

CBS' board of political correspondents—Elmer Davis, Bob Trout, and Albert Warner—broadcast election returns as they come by telephone and press association tickers to CBS headquarters in New York. In the early evening, when returns are sparse, they broadcast during the regular news periods with an additional program each hour; but starting at 9 p.m. EST, when the results are fuller, they remain on the air until Franklin D. Roosevelt or Wendell Willkie is elected President of the United States. Elmo Roper, director of the Fortune survey, joins the CBS corps of more than 40 experts to analyze the returns in the light of the straw polls.



OCTOBER 10: Colonel Fulgencio Batista, president-elect of Cuba, was heard over CBS in his inaugural address from the Presidential Palace in Havana, 3:15–3:30 p.m.

OCTOBER 10: William S. Knudsen, member of the Defense Advisory Commission, gave one in a series of talks on the "Progress of National Defense." 10:35–10:45 p.m.

OCTOBER 12: President Roosevelt's address on "Hemispheric Events" was broadcast on the coast-to-coast Network of the Columbia Broadcasting System. The President spoke before a battery of microphones installed in his railway car at Dayton. Ohio. where he paused on a tour of defense projects in Pennsylvania and Ohio. 9–9:45 p.m.

october 12: A special CBS broadcast, including pickups from New York and Detroit, presented graphically the place of the American automobile in the national defense program, 10:15-10:45 p.m.

OCTOBER 13: Princess Elizabeth, 14-yearold heir to the British throne, was heard in a child-to-child message to her future subjects, 11:15-11:20 a.m. OCTOBER 14: Admiral William D. Leahy. U.S. Navy, Retired, now Governor of Puerto Rico, and Assistant Secretary of the Navy Lewis Compton were heard in a fifteen-minute program from the studios of WJSV. Washington. 10:30–10:45 p.m.

OCTOBER 15: Gene Tinney, chairman of the National Foundation for American Youth, called on 9,000.000 American youth to exercise their "first votes" in the 1940 presidential election. Mr. Tunney presented F. Stephen McArthur, Jr., president of the Young Democrats, and Charles Whitman. Jr., young Republican worker, 6:15-6:30 p.m.

OCTOBER 15: Lt. Col. Lewis B. Hershey. acting director of Selective Service Act. spoke on the eve of the registration of 16.000.000 young Americans for national defense. 11:15–11:30 p.m.

OCTOBER 16: President Roosevelt was heard in an early-morning message to the millions of Americans about to register for conscription. 8-8:07 a.m.

OCTOBER 16: After registration for the draft was finished, Columbia reporters in four cities interviewed men-on-the-street on

their attitude to the conscription of the nation's manpower. The cross-country program included pickups from Washington, New York City, Chicago, and Hollywood, 10:15-10:30 p.in.

OCTOBER 19: Columbia broadcast a special, transoceanic broadcast from a London air raid shelter, 6:15-6:25 p.m.

OCTOBER 19: Charles Boyer, the French movie star, told why he believes alien registration is important to the safety of the United States. The film actor's talk, originating in Hollywood, was the second in a series of addresses on the importance of enrolling aliens. 10:15-10:30 p.m.

OCTOBER 23: Wendell L. Willkie, Republican candidate for President, presented his views on American defense in an address broadcast from the tenth annual New York Herald Tribune Forum on Current Problems, 10:31-11 p.m.

OCTOBER 24: President Roosevelt spoke from the White House to the Herald Tribune Forum assembled in New York City. The President's remarks were directly rated to the theme of that day's Forum session. "Saving Democracy in the Western World." 4:45–5:15 p.m.

OCTOBER 24: Brigadier General Raymond F. Metcalfe of the U. S. Army Medical Corps revealed how the medical profession is adapting itself to the national defense program. Dr. Metcalfe's talk originated in Chicago during the evening session of the Clinical Congress of the American College of Surgeons, 10:45-11 p.m.

OCTOBER 26: General Robert E. Wood. chairman of the board of Sears Roebuck & Company, spoke on "Onr Foreign Policy" under the auspices of the America First

Committee. He presented the Committee's stand, which is opposed to extension of aid to the Allies beyond the limitations of the strict cash-and-carry law, 10:15-10:30 p.m.

OCTOBER 27: CBS joined in the nation's celebration of Navy Day, 1940, with a special half-hour program, climaxed by a talk by Secretary of the Navy Frank Knox. The early part of the broadcast included an address by Admiral Harold R. Stark, Chief of Naval Operations, and interviews of a newly-enlisted man, a veteran sailor, and a Marine. Lieutenant Commander Arthur Godfrey, U. S. Naval Reserves and an announcer at WJSV. CBS station in Washington. acted as master of ceremonies, 2–2:30 p.m.

october 29: CBS brought its listeners a word-picture of the ceremonies in Washington, as Secretary of War Henry L. Stimson drew the first number in the national draft lottery. Bob Trout, ace CBS reporter, described the scene as Secretary Stimson drew numbers from the same goldfish bowl used for the draft in the World War, 12-12:45 p.m.

OCTOBER 5: President Roosevelt was heard in a special address in connection with the dedication of Franklin Delano Roosevelt High School in East Park, N. Y., 2:45-3 p.m.

OCTOBER 6: Heralding approach of the most sacred holiday on the Hebrew calendar, CBS presented a special Yom Kippur program from its New York studios. Rabbi Israel Goldstein of Congregation B'nai Jeshurun, New York City, delivered the Yom Kippur address, 2:35-3 p.m.

OCTOBER 12: Dr. Robert L. Swain, winner of the 1940 Remington medal in pharmacy,

spoke to the Columbia Network audience on the relationship of "Advertising and the Consumer's Dollar," 2-2:10 p.m.

OCTOBER 12: CBS broadcast an imprompturound-table discussion of safety from Chicago, in connection with the National Safety Congress. Participants included a champion truck driver, a woman driver, a taxicab pilot, and a pedestrian, 2:15–2:30 p.m.

october 10 and 17: CBS broadcast two programs from the 53rd triennial session of the Protestant Episcopal Church in Kansas City. On October 10, the speaker was the Most Rev. Derwyn T. Owen, Primate of Canada; on October 17, the Right Rev. W. Appleton Lawrence, Bishop of Western Massachusetts, 5:15–5:30 p.m.

OCTOBER 12: Dr. Oscar Blackwelder, pastor of the Lutheran Church of the Reformation in Washington, analyzed "The Contribution of the Christian Faith to the Present Hour" in a special address over CBS. His talk originated at the 12th biennial conference of the United Lutheran Church of America in Omaha. 6:15–6:30 p.m.

october 12: Leopold Stokowski, famed music conductor who recently returned from a South American tour with the All-American Youth Orchestra, spoke over CBS in connection with Founder's Day of the Young Men's Christian Association. Theme of this year's celebration of the anniversary of the birth of Sir George Williams, founder of the Y. M. C. A., was "Youth Rises in a Crisis," 6:30-6:45 p.m.

OCTOBER 19: Pope Pius XII was heard over CBS in a special message from Vatican City, 1:30-1:48 p.m.

OCTOBER 23: Dean George Schicks of Rutgers University College of Pharmacy discussed the profession's contributions to the health and progress of mankind in a Columbia Network broadcast, 5:35-5:45 p.m.

OCTOBER 30: The King of America's Cornhuskers came directly from the national contest grounds in Davenport, lowa, to the studios of WOC, CBS station in that city, to describe how he outshucked his rivals, 5:30–5:45 p.m.
