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Deejay Organization?

This is being written just as the deejay convention in Miami is getting underway and we don't know what the outcome of the various seminars and meetings will be.

However, Bill Gavin, who has been plumping for a deejay organization in his newsletter, poses some interesting questions. They may be answered at the convention — or they may be left unsettled.

Bill believes the deejays should run their own convention, while paying respects to the organizational efforts of Bill Stewart and the Storz chain.

He asks: "Are disc jockies . . . too passive, too self-centered, too individualistic, too cynical, to take an active part in planting and organizing their own national conventions? These charges have been made but I can't accept them. I believe that there are enough of us willing to devote some of our time and abilities throughout the year, so that there is a genuine prospect for making a National Disc lockey Association a practical reality.

"Whether we could organize solidly enough within a year to swing our own 1960 convention, I don't know," Gavin continues. "I do know that the same convention management organization that sets things up for the NAB would be available to coordinate plans for us. I've been assured that the record companies, the trade press and the owners of many important radio operations would co-operate with a responsible disc jockey organization."

The question is one that had been allotted an hour on the convention floor. We'll be waiting to learn what happens.

ILLINOIS TOWN'S BAN ON JUKE BOXES MAY SET DANGEROUS PRECEDENT FOR INDUSTRY

RIVER FOREST, Ill. — This residential community's ordinance prohibiting juke boxes has been upheld as constitutional by Circuit Court Judge Charles S. Dougherty, sitting in neighboring Chicago.

Judge Dougherty, holding the ban to be within the village's police powers, declared:

"I don't think anyone has a right to play rock and roll to the discomfort of others. I, for one, wouldn't want to be forced to listen to Elvis Presley play whatever it is he plays."

Judge Dougherty's view is at variance with the 1952 case in which the United States Supreme Court held that the playing of recorded music "piped" into street cars did not violate the constitutional rights of the riders.

The N.Y. Times says, "Authorities on juke box law noted that in many communities the devices were taxed, licensed and regulated as to hours and noise. But they know of no other outright ban on their existence in any American community."

James Sorce, defendant in the case here, is co-owner of a reputable establishment known as Jim and Pete's Pizzeria. Although there are 87 coin-operated food machines and 27 coin-operated eigaret machines in the village, Sorce has the only juke box the village, he has the only juke box here.

To circumvent the local ban a small sign was placed on the box advising patrons to ask a waitress to play the tunes.

A River Forest policeman last March dropped a dime into the slot, to play a recording of "Petite Fleur" and then brought charges against Sorce.

Sorce was fined \$25 and costs in the Police Magistrate's Court. He appealed to the Circuit Court. Sorce's lawyer, Jeremiah J. Buckley, professor of evidence at De Paul University Law School, said he would take the case to the state Supreme Court.

According to Buckley, if they can prohibit juke boxes, "then can prohibit any lawful business. There is a certain mental block set up in the public's mind about juke boxes. They're subconsciously associated with slot machines, but there is a vast difference between phonographic music and 'one-armed bandits."

This is not the first time the village ordinance has been challenged. It had previously provided that the village could seize a juke box. The seizure section was outlawed by the Illinois Appellate Court in 1953, and the ordinance was later rewritten. This case, however, did not go to the Illinois Supreme Court and its constitutionality was left undecided.

When asked to explain the genesis of the ordinance a village official told a reporter that the distribution end of the juke box industry was "unsavory."

Editor's Note: This is the most serious threat to the juke box industry we know of. While there have been restrictive licenses and ordinances limiting use of juke boxes, this outright ban is most ominous. Once again the need for public relations for the industry is dramatically illustrated.

Two Jimmy Mitchells Confuse Disc Logs

■ CHICAGO - One of those rare coincidences that happen in show-biz occurred last week when two new recording artists both named Jimmy Mitchell, each hit the spotlight with a disk, on their respective labels. It was the first recording on the labels for each. Each is a ballad singer. They aren't related.

The Jimmy Mitchell who cut his first for Mercury — "May I" / "Picture Yourself With Me," is a 27-year-old from Detroit, now working in clubs in New York and attending dramatic school there. The other Jimmy Mitchell has recorded "I Can Only Live for Your Love" / "Reading Between

the Lines."

A trade mag, making the understandable error of attributing both platters to the same singer, blurbed, "On both disks he impresses highly - both records can break out and the artist can be in the enviable position of having clicks for different diskeries."

At this time, neither of the Jimmy Mitchell's is contemplating a name change.

THE QUIET THREE (Gregman, BMI) / FORTY MILES OF BAD ROAD (Gregmark, BMI) -Duane Eddy - (Jamie 1126).

• Eddy comes in again for another twangy go-round. Top side sports the raucous Eddy sound backed by a chorus on a rather haunting tune. The flip side is more in standard groove for Duane. He drives hard on a grinding handclapper that should catch many a teen ear. Don't count out the top end. It's different and could cop the honors.

THE WHISTLING ORGAN (Lowell, BMI) / I'M HAPPY (Lowell) - Dave "Baby" Cortez - (Clock 1012).

• Cortez follows his current blazing record of Happy Organ with the Whistling Organ. Tune is essentially cut from the same mold. Has the same approach and feeling as the first organ opus. The flip I'm Happy, is a shuffling opus that gets an exciting vocal from Cortez. It could take the play, but for longevity the top side will out.

OVER SIXTEEN (Hermosa, Kags, BMI) / LET'S GO STEADY AGAIN - Sam Cooke - (Keen 2022).

• Both sides of Keen's latest platter could come into the loot bin. Sam hits home with a smart teen lyric on Sixteen. Undercut has Cooke chanting a class ballad with plenty of sincerity. Chorus backs on Steady. Deck should be good for action at the counter. Air play will be strong.

TILL THERE WAS YOU (Frank, ASCAP) - Anita Bryant - (Carlton 512).

• A class ballad from *Music Man* which has been waxed before gets an up-dated tempo with Miss Bryant at the vocal helm. This one could step out. The tune is beautiful and the backing makes teen age sense. Chorus assists Anita warble the romancer. With a push this one could go over well.

THE BOTTLE HYMN (Music Maestros, BMI) / FRENCH ROCKIN' WALTZ - Robert Chauvigny - (Top Rank 2001).

A pleasant instrumental featuring bottle playing over smart violin backing. Slide trombone also comes for a few smears to make more interesting. A big air item. Waltz is a class piece reading with sax, accordion lead in front of strings. Combo waltz and tango-like beat on first and last chorus makes for an appealing different sound. Programming heavy here, too.

A HOUSE OF OUR OWN (Knollwood, ASCAP) - Dennis Bell - (Top Rank 2002).

• Double premiere for artist and label turns out to be a mighty worthwhile venture. Dennis Bell rings the bell with a pretty romancer done in a rock-a-ballad groove. Release switches tempo into a slow two-beat shuffle. Lyric tells a teen message. Deck could make plenty of noise.

I BELIEVE IN MYSELF (Conrad Babb, BMI) / EVERYBODY BUT ME (Conradi - Gene Allison - (Vee-Jay 317).

• The prospects for a two field operation looms large with Allison's outing on a powerful ballad opus featuring a gal chorus and plenty of beat. Other end is another ballad taken at a slower pace with a gospel touch added. This one should move well.

THE CHOSEN FEW (Siras, ASCAPI - The Four Lads - (Columbia 41409).

• A very pretty ballad gets a sensash reading from the lads who really pour it on with a big sound. The backing is just as big with Frank DeVol and orchestra soaring. Big air item here. Top drawer stuff.

GRADUATION SOUVENIRS (Kellem, ASCAP) - Scott Garrett - (Laurie 3029).

• A class ballad that could easily become a big Summer item on the charts. Garrett works with echo effect and pretty guitar gimmicks. Tune has a great lyric and Scott warbles softly with tenderness. Great chart prospects.

FLOWER OF LOVE (Winneton, BMI) / MOLLY MAE (Winneton) - The Crests - (Coed 511).

• Mucho hot outfit are the Crests who've hit twice in a row. This could easily be their third winner. They pitch two rocka-ballads at the teen audience and one of 'em or both could make it.

Dave "Baby" Cortez Clicks For Clock

Like many other aspirants to fame and fortune, Dave 'Baby' Cortez born twenty years ago in Detroit, Michigan, came to New York to look for his 'lucky break.'

With a pocketful of songs, 18-year-old David Cortez Clowney made the rounds of New York's 'Tin Pan Alley' the home of the nations music publishers. He demonstrated his material singing and playing the piano. Some of his songs were recorded by artists such as Clyde McPhatter and La Verne Baker. David made frequent appearances with the nation's top artists accompanying them at personal appearances on the piano, this led to his being called by many recording companies as a supporting musician, for rapidly he had gained a reputation on account of his ability to inject an infectious beat into any group with whom he performed. Being a self taught musician is probably one of his greatest assets, he does not feel limited and

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does not work from written arrangements.

Having mastered the piano, Dave approached the formidable project of masterting the organ in much the same manner . . . he just sat down and played. The success of his 'HAPPY ORGAN' a record which reached the top of the national best selling record charts, follows a typical pattern of Dave's musical career, it was completely spontaneous. A very interesting future is predicted for this young man, who in the space of two years has contributed much to the popular music field.

The success of Clock Records under the direction of it's president Wally Moody, (former A and R Head of Electric and Musical Industries England) follows closely on the heels of his other achievements this year, for his publishing company Lowell Music, has been associated with several other hits such as Tragedy, Tell Him No, and Rockin Crickets. The distribution and sales of Clock Records is handled through Ember Distributors, headed by his son Doug. Moody.

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

 Fourth LP outing via Cadence for Andy Williams is excellent. Andy possesses one of the best voices around and combines a keen sense of understanding with built-in showmanship. The twelve cuts offered are all romancers of varying beat. Andy chants in front of bossman Archie Bleyer's arrangements plus chorus. Tunes all have made it big before via Andy and others. Album will appeal to an adult market as well as teen agers. Although the beat and feel has been up-dated, Andy's superb styling will get through to many older folk. Included is his current single of Hawaiian Wedding Song, My Happiness, Near You, Blueberry Hill. Sail Along Silv'ry Moon, and the Wedding Song are the top offerings. Love Letters In The Sand cops honors also.

AFRO-DESIA - Martin Denny - (Liberty LRP-3111).

• Sixth in a series by Martin Denny dealing with the exotic sounds of lands far and near. Basically island and jungle stuff Denny offers some strange and weigd sounds. Package gets an African slant from the orchestra and chorus. Wide use of drum, marimba and vibes combined with voice gimmicks make this one quite a hi-fi excursion. Rhythms approximate mambo and bolero tempo, so that the dancers in the crowd can get their kicks as well as the listeners. Cubano Chant, Raftero and Jungle Drums stand out. Swamp Fire, the old Hal Kemp favorite comes in for some new twists also. A Music Vendor SURE BET (6/I).

SWING CLASSICS IN HI-FI - George Williams and Orchestra - (United Artists UAL-3027).

• A big bright swingy package by arranger, leader, and sax man George Williams. A quick jaunt back to the late thirties and forties by Williams and orchestra comes out 1959 brand new. Most of the stuff is associated with Goodman, Henderson,

Ellington et al. It is played and arranged with an eye toward a fresh sound. The idea is a good one and the result is most gratifying to those who dig the big band sound without going off the deep modern end. Williams has gathered a group of musicians for this date who all shine in their own right. Together they blow up a big swing storm. An adult package all the way. Dorsey, Miller, Goodman contemporaries will have no trouble digging the new sound of Flying Home, Back Bay Shuffle, Pompton Turnpike, Take the A Train, Marie and others. Smart merchandise.

PORGY AND BESS - George Rhodes - (Aamco ALP-331),

Aamco entry in the *Porgy and Bess* derby is a spirited job done in the jazz idiom. Arranged and conducted by George Rhodes, the package headlines Rebecca Hall, Carnegie Burruss, Johnnie Brown and Barbara DeCosta in the vocal chores. Orchestra is a hand picked group of musicians chosen by Rhodes. His score and arranging shows careful thought and understanding for the opera, Vocal work leaves nothing to be desired. A well-rounded album that should come in for a good share of the moola spurred on by the picture which is due shortly.

ROCK 'N ROLL RECORD HOP - (Roulette R-25059).

 A solid rock-'n-role buy for the teen ager. Roulette has gathered a great deal of talent via five groups and Frankie Lymon who handle the vocal chores for two cuts apiece. Group include The Playmates, The Crows, The Heartbeats, The Valentines, The Cleftones, and Frankie Lymon and the Teenagers. Selections are tunes that have already made it on the charts and are sure to appeal again to the kids. The disk should keep 'em dancing all night. Lymon chants Why Do Fools Fall In Love, The Playmates blend on Don't Go Home, Baby for the Crows, Wedding Bells by the Heartbeats, Cleftones render Lover Boy. A rock and roll reprise that should catch on.

CUTTIN' CAPERS - The Playmates - (Roulette R-25068).

• Standout group for the Roulette banner offer a happy package. Guys really enjoy themselves when they work. 

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
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




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
