Hit Prescription: 'Valley of Dolls'

Well, the screen version of Jacqueline Susann's phenomenal "Valley of the Dolls" is ready to be uncorked, and it's every bit as good as the book.

Twentieth Century-Fox has spared neither coin nor cliché to see that the saga of four easy gals about Hollywood, Broadway and Europe (three on drugs, one on "fugs") has gotten its due. Most of the characters from Miss Susann's novel are present: the cosmetics pitchwoman (Barbara Parkins), the beloved filmusical queen (Patty Duke), the blonde sex symbol (Sharon Tate) and the badmouthed Broadway musical star (Susan Hayward). If you haven't already, pick your real-life prototypes-your chances of guessing wrong are as slight as a Susann heroine's virtue.

Most of the dialogue and situations have slipped into early talkies folklore, and ingenues Parkins, Tate and Duke would have been laughed out of Forty-Second Street." Little Patty, in particular, is aggressively offensive with her endless dress-up debauching in the last half. The outstanding performance is Miss Hayward's. Looking at least as attractive as the three youngsters (although La Duke refers to her at one point as "Grandma"). the veteran actress - despite the character's tough manner -provides, as in the book, the only really sympathetic portrayal. Her scenes are much too few, but they have a gutsy thrust lacking just about everywhere else.

Dory and André Previn have written several songs spotted

throughout and heard on the Fox soundtrack LP, but it's anybody's guess who is really singing. Apparently, Liberty Records' Tony Scotti, touching as a brain-damaged crooner, does his own; as does, of course, Scepter's Dionne Warwick, who is heard but not seen on the film's theme. Interestingly, Miss Duke has a United Artists LP out of songs from the picture.

It was directed by Mark Robson who directed the film of "Peyton Place" which as a TV series stars Miss Parkins. All of which sounds faintly, appropriately incestuous. In short, "Valley of the Dolls," its glaring-no, blinding-deficiencies notwithstanding, is a certain box office hit.

Stinson, Executive Vice-President and General Manager of the Paramount Picture music publishing division, Monument recording star Don Cherry just recorded the main theme, "Lonely Rider," for the soundtrack of "Will Penny," starring Charlton Heston and Joan Hackett, it was confirmed by Fred Foster, Monument President.

In addition to the soundtrack. Cherry will also cut a single record version of "Lonely Rider" for Monument this week so that the record can be issued by mid-January overseas, due to the advance playdates of the film abroad, with USA release of the record slated for sometime in February, tying in with the March premiere in the USA.

Negro Stations, Del Shields Figure in Newsweek Article


'While the Money is Green, The **Power is Strictly White**

Negro radio stations were examined by Newsweek magazine last week in a lengthy article that closed with a few quotes from NATRA's, WLIB-FM's and Record World's Del Shields, concerning the future of Negro stations as community boosters.

Shields said, "If you're not interested in serving the Negro community, then stop calling yourself a Negro station."

The article studied the sophistication of Negro radio stations and their increased sales power.

In its essentially critical report Newsweek wrote this: "While the money is green, the power is strictly white. Of all the stations broadcasting to the ghettos, only five are owned by Negroes. There is just one Negro station manager and few top Negro executives; on many stations only the disk jockeys and janitors are black. And whites, for the most part, pick



the music. Nor are the majority of Negro stations truly responsive to their listener's needs. They simply present a weary diet of rhythm 'n' blues and 'nigger-talking' deejays."

NEW YORK-Ben Bart, personal manager of James Brown, has resumed his managerial duties with the artist after a three-month vacation in the Caribbean and Miami.


His record company boss, Gutner Ilgner of Cornet Records, flew from Cologne to Amsterdam to get Cockie's signature on the Victor contract prepared by Dick Ettlinger of New York. His first single, "Too Young for Love" backed with "Prisoner of the Bottle," has been released stateside by Victor. Cockie's arranger-producer, bearded Ted Powder, goes out for the "soft sound" and baroque beat style using a 14th Century organ with oboe, flute, strings, guitars, and the tapes are flown into New York, where RCA puts on an American rhythm section, doctoring the tapes for American consumption.

Cockie specializes on the lute. He doesn't wear blue jeans, but 18th Century suits. In his spare moments, Cockie still likes to walk the streets and canals of Amsterdam, playing his lute; but now busy TV schedules in Germany, Holland and Belgium and soon the USA take up his time.

His LP, "From Cockie with Love," is enroute to RCA. And the man who made this all possible for Cockie Kay in the USA is publisher George Pincus who now has an exclusive contract for all of Cockie's songs. Perhaps George will receive a Rembrandt for Christmas.

A very important new single-release is "I See the Rain" by the English group, the Marmalade coupled with "Laughing Man," as well as the second CBS single by Bettye Swann: "Fall in Love With Me" "Lonely Love."

A very good Christmas album by the Philadelphian Brass Emsemble was recently released containing works of Brade, Pezel, Reiche and Holborne.

One of the most important Christmas albums of this year "A Barbra Streisand's Christmas Album" . . . CBS releases in the pop LP field include the English Folk group 3 city 4 with their first CBS album "Smoke and Dust" as well as a re-release of Doris Day's "Do Re Mi" with Jimmy Joyce and his Children's Chorus.

This week the repertoire of ABC was added to that of the Bovema EMI Gramophonehouse. Bovema's manager of the American repertoires, Joop Visser, released at the same time on ABC Ray Charles, "Yesterday," the albums "Live at the Playboy Club in Hollywood" of Della Reese and "I'll Take Care of Your Cares" by Frankie Laine.

Four impressive blues albums are show cased in first Bluesway release: the Chicago-blues of Jimmy Reed, the album of Otis Spain, the real Kansas City blues by Jimmy Rushing with the all-star-formation of Oliver Nelson and the live album of John Lee Hooker.

Bovema released the wonderful album "With Love" of Cher. "You Better Sit Down Kids" by Cher is a hot one in Holland. Besides the Beatles, the Small Faces, the Beach Boys, the Move, Procol Harum, the Hollies, the Nice and many other groups now, the Pretty Things were added to the Gramophonehouse. "Defecting Grey" was released this week. The release of "Hello Goodbye" by the Beatles and "Every - Body Knows" by the Dave Clark Five have created a sensation in Holland. Bovema has released the great Uni single "Incense and Peppermint" by the Strawberry Alarm Clock. A special press campaign is planned on behalf of this record.

With the merriment of the Christmas season upon us, it is gratifying to note that with the abundance of seasonal material, the recording companies have taken note of the need to include the jazz musicians. This added emphasis on having the jazz artist record Christmas material has been somewhat of a windfall for the jazz disk jockeys who are faced each year with just a minimal number of recordings.

Although there still is insufficient material, it is encourag-



ing to know that the jazz record shows will no longer be barren ones in finding suitable material for air play.

The following is a check list of current Christmas ma-

terial performed by jazz artists or jazz oriented artists.

In "Ella Fitzgerald's Christmas" (Capitol), Ralph Carmichael's Orchestra and Chorus surrounds the first lady with a velvety backing that does magic for Ella's "O Holy Night," "Silent Night" and "O Little Town of Bethlehem." An earlier album still in release is "Ella Wishes You a Swinging Christmas," on Verve. In this album, Ella is backed by Frank DeVol and Orchestra. There is more emphasis on pop material and secular material: "Jingle Bells," "Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas," "Good Morning Blues," etc.

Lou Rawls, whose popularity crosses all music tastes, will have a joyous Christmas airing from jazz jocks with his "Merry Christmas Ho! Ho! Ho!" for Capitol. H. B. Barnum conducts for Lou who offers: "The Little Drummer Boy," "Santa Claus is Coming to Town," "What Are You Doing New Year's Eve?" and "Christmas will Really Be Christmas."

From the creative world of Stan Kenton comes a "Merry Christmas!" also Capitol. The big band of Stan interprets in his imaginative style some of the classics including "We Three Kings of Orient Are," "Good King Wenceslas" and "The Twelve Days of Christmas."

What was formerly "Christmas '64" for the master of the Hammond organ, Verve's Jimmy Smith, has now become "Christmas Cookin'." Jimmy's Christmas package is very modern wrapped up in arrangements by Oliver Nelson including some of the following: "God Rest Ye Merry Gentlemen," "Jingle Bells," "The Christmas Song" and "Santa Claus Is Coming To Town."

"Ramsey Lewis, Sound of Christmas," on Cadet, was recorded in 1961. And the freshness of the trio was never better as they are augmented by a band conducted by Riley Hampton. "Merry Christmas Baby," "Winter Wonderland" and "Christmas Blues" are some of the songs offered.

"More Sounds of Christmas" is a later offering of Ramsey, the Trio and Orchestra, on Cadet. Here the group offers a varied program of "Snowbound," "The Twelve Days of Christmas," "Egg Nog" and "Plum Puddin'."

On "The Christmas Sound," Nat King Cole's velvety voice weaves a magical spell in his Capitol Christmas package: "The Christmas Song," "Deck The Hall" and "Adeste Fideles." Ralph Carmichael does the conducting here, and the album is a real Christmas chestnut, in the best sense.

"This Time of Year, June Christy," Capitol, offers a set of Christmas originals with the big band of Pete Rugolo backing the misty Miss Christy superbly. A number of the originals here certainly should become Christmas standards: "Christmas Heart," "Ring a Merry Bell," "Hang Them on the Tree."

"Al Hirt's the Sound of Christmas." RCA, has the big horn filled with Christmas a plenty. Al's brass is at his best here and as always projecting a sound of bright jolly spirit: "Nutty Jingle Bells," "I Saw Mommy Kissing Santa Claus," "Sleigh Ride," "What Child is This?"

"Winter Wonderland — Earl Grant," Decca, is a winter wonderland including "Silver Bells," "Winter Wonderland," "White Christmas," "The Christmas Song." This is a varied album of some of Earl's best vocalizing and organ as well as piano work.

These albums are by no means all of the Christmas material. However, they rank among the best this reporter has heard to date.



The occasion drew talent merchandisers from all across the nation, including a delegation from the Hubert Long Talent Agency.

Long and Associate, Louie Dunn, displayed the wares of the HLTA stable of stars and returned to Nashville with reports of greater-than-ever response to the country music product. An increasing demand for country talent has been a fact of life at fairs and expositions in every corner of the nation for the past several years.

"We noted every country music representative seemed to be doing a brisk business," Long commented, "and we were able to develop sunshine circuit calendars for several of our artists. An early indication points toward a banner Country and Western year. David Houston, Tammy Wynette, Bill Anderson, Ferlin Husky, Leroy Van Dyke and George Jones were particularly in demand."





An interesting footnote to this barrage of important product is that it reverses the usual policy companies follow of issuing albums in November for Christmas and then laying low in December.

The first of these, to deal with the subject of "Pop Singles and their Promotion," will feature Bill Gavin as moderator. A second seminar on classical product will follow immediately. NARM Makes Firm Commitment to Tape Biz

PHILADELPHIA — The Board of Directors of NARM has revealed its commitment to the idea of tape cartridges as an ever more important part of the record industry.

Announcement was made by NARM Exec Director Jules Malamud, following the recent Board meeting in Los Angeles.

This commitment will be implemented at the annual convention, which will be held March 17 through March 22, 1968, at the Diplomat Hotel in Hollywood, Fla. This, the 10th Anniversary NARM Convention, will place substantial emphasis on tape cartridges, devoting considerable time to the growing new industry in the way of workshops and seminars, as well as to educational displays.

Of prime interest to tape cartridge wholesalers and manufacturers will be the use in 1968 of the time formerly devoted to the NARM Mid Year Meeting for holding the first all-tape cartridge convention under the aegis of NARM. This meeting will be held Sept. 3 through Sept. 6, 1968, at the Continental Plaza Hotel, Chicago.

It will feature a complete educational program of business sessions and workshops directed at the wholesalers and manufacturers of tape cartridge product, and will also feature a Person to Person schedule. A portion of this meeting, however, may still be devoted to record industry business.







According to Mort Hoffman, Epic's Director, Sales and Promotion, great care has been taken by Epic and by Donovan himself in planning and supervising the packaging of both the set and the individual albums.


