David N. Judelson, Gulf+ Western's President, said William P. Gallagher, formerly head of MCA's Decca Records division, has been appointed President of the newly-formed music company. Gallagher will report to Judelson at Gulf + Western headquarters.

The newly-created G+W unit will consist of companies which formerly comprised the Music Division of Paramount Pictures, a Gulf+Western company. Included are Stax-Volt Records, Dot Records, Inc., Paramount Records and Steed Records. The music publishing operations include Famous Music, Inc., En-

Lasker feels that categorizing particular acts in underground, R&B, Country and Western, etc., can limit the exposure of new acts and ultimately adversely affect the over-all sales of their records. "The public today buys rec-

Capitol Records, a wholly owned subsidiary of Capitol Industries, now owns about 52 percent of Merco, one of the nation's largest record distributors.

The exchange ratio will be .7275 shares of Capitol Industries common stock for each share of Merco common stock. The transaction involves the is-

New Mercury Prez Steinberg Stresses Internat'l Liaison

CHICAGO — With his appointment as President of Mercury Record Corp., Irwin H. Steinberg plans to spend much of his initial time in the post girding the already strong relationship between Mercury in the U.S. and affiliated Philips Phonographic Industries labels in Europe and elsewhere.

Steinberg, who was named to succeed Irving B. Green as chief of the Mercury operation. stated: "The way the Philips organization is structured, the entire world is our marketplace.

"In the future, we can expect to see many of our acts gaining international recognition. At this moment, for instance, the Sir Douglas Quintet's 'Mendocino' is one of the biggest international hits of all time. In tiny Switzerland, more than 50,000 copies have been sold, and this incredible success is being repeated in other European countries such as 'Holland and Germany.

! "Likewise, we plan to draw even more from our foreign affiliates and their wealth of product. In the past, we have made names here of such unknown (to U.S. audiences) acts as Paul Mauriat, the Singing Nun and the Swingle Singers, 'just to name a few."

Audio Fi Gives Mavericks In 'Are You Curious' Contest

NEW YORK—"Maverick" is the key word in the unique, \$100,000-plus distributor sales program just started by Audio Fidelity Records.

"It's for one of the timeliest, as well as funniest, albums we've ever brought out," said Audio Fidelity Sales and Promotion Vice President Mort Hillman of the label's new push package, "Are You Curious or Yellow?" (AFSD 1711).

Out this week, the LP is the brainchild of Kermit Schafer of "Blooper" comedy album fame and is being backed up by what Hillman called "The most spectacular program accorded any album in the history of the company, a Ford Maverick automobile giveaway contest for distributors. We expect to give away 50 Mavericks to the distributors selling the most albums, and in their choice of colors. The program ends on April 30, 1970."

The album's title is inspired by the currently successful, controversial motion picture, "I am Curious (Yellow)," and as an added incentive in the label's all-out campaign dealers in the various cities where the film plays will be given free tickets to see it. "Are You Curious or Yellow?" is presented in Audio Fidelity's "Personality Series," with a \$5.98 suggested retail price.

The album's "maverick" concept has many voices from today's headlines answering irreverent questions posed by a bogus interviewer. Wherever possible, the actual voices are presented, however. Among the celebrities spoofed are Jacqueline and Aristotle Onassis, President Nixon, Mr. and Mrs. Lyndon Johnson, Zsa Zsa Gabor, Roy Wilkins, U Thant, Sen. John O. Pastore, Andy Warhol, Queen Elizabeth, Jack Benny, Abe Fortas, Ted Kennedy, Gov. Nelson Rockefeller, Neil Armstrong, David Ben Gurion, Elizabeth Taylor and Richard Burton, Fidel Castro, William F. Buckley, Jr., Mao Tse Tung, Johnny Carson and the Swedish leads in the film "I am Curious (Yellow)," Lena Nyman and Borje Ahlstedt.

Created Many Best-Sellers

Besides the "Blooper" series, Schafer — who created, wrote, edited and produced "Are You Curious or Yellow?" — has presented many other best-selling comedy albums. This latest was brought to Audio Fidelity by label President Herman Gimbel. Hillman devised the Maverick giveaway sales program, and Hal Drayson, Executive Vice President of Audio Fidelity, already has ordered the 50 cars.

"There will be a complete servicing of LPs to radio stations," noted Hillman, "coordinated by Dick Colanzi, our National Promotion Director. Our recently expanded, solid regional sales force will be on it, too. While this is primarily a domestic sales incentive plan. we have encouraged our foreign licensees to participate in similar sales programs. The release of 'Are You Curious or Yellow?' is especially timely because of the season. The album is a great Christmas item. Furthermore, Kermit Schafer is going to be doing a lot of television promoting it. Expectations here are that it is the best thing of its kind since 'The First Family.'

"And with our Maverick sales program behind it, we expect the album—like a maverick —to pull out from the pack and set its own fast sales pace."

Deity In Reprise Deal

HUDSON BAY, CANADA — Deity Records, a company generally known only for a series of albums released several years ago called "Sounds of Nature," has consummated a distribution agreement with Reprise Records for an LP titled "The Masked Marauders."

The album, which has been the object of some excitement in the rock press, attained only limited circulation in its first month of release because, according to Deity President Solomon Penthaus, "We were not prepared for the sudden consumer demand."

"A number of prominent labels expressed interest in the project," he said, "but we settled with Warner Reprise after they guaranteed us complete artistic control and agreed to reissue our Sounds of Nature series."

Reprise plans to release the album as soon as possible but, Penthaus said, "It wil be necessary to remix the master, which wasn't quite up to industry standards."

Pending these technical refinements, the company is rushreleasing a single to fill interim demand.





Concert Review

Donovan Sweet Perfection



NEWYORK — Donovan, flowery as always and sweet as sugar (or was it cyclamate?), floated into Madison Square Garden with his special brand of hip reserve last Friday (17).

He managed to keep the 20,-000 fans' attention with his acoustic ballad sound for over two hours accompanied only by jazz flutist Paul Horn. Although Donovan really wants disciples he has only fans. They kept adding the inevitable New York clapping back-beat at inappropriate times and screaming out demands for his hits. The Scotch bard quieted them, however, with a smiling reprimand, allowing the merest hint of irritation to enter his serenity. Gradually he doled out his hits like a teacher handing candy to a class of eager kids, interspersed with dogma and ballads.

Behind all of the "perfection" is an immensely talented singer and writer. He is an unparelleled showman who has the crowd hanging on every innuendo. He also hits at all levels in his wooing of the flock, arranging his tactics from subtle humor to the Ed Sullivan - like invocation of the Mets. He is really far too talented to have to resort to such seductive techniques but he evidently enjoys his selfmade aloofness.

Donovan's appeal is in his perfection. His songs are strong enough to keep him filling arenas forever, but there is something a little spooky about his flawlessness. He is

detached from his songs which are abstractions rather than emotions. Ably guided by Mickie Most, Donovan is a bona fide super star but I have a feeling the sea that dwells beneath the smiles is not all that placid. Meanwhile, like Beardsley he paints flawless, charming, stylized pictures of nothingness which delight the ear while side-stepping the soul.

'Tommy' Rocks Fillmore East

NEW YORK - On Oct. 20, | the British rock group the Who gave the New York premiere performance of their rock opera (or oratorio, as it is more accurately called), "Tommy," at Billy Graham's Fillmore East.

The lengthy piece, already considered a classic both by rock connoisseurs and people in the record industry, was performed heartily and theatrically by the combo. After each section, the audience applauded appreciatively.

Although the performance was dynamic and the Who are among the most impressive acts working in rock today, there were three factors which prevented the show from being all that it might have been. First and foremost was the volume of the ensemble's instruments i.e., the gain was turned all the way up on their amplifiers, the result being that they were louder than even the old Paul Butterfield Blues Band used to be, and the sound was, to these ears at any rate, almost unbearable.

The second was that the Who deleted several extremely good numbers from the opera, including "Cousin Kevin" and "The Underture," and somehow this created a discontinuity that was disconcerting. The last and least disturbing point is that, like so many other rock groups



Shirley Bassey: They're Probably Still Standing at the Waldorf

By DOUG McCLELLAND

NEW YORK — It was a tossup who was more exhausted after Shirley Bassey's long Empire Room opening last week (20), the orgasmically explosive star or the audience which found itself rising at each bogus finale for at least six standing ovations.

Not that Miss Bassey didn't deserve one or two of them—on sheer stamina alone. For the flashing-eyed, attractive United Artists thrush spares no one when she works, not herself, not her audience, not even her conductor who happened to be standing nearby when the demonstrative lass suddenly got, as we used to say, "the urge to merge."

Miss Bassey has a walloping, passionate voice which she backs up—like it needed help with lively movement and gesture, utilizing her arms with particular effectiveness. In fact, there is probably no singer around who does more expressive, insinuating things with these limbs, which are usually engaged in caressing Miss Bassey and are probably the only choreographed arms in show business.

Not that there's anything wrong with the rest of her lithe body. Whenever she thought you weren't getting this message (a table in Siberia would be the only excuse), Miss Bassey would let you know "they call me a female Tom Jones." Or she'd sing about "Shirley," written for her by Leroy Holmes. She can bump with the best, too, this British subject, and her steamy "Big Spender" indicated she would be "bloody" (her Word for the Evening) good in some production of "Sweet Charity."

Also Has Humor


There is also a sense of humor smiling bravely beneath the bombast, and Miss Bassey would be wise to let it surface more often as she did with her laughingly fumbled, relaxed rendition of another Broadway ditty, "I'll Never Fall in Love Again," from "Promises, Promises."

The gal evoked cheers with her "head" medley: "I Think I'm Going Out of My—" and "You Go to My—." Ditto "I Who Have Nothing," "He's Not the Man for Me," "This is My Life," etc., on through what may be a Waldorf record for standing ovations — or so it probably seemed to opening night arches.

The songstress was clad in a spangled body stocking with a removable skirt, and after the last (positively) encore, she somehow was still able to parade in full plumage across the stage with her ensemble's spectacular blue and gold cape extended. Miss Bassey had to go and ask how the room liked it. One ringsider said, "You look like Danny LaRue." The star rather magnanimously explained that LaRue was "a drag queen back home."

Lib/UA Tape Ups Cassette **Prices, Issues Pik-Paks**

October is marked by two moves for Liberty/UA stereotape: a price hike for cassettes and the release of pik-pak boxes individually designed to compliment their contents, a first-time innovation for Liberty/UA.

Earl Horwitz, General Manaager for the tape division, disclosed that the suggested list price for single cassette cartridges is now \$6.98, with twinpak cartridges up to \$9.98.

Volumes I and II of Ferrante | and Teicher's 10th anniversary album have been released as eight-track cartridges in their own individually-designed pikpak boxes. Previous product has been released in the attractive 4"x12" theft deterrent containers, but the boxes carried only the Liberty/UA generic design. Packaging for the current Ferrante and Teicher releases declares the album title in bold type; volume I is boxed in red, volume II comes in avocado.

The October piano package is supplemented by header cards that will be utilized with browser boxes in the field, and with attractive counter consumer supplements listing all available Ferrante and Teicher tapes. Liberty/UA Stereo-Tape was the first major company to utilize the pik-pak concept, which it introduced last June with Johnny Rivers and Fifth Dimension product.

Horwitz expresed concern that many mass merchandisers haven't completely adapted to the new packaged tapes. "While the principle of the tape in a box is accepted, we know that many retailers are having problems converting to a packaged inventory -- everyone is in a of transition," said state Horwitz.

Some dealers have ordered the boxed tapes, while others are interested in the conventional cartridge sans box, "We are willing to absorb the cost of the box," continued Horwitz. "but trying to offer our product in both conventional and boxed versions presents us with additional problems of cost and logistics." The burden

of maintaining two separate inventories of the same album is increased by the nature of product, which often tape means keeping reel-to-reel. four-track, eight-track, and cassette inventories.

Other Releases

Other releases for October include a five cartridge "Tape Goes Jazz Revisited" series, a follow-up to the successful July jazz release. Horwitz feels that the new jazz series, with offerings from Stanley Turrentine, Horace Silver, Lou Donaldson. John Patton and Lonnie Smith, is even stronger than the July release.

Two more "move" music cartridges have been shipped. "Strings on the Move" features string renditions of "Romeo and Juliet," "More" and other standards. "Country and Western on the Move" draws from the Liberty catalogue of Slim Whitman, Del Reeves Bobby Goldsboro and others.

Other releases include "Keem-O-Sabe" by the Electric Indian, "Travelin' Trombones" by Trombones Unlimited, "Put a Little Love in Your Heart" by Jackie DeShannon (in simultaneous release with the disk LP) and banjo renditions by Freddy Morgan's "Bunch-A-Banjos on Broadway." "Underground Gold" is a treasury of Canned Heat, Johnny Winter, Traffic, Spencer Davis Group and others.





mann, Gallagher's assistant at Decca, will become Executive Vice President of the new Gulf+ Western Company and said that the top operating executives of the several companies which now comprise the new G+W music unit will continue in their present posts.

He said William Stinson, Executive Vice President and General Manager of the music publishing firms, will remain in that post as will James Stewart, President, and Al Bell, Executive Vice President, of Stax-Volt Records.

Judelson said: "Mr. Gallagher brings to Gulf+Western a successful 21-year career in progressive management, coupled with innovative ideas, to direct the extensive record and music publishing assets of the former Paramount Music Division. We expect he and Jack Wiedenmann will lead our team of top operational and creative executives to substantially increase our activities in the music industry."

He noted that the record industry alone has become a \$1.2 billion a year industry, double its volume of 10 years ago. "In this past year alone," Judelson stated, "the pre-recorded tape segment of the industry has leaped from \$50 million to what is estimated at \$400 million by the end of this year. We expect to gain an ever increasing share of this market."

An important direction for the new company will be the establishment of Famous Music Company as a major factor in the burgeoning world markets for records and tapes. "This international business is expanding especially in Britain, Japan and Germany," Judelson noted, "and we intend to become a more important factor in the worldwide music boom."

Though it is a separate unit, the new music company will continue to co-ordinate closely with Gulf+Western's other leisuretime operations, especially with Paramount Features and Paramount Television divisions.

Gallagher announced that the new organization will allow both a broader and wider operation. "In co-operation with other Gulf+Western Leisure-Time companies, the new Famous Music Company, will begin a major thrust to develop new composers, producers and recording artists."

Gallagher, who was named "Record Man of the Decade" last year by the National Association of Record Merchandisers, said he plans to seek new independent record producers "because that's the trend of the business." He stressed. "I am particularly pleased to be associated with the Stax-Volt organization, with Jim Stewart and Al Bell. In addition to planning for their continued growth as the guiding forces behind the success of Stax-Volt, I'll be looking to both these men to play an even broader operational and creative role than before, And, of course, I shall rely heavily on the expertise of Bill Stinson in the music publishing field."

In New York for Now

Judelson said the new company will maintain executive headquarters in New York and will move into the parent company's new Gulf+Western Headquarters Building, now under construction at Columbus Circle, when it is completed early next year. Divisional operations will continue in their present locations.

Gallagher joined Famous Music Company as President in October, 1969, following nearly two years as Executive Vice President of MCA's Decca Records. Prior to joining MCA, Gallagher was associated with CBS and Columbia Records for 16 years. He joined CBS Records as a District Sales Manager in Kansas City, Mo. and subsequently, managed Regional offices in Cleveland, Detroit and Philadelphia, then came to their New York offices in 1955 as Training Director of Marketing and Merchandising.

In 1957, he was promoted to National Sales Manager and in May of 1961 was elevated to Vice President and Director of Sales, and then to Vice President of Marketing for the CBS R e c o r d s Division. He was named Vice President and General Manager of Columbia Records in August, 1965.

Wiedenmann entered the music business as Operations Manager for Columbia Records in Philadelphia in 1959. Two years later he was named Operations Director of the Columbia Home Music Library and in 1963 was named Assistant to the Marketing Vice President of Columbia Records. In 1965 Wiedenmann was named Director of A&R at Columbia and two years ago was appointed Vice President and General Manager of Kapp Records, a position he held until he was named head of A&R and Creative Services at Decca.

ords because the artists, the songs and the sounds are good and they do not place boundaries in any particular areas of taste—no matter how the industry might type them," he says.

As examples Lasker cited Johnny Cash and Glen Campbell as artists that the recordbuying public did not type as country, and Dunhill's own Steppenwolf as artists that did not remain in the so-called underground bag.

It is Lasker's contention that if Steppenwolf had been limited to that area that they would be "out of business today." The group was played on all types of stations and sold universally and consequently is one of the top acts in the country today. As an example of trying to restrict their appeal, he said that as Steppenwolf's audience widened, the underground papers began to rap them as being too commercial.

Lasker stated that his label is not specialized, but is dedicated to producing good sounds and new sounds for a general audience. Backing up his statement is the new Dunhill release containing albums by Mama Cass, Three Dog Night, the Grass Roots, an LP containing songs from "Easy Rider," "Monster" by Steppenwolf which he described as 'telling what's happening in the United States today in a constructive manner," and the Bangor Flying Circus, introducing a new group and a new sound.


Concerning the latter, Lasker said the industry should make a concentrated effort to convince top 40 stations to play the new sounds so that new acts are not limited in their exposure and not "categorized" and can reach all types of listeners and record buyers. Flack's LP, "First Take," which also snagged many re-orders.

Sales of Atlantic's 8-track cartridges ran higher during this first week of the fall sales program than in previous sales programs. According to tape sales chief Bob Kornheiser, tape sales ran at 25 per cent of album sales, an all-time high figure for the firm. All of the new Atlantic-Atco LPs were issued simultaneously on 8-track cartridges.

The Atlantic fall sales program encompasses heavy radio advertising, strong in-store merchandising and potent window displays. The program will be supported also by advertising in underground and consumer magazines.

La Lupe Thrills St. George Hotel

BROOKLYN — La Lupe, the undisputed Queen of Latin Soul, turned in her annual performance at the St. George Hotel bringing an expectant Spanish-speaking audience to a frenzy with an incredible postmidnight performance (18). The crowd was at least a thousand but sounded like 10,-000 as it hung onto every word, note and gesture of the performance.

Despite an atrocious sound system and some questionable arrangements, La Lupe's musical genius came through. The magic that captures everyone in sight was quite clear. She is less a singer, although her voice is unforgettable, than a presence. To describe her as a Spanish Janis Joplin or a female James Brown is only to scratch the surface of her style. She flaunts her sex, throws herself totally out to her people and reaches an incomparable level of frenzy. Superlatives just don't do the trick of conveying La Lupe's magic or her special brand of wisdom which is as intoxicating as the Bob Dylan type. Mostly she's a woman, a sex symbol for real.

Hopefully, she will make herself available to English speaking audiences in the future, who could certainly use a queen. La Lupe records for Roulette Records, thus far mostly in Spanish. —Dan Goldberg.



UFA and Vienna Boheme Publishers, one of the most important European publishers with thousands of copyrights and standards, is now celebrating their 50th year in action. Currently heading this mammoth pubbery is Rudolf Förster, known to the trade as "Rudy."

German television will do a show featuring some of the composers and artists whose copyrights adorn this catalogue, such as Robert Stolz, Cedric Dumont, Franz Grothe, Michael Jary, Nico Dostal and Friedrich Holländer.

The firm started in Vienna in 1919. Otto Hein was the founder of Vienna Boheme Verlag. Some of the first hits were written then by Robert Stolz, including "Salome" in the '20s. Another world hit was Robert Katscher's song, originally known as "Madonna, Du Bist Schöner Als der Sonnenschein," then made famous by Paul Whiteman as, "When Day Is Done." Another Vienna Boheme world hit was "Just a Gigolo." In 1931, UFA took on the firm. UFA then was the leading motion picture producer with thousands of movie songs. Famous stars such as Marlene Dietrich, Lilian Harvey and Zarah Leander sang their songs to hitdom.

Since 1962, the firm has been based mainly in Munich. Rudy Förster has been handling the firms for the past 11 years.



Club Reviews

Week-end with the Folks

NEW YORK-Folk music, of course, has never left. But commercially, it's news that folk is happening. Not only have the old names in folk been popping up but a whole new generation of urban folk artists was developed. Center of this renaissance, just as it was eight years ago, is the Village Gaslight, which recently has been taken over by its original owner, Sam Hood. Folk is being revived, being created and, most important to those in the business, drawing crowds. Typical was last weekend (Oct. 10-12).

The Gaslight was full on Friday as people waited outside to see Janis Ian, folk's first child prodigy who brought her way with words from the High School of Music and Art to the Top 40 with "Society's Child" a few years back. There were two drastic improvements in her style since that early intellectual teenager-in-love period. For one thing, she has a couple of years of performing behind her and has turned into a charming lady. Second, her material is a little more subtle and hence wears better. She has become, along the way, a good performer and a pretty good musician, adding an articulate piano to her familiar guitar strum. While her old image was strictly for teenies, her new thing, mellow, relaxed and genuinely entertaining, may have an appeal far beyond the Gaslight. Janis still records for MGM.

Splendid Showcase

The next night at the Gaslight proved to be a splendid showcase of some of the new folk writers who are sure to follow in the footsteps of their Gaslight predecessors, who include Bob Dylan, Peter Paul and Mary and virtually every important folk artist of this decade. The most spectacular of the new talent is named Loudon Wainwright III. Lyrically in a class by himself, he adds to his verbiage with an unforgettable voice and a glazed speedy presence which connotes genius and/or insanity. Wainwright, prophetic and satirical, and absolutely unique, has not yet signed his Anglo-Saxon soul to a record company. It won't be long, undoubtedly. He has been performing at the Gaslight on and off for a few weeks and will continue do do so.

Also present was S. David Cohen who recorded a couple of albums under the name of

David Blue. His material gets a little boring at times but his singing is strong and betrays a few years of hardship. His eyes gleam behind a weather-beaten, whiskered face. Tom Ghent, who recorded an album for Tetragrammaton, played a few songs looking pained by circumstance but sounding better than on his disk. His "Merry-Go-Round" is a classic beauty sounding something like a folk Buddy Holly. The Gaslight usually deals in talent and feeling rather than image, and its lack of self-conscious "hipness" makes it a far more enjoyable place to be than most of its better-known competitors.

Sky Full House


Meanwhile, over at the Washington Square Church, Verve artist Pat Sky played to a full house at a benefit for Izzy Young's Folklore Center. Sky, originally from Georgia, is really an urban folksinger, and he entertained the collegy crowd with his country instrumental work and his citified humor as in "Don't Get Too Close To The Screen Door Grandma Or You'll Strain Yourself." Sky's humor is sometimes more forced than funny, but his music is his own and it's good. He was accompanied by the equally talented Eric Frandsen whose dead-pan humor and unmatched guitarpicking added greatly to the show. Sky's "comeback" will obviously be no problem as his name alone is able to fill the hall and his talent sufficient to please the customers.

P-S Program Pays Off

Jimmy lenner, Director of Talent and Production for Peer Southern Publishers and Lucky Carle P.S. Professional Manager, announced that Peer Southern's major talent development program has paid off handsomely as their contract signings hit a peak.

The program which began nine months ago involved the rebuilding of Peer Southern's New York studios and spreading the word that P-S was searching for new, young, creative producers, managers and artists. The next step involved beefing up the internal Peer Southern promotion departments on both coasts and the addition of a number of indie promotion men to their field staff.

Based on the concept of freedom for the creative person, the program is unusual in that Peer Southern plays the role of matchmaker between the production and the recording talent, much like the publisher who in the past brought lyrn cists and composers together. The program discovers, develops, matches and negotiates on behalf of production talent and then promotes and publicizes it. An additional built-in advantage of the P-S program for artists is that it keeps their copyrights alive. The program has yielded over 15 releases to date and now gives Carle and Ienner 11 major productions with mutual first refusal.

The two newest projects of the P.S. program are the January Tyme Stax/Volt "The First Time" LP and a Mike Millius Uni LP, "Desperado." Stax/ Volt and Peer Southern plan a major promo for the January Tyme LP which consists of all original material and was produced by Fox/Tyme Productions in conjunction with Jimmy lenner. The Millius LP is a collection of original contemporary songs produced for Peer Southern by Don Thomas. Both the January Tyme and the Mike Millius LPs were recorded in the Peer Southern studios with P.S. publishing this material exclusively.

Peer Southern has 15 releases by major artists set for the next four months and four major production deals pending. Ienner and Carle will be returning from the Coast shortly after completing negotiations with major labels for Peer Southern artists and beefing up the P.S. West Coast operations.

Rene-Reinach Produce LPs To Read Best-Sellers By

Joe Rene and Jackie Reinach, veterans of dozens of music world enterprises, have formed Discobook, Inc., to produce specially-created scores for bestselling novels.

The initial project is Music to Read the Pretenders By, just released by Philips Records. It launches the new company with a song score for Gwen Davis' best-selling novel about the international jet set, "The Pretenders."

The book publishing industry is showing keen interest over this previously unexplored method of merchandising books and records. The albums will be made available in bookstores nationally, as well as record marts, with sales being handled by the major national record distributing outlets.

Rene, composer-conductor-arranger-producer, is president of Rene Enterprises, a music complex. Discobook is an affiliate of that firm. Rene received his first BMI award several years ago as co-composer of the R&B smash, "Tossin' and Turnin'," later produced hits for King, Epic and RCA, among others.

Jackie Reinach, a member of ASCAP and the Dramatists Guild, is best known as a serious writer of children's songs and boasts more than 300 to her credit with sales of several million. She has also written extensively for the TV commercial field and legitimate theater.

The album's liner notes have been written by "Pretenders" author Davis, and the cover is a blow-up of the book's hardcover jacket. The music is performed by the Joe Rene Complex.

Philips, which has a non-exclusive arrangement with Discobook, is releasing a single of the main theme song, "If You Pretend," along with the album. It is being merchandised along with a printed promotional piece being sent to 5000 deejays and radio stations.

Discobook has hired DeNave-Leshin to publicize the enterprise, and has its own national record promotion staff augmenting Phillips' regular organization.

Special bookmarks announcing the album will be inserted into copies of the book and a further extensive campaign is being mounted by the World Publishing Co., publishers of the hardcover; and New American Library, publishers of the forthcoming paperback. Radio-TV appearances by author Gwen Davis beginning Nov. 5, will plug the record as well as the book, and both Rene and Reinach will be made available for in-person interviews later in the month.

Titles of the songs, designed to stimulate talk, are subtitled with the pages that inspired them, such as "Menage a Trois (Music to Read Pages 54-55 By)" and "Double Bubble Bath (Music to Read Page 331 By)."

Rene-Reinach explain that purchasers don't have to read the book to enjoy the music, or vice-versa, but add that it is a more satisfying experience if they do.


The new facility was the site of the first off-Broadway Board of Directors meeting for ASCAP on Oct. 15.

Lamb's country-keyed Doubletalk label is armed with product ammunition by Christina Christi, whose first effort, "Be Somebody for Billy," hit the charts earlier this year, plus disks by such artists as Sam Smith (with a current release, "Lyin' in the Hurt" and "Second Car Cheatin' on Me"), Jim Lunsford and others. Doubletalk has eight acts on its growing roster.



Whitfield; Gospel Songwriter of the Year, Bill Gaither; Best Female Vocalist, Vestal Goodman; Best Male Vocalist, James Blackwood; Best Record Album of the Year, "It's Happening" (Oak Ridge Boys); Gospel Song of the Year, "Jesus Is Coming Soon" (Winsett); Best Mixed Group, the Speer Family; and Best Male Group, the Imperials.

The special award, Gospel Music Ambassador Award, went to W. F. Myers, Director of International Relations for SESAC, Inc. and President of GMA.

The association presented to the award winners the "Dove," a symbol of peace and unity. As part of the decorations at the banquet held in the Skyway Room of the Sheraton-Peabody, a seven-foot replica of the "Dove" award was placed on the stage where the awards were presented.
