# RADIO STATS

OUR RELATIVE CHARTING, AS SEEN BELOW, RESEMBLES BASEBALL'S BATTING AVERAGES. IT ESTABLISHES A RATIO BETWEEN THE IDEAL, (HEAVY AIRPLAY AT EVERY STATION WHICH REPORTED); AND THE WEIGHTED COUNT THAT A RECORDING HAS ACTUALLY EARNED. THIS MATHEMATICAL FORMULA IS APPLIED TO EACH RECORD—FIRST REGIONALLY, THEN NATIONALLY. A DUAL WEIGHTING SYSTEM IS USED TO DERIVE THE COUNT. IT ADJUSTS FOR MARKET SIZE AND FOR HEAVY OR MODERATE AIRPLAY. THESE CHARTS SHOW THE RELATIVE INTENSITY OF RADIO AIRPLAY FOR BOTH NEW AND ESTABLISHED RECORDINGS.

## SPECIAL MENTION ALBUMS

(These records which, in our opinion, deserve special mention because they come closest to perfecting their musical genre regardless of progressive radio application)

## STRONGLY MERITORIOUS

(We feel that these Lp's have an extra edge.)

- Billy Joel/THE STRANGER/Columbia JC 34987 (Expectations are dangerous, especially when festered by time. Billy's long awaited album is a strong record for an artist whose strength is in the live performance situation. Side one is solid Billy Joel but, side two betters it. "Vienna," "Only The Good Die Young" and "Everybody Has a Dream" are the special contributions.)
- The Rolling Stones/LOVE YOU LIVE/Rolling Stones COC 2-9001 (No other band gets you to move quite the way The Stones do. They may be the elder statesmen of rock 'n' roll but, they don't show signs of tiring. In spite of the old material, take a gander at the titles which fill side four, stronger music is hard to find. Fine recording quality brings it on home.)
- Gil Scott-Heron & Brian Jackson/BRIDGES/Arista AB 4147 (Simply put, Gil Scott-Heron is one of the few truly creative, vital forces who still has something to say. Beside that, he has a marvelous voice with which to sing his super songs.)
- Steely Dan/AJA/ABC AB-1006 (Their writing is real good, though not more. It is their absolute mastery of the recorded medium which propels them. For Steely Dan, the medium truly is the message. Paul Simon is one of the few other artists who comes to mind as a master of the medium. *Aja* is another specially crafted Steely Dan album featuring a great feel, great sound and spaced chordings.)

## MERIT PLUS ALBUMS

(All Merit and Merit Plus Albums are recommended for serious progressive radio consideration, recognizing that not all of these recommendations are suitable for all stations. The Merit Plus Albums distinguish themselves with an extra vitality.)

- Barclay James Harvest/GONE TO EARTH/MCA 2302 (Without being flashy - that's their problem - Barclay James Harvest's rock-on-a-grand-scale is pleasing. Their songs are the basis for the success. Every aspect is carefully developed and presented. Like eating bran, it's good for you.)
- The Boomtown Rats/Ensign Envy 1 (The Boomtown Rats invade with a refined, such as it is, brand of basic music. The foundation is not merely raw energy but, songs. Their lyrics carry the message of the somewhat desparate, next generation of the streets.)
- Vassar Clements/THE BLUEGRASS SESSION/Flying Fish 038 (Clements is an acknowledged craftsman but, his career, in recent times, has been unfocused. Trying to play everything for everybody doesn't work. Here, in a bluegrass setting he is at home cooking. A little swing mixed in for spice keeps the flow going.)
- David Oliver/JAMERICAN MAN/Mercury SRM 1-1183 (Although the reggae melts away after the first track, David Oliver's Lp makes an interesting conceptual point. Reggae evolved from American rhythm blues and that first track, "What Kinda Woman," weaves reggae back into rhythm and blues. Coming full circle Oliver is the author of some fine songs. Wayne Henderson's mega-production is predictably big and well organized.)
- Danny Peck/HEART & SOUL/Arista AL 4126 (Danny's album sticks out. From the opening notes you know that he hasn't given us just another singer/songwriter album. His personal stamp is placed on every vocal. Further, his writing often reaches a higher level.)
- Point Blank/SECOND SEASON/Arista AL 4137 (Making a habit of round songs is only the start as Point Blank hits the nail on the head. That nothing is a contrivance adds weight to the impression of an Lp which is essentially only rock 'n' roll. Side two has a harder edge to it.)
- Racing Cars/WEEKEND RENDEZVOUS/Chrysalis CHR1149 (The machine is sleek, sporting super rhythm movement, excellent vocals and two harmonized guitars. Fueled by several top grade songs Racing Cars qualifies in the front line of relative newcomers.)
- Sparks/INTRODUCING.../Columbia PC 34901 (Songs which are little operettas and an insistent beat define all of the bent Sparks albums. The subject matter of their songs may be the strangest aspect of all. "Joan of Arc Just Sits and Smokes.")
- John Stewart/FIRE IN THE WIND/RSO RS 1-3027 (Fine songwriting and carefully devised arrangements place John Stewart at the top of the folk singer/songwriter sub-category. Under control, this production leaves the mistakes out. John projects little personal charisma.)

## MERIT PLUS ALBUMS CONTINUED

- Talking Heads/77/Sire SR 6036 (Talking Heads take some getting used to but, that's because there exists nothing quite like them. Lead singer David Byrne can't sing.. on purpose. The super players behind work as counterpoint. Some of their best music is on side two, i. e. "Pulled Up." Isn't that just like them?)
- James Talley/AIN'T IT SOMETHIN'/Capitol ST-11695 (A rare funky folksy, Talley moves you from the mountains to the edge of the inner city without jolting your sensibilities. He generously gives us twelve round songs.)
- Robin Trower/IN CITY DREAMS/Chrysalis CHR 1148 (Stressing the music instead of the power, *In City Dreams* has character. However, the great melodies are ghettoized on side one. The second side holds up but, it pulls side one down.)
- Dwight Twilley Band/TWILLEY DON'T MIND/Arista AS4140 (Searching for artists who project a special energy is what we all do. Dwight Twilley Band has that extra element. All of their better than average songs are infected with it. They participate in the stripping of pretense from rock 'n' roll.)
- Unicorn/ONE MORE TOMORROW/Capitol ST-11692 (Lots of ear-pleasing tunes set in a smooth, country-tinged rock feel stimulates interest in Unicorn. Warm harmony vocals act to smooth it out even more. Otherwise anonymous, the band lacks pizzazz of any kind. They would do well to harden the sound just a little in order to get someone's attention.)
- Junior Wells/BLUES HIT BIG TOWN/Delmark DL 640 (Urban blues may not be part of your standard diet. But, this Lp, made up of tracks cut in 1953 and 1954, contains what we would now consider a rock & roll feel. The up tempo snap in these fine tunes drives the point home. Portions of this Lp have been previously issued but only as obscure singles.)
- Larry Jon Wilson/LOOSE CHANGE/Monument MG-7615 (Leaning into the mic Larry Jon's baritone melts over a lyric in a funky kind of way. Fine tunes - original and choosen - maintain consistent interest. The Muscle Shoals side seems more earthy.)
- Zao/KAWANA/Peters International PLD 9019 (Pleasing melodies are not good enough for a band of quality fusionists like Zao. To equal their playing skills they require soaring, inspired tunes of which they don't get enough. "Free-Folk" comes closest.)

## MERIT ALBUMS

- Airto/I'M FINE, HOW ARE YOU?/Warner Bros. BS 3084 (Yes, but where are the tunes? Airto rhythm goes without question. It is always set in the attack mode. But, unless someone throws in a good solo, his music is one dimensional. Tunes capture the heart while rhythm alone captures lesser organs.)
- Automatic Man/VISITORS/Island ILPS 9429 (Michal Lloyd has been associated with more pop productions in the past. He gets a fine performance out of the band without popping them up. But, he can't get more than the average songs can give.)
- The Babys/BROKEN HEART/Chrysalis CHR 1150 (Impressive writing has to fight needless over-arranging as the orchestra swarms in. They go for "a piece of the action, a slice of the cake" without sacrificing too much of their rock power.)
- Barefoot Jerry/BAREFOOTIN'/Monument MG-7610 (Warm and comfortable, Barefoot Jerry makes life more fun with their music. A couple songs on each side are real good while "Tokin' Ticket" might become NORML's anthem.)
- Peter Baumann/ROMANCE 76/Virgin PZ 34897 (After listening to Peter's album you will know which member of Tangerine Dream is responsible for the group's musicality. Baumann is a spaced romanticist, as this Lp's title suggests. Yet, *Romance 76* is much less space and much more melody than anything with which Peter's name has been associated. The mystical quality found in T. Dream isn't in evidence here.)
- Rory Block/INTOXICATION/Chrysalis CHR-1157 (Resurrecting lots of old Motown charts Rory has put together a complete, though popish, album. The production is overdone in many places however, the feeling still gets through. More could have been done with less for even greater effect. This album seems to be a bit of over-compensation after an earlier semi-finished album.)
- Jethro Burns/Flying Fish 042 (To label Jethro Burns' music country-swing is only partially accurate because that does not indicate how swinging his music really is. He and Vassar Clements fly through a hot album.)
- Chicago/XI/Columbia JC 34860 (The enormous response to Chicago albums is mysterious. Their productions always sound great, XI is no exception. But, we find most of their writing to be mediocre. This record leads off with three tunes which approach the best the group has ever delivered. After them the writing falls into their familiar pattern.)

# NEW RELEASES

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## MERIT ALBUMS CONTINUED

- F. A. T. /FUNKY & TOUGH/Bold 305 (Solid rhythm & blues. Their songs are rarely memorable - "Tip of My Tongue" is an exception - but, the rhythms are emphatic. They carry the message saying everything the group has to say. Distributed by T.K. Records, 495 S. E. 10th Court, Hialeah, Fla. 33010.)
- Golden Earring/LIVE/MCA 2-8009 (Powerful presentation overwhelms the recordists somewhat. The sound quality is only fair but, that speaks well for the dynamism of Golden Earring. Their good songs provide a firm foundation for the show.)
- Phillip Goodhand-Tait/TEACHING AN OLD DOG NEW TRICKS/Chrysalis CHR 1146 (A nice recording on all levels. Phillip's voice is pleasing and his songs are nice but, rarely better than that. The more special tracks congregate at the front of each side.)
- Merle Haggard/A WORKING MAN CAN'T GET NOWHERE TODAY/Capitol ST-11693 (Expressing the feelings of a vast portion of America, Merle hits the mark. It is a similar frustration which English punkers rock expose. Haggard's music is music of the folk's and it is presented without extraneous arranging ploys.)
- Don Harrison/NOT FAR FROM FREE/Mercury SRM 1-1185 (A beautiful Ken Scott production gives Don Harrison's new career a nice start. Good street lyrics are hosted by average melodies to forge songs in the Springsteen direction.)
- Killough & Eckley/Epic PE 34886 (The two faces of Killough & Eckley are both literal and musical. Their basic sound is rock with a folksy slant. However, the majority of side one is augmented with sweeteners which, at times, get oppressive. Side two reverses the percentages. Rock Killough's tunes backbone the otherwise appealing album.)
- Mary McCaslin/OLD FRIENDS/Philo 1046 (Her lovely voice must carry the album, almost by itself. A nice, but not memorable, folk accompaniment applies itself to a diverse batch of chosen songs. For example, "Pinball Wizard" and "Don't Fence Me In," both get squeezed into this narrow focus.)
- Meat Loaf/BAT OUT OF HELL/Epic PE 34774 (In a gigantic Todd Rundgren production designed to overwhelm the listener, Meat Loaf's voice and Jim Steinman's songs come through. Even the sound quality suffers because of the bigness and intensity of the information cut into the disc. Still, you come back to those songs and the vocal power of Meat Loaf. The production excesses override some of the obvious talent wedged into the grooves.)
- Peter-John Morse/ON THE SHORELINE/MCA 2299 (Most of *On The Shoreline* feels good. The material and the presentation work together nicely even if they get too big at times. Peter-John turns out to be a thoughtful singer of some note.)
- Nektar/MAGIC IS A CHILD/Polydor PD 1-6115 (Nektar's playmanship and determination out distance their writing. Often their songs are pieced together by connecting fragments rather than by developing the fragments into whole ideas. They play so well that they cover the seams as well as possible. The band comes by it honestly given the example of groups like E. L. & P. and Yes.)
- Juice Newton & Silver Spur/COME TO ME/Capitol ST-11682 (Juice Newton may be the female rock and roll hope. It is an open field. She is a strong vocalist and with Silver Spur, some solid writing results. Their presentation, though well crafted, seems to lack flair. That holds them back.)
- Esther Phillips/YOU'VE COME A LONG WAY, BABE/Mercury SRM 1-1187 (Reaching for two audiences is not a good musical idea. Esther's album tries to maintain her traditional blues-jazz audience while garnering some support from the R&B-disco audience. A couple tunes on each side remain true but, they require some picking and choosing.)
- Mark Radice/INTENSE/Road Show RS-LA 788G (If memory serves, Mark's new album is a much more finished production than the last one. Though it seems a little self-conscious at times, when Radice's songs are right, any serious problems are quickly overcome.)
- Reilly & Maloney/AT LAST/Freckle RM-01898 (Two guitars, a male and a female voice harmonized and a batch of mellow songs, Reilly & Maloney give new life to the clean-cut, folk idiom. Relaxing counterpoint to current trends. Write: Box 31319, San Francisco, Ca. 94131.)
- Jim Ringer/TRAMPS & HAWKERS/Philo PH-1047 (Jim Ringer's mellow baritone wraps itself gently around a lyric. His Western style folk music combines power and tenderness in a standout performance. Good songs punctuate the album.)
- Sherbet/MAGA ZINE/MCA 2304 (In spite of a silly name, Sherbet is a solid musical force. Good songs presented with some concern about quality presentation mark them, O.K.)
- Sierra/Mercury SRM 1-1179 (At the brink of complete popness. Bobby Cochran lead vocals are often too pretty. Oddly it is his gutsy lead guitar playing which often saves it. Songs and presentation are good, it is just the style which can be hard to take. Sneaky Pete is a hidden force.)

## MERIT ALBUMS CONTINUED

- Split Enz/DIZZYRHYTHMIA/Chrysalis CHR 1145 (The thrust of Split Enz energy goes into the performance of their material rather than the development of it. Lots of drama is built into the arrangements making them one of those bands you have to see live. Tunes like "My Mistake" and "Nice To Know" stand on their own.)
- Ringo Starr/RINGO THE 4TH/Atlantic SD 19108 (Again, the song choices are exceptional. They are not only well written, they also fit Ringo's personality, so that, even if he didn't write them they still become his own. However, working counter to his personality is an overly slick production. It tends to envelop, rather than bolster the album.)
- Topaz/Columbia PC 34934 (Power-rockers divide themselves into two broad categories. Those who pander to childish elements in the audience and bands like Topaz which attempt legitimate material without giving up the power. It is the Boston-Foreigner success formula. With the exception of a few change ups, one a CSN sound alike, Topaz pushes around some decent songs in their power configuration. "There's just too many people playin' rock and roll.")
- Pete Townshend & Ronnie Lane/ROUGH MIX/MCA-2275 (Pete and Ronnie have made an album which has no ulterior motive. It is music for the fun of it and because they wanted to play together. "Till the Rivers All Run Dry" is most memorable.)
- Various Artists/SOUNDTRACK-OUTLAW BLUES/Capitol ST-11691 (Projecting through a pound of vinyl is quite a different trick than projecting through a lense, so Peter Fonda and Susan Saint James find out. With good songs to work with, they survive. Other tracks use Steve Fromholz and Hoyt Axton to good effect.)
- Stomu Yamashta's Go Too/Arista AB 4138 (Once over the awe inspiring list of contributing forces, Yamashta's album asks the question, "how much of the Lp do you want to hear a second time?" The answer, in spite of the expert presentation, is not too much. As important is the feeling that when its finished you haven't gotten a sense of Stomu Yamashta's essence. He doesn't come through.)

## SATISFACTORY ALBUMS

- (Albums of acceptable quality, which, of themselves, require only secondary progressive radio consideration.)
- Urszula Dudziak/MIDNIGHT RAIN/Arista AL 4132 (The first move was correct. Urszula had to sing songs as the basis for her vocal gymnastics. However, the choice of material blew it. Cliches of a jazz past ignore ten years of material which has been sung once and which could stand a reinterpretation. The Peggy Lee - Julie London approach adds nothing to the genre either. Finally, the reliance, by Michal Urbaniak's production, on electric gismos reduces the recording's articulation too much to be justified.)
- Legs Diamond/A DIAMOND IS A HARD ROCK/Mercury SRM 1-1191 (Eddie Leonetti's production brings clarity to Legs Diamond. That is what does them in. Had the recording quality been bad you might not hear that their lyrics are substandard or that virtually every note played is borrowed. Legs Diamond is a weak imitation of their hard rock predecessors.)
- Danny Toan/FIRST SERVE/Embryo SD 535 (Until "Mighty Max" you won't know that the guitarist is the centerpiece. But, at that point you will realize that Danny has a special gift for the instrument whether or not this Lp delivers it. While the accompaniment sometimes inundates Toan, it also becomes rather prefatory. "Kunte Kunte" is another notable tune. Danny's *First Serve* may be a foot fault but, he has the ground strokes to rally in the next set.)

## UNDISTINGUISHED ALBUMS

- (In our opinion, below standard Lps except where noted.)
- Johnny Cole/FIRST MEETING AFTER/Stanley AN 14001 (Mediocrity on just about every level. Record quality, material, concept and performance all lack polish. Sweeteners replace arrangements, some of which get pretty hokey. No address for Stanley Records was provided.)

## FRINGE ALBUMS

- (Good albums which are not progressive, yet hold some interest for progressive audiences.)
- Angelle/Epic PE 34836 (The ever broadening hip M.O.R. genre continues to blossom. Each new artist has to be considered individually. Angelle, as a result of her arranging approach, crosses the line to the M.O.R. side. John Boylan's production is expert and Angelle's voice is pretty but, pretty is the problem. Her songs are fair.)
- Kenny Burrell/ELLINGTON IS FOREVER VOL. II/Fantasy F-79008 (This two record set is an eloquent tribute by a host of jazz luminaries. The music is so familiar that it is hard to imagine a world without them. Further, that they are the product of one mind is amazing. *Classy.*)

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## FRINGE ALBUMS CONTINUED

- Linda Clifford/Curtom CU 5016 (Though the thrust of Linda's album is pop R&B, and therefore out of progressive bounds, she does a nice version of Rod Stewart's "Tonight's The Night." It is an alternative.)
- Bill Cosby/DISCO BILLY/Capitol ST-11683 (Cosby's disco music has one added element which makes it interesting, his humor. The music is hot and a track like "Happy Birthday Momma" makes for fun.)
- Randy Edelman/IF LOVE IS REAL/Arista AB 4139 (A cross between story format of Harry Chapin and the big orchestrations of Barry Manilow places Randy in the hip-pop wings. While he brings quality to the genre he makes himself less appealing on the hip side.)
- Linda Hargrove/IMPRESSIONS/Capitol ST-11685 (Pete Drake's production of Linda moves her to the sidelines of hipness. A fine writer, her songs are treated with delicate hands instead of the punchy style which would put her in a league with Ronstadt. Good but, pop.)
- Bobby Hutcherson/KNUCKLEBEAN/Blue Note BN-LA 789H (That West Coast feel breaks up the monotony. As the moods shift Hutcherson's approach becomes more or less intense. Of the six tunes, two hot ones make waves. "Sundance Knows" and "Knucklebean.")
- Hank Jones/BOP REDUX/Muse MR 5123 (In what amounts to a tribute to Charlie Parker and Theolonius Monk, the eloquent pianistic skills of Hank Jones are applied to 8 of their compositions. Cozy trio textures elevate this recording.)
- Herbie Mann & Fire Island/Atlantic SD 19112 (Disco madness.)
- Pat Martino/EXIT/Muse MR 5075 (Flaunting career consciousness, Pat settles back into his post-bop style. His skills and those tunes excel in a mellow cloud. Warm and tasty.)
- Muscle Shoals Horns/DOIN' IT TO THE BONE/Ariola America ST-50021 (Pop.)
- Harold Ousley/THE PEOPLE'S GROOVE/Muse MR 5107 (The People's Groove translates into rather straight playing. Ousley rarely takes a melody to the outside. The rhythm feel does take over as the central point of focus. It is grooved.)
- Don Patterson/MOVIN' UP!/Muse MR 5121 (Patterson's organ quartet leans out of the 50's, swinging pretty good. He plays no originals but, he does have fun with several Richie Cole tunes. Richie's alto is featured.)
- Pockets/COME GO WITH US/Columbia PC 34879 (An exhilarated performance. Each pocket contains another R&B experience. Most are too pop to even consider. The hot instrumentals which end each side are the two possibilities.)
- Reverberi/STAIRWAY TO HEAVEN/United Artists UA-LA 813-H (Reverberi's rock is suspect because of his use of the orchestra. The rock and roll is the come on, while the real thrust of his music is easy listening. Possibilities are: "Escalation" and "B'ahia.")
- The Saints/(I'M) STRANDED/Sire SR 6039 (Previously reviewed as an import. Needless to say The Saints aren't. Taking Lou Reed to his logical extension yields a guitar-blur accompaniment in support of nonsong lyrics. This mindless sound wave is suited to those pre-teens of great strength and little discretion.)
- Seals & Crofts/SOUNDTRACK - ONE ON ONE/Warner Bros. BS 3076 (This movie album should not be taken as a Seals & Crofts album. They merely contribute their distinctively harmonized voices to the Charles Fox - Paul Williams songs. Fox's arrangements put an M.O.R. haze over most of the soundtrack.)
- Jimmy Smith/IT'S NECESSARY/Mercury SRM 1-1189 (A comfortable, live jam which places Jimmy's organ and piano work at the center of things. On the swingin' side, these sides do no challenging but, they do make you feel good.)
- Don Thompson/FANNY BROWN/Brunswick BL 754215 (The vast majority of Thompson's album disqualifies itself on grounds of inappropriateness. However, Don hits on a few natural rhythm and blues tunes which fit any situation. Audition the first side. Write: 888 7th Avenue, New York, N. Y.)
- Art Webb/LOVE EYES/Atlantic SD 18226 (Love Eyes blends ideas from jazzy, R&B, disco and rock music in a rather lavish production. Webb's flute doesn't make the biggest impression, that is reserved for the voice of Tamatha Agee who sings one song. She's dynamite.)

## SPECIAL PROGRAMMING

(Spoken, poetry - comedy and extraneous musics.)

- Dewey Balfa, Marc Savoy & D.L. Menard/LOUISIANA CAJUN MUSIC/Arhoolie 5019 (Cajun music has a special joy built into it. This super group of Cajun stars joins for their first recording together. Each man shows strength in a balanced, musical performance.)
- Eugene Chadbourne/GUITAR TRIOS-VOL. 3/Parachute P-003 (Beyond abstract. Chadbourne has gathered 3 of his friends, like minds, to break the silence. The guitar as an instrument of sound - liberated from form - is the aim of these sides of improvisation. Write: Chadbourne at Apt. 8C, 17 W. 71st St., New York, N. Y. 10023.)

## SPECIAL PROGRAMMING CONTINUED

- Halloween Horror/A&M SP-3301 (For the production library. One side is a ghost story and the other a valuable set of scary sound effects.)
- The Klezmerim/EAST SIDE WEDDING/Arhoolie 3006 (These Yiddish folk songs have the unmistakable flavor of Eastern Europe - Rumania, Poland, Russia. Somehow the lyrics don't always apply. One translation taunts, "Your sister lives with a Cossack." Music of the folks.)
- Steve Martin/LET'S GET SMALL/Warner Bros. BSA 3090 (Finally.)
- Uncle John Patterson/PLAINS, GA. ROCK/Arhoolie 5018 (If you like banjo pickin' Uncle John will entertain you. His sense of time is extraordinary, enhanced by some of his foot stompin'. That rhythm sense translates to his piano playing too. A good ole time.)
- Various Artists/UKRAINIAN-AMERICAN FIDDLE & DANCE MUSIC VOL. 1 & 2/Folklyric 9014 (These two recordings, which cover the period 1926-1936, document a point made here before. That the folk musics of cultures throughout the Western world tie together in spite of the fact that many of the peasant cultures rarely interacted. Lawrence Welk is not far removed from this music.)

## REISSUES

# CONCEPTS

## AUDIO REALITY

At a concert a few weeks ago it became obvious that the sound quality was excellent. A fairly loud rock band in a hockey hall with a throbbing mass of 20,000 and you could hear each member of the band. The bass vibrated deeply and articulately. It was not boomy. It was not billowing over the rest of the band rendering the vocals inaudible. The drum kit was likewise in proportion and fairly natural sounding. The whole band was making music, powerful and intense, but music nonetheless.

This happened in a building through which hundreds of acts have passed and from which many concert reviews have originated. They have appeared in *Walrus* and in many other publications. A cliché which has evolved, not only in some of those reviews, but in concert reviewing in general, assumes that the sound in a giant arena is bad.

Further, a counter assumption has developed which holds that the sound is better in a small club.

Challenging assumptions with facts, the truth is that if amplification of any sort is involved the audio has the potential to be lousy in any room regardless of size or acoustic qualities. Therefore, the sound quality at a concert has less to do with the building and more to do with the skill and caring of those in charge of the sound.

Supertramp and Pink Floyd rarely generate audio complaints regardless of the building they are playing. They are an object lesson. Let's remember to blame the people responsible for the problems. Ultimately the band has to take responsibility for how it sounds, looks, plays, performs, and writes.
