WALRUS STATISTICS

Our statistics are a quantitative reflection of current Lp acceptance based on our contributors' reports. Progressive Retail Reaction is derived from Top 15 retail reports while New Retail Action is derived from New Reaction reports. Both are weighted to compensate for the size of the store chain. Radio Emphasis is computed by counting radio reports of Audience Reaction and Heavy Airplay. (Heavy Airplay new additions are not included.) New Releases to Watch is calculated by counting all indicated New Additions and weighing them according to heavy or moderate play. All calculations are first done regionally then combined to form the national totals.

NEW RELEASES

Below is a catalogue of new releases. They are divided into categories designed to give you an idea of their relative musical worth. These first impressions are not meant to relate in anyway to past, present or future sales, nor should they be taken as the word of God.

SPECIAL MENTION ALBUMS

(These recordings which, in our opinion, deserve special mention because they come closest to perfecting their musical genre regardless of progressive radio application.)

Elton John/BLUE MOVES/MCA-Rocket 2-11004 (Blue Moves is not just another Elton John album. It is the product of a perfectionist's effort. A major work in which Elton returns to his essential self. The weight of its consistent quality is persuasive.)

STRONGLY MERITORIOUS

(The following Lps are Merit Albums which we feel have an extra edge.)

John Abercrombie - Ralph Towner/SARGASSO SEA/ECM 1-1080

(Moments of enchantment lift this album above and beyond. These two masters working together made some towering music an expectation. They command the guitar horizon but, do not revolutionize it. Classy.)

Allman Bros./WIPE THE WINDOWS.../Capricorn CP 0177

(Be assured that politics will affect this album's acceptance. Speaking musically, it is a superior live album by a superior band. The uninhibited concert situation is/was their natural habitat.)

Joe Chambers/NEW WORLD/Finite FIN 1976-2 (Exhilaration comes from renewed faith in humanity as much as from the challenging music. Veteran Joe Chambers creates an Lp at the crest of the new wave of jazz. Not content to relive a musical past and mindful of the self-centeredness of ultra-spaced jazzers, he has nailed it.)

Burton Cummings/Portrait PR 34261 (The rock and roll starts on the second track of each side. But the incredible Cummings voice is present, out front, throughout the record. Good songs and a sure handed Richard Perry production give the album a zesty life.)

MERIT PLUS ALBUMS

(This is a temporary category to help distinguish these Merit Albums which tend, in our opinion, to be better than the other Merit Albums. There may be only a percentage point's difference between them but, with the volume of good albums around it seems necessary to make the distinction.)

The Elvin Bishop Band/HOMETOWN BOY MAKES GOOD/Capricorn CP-0176 (Highlighted by a few sterling cuts Elvin issues an album which tracks his influences. Every black music rhythm gets an airing. It feels right all the way.)

MERIT PLUS ALBUMS CONTINUED

Justin Hines & The Dominoes/JEZEBEL/Island ILPS 9416 (This group wins artistically because of the absolute purity of their reggae music. They might suffer in audience appeal because of it. Produced by Jack Ruby, something of a Jamaican music historian/philosopher, Hines & The Dominoes were destined for a rootsy sound. This is the real thing friends.)

The John Lewis Sound/TRAVELING/Finite FIN 1976-1 (Two long energized suites speed relentlessly. While the second one is strong it doesn't reach the hair-raising levels attained by the interaction of Alex Foster's sax and John Blair's vitar in the first. Fusion with a twist.)

L. A. Express/SHADOW PLAY/Caribou PZ 34355 (The statement about their music today which appears on the inside jacket is a signal. It implies the audible change in this album. An energized fusion jazz sound brings the group to life allowing these fine players the space needed to stretch. Vote yes.)

Melissa Manchester/HELP IS ON THE WAY/Arista AL 4095 (Melissa is giving her audience their money's worth. Solid material, original and chosen, dominates a big production. Though it sometimes sounds like it's about to come apart, it never does.)

The Nighthawks/LIVE/Adelphi AD 4110 (It's hard for people from the outside world to understand that some rock and roll is legitimate and some is counterfeit. The Nighthawks are the real thing. Their certification is contained in the grooves of their recordings, including this one.)

Phoebe Snow/IT LOOKS LIKE SNOW/Columbia PC 34387 (Phoebe issues a more subtle album which depends less on the vocal tricks of which she is capable. It can operate on this higher level because the mean level of material is measurably better than even her first album. Good outside material and writing assistance does the deed.)

Spiders Webb/I DON'T KNOW.../Fantasy F 9517 (With all of the prospects of being just another R&B-disco fusion, Spiders Webb emerges with greater respect. Mainly due to the vitality of the band's play and creativity of the arrangements this band soars above most others in their field.)

Thin Lizzy/JOHNNY THE FOX/Mercury SRMI-1119 (Combining Phil Lynott's superior writing skill - at times a poor man's Springsteen - and a rock solid rock feel yields a better than average band. They make better than average albums.)

MERIT PLUS ALBUMS CONTINUED

Various Artists/WOODY GUTHRIE'S "WE AIN'T DOWN YET!"/ Cream CR 1002 (In a real way this album is a document. Alternating the writings and music of Woody Guthrie, the record only begins to represent this rare man. It turned out that Woody was ahead of his time, but that is a conclusion reached after the fact. Woody was doing what came naturally. More exact credits should be included.)

MERIT ALBUMS

(Our recommendations for serious progressive radio consideration, recognizing that not all Merit Albums are suitable for all stations.)

Doris Abrahams/LABOR OF LOVE/Philo PH 1034 (Almost as if to demonstrate that they are capable of making pop albums like everyone else, Philo shifts its philosophy. Doris' recording exemplifies that change. Some of it is so glossy that it reaches to the fringes of acceptability. There is no question about competence, just about how far to the right is too far?)

The Bar-Kays/TOO HOT TO STOP/Mercury SRM 1-1099 (The Bar-Kays, after many years, remain a progressive R&B unit. Though they work in the hot rhythm style of today, they bother to invest it with creative thought. Stimulating.)

Blackfoot/FLY IN' HIGH/Epic BL 34378 (A rock and roll steamer. Blackfoot attacks. Their intensity is, at times, overpowering and their tunes are pretty fair.)

Bohannon/GITTIN' OFF/Dakar DK 76921 (This is a two sided album. It contains a disco-like R&B pulse on side one followed by a sensuous, mellow jazzy feel on side two. The subtle, graceful melodies on side two contrast with the nudging of the first side's "South Africa '76.")

Tom Chapin/LIFE IS LIKE THAT/Fantasy F-9520 (Leaving his kiddy T. V. show behind, Tom works to adults mostly. A couple too-cute didies creep into an otherwise smooth album. Tom's songwriting is more basic than brother Harry's but, as melodious.)

Byron Keith Daugherty/LET MY HEART BE MY HOME/Fantasy F-9515 (B. K. D. is another in a courageous line of singer/songwriters who are trying to crack in. He is an accomplished writer but, the album's presentation doesn't do enough to single him out of a crowd.)

George Duke/LIBERATED FANTASIES/MPS G22835 (George's fantasies carry him too far. He is led to believe that standard R&B, fusion jazz and redone Sergio Mendes can exist in the same album. The result may be conceptually poor but it is well executed.)

Esposito/PROCESSION OF THE HIEROPHANTS/Peters International PILPS 9012 (If you view this album the way Toni Esposito did, more as a vehicle for his percussing than as music, you'll appreciate it from its proper perspective. He delivers a good drummer lead album, not more.)

Roger Glenn/REACHIN'/Fantasy F-9516 (The hot R&B fusion music which features near relentless rhythm bows in impact to the African rhythm of "Rezo Chango". Melodically there is no contest either. No one will take the last track seriously but, it is an oasis in a desert of sameness.)

John Guernsey/TWELVE SONGS/Adelphi AD 4108 (Guernsey's album isn't unified. John doesn't sing, so that the Lp can't focus around a voice and his piano playing is not a major peg in the arrangements either. A batch of decent songs are left adrift in a musical sea. Both performance and music are okay.)

Alexander Harvey/PRESHUS CHILD/Kama Sutra KSBS 2618 (Solid writing supports a joyous country-rock effort. Normally, the sight of another Alex Harvey would not be greeted happily but this Alexander was actually here first. He makes himself welcome again.)

Dan Hill/HOLD ON/20th Century T-526 (Dan is a very serious man of emotions. His passion usually translates into quality songs however, sometimes his lyrics miss dead center. Pacing is the only findable flaw. Good show otherwise.)

Kansas/LEFTOVERTURE/Kirshner PZ 34224 (Kansas' artistic skill has grown remarkably since their first Lp. Their English power band formula, at this level of accomplishment, is a winner. Forceful.)

Sherri King/ALMOST PERSUADED/United Artists UA-LA686-G (At times Sherri's country is aggressive to the point of oppression. But, mostly it is the kind of modern country album which respects its roots. Another not so minor element is that Sherri sings good songs throughout.)

Art Lande/Rubisa Patrol/ECM 1081 (Open, airy music fills space with articulate grace. Art's soothing mental exercise does not bother to reach the somatic level. Free.)

Susie Monick/MELTING POTS/Adelphi AD 4107 (Susie's significant contribution is that through her own resourcefulness and imagination she forces us to rethink the banjo. By placing it in a myriad of musical settings she cracks the standard mind set which limits the scope of the instrument.)

Michael Murphey/FLOWING FREE FOREVER/Epic PE 34220 (An expansive production sometimes blurs the essence of Michael Murphey. A relaxing album which does flow easily fulfills its promise, if not the need for titillation.)

Billy Preston/A&M SP 4587 (The exuberance of the Preston performance injects an extra element in Billy's music. Beautifully recorded he gives his songs their best shot.)

Turley Richards/WEST VIRGINIA SUPERSTAR/Epic PC 34306 (Much of Turley's album has an underlying energy which drives even through some slushy arrangements. His songs are round and they carry the positive impression.)

Mongo Santamaria/SOFRITO/Vaya JMVS-53 (If you listen to Latin music you know that Mongo is an artist unto himself. It is said that his Afro-Cuban sound of the early 60's contributed to the development of Ska music in Jamaica. Ska music - Desmond Dekker & The Aces - was the predecessor of reggae. Mongo's music, beyond being entertaining and uplifting, is important too.)

MERIT ALBUMS CONTINUED

Bobby Scott/FROM EDEN TO CANAAN/Columbia PC 34325 (In a beautifully mounted album it is the sincerity of Bobby Scott which comes through and dominates. His approach is what Rod McKuen's should be, elegant and creative. A few unfortunate choices, like "Autumn Leaves," reduces enthusiasm.)

Side Effect/WHAT YOU NEED/Fantasy F-9513 (The complaint about Side Effect is that they attempt to be all things to all people. Dynamic presentation attempts to draw many styles together. It can be only limitedly successful. Unity is required to maximize the group's effect.)

Sparks/BIG BEAT/Columbia PC 34359 (Ron's lyric writing simplifies noticeably. The big beat is central, as promised. Sparks does maintain its basic integrity - you won't confuse them with Barry Manilow. Between "Throw Her Away" and "White Women" they won't get any awards.)

Jimmie Spheeris/PORTS OF THE HEART/Epic PE 34276 (Jimmie's soft voice leads a mellow-hearted and melodious album. He has evolved into quite a pleasant singer-songwriter type.)

Robb Strandlund/Polydor PD 1-6085 (An appealing country-rock. Smooth tunes and a production which spins without hitches, finds a place for itself. Tasty.)

Sutherland Brothers & Quiver/SLIPSTREAM/Columbia PC 34376 (Sutherland Brothers & Quiver are journeymen rockers who never fail to entertain but, they rarely electrify either. This album fits the pattern. It is solid throughout.)

Various Artists/VINYL DAYS/Brute Force Cybernetics (Surprisingly high quality music for an album of this sort. Produced, charitably, by WEBN in Cincinnati to benefit the United Appeal, it implies a healthy local music scene. Another positive station promotion like the annual KGB effort.)

James Vincent/SPACE TRAVELER/Caribou PZ 34237 (Conceptually superficial but, well constructed. There is no quarrel with the individual tracks, though a serious question exists as to whether this collection of sides is an album. The fusion music, about half of the Lp, is where the focus should be.)

SATISFACTORY ALBUMS

(Albums of acceptable quality which, of themselves, require only secondary progressive radio consideration.)

Bullfrog/Annutt Coeptis AC 1003 (Aptly named in the light of Gerd Hoch's vocal quality. With some O. K. songs and play the discussion centers around the vocals. Like Joe Cocker and Rod Stewart you either buy the voice or not, there is no middle ground. This time we opt out. "Get Away" is best.)

Kid Dynamite/Cream CR-1003 (Kid Dynamite is a power band which lacks fluidity both rhythmically and melodically. Even their chosen material gets caught in the trap rigged by this unpleasant rhythm style.)

Poison/ON OUR WAY TO NUMBER 1/Roulette SR 3017 (There are a few obstacles in Poison's drive to numero uno. Mostly their uninspired material and their standard presentation. What makes them stand out of the crowd? Nothing here. They do not use the apparent talents of Janet Cook correctly either. Direction, more than ability, is the missing element)

UNDISTINGUISHED ALBUMS

(In our opinion, below standard Lps except where noted.)

Lonnie Smith/KEEP ON LOVIN'/Groove Merchant GM 3312 (Purposeless and raggedly presented on all levels. Horn charts and solos are poorly conceived and executed. Sub-standard manufacturing.)

FRINGE ALBUMS

(Good albums which are not progressive, yet hold some interest for progressive audiences.)

Steve Bateman/SOMEDAY/Amherst AMH 1004 (Steve's somewhat anemic country music isn't too far out of contention. He writes songs of some quality but, the limited delivery system thwarts more serious consideration.)

Brass Fever/TIME IS RUNNING OUT/ABC Impulse ASD-9319 (The mixture of legitimate and jive requires surgery to separate. Things like "Boogie On Reggae Woman" and the first two tracks on the second side make music out of just another dance record.)

Betty Carter/NOW IT'S MY TURN/Roulette SR-5005 (Betty generates all of the energy this Lp has to offer as she fills a gap which leaves her alone as a scat singer. Lodged in the fifties, she draws from a tin pan alley repertoire and sets the tunes in that era's mellow superclub mood.)

Crown Heights Affair/DO IT YOUR WAY/De-Lite DDJ-2022 (Mounted with assurance and driving disco desire, Crown Heights Affair tears it up. Their sensual, rhythm ride delivers what it intended to.)

Rita DaCosta/MEETS THE CEDAR WALTON TRIO/Finite FIN 1976-3 (Rita is strictly a lounge singer as recorded here. This trio with vocalist format and the material put her in about 1953, Not quite Sarah Vaughn.)

Bill Evans - Eddie Gomez/MONTREUX III/Fantasy F-9510 (Poor production instills an unnaturalness in Evans' piano and mixes the accompanying bass into the background. The general texture is O. K. though a little sleepy.)

Rupert Holmes/SINGLES/Epic PE 34288 (Singles, as a title, telegraphs the direction from which Rupert Holmes comes. He is one of the classiest of the school of hip-MOR. Good songs.)

Lyons & Clark/PRISMS/Shelter SRL 52005 (A tendency, in the arranging, is to match the soft stroke of two harmonized female voices. Instead a contrasting setting might have added some spark. "Nothing But Sand" comes closest. Shimmering and vivacious, the album is still a success, Pretty.)

FRINGE ALBUMS CONTINUED

Chuck Mangione/MAIN SQUEEZE/A&M SP 4612 (Celebrating his mellow soul with an air of restrained confidence is standard Mangione. He creates a pleasant backdrop for living until the title track which takes center stage at the Lp's end.)

Kenny Rogers /United Artists UA LA 689-G (Hip MOR.)

Rhythm Makers/SOUL ON YOUR SIDE/Vigor VI 7002 (Running the gamut of R&B sounds, old-time song format to disco, the Rhythm Makers create a positive impression. The disco-jazz which closes each side is most enjoyable.)

Sins of Satan/THOU SHALT BOOGIE FOREVER/Buddah EDS 5673 (In the running for the ugliest album cover of the decade or the best camouflage of a decent Lp. If you manage to listen to the speakers only, a fairly talented R&B group surfaces. Wisely directed, their potential might be developed into something artistically worthwhile.)

Esther Williams/LET ME SHOW YOU/Friends & Co. LPS FS 109 (In a pretty good pop R&B album there are a few things of interest. Led by "It Feels Real Good," Esther gets at least a vote of confidence.)

(Spoken, poetry - comedy and extraneous musics.)

The Chieftains/BONAPARTE'S RETREAT/Island ILPS 9432 (The Chieftains provide the perfect opportunity to add class to the sound of any radio station. Their melodies define purity while their performances invigorate the air.)

Harmonica Frank Floyd/ADELPHI AD 1023 (Frank is one of those rare old geezers whose life story sounds like a soap opera with a downward arc. His blues is genuine but, at times telltale signs of age interfere with the delivery system. Still, Frank is a soul worth saving.)

Eric Idle & Neil Innes/RUTLAND TIMES/Passport PPSD - 98018 (A brilliantly funny skewering of pomposity.)

Jean-Pierre Rampal/VIVALDI/RCA FRL 1-5467 (The six sonatas included here share a lovely common musical bound. Lifting and sentimental they could find some specialized use.)

Sweet Honey in the Rock/Flying Fish FF 022 (Deeply sewn roots are a requirement for all legitimately progressive music. Sweet Honey, so steeped in tradition, raises the trails of today to spiritual experiences. Out of the church into the frying pan.)

Various Artists/HEAVY TIMBRE/The Sirens 102 (These Chicago bluesmen provide an enjoyable trip back to the basics. Straying too far from the roots is never a good idea. MDR.)

Alan Price/SHOUTS ACROSS THE STREET/Polydor 2383 410 (As a rocker Price is well regarded but, as a balladeer he is superb. His super vocals and combo sound wrap around some marvelous tunes organically. Alan should be a star. Strongly Meritorious.)

Southern Comfort/DISTILLED/Harvest SHSM 2009 (Reissue.)

June Tabor/AIRS & GRACES/Topic 12TS 298 (June takes a place among distinguished company, Sandy Denny and Maddy Prior, as a grand lady of English traditional music. She remains on the pure side with only light accompaniment or a capella arrangements. Accomplished. Merit Plus.)

CONCEPTS

BORED!

The die is already cast for this year. So that the following intuitive assessment of the current music scene amounts to a statement in hope of a change for the year to come.

The reckless expansion of artists and styles which preceded the recession/vinyl shortage of 1973-4 ended abruptly. In its place, as a result of that economic upheaval, came an A&R philosophy which was conservative. Artists were signed only if they fit already established patterns or if they had already marketable names i. e. the solo incarnation of an established band member. There was nothing wrong with that policy when it was a matter of survival.

However, as we read it a potentially fatal mistake is being made by the major record companies as they continue the A&R policies of the recession in a period of economic expansion. Those kinds of policies are short term strategies

justifiable in treacherous times. But, any record company which wants to be a force in the future has to begin developing new sounds, has to be taking some chances on artists who don't sound like anyone else. That is not happening to any great extent now.

Instead, in a time when we find an ever increasing number of records being released (we have already surpassed last year's Lp count) we hear a disturbing proportion of dittos. The New York studio players or the L. A. studio players sit in behind a singer/songwriter just filling in the blanks, everything is down the middle. Today's producers have reached high levels of skill. They are able to save album after album eliminating mistakes and expanding the mediocrity. But, few chances are being taken and, in the end, we risk the one thing which will end the great music surge, boredom.

In the past two weeks we have aired debates on the pros and cons of proposal for a public power authority and flat rate electricity proposals. Both are being heavily and expensively opposed by private corporate electrical interests while consumer groups are backing them.

The womens show has featured reports on efforts to do something about sex stereotyping in the schools.

You Don't Say (our weekly conversation pieces) featured interviews with the authors of new books on Adolph Hitler and Henry Kissinger in two successive weeks -- the relationship between the two to be left to your conscience and consciousness.

I would last report that we have quite a diverse response to our offer to provide feeds on the recent Susan Saxe trail here in Boston. Many stations took us up on the offer, and we hope that we will have the occasion to reciprocate.
