BOOMERANG?

Implications and inferences about the unsavory character of juke box operators that have appeared in the public prints recently may boomerang, because of the testimony aired before the Senate Rackets Committee.

Operators, this testimony reveals, are embattled against efforts by hoodlums and coercive groups to take over the industry.

Coverage in the newspapers of the hearing shows that unsavory elements have made the juke box industry a prime target. Reports on testimony also show that operators, through valid trade associations and individual integrity have fought the attemps of the hoodlums to move in.

Unfortunately, most persons read headlines and skim through stories. Buried in the accounts are statements that exonerate most operators from the implications of the headlines.

The courage shown by Al Denver of the Music Operators of New York and other operators in their dealings with the hoodlum elements are to be applauded.

From all the testimony and the hearings, a salutary effect may result – the atmosphere may be cleared of unwarranted charges and innuendo.

To capitalize on this possibility, we hope a positive program of public relations will be formulated by the MOA at convention time.

The evils spotlighted by the Senate Rackets Committee pertain to elements other than reputable operators.



MUSIC ON RECORDS—INTERNATIONAL LANGUAGE AND COMMODITY

When rock and roll won its startling acceptance all over the world a few years ago, cynics said it proved that music was an international language. Not even in America, where the idiom was spawned, it was pointed out, did everyone comprehend rock and roll vocals. Thus, if nobody understood, then everybody understood.

Last year, the biggest popular record in the United States was "Volare" or "Nel Blu Dipinto di Blu," suug by Domenico Modugno in Italian. Because of the surrealist imagery of the lyrics, it was claimed that the words did not make sense to the Italians either.

There are reports that records by Patti Page are smuggled into Red China and bring fantastic prices on the black market. Miss Page is noted for the precision of her diction. But are her words understood by the Chinese?

International musical exchanges are not new. We welcome foreign artists and our popular and classical artists win acelaim abroad. America is one of the few countries in the world where oppras are not sung in the language spoken by its citizens.

Every now and then, stories appear in our newspapers citing the tremendous acceptance accorded our popular artists. The most recent detailed the record-breaking attendance attracted by Louis Armstrong. While Armstrong has played this circuit before and has been around long enough to win recognition, a teenager such as Paul Anka can tour the Orient successfully.

Even country music artists win large audiences outside the United States. Considering that the lyrics of country songs often include local idioms and native expressions rather than regular English, the success of these artists abroad is noteworthy.

One reason for the appeal of American musical artists abroad is definite: Recordings have made them familiar to the audiences. American records are being exported in ever-increasing numbers. On deejay shows, juke boxes and in private homes, American records communicate with listeners. Thus, our performers can play to "conditioned" audiences.

Whereas records used to achieve popularity abroad long after they reached the top of the charts here, the time lag is diminishing. This may be due to speeded transports and swifter communications and TV tape recordings.

Similarly, Americans now get foreign hits faster. There is also a curiosity factor at work in this situation. A few weeks ago, Shirley MacLaine, substituting for Dinah Shore on TV, built a show around Japanese entertainers. The singers sang American songs and an instrumentalist plunked on an ancient stringed instrument.

"Can you play this?" Shirley asked and hummed the opening phrase of "When the Saints Go Marching In." In response the Japanese girl swung into the old Dixieland classic with rhythmic verve.

Record manufacturers who must be alert to trends and developments are setting up distributorships all over the world. Even in lands where the musical idioms and traditions differ radically from our own, American records are selling. Thus, when American artists perform in those countries, the audiences want to see the visitors "in person."

In our own country, the recording has replaced "the road" for the performer. The record reaches towns, suburbs and rural outposts that could not possibly be reached by one-night stands or through the coaxial cables of TV.

And now records are reaching remote parts of the world, building followings for the artists.

Which leads us to the question: "Does the artist make the record, or does the record make the artist?"

There will be six forum meetings in addition to two general business meetings, reports George A. Miller, president of MOA.

The second forum meeting, beginning at 10:30 A.M. on April 6, will cover "Percentages, Depreciation, Tax Forms" and the "National Tax Council and Its Advantages." John Wallace, Leo Kaner, Nicholas E. Allen and William Hullinger will be panelists.

The third forum meeting, set for 7 P.M. April 6, will deal with "Diversified Operation and Its Necessity, as Well as the Financial Benefits of Such Routes." Discussants will be J. Harry Snodgrass, William Blatt, Lewis Ptacek, Jake Friedman and Pete Weyh.

"Future Copyright Legislation, Public Relation and National Publicity" will be discussed April 7 at 7 P.M., by C. S. Pierce, C. G. Silla, Max Hurvich, Victor Ostergren and K. A. Cormney.

James K. Hutzler, James Tolisano, David Baker, Harlan Wingrave and Lloyd Cramer will preside at the fifth forum meeting Wednesday, April 8, at 9:30 A.M., to consider "Personal Property Tax, Discriminating City, County and State Licenses."

"Sales, Location Relationships, Loans; Location Leases and Their Advantages" will be the subject of the sixth forum session Wednesday at 11 A.M., with Carl Pavesi, Tom P. Withrow, Joe Lederman, Frank Fabiano and Gordon Stout as moderators.

Green Title Strips For St. Patrick's Day

Green title strips have been distributed by the Hit Parade Program Service to subscribers who are programming Irish music in their locations for St. Patrick's Day, March 17. The strips have been issued to allow sufficient time for servicing the boxes.

Public Relations Program Planned

A "national public relations program second to none," is regarded by George A. Miller, president of MOA, as the next important venture to be undertaken by the operators' association.

"It is a crying shame," Miller says, "that the great majority of fine persons in the juke box business suffer because of a few unscrupulous persons who have associated themselves with the automatic phonograph industry."

The public relations program will remedy the adverse and unfair criticism leveled against the entire industry because of the activities of a few.

The subject of public relations will be discussed at the MOA Convention at the Hotel Morrison in Chicago April 6, 7 and 8.

■ "Money Management Tips for Juke Box Operators," by Leo Kaner, CPA and tax counselor for the MOA, has been sent to MOA Members. George A. Miller, president of MOA, reports that requests from members for specific information have been forwarded to Kaner.

Miller also reports that several non-members of MOA have requested tax information and wishes to remind all operators that only MOA members can obtain the services of the National Tax Council.

Kaner is scheduled to speak at a forum meeting at the April Convention of the MOA and will answer questions from the floor.

Mercury Primes For International Record Market

CHICAGO – Ken Myers, Mercury's director of advertising provertion, heads the label's new promotion division, which consolidates all press, promotion and publicity activities, in a move to give fuller attention to the expanding international record market.

"No facet of the record industry can equal the growth ratio attained in recent times by the overseas market," Mvers points out. By way of example, he notes that Mercury now has 33 foreign affiliates and licens a who distribute the label's records in every country this side of the Iron Curtain.

Working with Myers will be Tom Schlesinger, former PR director for the firm, who is now in charge of international artist relations, and Michael Kerr. Dorothy Deero replaces Schlesinger in the press relations post.

The promotion division headed by Myers will be working closely with Irving Green, Mercury president, who personally developed the label's network of foreign affiliates, and with Brice Somers, director of the international division, whose headquarters are in Geneva, Switzerland.

3 New Kern Tunes Recorded On Atlantic LP

NEW YORK – Atlantic Records recently recorded three previously unpublished, unrecorded Jerome Kern tunes in an LP entitled "Premiere Performance! George Byron Sings New & Rediscovered Jerome Kern Songs."

Byron was a favorite singer of Kern's and one of the composer's close personal friends. Now married to Kern's widow, Byron came upon the songs recently while examining some of the manuscripts left untouched since the composer's death in 1945. They had neither lyrics nor even suggested titles, so Byron forwarded them to Dorothy Fields, the lyrist of so many of Kern's greatest songs. She gave the songs words and their titles: "Nice To Be Near;" "Introduce Me" and "April Fooled Me."

They were recorded by Atlantic in a closed session at the Capitol Studios in Hollywood. Andre Previn served as conductor-arranger-pianist for the occasion. Except for Previn, not a single member of the 27-piece orchestra was aware that he was playing "new' Kern material. In order to preclude any "leak," Kern's name was omitted from the music parts.





Peggy's `Man' Going Strong

After "Fever" registered high on the popularity barometer, Peggy Lee has come through with a hot version of "My Man" for Capitol that makes her "My Gal" for disc fanciers.

Making hit records for Capitol is nothing new for Peggy, whose "Manana," sold over a million copies. When she doesn't write her own songs, she devises unique arrangements in her sound proof studio in her home atop Coldwater Canyon in California.

Peggy, who was born in Jamestown, North Dakota, was a soloist in her highschool glee club and belonged to a church choir. After working with some semi-pro college bands, she decided to make singing her career and headed for Hollywood. Only one night club date resulted.

Back home she went and landed a job on WDAY in Fargo and doubled at the Powers Hotel. This led to an engagement at the Raddison Hotel in Minneapolis. She moved on to sing with Will Osborne, got song singing dates in California, then began to hit her stride with Benny Goodman's band.

She's since played all the major nightclubs and TV shows, and won an Academy Award nomination for her performance in "Pete Kelly's Blues." She wrote the lyrics for Disney "Lady and the Tramp" and the more recent George Pal picture, "Tom Thumb."

One of her greatest fans is another Capitol stylist, Frank Sinatra, who conducted the orchestra for her "Man I Love" album.

Shortly after "Fever" was released, Peggy actually did develop fever and was confined to her home for several months. Now she's active again. Next on her agenda is a series of spiritual-type of songs.

Meanwhile, "My Man" gets lots of play dates.


