

REPUBLICAN CONVENTION

The Republican Convention which nominated Wendell L. Willkie for the presidency of the United States was thoroughly covered by CBS. Climax of a long series of Columbia broadcasts from Philadelphia came on Thursday evening, June 27, when CBS brought its audience the direct, on-the-floor proceedings of the third, fourth, fifth, and sixth ballots. CBS that night was on the air from Philadelphia continuously from 8:40 p.m. to 2:00 a.m. Among the men who described the Convention for CBS were Elmer Davis, Bob Trout, Albert Warner, Paul Sullivan, Bill Henry, and James Fleming. Among the prominent Republicans heard from their headquarters or the Convention were Wendell L. Willkie, Senator Robert A. Taft, Governor Harold Stassen, Representative Joseph W. 
JUNE 19 and 21: Bob Chester's music was featured in two broadcasts from the Rhododendron Ball and Royal Coronation in Ashe-
