One result of this flexibility and timeliness is the following partial list of September programs which were arranged too late for inclusion in the last month's issue of THE COLUMBIA PROGRAM BOOK.

PUBLIC AFFAIRS

SEPTEMBER 4: Norman Thomas. Socialist Party candidate for the Presidency, discussed "How We Can Defeat Hitlerism" in a special CBS broadcast from Buffalo, 10:15-10:30 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 11: Senator Robert M. LaFollette, Jr., Progressive of Wisconsin, opposed extension of aid to Great Britain beyond the limitations of the "cash-and-carry" neutrality law in a specially scheduled CBS address. His talk, which originated in the studios of WBBM, Chicago, was made under the auspices of the America First Committee. 10:15–10:30 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 11: Winston Churchill, prime minister of Great Britain, was heard over CBS in an address from bomb-torn London, 1-1:15 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 12: Dr. Arthur H. Merritt and Dr. C. Willard Camalier, president and former president respectively of the American Dental Association, discussed the dentist's role in national defense from the Association's convention in Cleveland. 5:30-5:45 p.m.

General John J. Pershing, commander of the American Expeditionary Force in the World War, on the occasion of his 80th anniversary was broadcast over CBS. Raymond Kelly, then National Commander of the American Legion, paid tribute to General Pershing from Chicago, and the General replied from Washington. 5:30–5:45 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 14: Senator Charles O. Andrews. Democrat of Florida, was heard in a broadcast over Columbia's coast-to-coast Network from Washington. 10:15–10:30 p.m.

september 16: Wendell L. Willkie's speech at Coffeyville. Kansas, called by the Republican candidate the "main opening" of his campaign, was heard throughout the nation over CBS. Mr. Willkie was introduced to the Coffeyville and radio audiences by Walter Johnson, one-time baseball star who is now a Republican candidate for Congress in Maryland, 6-6:30 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 16: General George C. Marshall, chief of staff of the U. S. Army, addressed 200,000 members of the National Guard over the nationwide Network of CBS. The Guardsmen, some of whom were mustered for one year of active training, were

assembled in armories in all parts of the country for induction into the Federal military services, 11:15-11:30 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 17: Dr. Thomas Mann. Nobel prize winner and refugee from Nazi Germany, explained why alien registration is important in the United States in an address over CBS. Dr. Mann. interviewed by William A. Carmichael. Federal supervisor of immigration and naturalization for Southern California. told the Network audience that the checkup of foreign-born residents in the United States serves as a safeguard against fifth column activities, 10:15-10:30 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 18: H. W. Prentis. Jr., president of the National Association of Manufacturers, and Major Benjamin H. Namm. executive committee director of the National Retail Dry Goods Association, met before a CBS microphone to discuss "Business Unity for National Defense," 10:15–10:30 p.m.

head of the National Defense Advisory Commission's Industrial Materials Division, spoke on the first of three progress reports from the Commission to the country. Talking from the studios of WJSV, CBS station in Washington, Mr. Stettinius outlined the commission's aims and accomplishments, 10:15–10:30 p.m.

ROOSEVELT SPOKE OVER CBS in connection with the bicentennial celebration of the University of Pennsylvania, at which the President received an honorary degree, 4-4:30 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 21: Maury Maverick. Mayor of San Antonio. Texas, presented the reasons why he has abandoned his former stand for isolationism in America. The address, en-

titled "An Isolationist's Change of Heart," originated in the studios of WABC, 10:35–10:45 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 21 THRU SEPTEMBER 26: CBS covered the 22nd convention of the American Legion in Boston with a diversified series of programs covering all phases of the veterans' activities. On September 21, Columbia listeners were taken "Behind the Scenes," as then National Commander Raymond J. Kelly and Glenwood J. Sherrard. Boston Convention Corporation president, discussed arrangements for the Convention with a CBS announcer (5:30-5:45 p.m.).

On the following day, Katherine F. Lenroot, chief of the Children's Bureau, U. S. Labor Department. and Ed Morgenstern. Legion child welfare committee chairman, spoke on the veterans' \$4,000,000 child aid campaign (2:15-2:30 p.m.). The first of two programs on September 23 brought Mrs. Corwith of the Legion Auxiliary to the microphone, while the second featured the winners of the Legion drum and bugle corps tournament (11:15-11:30 p.m.). On September 26, a "Hail and Farewell" broadcast included addresses by retiring Commander Kelly and by newly-elected Commander Milo Warner. 5:30-5:45 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 24: CBS broadcast addresses by John C. Paige and William W. Warne from the National Reclamation Association Convention in Great Falls. Montana, 6:15– 6:30 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 28: President Franklin D. Roosevelt was heard in an address at the cornerstone laying ceremonies for the Washington National Airport's Terminal Building. The President, discussing the general question of preparedness, promised the United States that it would be impregnable in the air, 3:30–3:45 p.m.

SPECIAL EVENTS

SEPTEMBER 10 THRU SEPTEMBER 14: Ted Husing brought CBS listeners vivid descriptions and summaries of the play in the National Amateur Golf Tourney, held this year at the Winged Foot Golf Club in Mamaroneck. Husing's reports started with summaries of qualify play (September 10. 5:30-5:45 p.m.) and of the first four rounds of match play (September 11, 5:30-5:45 p.m., and September 12. 5:15-5:30 p.m.). On September 13. he summarized the semifinal round of match play (5:00-5:15 p.m.) and on the morning of September 14, he summarized the morning round of finals (11:30-11:45 a.m.). Husing's series was climaxed by a play-by-play description of the afternoon round of finals. 2-4 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 15: Richard Llewellyn, author of the best selling novel. "How Green Was My Valley." spoke from London in a special Welsh Day broadcast over CBS. Llewellyn was granted leave from military duties for the broadcast. 2:45–3 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 15: Another CBS sports exclusive brought Columbia's audience an eye-

witness account of the 1940 national open polo championship finals from International Field. Meadow Brook Club. Westbury. Long Island. Ted Husing. assisted by Jimmy Dolan. presented the running account of the contest. 3:15–5:30 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 21: Ted Husing's full and exciting September sports schedule brought him to Aqueduct, where he described the running of the Beldame Handicap at the track's closing for the season. 4:30—4:45 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 23: Ted Husing and Jimmy Dolan covered the 48th running of the Lawrence Realization, highlight of the opening day of the Belmont track's fall meeting. 4:30–4:45 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 28: Columbia presented the first in its series of descriptions of major football games—Ted Husing's colorful playby-play of the clash between Minnesota and Washington. 3:45–6 p.m.


