had managed bands, promoting concerts, worked as a roadie as early as high school in New Jersey, his home state. "I was always looking for a musical career," Lott recalls. "And frankly, when I got out of law school, the same thing that happened to me happens to a lot of people when they get out of school. No one would hire me because I had no experience, and you say, 'how do I get experience unless you hire me?' But after three years of knocking on doors, working as a lawyer in downtown Manhattan, I ended up by getting hired by Arista."

As noted, among Lott's responsibilities are two country labels, Capitol Nashville and Virgin Nashville. In view of the media negativity on the future of country, Lott was asked where he thought country was going.

"I think country will always be a very strong format. It's not currently enjoying the highs it enjoyed at one point in time, but I think it's incumbent upon every major record label to be involved in all genres of music. You can't limit yourself in that context because what frankly happens is all genres have ebb and flows of success. That's a lesson I've learned from my twenty plus years of experience in the business. Country is still very successful; it's just not as hot as it was when everybody was writing about it and today there's other things they're writing about. Country will always be a successful genre."

Switching to the Internet which is taking up the time of many writers, Lott was asked if he found the inroads of Internet commerce scary.

"I view it more as an opportunity than scary. In my mind the Internet is offering music junkies like us the ability to dial up to some Internet site and be able to order from EMI or elsewhere, that record I loved in 1965 that no record company can keep in its catalogue because no retailer can stock every record that was ever manufactured, and you're going to be able to order it.

"But your regular retail stores and your brick and mortar stores are going to continue to exist. I think it's going to be a great thing, both for the economic health of the industry and for artistry because it means that every record that was ever recorded will be available."

As far as protecting copyright, Lott offered that it would be "a challenge. But I'm confident that we're going to succeed in that."

It's no secret that EMI Music Canada has been a leader in developing its domestic roster since 1970 and been very successful with a number of artists from that roster. "I know that EMI Music Canada has been extremely successful with Canadian content. EMI Canada has also been extremely successful with UK and American content, let's not limit them in that standpoint. But what I would be looking for and continue to look for frankly is the opportunity, and one of the reasons for this structural change is to try to have situations where we can have better coordination and where we can maximize the opportunities for their direct signings here in the US, as well as maximize the potential for US signings in Canada.

"We have to recognize there are unique differences between the two territories, but we also have to realize there are unique opportunities for coordination because the two territories are right next to each other."

When asked what he thought his biggest obstacle might be, Lott admitted to being "so damned optimistically-minded," he was frank in answering "I don't know."

He went on to point out that the music industry is facing challenges. "I think you have to take the long term view of it all. These challenges have come up before and the music industry has survived. Remember the video game challenge? I'll always remember Clive's (Davis) classic quote 'You can't hum a video game,' when we were being told the record business was going to end. I remember people doubting CDs coming in and I remember 8-tracks. Life goes on. Life changes. As long as you take a long term view of things, and as long as you don't lose your head, we'll continue to be successful."

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Unique muscle show creates new indie fan base

In an effort to build a wider audience for Canada's hardcore, metal and punk bands, Jesse Mackowycz of Toronto agency Boundless and frontman of Bad Blood has cross-promoted this genre with independent professional wrestling for a show bannered as Ring'n'Ears.

"Heavy music in Toronto and Canada doesn't get the exposure the bands deserve." Mackowycz said "These bands work as hard as any other band and so do the independent wrestlers. Why not put them together and promote both of them?"

The fourth instalment was scheduled for July 10 at Toronto's Opera House. Following on the heels of the last three shows that averaged 800 people, Boundless is expecting another sell-out.

An opportunity for the bands to perform in front of 800 people is rare as most draw around the 200 -300 mark. The bands' main goal are turning some of the Ring'n'Ears audience into fans that will come out to their next show. Mackowycz explains, "If people came to see the wrestling but they liked two of the bands, we've done our job. We've given that band exposure they wouldn't have received before. The same thing with wrestling. People see the wrestling and become fans."

Already the buzz from the music community on how the show can create bigger audiences has many bands calling Boundless requesting to be on the bill. The agency however solicit acts that already have a small draw. "We approach the bands. We sit down and say 'who do we want in the show.' We

Hot roster of talent keeps Bruce Allen Talent focused

The Vancouver-based Bruce Allen Talent is singing the international and domestic praises for its roster of talent.

First and foremost is Bryan Adams, currently charting with Cloud #9, a single taken from his A&M/Universal release On A Day Like Today. The CD is platinum in Canada and gold in Germany, Hong Kong, Italy, Japan, Austria, Denmark, Switzerland and the UK.

Adams performed seven outdoor shows in France recently to an estimated audience of more than 150,000. His Paris show alone attracted a crowd of close to 80,000. He is presently in the US shooting a video for Inside Out, the fourth single from his album. The single and video will be released later this month. Adams then resumes his tour with dates in Germany, Turkey, Latvia and the UK.

Anne Murray has just capped a successful road trip through the US and is busy shotting a video for the first single from her upcoming inspirational album on the Sparrow label. She is scheduled to

have a good mix for this show," he commentated.

Where this mix comes into play is the switching between wrestling and music. Having multiple bands on a bill always creates boredom while crews tear down and set up the stage. This show is packed with non-stop action. While the crews are tearing down the stage and setting up for the next band the wrestling matches start. When one match is over the music crews are just finishing setting up the stage and the next band performs. This see-sawing continues until the last band hits the stage or no one is left standing. In the past it has been so packed with action that people became tired, so for this event a thirty minute intermission is planned.

Some may shrug off what Mackowycz is doing as gimmicky, but wrestling and music is a winning combination that is providing bands like Bad Blood, ON, Soul Storm and GRIFT with much needed exposure they wouldn't get on their own.

In an effort to continue the media hype surrounding the show, a Ring'n'Ears compilation with 16 bands containing over an hour of music has been created. Previous bands who have played the show such as Trigger Happy, Scratching Post (who are also on the HARD compilation), Random Killing and others are on the CD. Available for the first time this Saturday, Mackowycz expects to sell several hundred. "We're kind of stoked on it. It's going to be sold for ten bucks which isn't bad. It's a good comp," he remarked.

Using the compilation as another marketing tool and in an effort to create further success, a major city Canada tour will be taking place this fall. "There

Laura Bartlett, president of Zomba Records Canada Inc. announced the appointment of Steve Coady as director of national promotion and media relations.



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
What's Happenning

The Red Hot Chili Peppers and HMV have scheduled a July 22 free concert outside the HMV flagship store at 333 Yonge Street in downtown Toronto. In view of the expected crowd, Yonge Street will be shut down for the band's concert, which is being co-presented by HMV and The Edge. The band is currently charting on the RPM Top 100 CDs chart at #8 with Californication after only four weeks. Formed in southern California in the early '80s, the band gained notoriety for their outrageous and often naked performances. Blending funk, hard rock and hip hop, their commercial breakthrough happened in 1991 with the release of Blood Sugar Sex Magik which garnered two hits, Under The Bridge and Give It Away. They reunited with Sex Sugar's producer Rick Rubin for the recording of Californication. The free concert will be the only opportunity for Canadian fans to see the Warner Bros band perform live until their tour which begins in the fall.

Eric Herbert rejoins EMI as the official Quebec region promotion representative. In his new position he will oversee all promotional activity

in the entire Quebec region for the EMI Music Canada Roster. Herbert has been developing relationships and a wide knowledge of domestic and international artists over the past four years. He recently added to his experience by further developing the EMI/Virgin France artists in the Quebec region. The announcement was made by EMI's vice-president of national promotions Peter Diemer.

Ben Lee and guest Julia Darling have July 27 date at Toronto's Horseshoe Tavern. Lee, an Australian songwriter/ performer, made his debut in 1993 as lead singer of Noise Addict, a fourpiece Sydney rock band. His solo CD release in 1997 titled Something To Remember Me By, signaled a directional turn, as he delivered what was described as "acoustically rich and folk tinged songs." His latest release is titled Breathing Tornados.

The Great Canadian Blues Festival will take place at Toronto's Harbourfront Centre from July 16 through 18. This will be the 14th year for the festival of free blues music and films which features 25 seasoned blues acts on six stages. Chicago's Son Seals and Syl Johnson will; headline the three-day event which will also feature Otis Taylor and Louisiana Red, plus an impressive lineup of Cancon artists including Carlos del Junco, Michael Pickett, Fathead, Curley Bridges, Bobby Dean Blackburn with his sons, known collectively as Blackburn, Sue Foley, Ray Bonneville, Trevor Finlay and Steve Hill. The East Caost fish fry will showcase Denis Parker, Hot Toddy, John Campbelljohn Trio, and Glamour Puss.

Australia's Jebedia, a Platinum Murmur/Sony recording band, have chosen Canada for their first international tour. The band has played Vancouver's already Brickyard, the Boot in Whistler and are scheduled for a July 13 date at The Horseshoe in Toronto followed by AJ's Hangar in Kingston (14) and London's Call The Office (17). The Ontario Council of Folk Festivals will once again present a juried showcase and its fifth annual Songs From The Heart Songwriter Awards. The setting will be Barrie, Ontario from Oct. 22 through 24.

The showcase is particularly important in that selected acts will have a 25-minute showcase spot in front of an audience of festival organizers from across the province.

Applications are being accepted from Canada, the US and elsewhere until Aug. 30.

Those entering must include a CD or cassette with three highlighted songs; a one sheet bio and a photo (no press kits); stage plot, tech requirements; a fee of \$20 or \$10 for OCFF members; and a stamped self-addressed packaging if material is to be returned.

Send applications, no later than Aug. 30, to: Ontario Council of Folk Festivals Showcase, 71 Beckwith Street East, Perth, ON K7H 1C2.

For the Songwriter Awards, the jury will select three winning songwriters from those entries submitted. Each of these artists will receive \$250, an awards certificate and an invitation to showcase their work at the OCFF Conference on Oct. 23.

Only residents of Ontario may submit entries; the entry fee is \$10 per song (cheques should be payable to the Ontario Council of Folk Festivals); include song title, composer(s), contact names and phone number along with the song on cassette tape; more than one song may be entered, but each must be on a separate cassette tape; each song entered will be assigned a contest entry number (enclose a self-addressed, stamped envelope to receive confirmation of submission and the entry numbers); submitted materials cannot be returned; the writer(s) retain(s) all copyright and publishing rights to the song(s) submitted; entries must be postmarked no later than Sept. 1/99

The awards will be announced in early October.

Although placed as the last track on the disc. Scratching Post's Bloodflame is a perfect fit with its sweet vocals and fast harsh guitars. This band sounds right at home with these American big boys and deserve plenty of recognition for their impressive sound. Superstar Marilyn Manson's The Beautiful People is an interesting choice for this album. Already used as the groundbreaker the song shows Manson before his change in music direction. Fear Factory working with Gary Numan have produced the best song, a cover of Numan's Cars. Expect this fusion of metal-industrial-pop to break this band to bigger heights. The song is already gaining airplay in some markets. Through constant touring the band have developed a hardcore following that just keeps getting bigger. Radio friendly Cars will help this following grow enormously. Half the tunes on this album have never appeared on a compilation and this will appeal to fans. The compilation is perfect for those just getting into the new metal scene or those desiring key songs missing from their collections. -MM

MARK LAFORME - Country'n Blues True To Form ACT-07972

Mark LaForme is back and, as the title indicates, is true to form. His music stylings are unique for country in that he was teethed on rock 'n roll in the mid to late '70s with a solid foundation of R&B. The blues are still highlighted on this album which fits nicely into the country groove. That powerful vocal base that's unmistakably his and which brought him into country prominence more than a decade ago, is still there. He fashions his lyric attack to stroke and enhance the music. He's in



command ... the storyteller, and he has 14 tales that he shares, four of which are his own. There are a few head-turners here as well, songs written by Stompin' Tom Connors which



LaForme translates into poetic magic, like Shakin' The Blues, Hey Hey Loretta, I'll Do It For You, Old Flat Top Guitar, She Don't Speak English and I Am The Wind, the latter a powerful ballad that should also appeal to A/C programmers. The Best Years, written by Randall Cousins, is also a standout. But don't overlook At Last and Do It All Over Again, written by Buddy J. Black (aka Bud Roberts). The session musicians were the pick of the crop: Jesse O'Brien on keys, bassist Larry Murphy, drummer Dan Lockwood, Darrin Schott on steel, dobro and fiddle, guitarist Mike Eastman, Chris Dahmer on accordion and LaForme on mouth harp, and guitars. Dancin' Danny Lockwood and LaForme provided the background vocals. Produced by Tom Connors Jr. and Tom Connors Sr. Recorded at Escarpment Sound Studios in Acton, Ontario. All tracks are 100% Cancon. -WG



GRAND FUNK Thirty Years of Funk 1969 - 1999 Capitol 99523 - F

WOW! Not only is the music still sounding vibrant but the three disc set has been presented masterfully. Each disc displays a picture of a band member. The 40 page booklet is packed with photos and historical notes. Combined, this makes for a great set for the dedicated fan and those looking to discover the creators of the garage rock sound. For a band that was never big with critics, Grand Funk or Grand Funk Railroad as they started out, have sold over 20 million records and have 10 platinum albums. Built almost solely on their ability to capture a working class/protester sound. Band members attribute this to their working class home town of Flint, Michigan which has

almost as many assembly lines as Detroit. This sound has influenced many bands today for what is simply termed garage rock or for a chosen few stoner rock. Their influence on alt-rockers The Butthole Surfers goes so far as Paul Leary naming his dog after Grand Funk vocalist Mark Farner. With this three disc set their historical significance on rock'n'roll is cemented. Included are their big hits We're An American Band, I'm Your Captain/Closer to Home, The Loco-Motion, Some Kind of Wonderful and Bad Time. But this album just isn't culled from their 25 albums. Nine of the 45 songs were previously unreleased. Seven are lengthy jamming live tunes. Four great cover songs, Gimme Shelter, Walk



Like A Man, The Loco-Motion, and We Gotta Get Out Of This Place are also included. And if that isn't enough, three new songs have been recorded by the original lineup which should pique old time fans' interests. All told this set showcases the band in a magnificent form. -MM

Digital Music Express offers boost to independent artists

Digital Music Express (DMX) based in Calgary, unveiled a campaign directed at Canada's independent artists. Artists can send in their CDs which will be considered for airing on the

King's singing career boosted by accident

Stephen King, known for his writing of horror films, also had a little known hobby of singing. He did in fact record Stand By Me in 1960.

Following his recent accident, several radio stations were apparently flooded with calls to air the track which was released on a CD of writer-sung songs titled Stranger Than Fiction. The CD was released on the Oglio label, distributed by Koch in Canada.

According to Kathi Goldmark of Oglio's San Francisco office, radio stations are playing the song "to encourage folks to stand by Stephen through his crisis."

George Strait holds at #1 for another week with Write This Down. This is another indication of country programmers airing singles longer. Even the record companies are now holding back on the follow-ups, which would normally be in the pipe when the single gets into the Top 5. No news on Strait's follow-up. Hold the presses. Universal's Chris Tripodi saves the day. He just brought in Strait's new single, What Do You Say To That. The song was written by Jim Lauderdale and Melba Montgomery. Both tracks are included on Strait's MCA Nashville album Always Never The Same, which Strait produced with Tony Brown. Backstage at the Silverdome in Pontiac, Michigan, Tripodi, Donna Lidster and Sue McCallum caught up with Strait and his longtime Manager Erv Woolsey at the George Strait Festival. The Universal trio presented the pair with special Canadian awards celebrating the sales of close to two million Strait CDs sold in Canada since his first album released in 1981. (see photo)

Mark Wills has the big mover as She's In Love makes a huge move up to #56 from #90 after only the second week of charting. The song was written by Canadian Dan Hill and well-known Nashville writer/producer Keith Stegall. There is no Cancon credit however. The new single is the follow-up to Wish You Were Here, the title track of his album released as a single and now descending the chart (#52) after 22 weeks on the chart. Independent Artists Channel, which is part of the DMX mix delivered to a reported 250,000 Canadian homes by satellite and digital cable television.

"This is a real coup for the Canadian music business," says DMX programming manager Ted Kennedy. "When the talent is already there, success for an artist is usually just a matter of being discovered." Kennedy goes on to point out that with the Independent Artists Channel "artists of any music genre get centre stage -- just as long as they are not yet signed by a major record label."

The Independent Artists Channel features the DMXtra system. When a song is played on DMX, the artist, composer and CD are given credit on the television screen, an added convenience for customers who might be curious about the song.

To take advantage of DMX, independent artists from all music genres should send their CDs and bios to DMX Independent Releases, Suite 700, 630 - 3rd Avenue SW, Calgary, AB T2P 4L4.



Jim Witter has the most added single this week with Jumpin' Right In entering the chart at #36. The new single, written by Witter and Rory M. Bourke, is the follow-up to All My Life now descending the chart (#57) after a run of 21 weeks. Both tracks are included on Witter's Curb/EMI CD All My Life, produced by Chuck Howard.

Mark Laforme makes an impressive return singing the country blues on his new album, appropriately titled True To Form (RPM New Releases - July 12/ 99). LaForme bounced back into prominence last year with 40 date concert tour with Stompin' Tom Connors that took him across Canada. He also performed at the historical closing of Toronto's Maple Leaf Gardens. LaForme was born on the New Credit Reserve in Mississauga, Ontario on Nov. 6. 1954. He moved to Hamilton in 1975 where he formed Next, a rock band with former Crowbar member Roly Greenway. He gained a large fan following over the years and in the '80s began writing for Chappell Music (now Warner/Chappell) which led to a number of country artists recording his material including Gene Watson, Ronald Reagan's daughter Patti Davis, Dallas Harms, Marty Butler and Harold MacIntyre. LaForme dropped out of the business in 1989 to register at George Brown College where he graduated as a gourmet chef. He

Universal signs Joée with unusual twists

A couple of firsts for Universal Music Canada's newest artist, Toronto's Joée. Not only is he the first Canadian to be signed to the newly-amalgamated company, but the contract is for a singles-driven development deal.

"The deal is certainly styled more after the European model," explains Allan Reid, Senior Vice-President of A&R for Universal, "and is somewhat unique in Canada. But we believe it's the perfect set up to launch this artist to a broader audience," said

Joée (a.k.a. Joey DeSimone) has collectively sold almost 20,000 copies of his various singles. His second album, Truth, has done very well, selling approximately 25,000 copies. All of this accomplished as an independent artist.

The first single to be serviced by Universal will be Arriba which will ship to radio July 26th, and will be available in retail stores on Aug. 17th.

There is no MAPL logo on the label artwork, but it's assumed the single is at least two-parts Cancon (AP). Session musicians included Steve O'Connor on keys, steelman Doug Johnson, bassist Don Edmunds, and Jon Park-Wheeler doubling on acoustic and electric guitars. Background vocals were supplied by Harnden and Karen Smith. The single is released on the Fox Kare Music Label. Ian McCallum of Londonbased Starbiz is handling radio promotion and tracking.

Gilles Duhaime and Claude Brow recently performed at the annual Truck & Sine Show in Sturgeon Falls, Ontario which was held June 17, 18 and 19. The event attracted more than 20,000 country music fans from northern Ontario and Quebec.

LiveWire chronicles a busy three month period

LiveWire, which mounts mobile, Airpack and Tourpack systems with a fixed base in Toronto, continues to dominate in its field of recording mobile events.

The past three months has been particularly busy for the company which included recording the Young Achievement Awards for YTV with a performance by Ireland's new girl group B*Witched. The show was filmed at Ottawa's National Arts Centre.

The mobile unit was used when former Journey drummer Steve Smith brought Vital Information, a jazz fusion combo, into Toronto's Bamboo Club for an April concert to be recorded for an upcoming live album. Guitar duties were handled by Frank Gambale. As well, a concert by The Moffatts, an EMI recording band, was taped in Kitchener and Toronto during the month of May for an upcoming live album.

The mobile unit was also on hand for the MuchMusic June taping of Keep The Tribe Alive, an AIDS Awareness special. Much also hosted an Intimate and Interactive special with Newfoundland's Great Big Sea. Both shows were engineered by LiveWire's Doug McClement. LiveWire provided the music mix for this year's Telethon for the Toronto Hospital for Sick Children. The LiveWire Airpack portable system recorded a standup comedy album for Maggie Cassella at Tallulah's Cabaret for Uproar Entertainment in Los Angeles. The system was also used by Mighty Lie Music for the recording of a tribute to Toronto songwriter Norm Hacking at the Tranzac Club. A number of local singer/songwriters, including Nancy White, Ron Nigrini and Chris Whitely each performed a song written by Hacking.

Other live album sessions recorded included G7 at the Berlin Club, the WAB Choir at the Church of the First Born and the Arabesque Dance Orchestra.

A festival of gospel music was recorded at the Toronto Baha'i Centre featuring Salome Bey, Blaxam, the Youth Outreach Mass Choir, the first Commandment Singers, Sharon Lee Williams and Les Voix Coeur.

McClement also reports the LiveWire Tourpack system spent the month of May on the road with The Philsopher Kings who recorded 12 concerts to be edited down for a live album to be released by Sony.
