PUBLIC AFFAIRS

NOVEMBER 6: CBS and the Council for Democracy joined the day after President Roosevelt's election in a three-quarter-hour broadcast demonstrating American unity. Democratic and Republican leaders rallied to the call "United We Stand" in this special broadcast, which was arranged before Election Day. Alf M. Landon, Newbold Morris, and Raymond Gram Swing were among those heard in addresses, while Irving Berlin and Paul Whiteman were featured in the musical portions of the program, 10:15–11 p.m.

NOVEMBER 7: CBS broadcast a special onthe-scene description of Washington's rousing reception to President Roosevelt after his election to a third term. The President was heard briefly during the program. 8:30– 9 a.m.

NOVEMBER 9: Theodore Dreiser, eminent American novelist, urged the repeal of the Conscription Act in an address under the auspices of the American Peace Mobilization. Dreiser advocated support of Representative Vito Marcantonio's bill for repealing the Act. 2–2:15 p.m.

NOVEMBER 11: President Roosevelt was heard from the Amphitheater of the Arlington Cemetery in a special address on Armistice Day, 10:59-11:15 a.m.

NOVEMBER 11: President Roosevelt was heard for the second time in one day over CBS in an address in connection with the cornerstone exercises for the new Naval Medical Center at Bethesda. Maryland. 3:30-3:45 p.m.

NOVEMBER 11: Wendell L. Willkie urged his followers to maintain a "loyal opposition" to the Democratic administration in a special address from New York City. 10:30–11 p.m.

NOVEMBER 15: The Hon. Herbert C. Hoover, ex-president of the United States. broadcast from Vassar College in Pough-keepsie. 9:30-10 p.m.

NOVEMBER 19: Governor Harold E. Stassen of Minnesota submitted to the nation-wide Columbia audience his program for economies in local government as a means of reducing the tax burdens created by national defense. His address was broadcast from Springfield. Mass., where the National Municipal League had opened a three-day convention, 10:30–10:45 p.m.

NOVEMBER 20: The Committee to Defend America by Aiding the Allies presented its program of strenuous aid to Great Britain in a special quarter-hour broadcast from New York and Boston, 11:15-11:30 p.m.

NOVEMBER 22: Philip Murray. head of the Steel Workers Organizing Committee and newly-elected President of the C. I. O.. was heard in an address from Atlantic City, where the C. I. O. elected him to succeed John L. Lewis as its leader, 9:45-10 p.m.

NOVEMBER 23: Frank T. Bow, General Counsel of the National Council of Independent Unions, spoke on "Undominated Lahor" from the studios of WGAR. Columbia's station in Cleveland. Ohio. 10:15–10:30 p.m.

NOVEMBER 27: The food industry's important role in national defense and the measures being taken to safeguard the public from profiteering during emergency periods were discussed by Paul S. Willis, president of the Associated Grocery Manufacturers of America, in a special CBS broadcast, 10:15–10:30 p.m.

NOVEMBER 30: Franklin D. Roosevelt, Jr.. Betsy Barton. and Dr. Frank Kingdon were heard in a special broadcast jointly arranged by CBS and the newly-formed Committee of Thirty Million, "A Roll Call of Youth for Democracy," 10:15–10:30 p.m.

SPECIAL EVENTS

NOVEMBER 12: Columbia broadcast a special program in connection with the "National

Conference of Catholic Charities," from Washington, 5:30-5:45 p.m.

NOVEMBER 15: Norman Corwin's verse-drama, "Seems Radio Is Here To Stay," was again given as a tribute to the industry as part of the National Association of Broadcasters' observance of radio's twentieth anniversary. The play was first presented in April, 1939, and since has won enthusiastic applause from a host of coast-to-coast listeners, 9:30–10 p.m.

NOVEMBER 17: The American Red Cross 1940 drive was heralded by a special program originating in the studios of KNX. CBS station in Hollywood. Many screen stars participated in the program which urged Americans to support the Red Cross, 1:30-2:30 p.m.

NOVEMBER 19: Kate Smith was heard in an appeal for the American Red Cross from Hollywood, 5:30-5:45 p.m.

NOVEMBER 22: Columbia broadcast a special program in connection with the Texas State Teachers Conference and the Virginia State Teachers Conference. 3:15-3:30 p.m.

NOVEMBER 25: CBS covered the arrival of draftees at Fort Dix with a special broadcast originating at the camp's Recruit Reception Center. Draftees were interviewed on the program, and the first days at camp were graphically described, 9-9:15 a.m.. 10:45-11 p.m.
