

RADIO INDUSTRY INVESTMENT IS IMPRESSIVE

THE importance of radio broadcasting as an industry is evidenced by figures recently compiled of the money put into manufacturing plants and broadcasting stations, the former having an investment of some \$3,000,000,000 and the latter, it is estimated, close onto \$100,000,000.

With this tremendous amount invested in a single branch of the entertainment industry, it is little to be wondered at that proposed changes in broadcasting regulations or allocations which tend to reduce the field, such, for instance, as the proposal to reserve certain frequencies for educational purposes, arouse a storm of opposition from set manufacturers and broadcasters, and provides a very definite reason why the manufacturers are anxious that broadcasting technique and programs be constantly improved.

In addition to the investment in these two groups, hundreds of millions of dollars have been spent for property and equipment by other branches of the radio industry, for marine services, transoceanic communications and the like, while the United States Government itself has sunk a respectable sum in equipment and stations for the Army and Navy, Lighthouse Service, aeronautic services, etc.

To top all this, within the next few years additional millions are expected to be in-

vested in television stations and manufacturing.

Listening to the program coming in over a set which may have cost only a few dollars, it is difficult to realize that millions of dollars were spent before the program, which may have originated in Europe, could be provided. Yet research has been one of the heavy expenses of the radio industry, as of all other branches of electricity. Study, investigation and invention have been the order of progress in broadcasting, made successful only because the public has steadily displayed a desire to avail itself of every new development, encouraging manufacturers to risk large sums to bring out new and radical improvements.

Present-day American broadcasting is a tribute to private initiative. While the Government has devoted considerable study to the subject of radio and has aided in its development, private industry, unaided by Government grant or subsidy, has within a decade pushed broadcasting from the crystal-set-phonograph record stage to its present perfection. In few other countries has the radio industry been so completely divorced from government as in the United States, and in most of those countries where such a separation exists, American methods, instruments and practices have been largely followed.

To Dyal Turner

It is not my custom to write to papers; but, after seeing this week's edition of your publication, I am afraid that my reticence has been overcome.

Some weeks ago, I noticed a criticism of yours about George Nyklicek of KPO. At first I was quite indignant at your most venomous attack. But after due consideration allowed myself to be lulled and comforted in the belief that you do not know what good music or accomplished playing and rendition is.

This week I find that my false security was more than false. For what do I see? A criticism that is obviously personal and not one whit constructive. Not yours, but no doubt brought about by your previous effort. I firmly believe that before one ventures an opinion on any subject whatever, one should be more well informed concerning it. I happen to have been listening to that program in which Mr. Nyklicek played Rubinstein's "Melody in F," and if I may give my humble opinion, as a musician, it left nothing to be desired. In the first place it was obviously a "fill-in" (I think those are the words used to describe the situation, in radio terminology) for the political speaker immediately preceded the alleged offending musical offering. I trust that in future YOU and the people like myself will have a little more forbearance and understanding when something may sound wrong to our ears. It does happen, you know, that we are not

infallible, and to use an old "bromide," to err is human.

But I beg you not to allow such biased criticism again to grace the pages of your worthy magazine.

In all fairness to you, Mr. Dyal Turner, I must say that your critique is very good, until you get on the personal line, and then your personal likes and dislikes make themselves rather obvious, and I think that personalities should be treated leniently, to say the least, if we do not like them ourselves. A word of cheer or kindness is so much easier to say than to be unkind. I hope you will remember that, sir.

Radio Sandwich a la C. M. H.

A little nonsense now and then is relished by the wisest men, but that is no reason why the air should be filled with piffle and nothing else. Much as I appreciate radio, my set is only turned on for an average of less than two hours per day because I can find nothing but jazz and brain food for morons most of the time. Why don't we have more music like the Standard Symphony Hour, the National Concert Orchestra, the KFI and KPO Concert Orchestras, Nathan Abas violin recitals and chamber music? Why do we not have more dramatic entertainment like the Sherlock Holmes series and the KGO and KPO players? By the bye, the dramatic programs, including the mystery serials, should be spotted earlier on the programs and not between 9 and 11 o'clock, for they are great favorites with the children, who enjoy them as much or more than the talkies; and it is a case of either depriving them of this pleasure or of allowing them to stay up too late for the good of their health.

Of course I realize that jazz and the lighter programs are in demand by many, but why deluge us with it, almost to the exclusion of anything else? I suggest that the various stations stagger their better class programs so that we who prefer silence to jazz may be able to pick up something to our taste at most hours of the evening.

With regard to BROADCAST WEEKLY, in its present form it is of little assistance in selecting entertainment. If I want to listen in at 8 o'clock I have to look through over

thirty programs to see if there is something I like. I prefer the chronological arrangement. In addition, the programs should be classified under such headings as "Classical Music," "Popular Music," "Vaudeville," "Features," "Drama," "Sports," etc. Also at this time of year when it is possible to bring in distant stations you could carry a condensed schedule covering these, like you used to do years ago.

Please don't think I like only serious programs. Collier's Hour, Golden State Jamboree, Associated Spotlight Revue and RKO are sometimes very enjoyable. I like a chocolate cream once in a while, but not as a steady diet.

WHEN a soprano has such fine radio technique that she brings pleasure to the station control technician as well as the listeners she is usually a "find." Margaret Nixon Emahiser, newest performer at station KHQ in Spokane, Washington, is such a soprano.

Few people who enjoy the rich notes of a soprano when sitting before their sets in the comfort of their homes realize the average soprano is the curse of the station technician. Due to the volume generally required to reach the high notes the control technician is kept jumping to keep the volume control needle from jumping out of the monitor. Margaret Emahiser has such unusual volume control of her voice that the needle in the monitor hardly varies over five degrees.

In addition to having a most pleasant voice, Mrs. Margaret Nixon Emahiser (yes, sorry, boys, she became the bride of the city editor of the *Spokane Press* nearly a year ago) she has a delightful personality. Margaret was born in Spokane, Washington, on September 29, 1906, of French-Irish parentage. Her education was at the Holy Names Academy, of the same city. She majored in Music and Fine Arts.

In 1926 the stage claimed her attentions and she entered stock work as ingenue and soon became leading lady in various stock companies playing throughout the Northwest. She enjoyed four years

on the stage until she became leading lady in a domestic scene.

Mrs. Emahiser has a most unusual hobby for a married woman; it is cooking. Another unusual thing is her aversion for bridge luncheons. Favorite reading is historical

novels, sport calls her to the outdoors for swimming. In music she thinks there are none like Schubert and Harry Barris and the favorite author is Don Byrne. Margaret is unusually optimistic and admits that she is not at all superstitious (however, she is French-Irish). As far as her parents' musical and dramatic ability is concerned, her mother was a choir singer and her "dad" could certainly tell Irish jokes. Although Margaret Nixon Emahiser has only been "on the air" a little over a month, it looks like she will have an indefinite run.

VERY unusual girl is diminutive Nora Schiller, KFRC comedienne. Here are a few items that prove it:

1. Was on the Pantages circuit in a singing and dancing act, doing impersonations of famous stars when eight years old.

2. Entered a high school in San Diego when eleven years old, the youngest student to ever enter the school.

3. After high school took a business course so she would have something to fall back on when she was through with the stage.

4. Weighs 102 pounds; lacks one and a half inches of being five feet tall; has brown eyes, and is in her very early twenties.

Nora, to put it bluntly, is a "snappy little number." In her caracul fur jacket, brown derby with a French accent and a list to starboard she is a sight to increase any man's faith in life, love and the pursuit of happiness.

This little lady puts just a little bit more than "everything she has" in her radio work. Her blues singing is outstanding. But perhaps she is destined to go farther in the radio world with her comedy and impersonations than with her singing.

Twice she literally "stopped" the Golden State Jamboree with her burlesque of the small town soprano. The studio audiences were determined that she should do another number, which is a very rare thing, as all Jamboree fans

know. Encores just aren't on the bill of fare. Nora is a girl who has always known what she wanted to do. From the time of her Pantages debut at the age of eight, her life has been wrapped up in the stage. After high school she took a business course and then, at the age of sixteen, worked as a private secretary to get some experience. But she was just preparing herself for the possible need of a job when she was old and the stage couldn't use her any more. She still has a score or more years to go before that, however. And now radio will add another score to that—yes, we know about television, but that won't make any difference.

After the secretarial experience, Nora got a job in a San Diego musical show. Sid Grauman saw her and gave her work at Los Angeles' Million Dollar Theatre. She was featured with Paul Ash in San Francisco, over Fanchon and Marco, in the Publix Theatres, with Ash in Chicago, fourteen months at the Publix houses in Chicago and New York and then back to the West Coast with Fanchon and Marco again. Between times she made a number of shorts for Warner Brothers. KFRC is her first steady radio engagement.

Nora is very fond of swimming. She likes to go out into the country. She always takes her dog along, an Alaska Malamute that would chew people up if she didn't watch him.

She had aspirations to be a concert singer at one time and she likes to go to symphonies and concerts. The young lady has never married. Asked why she replied: "I can't say yes, sir" to any man.

HARRY STANTON, NBC basso, stays away from stage doors. Not because this tall, good-looking lad with the ruddy hair and the rich, powerful bass voice is afraid of chorus girls! But . . .

"Every time I smell grease paint I feel like a fire-horse who sniffs smoke," he confesses. "Then I remember that the microphone opens a

bigger stage than I ever dreamed of when I was in vaudeville."

Harry was born in Walla Walla, Washington, and is a graduate of Washington State College, where he won his AB in Business Administration. He first began to sing when he was a freshman in college, and was a member of the Varsity Quartet. He managed the quartet during the four years he was in college, but upon graduation he believed he was leaving music behind him. He was in business for eight months in Portland, Oregon, and then the footlights-fever, to which he is still a victim, seized him.

A quartet composed of Washington college men was formed, and Harry was invited to become its basso. He closed his business office forever and went on tour with the group. The four sang their way up and down the Pacific Coast in vaudeville and picture houses. Then followed an engagement with Paul Ash in New York and Chicago. Following that "The Foursonie" as the quartet was known, joined Fanchon and Marco and a cross-country tour brought them to San Francisco.

The rich beauty of Harry's tones was remarked by various experts who told him his voice was worthy of further development. So the young man decided to remain in San Francisco and study seriously. NBC soon signed him as a featured artist, and now he appears in such groups as the Pacific National Singers, where operatic range is required. He also sings ballads and folk songs with a sense of the dramatic, which makes him an outstanding microphone artist.

There are two Swedish impersonators at KPO: Helga Erickson (Anna Kristina) and Dudd Williamson (Lars Larson). At KFRC Pete Barlow plays Axel Larson. Anna is a native of Sweden, Dudd was born in Alaska of English parents and Pete is a combination of Danish and Irish with Minneapolis as a starting point.

Henri, San Francisco.—Nadine Chriss (KFWI) is a young divorcee with fluffy brown hair, luminously dark eyes and dim-

ples. Perhaps you saw her picture in a recent issue? It was an excellent likeness. Her height is 5 feet 6½ inches, her weight hovers 'round the 140 mark. NBC's newest bride has been singing ever since she was a tiny girl, and her older brother, leaving for the World War, made her promise to learn "lots of songs" while he was gone. He never returned, but Betty sang her songs to veterans in hospitals and she still is a great favorite with them. Her husband is the local representative of a national magazine.

• • • Harvey Orr, former star of KPO, has returned to microphoning from the Hale-Chronicle station and his pleasing baritone voice will be recognizable as a member of the Rhythmic Triplets heard over KPO every Sunday.

Orr was formerly a "flying ace" of the Canadian Royal Air Force and is continuing his air activities via radio.

• • • Caryl Coleman, producer of the Associated Spotlight Revue, and numerous other NBC programs, was an actor before he joined the San Francisco studios staff, and turned to writing and producing programs.

• • • Roger Krupp, the tall, dark and handsome announcer of KFI-KECA, stole a march on the scores of admirers who gathered around Marian Peck, blonde and vivacious member of the Three Co-eds, a popular harmony team.

Roger and Marian were married quietly one day, no one in the Anthony stations until then realizing the charming state of affairs which had developed right under the microphone's nose, as it were.

• • • The new KFRC Steamboat Bill is none other than Jerry Wilford, who is also the midnight Vagabond of the Air.

• • • Eleanor Thatcher, new KTM blues singer, is only 15 years old. Yet she has been on the Interstate circuit in the South, the RKO houses out here on the Coast and did some shorts for Warner Bros. back in the New York studios.

• • • Ethel Duncan, Good Samaritan of the Air, and an old favorite with KNX audiences as the "Question and Answer Lady," has just installed a specially-constructed booth in the Trinity Auditorium for the purpose of broadcasting her regular Sunday services by remote control.

Seating about 150 people, this booth is completely equipped for radio broadcasting. One of the largest organs in Los Angeles has been included, for the purpose of sending special musical programs over KNX.

• • • Don Lee isn't forgetting the boys who were so largely responsible for making radio broadcasting what it is today. The amateurs utilize the short waves—the 20, 40 and 80 meter bands—to talk with each other the world over via International Morse code. Radio fans who listen in on KJBS from midnight until the young hours of the morning are forsaking their craze for jazz music, preferring the semi-classics and light opera. The studio folks inform us that there has been a noticeable decrease in the requests for the poop-poop-a-doop stuff, although Bing Crosby records are still number one in demand.

• • • Cecil Wright (KTAB) better known as "Rowdy," told us the other day that he is a great tennis enthusiast and has taken up golf and soon will set his score beside any good golf player! Seems queer for a cowboy to take up such sports, but I suppose the call of the turf was too much for him!

• • • A screen test is hard enough on one's mental equilibrium at any time, but imagine getting a last-minute call asking one to jump out of bed at four bells to face a battery of cameras on the studio lot at 5:30 a. m. Such was the experience of Sid Goodwin, NBC announcer at the San Francisco studios. The test was successful and Sid won the juvenile part in the picture, which was called "Hands of the Gods." Other movie engagements followed, but the screen wasn't to Sid's liking. What's the screen's loss is radio's gain, for now Sid is under contract to NBC.

• • • When the lights went out in the NBC studios the other night during a program, Mahlon Merrick and the Vagabonds went right on playing jazz. Everything went dark in the midst of the first number, but without missing a beat the boys finished the number. An announcer held up lighted matches near Mahlon so the orchestra could of hopeful singers, monologists, musicians, swung smoothly into routine compositions which they could play from memory. In spite of ad libbed announcements and the substituted music, the program ended on time and listeners never knew the difference.





How to Get This Thanksgiving Dinner

The successful hostess is one who serves a delicious dinner with the least apparent work and effort. The best way to accomplish this is:

1. Minutely plan your dinner ahead of time.

2. Do all possible towards dinner the day before.

3. Leave only the finishing and perishable things to be done on Thanksgiving Day.

4. If possible set the table the night before.

Using the menu given above.

- Stuff the turkey.
- Peel and cook sweet potatoes.

The day before

- Cream the onions.
- Make cranberry sauce.
- Make salad.
- Make pie crust.
- Make pumpkin filling.
- Make cookies.

RECIPES

Delicious Cream of Tomato Soup

- 2 cups of tomatoes.
- 1 teaspoon of soda.
- 2 tablespoons of flour.
- 1 pint (2 cups) of milk.
- 1 teaspoon of salt.
- 2 tablespoons of butter.

Method: Cook the tomatoes, remove from the fire, and strain. Add the soda. Make a thin white sauce by: melting the butter, add salt and a little pepper, stir in the flour; last of all, add the milk. Stir constantly until it thickens. Immediately put the tomato juice into white sauce and serve.

Note: This soup cools very quickly.

MINCE MEAT

- 2 pounds of lean beef.
- 1 pound of suet.
- 3 bowls of apples.
- 1 bowl of sugar.
- 1 bowl of raisins.
- 1 bowl of currants.
- 1 bowl of cider.
- ½ bowl pickle peach or pickle juice.
- 6 teaspoons of cinnamon.
- 2 teaspoons of cloves.
- 2 teaspoons of allspice.
- 2 teaspoons of salt
- 2 teaspoons of nutmeg.

1 lemon, soaked in hot water, and cut up fine. Use medium-size mixing bowl as a measure.

Method: Cook beef and suet together and then chop. Then mix in order given. Put in stone crock, cover. Do not cook.

COOKING AND BAKING HINTS

To Make Mashed Potatoes Lighter

Add hot milk instead of cold to mashed potatoes. Mash well. Add salt and hot milk last. Beat well for a minute and serve.

Two Ways to Keep Meringues Light

1. Add a pinch of baking powder while beating.

2. After sugar is all beaten in, add a teaspoon of water.

New Easy Way to Make Frosting

Put a quarter of a pound of large chocolate creams in a double boiler. As they melt add hot milk. Only add one teaspoon at a time. Do this until the mixture is the right consistency to spread.

To Keep Left-Over Olives

Put olives in a bottle with some of their liquid. Then pour olive oil over this. The oil will remain on top and in this way keep the air out.

Potato and Turnip

Small turnip.

Potato—As much again as turnip.

Method: Peel and cook potatoes and turnip separately; cook as for mashed potatoes; when done, pour off water.

Mash together and season with pepper, salt, and plenty of butter and milk exactly as for plain mashed potatoes. Serve in place of plain potatoes. You will find this has a delicate flavor and is a pleasant change.


