Columbia's Special Feature broadcasts are arranged on a week to week, sometimes day to day, and even, on occasion, hour to hour basis. One result of this flexibility and timeliness is the following partial list of July programs which were arranged too late for inclusion in the last month's issue of THE COLUMBIA PROGRAM BOOK.

DEMOCRATIC CONVENTION

The Democratic Party Convention which nominated Franklin D. Roosevelt for a third term as President of the United States was thoroughly covered by CBS. Climax of a long series of Columbia broadcasts from Philadelphia came on Wednesday and Thursday evenings. July 17 and 18, when CBS brought its audience the direct. on-theconvention-floor proceedings of the balloting for presidential and vice-presidential candidates. Following the nomination of Henry A. Wallace, Secretary of Agriculture, for the vice-presidency, CBS broadcast an address by President Roosevelt from the White House to the Convention. Mrs. Roosevelt, Postmaster General James A. Farley, Speaker William D. Bankhead, Senator James F. Byrnes, Senator Alben Barkley, Senator Carter Glass, and many other outstanding Democrats were among the public figures heard in CBS broadcasts from the convention city.

JULY 7: U. S. Solicitor General Francis Biddle discussed plans for finger-printing and obtaining full information on America's three and a half million aliens in an address from Philadelphia, 10:30–10:45 p.m.

JULY 8: King Haakon. ruler of Norway until Adolf Hitler conquered the country, was heard in an address from his present home, London, 4-4:10 p.m.

JULY 9: Herbert Morrison. minister of supplies in Winston Churchill's British cabinet, broadcast from London. 5:30-5:37 p.m.

JULY 9: General George C. Marshall. Chief of Staff of the U. S. Army, and Admiral Harold R. Stark. Chief of Naval Operations, joined in a special broadcast from Washington, 11:45-12 midnight.

JULY 11: Commissioner Arthur S. Flemming was heard in a special broadcast from the nation's capital. 5:30-5:45 p.m.

JULY 11: Louis Johnson, then acting secretary of war, described the process of "Rounding Out the Army Program, 10:15–10:45 p.m.

JULY 11: CBS broadcast a special news report on the Mexican elections from Mexico City, 10:48–10:53 p.m.

JULY 12: Representative Sam Rayburn of Texas, in Chicago for the Democratic Convention, discussed the caucus, 10–10:30 p.m.

JULY 13: Senator D. Worth Clark, Demoerat, of Idaho, presented his views on America's foreign policy in an address from Chicago, 10:15-10:30 p.m.

JULY 13: Philip F. LaFollette, Progressive Party leader of Wisconsin, discussed "The Defense of America." 6:30–6:45 p.m.

JULY 14: Senator Burton K. Wheeler of Montana, head of the so-called Democratic isolationist bloc, explained "Why the Democratic Party Should Have a Peace Plank," 7:15-7:30 p.m.

JULY 19: CBS broadcast Chancellor Adolf Hitler's address to the German people prior to a renewed attack on the British Isles, 1–2:41 p.m.

JULY 21: Edward R. Murrow, Vincent Sheean, Arthur Menken, Erland Echlin, Eric Sevareid, and Larry Leseur, broadcasting from different parts of the British Isles, described Britain's preparations for immediate German attack, 11–11:30 p.m.

JULY 22-31: CBS carried an extensive series of broadcasts from the Inter-American Conference in Havana, called by Secretary of State Cordell Hull of the United States to consider problems arising from the European war which affect the western hemi-

sphere. Starting on Monday with Secretary Hull's keynote speech (5-5:40 p.m.), CBS covered with news broadcasts on Monday and Tuesday (10:30-10:45 p.m.), Wednesday and Thursday (10:15-10:45 p.m.), Friday (10:30-10:45 p.m.) and Saturday (10:15-10:45 p.m.). The broadcasts included summaries by Albert Warner, Alberto Zalamea, and Howard Pierce Davis of the CBS staff, as well as addresses from the floor. Dr. Leo S. Rowe was heard in a broadcast from Havana on July 29, 8-8:15 p.m.

JULY 22: Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt spoke over CBS from the New York World's Fair in connection with the WPA day ceremonies, 3:15-3:30 p.m.

JULY 22: Viscount Halifax discussed the situation facing England in a broadcast from London, 4:15–4:30 p.m.

JULY 26: Norman H. Davis, chairman of the American Red Cross, spoke from Washington, 10-10:15 p.m.

JULY 28: Representative Vito Marcantonio, American Labor Party Congressman from New York, attacked "The Registration of Aliens," 10:30–10:45 p.m.

JULY 30: CBS carried a special broadcast from the National Foreign Trade Convention in San Francisco, 10:15–10:30 p.m.

SPECIAL EVENTS

JULY 4: An American Legion broadcast from New York City and Chicago was a CBS Independence Day feature, 3:35-4 p.m.

JULY 7: Two half-hour productions by the Columbia Dramatic Guild, a charming fantasy and a horror drama, were broadcast over CBS Network late Sunday evening (actually Monday), 12:45–1:45 a.m.

JULY 9: Mel Allen and France Laux. two CBS star baseball reporters, described the All-Star game in St. Louis, 3:15-5:30 p.m.

JULY 20 and 27: On successive Saturdays CBS broadcast trackside accounts of two Arlington Park races in Chicago, the Arlington Classic and the Arlington Futurity, 6:05-6:20 p.m.

JULY 26: The nation's leading barber shop quartets, competing at the Band Shell, City Plaza, New York World's Fair, vocal-

ized over Columbia's coast-to-coast Network, 11:15-11:30 p.m.

JULY 28: Jack Knell, Columbia's marine reporter, presented the complete story of the "press run" of the S.S. America, largest and fastest luxury liner ever built in the United States, 2:35–2:45 p.m.
