Television Probable Next Year

INDICATIONS that the Radio Corporation of America plans to put television on the market coincident with the completion of the "radio city" now under construction in New York, possibly late in 1932 or early in 1933, are seen in recent statements by Merlin H. Aylesworth, president of the National Broadcasting Company.

Making public the details of the radio city recently, Mr. Aylesworth indicated that extensive provision is being made for television programs, both by themselves and in synchronization with sound. The annual report of Radio Corporation discloses that no effort will be made to put television equipment on the market this year, but states that it has been brought "definitely nearer to commercial development" by research during 1930.

Public interest in the new service promised through sight transmission by radio, and the new industry which the manufacture of television sets for the home now brings into view, requires a precise statement with regard to these developments.

While television during the past two years has been repeatedly demonstrated by wire and by wireless on a laboratory basis, it has remained the conviction of the corporation that further research and development must precede the manufacture and sale of television sets on a commercial basis. In order that the American public might not be misled by purely experimental equipment and that a service comparable to sound broadcasting should be available in support of the new art, the corporation has devoted its ef-

forts to intensive research into these problems, to the preparation of plant facilities and to the planning of studio arrangements whereby sight transmission could be installed as a separate service of nation-wide broadcasting.

It is felt that in the practical sense of the term, television must develop to the stage where broadcasting stations will be able to broadcast regularly visual objects in the studio, or scenes occurring at other places through remote control; where reception devices shall be developed that will make these objects and scenes clearly discernable in millions of homes; where such devices can be built upon a principle that will eliminate rotary scanning discs, delicate hand-tuning controls and other movable parts; and where research has made possible the utilization of wavelengths for sight transmission that would not interfere with the use of the already overcrowded channels in space.

Despite the depression of 1930, it is estimated that the number of broadcast receivers in use increased by 3,000,000 and now total between 14,000,000 and 15,000,000.

Approximately 13,500,000 homes have been equipped with telephones in the fifty-three years since the beginning of that industry, and 20,000,000 homes have been wired for electricity in the forty-nine years since the beginning of the electric power industry, while only ten years of broadcasting have been required to put receiving sets in more homes than are using telephone service and in 75 per cent as many as are wired for electricity.

Live and Let Live

The first issue of your radio program was handed me by Conrad Richter, (now out of business) from whom I purchased supplies to make radios. I continued to obtain them from him until you set a price of five cents on them, then I purchased them, and shortly after subscribed, and have been on your list constantly to date. I have watched your first little sheet grow, until it is now a firmly established and popular magazine, purchased by those who desire accurate knowledge of what is going on in the radio broadcasting. You have frequently changed the composition for the betterment, and I know as additional support is giving you, you will make your publication an absolute necessity to those owning radios, by constant addition of new matter pertinent to the subject. I have no criticism in your manner of publication, it fills the bill. Your new form of three columns is excellent. "Open Forum" gives your subscribers an opportunity to suggest forms which occur to them, and also enables the usual "kickers" to register their protests. The pictures enable us to visualize our broadcasting friends, and you are generous in the quantity you give us.

Now, as to the programs—My preference is for GOOD music, whether classical or popular; and incline to the vocal. There are some wonderful voices heard over the radio. I can get best results from KGO, then KPO. KFRC has some fine voices, particularly Bulotti, Tennyson; but I do not care for their jamborees. KFI is in the class of KGO, with very fine voices. Some

of the others have good programs occasionally. Jazz singers and crooners I cannot listen to. I can enjoy some of their work when I hear them in person, and get their expressions, but over the radio—no.

One thing I would like to comment upon—the applause given an artist by his fellow artists. I think it is entirely out of place, and uncalled for. Suppose you attended grand opera, and after the artist had rendered a beautiful aria, the other singers, and the chorus, and the orchestra should applaud loudly, what would you think of it? The greatest objection to the applause over radio is, that even over a very mediocre selection, the artists think it necessary to give applause, in fact they applaud every number, good or bad.

With the Eastern circuits working full time, and the many local programs daily, it is possible for the most discriminating listener to get something to his taste most of the time. It is easy to find fault. Let each one enjoy what he likes, and let the other fellow enjoy himself. Live and let live.

MICROPHONE GOSSIP



• • • KFRC's little Jean Clairmook, child prodigy who delights audiences with her interpretations of popular songs, is only five years old—but doesn't look so ancient.

Little Jean has a vivacious, dynamic personality and says she likes to recite, dance, and play with dolls as well as sing. When she grows up she fully intends to go into the movies.

In spite of her extreme youth, she is already a veteran at the "mike." Just two and a half years ago—and that would make her two and one-half years of age at the time, if our arithmetic is correct—she sang at a Shriners' luncheon at the Palace Hotel which was broadcast.

• • • Anthony Linden, NBC flutist heard in "The Voice of Pan," broadcast from the San Francisco studios of the National Broadcasting Company, feels that his vocation is purely a matter of chance. • • • Al Jacobs of the KJBS staff is the writer of "Song of the Hills," a new popular number that looks like it is destined to become a hit.

• • • Laura Lee Berry, a vision of charm and beauty in the KGER studios, hasn't always been a radio soprano. A few years ago she toured the southeastern circuit for Keith-Albee with a girls' singing and instrumental trio. But the three-a-day was too much and she finally lighted in Long Beach, where, besides the KGER work, she is soloist with the First Christian Church of that city. Her student days she spent in vocal study with Maestro Rignato Troisi.

The program is just what the name implies—a mixture of everything available in recordings from grand opera to Bennie Rubin. Carl also keeps the early risers posted on the correct time.

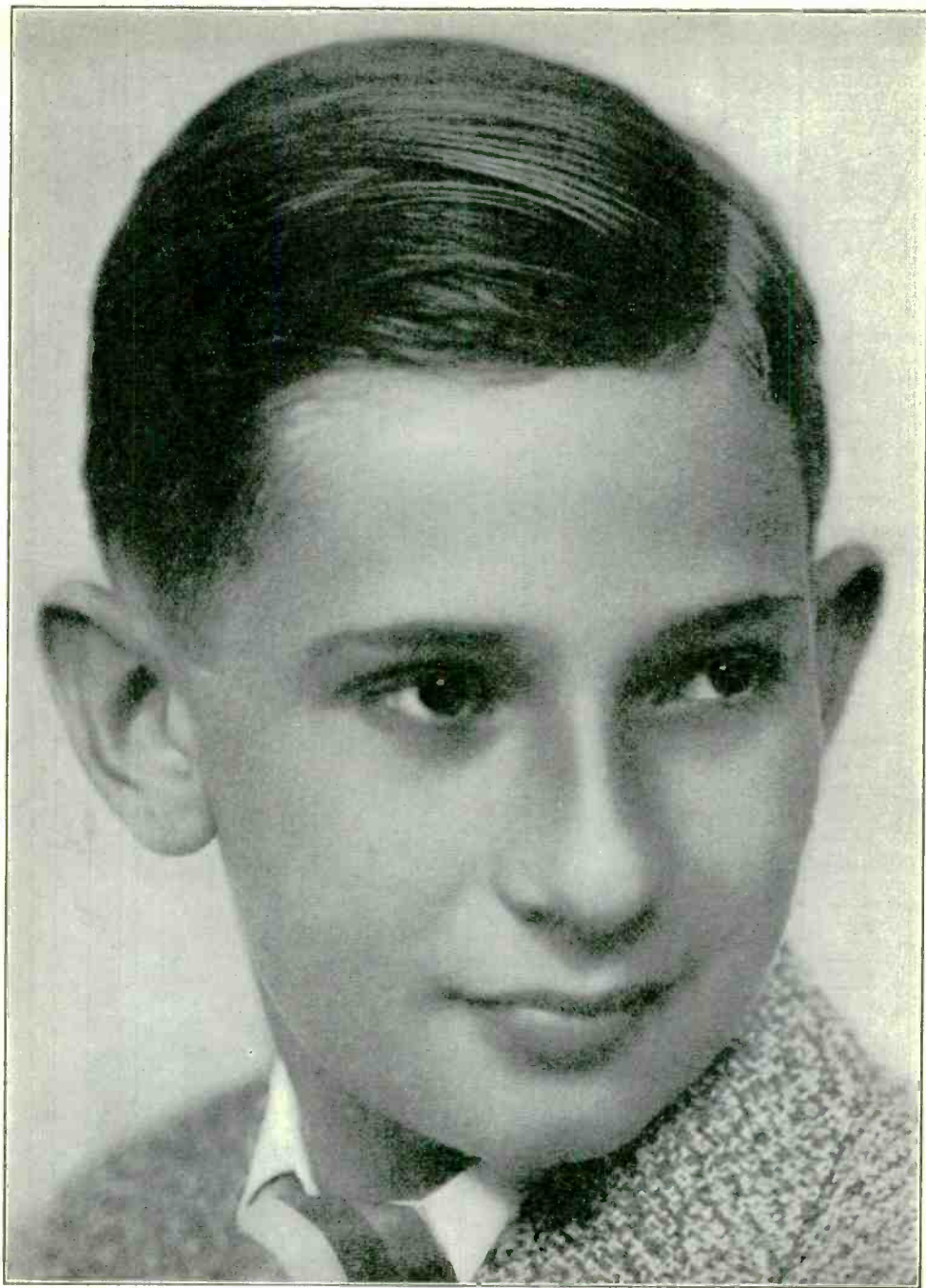

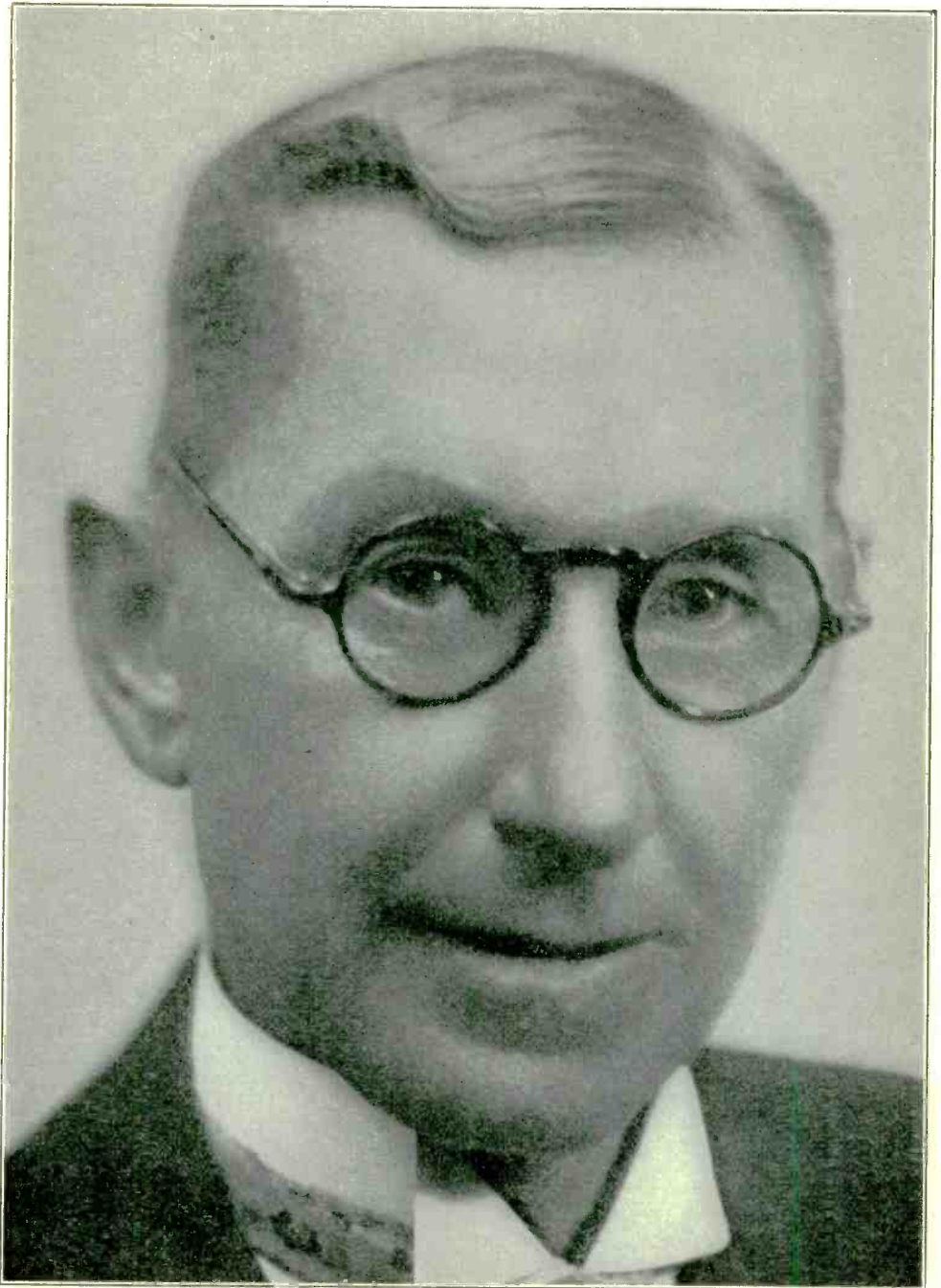

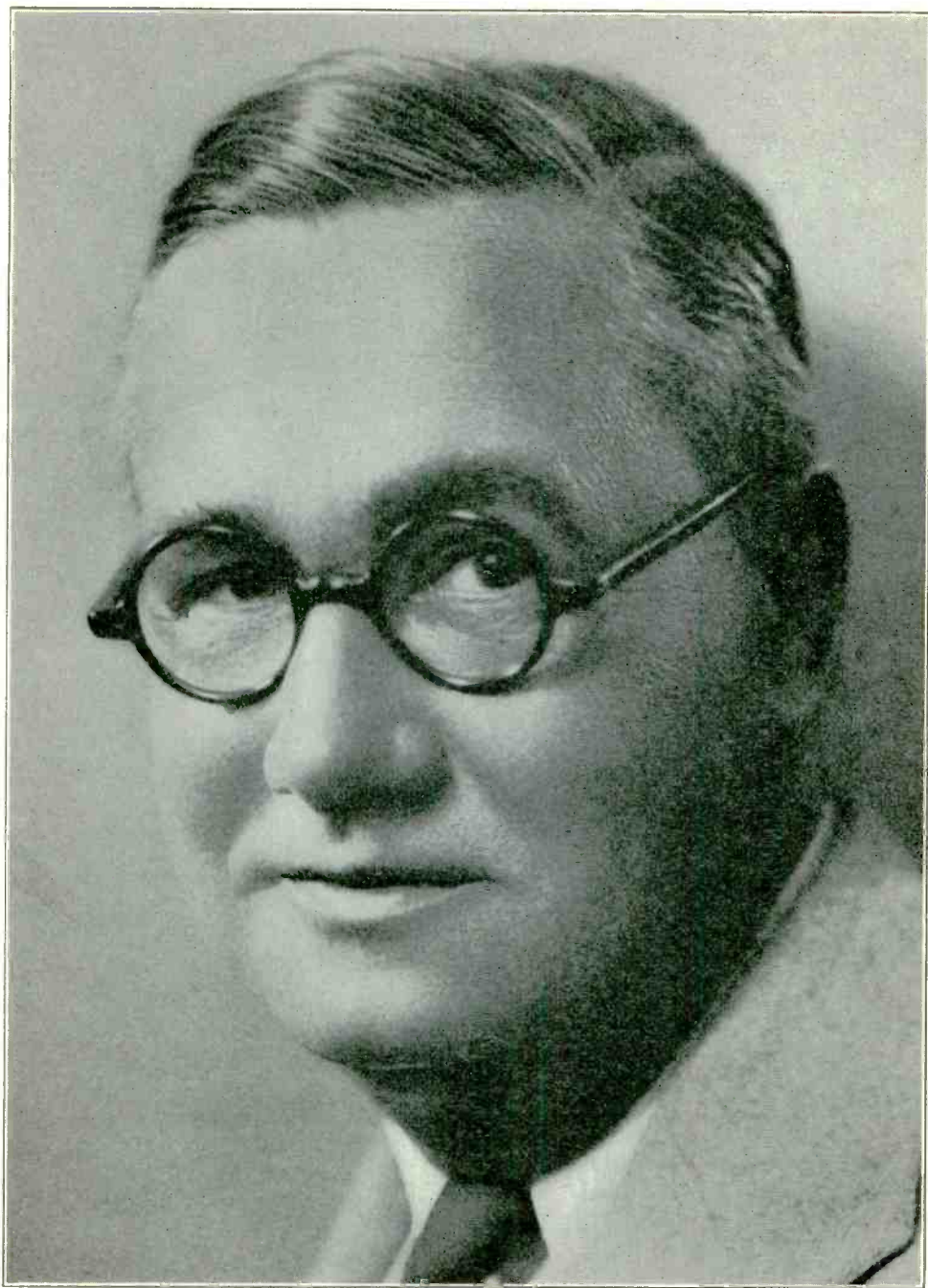

Memory Lane Turns the Corner

THERE'S an old saying, "It's a long lane that has no turning." And that goes for the General Petroleum Memory Lane, too.

Turnings . . . I'll say, plenty of them, but always turnings toward the sunshine of happier days. Almost four years old now and a husky youngster.

I always think of Memory Lane as my child . . . authors get that way, you know. Truth to tell, I'm only a foster-father. Our good and brilliant friend, Arthur S. Garbett, now Educational Director for NBC, is the real father. He created the first Memory Lane in April of 1927 in the very first week of the NBC on this west coast. It was about Thanksgiving time of that year that he handed it over to me. I had come from Tientsin, China, a month before to write the old Vagabonds programs. Garbett found that I came from Indiana, that I knew small-town life and old songs and so, rushed with the rapidly growing NBC programs, he gave Memory Lane to me. As a good foster-dad, I had to develop the infant program. When I got it, there were just old songs, the dear melodies of the 'seventies, 'eighties and early 'nineties. Each was introduced with a few lines of identification. I decided that a fitting setting for the songs would be a little dialogue between two Hoosiers. So "Pa" Smithers and his wife, Rosemary . . . she that was a Jenkins . . . came into radio being.

Ted Maxwell was the first "Pa" and a fine one. Eileen Piggott was the first, last and only "Ma." For almost four years Miss Piggott has played Rosemary without ever missing a performance. Vacations she has scorned. She has carried on bravely through sorrows. Only one radio artist of America has her beaten for continuous performances in one program. That is the golden-voiced Olive Palmer. But I ramble.

From memories of my childhood I took "Pa" and "Ma" Smithers. "Pa" was my Hoosier uncle Joe Gant and from the character of my Aunt Mag Mitchell of Shiloh I drew my Rosemary. One by one the others came in. First in importance is Billy Smithers. His prototype in my own childhood is my cousin, Otis Frazee, of Salem. When I got the idea of a boy's part, I had no boy actor in mind. Then one day I heard "Great

Moments of History," and in it was Billy Page. He had just the right voice. Wilda Wilson Church, now the Grandma Jenkins of the play, taught him his dialect. She comes from Sydney, Ohio, which once upon a time was very like our Goshen Center.

By the time Memory Lane had its first birthday the dialogue was going strong and the songs had dropped from twenty to twelve. That was one turning. At the end of the next year came another one. The fans wanted more play and less music. So Memory Lane became a half-hour dialogue with a short musical prelude and postlude.

And on it went, gathering friends. Changes of time, changes of nights for the performance hurt a bit at times, but somehow the husky youngster grew. Then came the last and the greatest change of all. The management of the NBC Pacific Division, glancing at "fan" mail reports, decided that the program had run its course. It was the last bit of entertainment left from that historic April week of 1927. But I wanted the audience to have a chance to save my child. The case was stated on a program last February. Should Memory Lane go into the limbo of forgotten programs? I suppose you know the rest. Ten thousand strong the "fans" rallied round Memory Lane.

The General Petroleum Company heard about the 10,000 letters. They decided that a program with that many friends should not pass out of the ether picture. General Petroleum not only decided to sponsor the program, leaving it in its original form, but also gave it the best time the program has ever had, 8:15 to 8:45 o'clock, on Tuesday evenings. That meant that children and old folks, for whom the program has a particular appeal, could hear it and from what I hear there's a lot of blessings on General Petroleum from Memory Lane fans. And so the lane had its turnings and this last turning to a splendid sponsorship is the best of all. To every friend of the program I send my thanks for the loyal response to our appeal of last February. To General Petroleum I am deeply grateful for the kindly sponsorship. And here, just as I am going good and starting to tell you lots of other things, I see that I've filled my allotted space.

"Now ain't that the beatinest?" as Rosemary Smithers would say.
