


APRIL 26: Representative Joseph W. Marn, Jr., of Massachusetts, chairman of the epublican National Committee, was heard ver the Columbia network in an address at the Connecticut State Convention of Young Republicans. 10:15–10:45 p.m.

APRIL 29: Manchester Boddy, president and publisher of the Los Angeles News, disussed the role of the press in American lefense in a broadcast originating at CBS tudios in New York, 10:15–10:30 p.m.

casting from a ringside position, Husing brought the winners to the microphone for brief interviews. 11:05-12:00 midnight.

APRIL 8: A special concert given by the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra, for American Chemical Society members convening in St. Louis, was broadcast over the CBS network, 11:00-11:30 p.m.

APRIL 9: CBS covered the ceremonies marking the commissioning of the new 35,000-ton battleship, North Carolina, with short-wave and network broadcasts from the New York Navy Yard in Brooklyn. 11:30–11:45 a.m., 3:30–3:45 p.m.

APRIL 12: The launching of the Rio de Janeiro. new Moore-McCormack passenger liner, at Chester, Pa., was covered in two broadcasts—one to Latin America and the other within the United States—over the facilities of the Columbia Broadcasting System. The actual ceremonies, including christening of the ship by Senhora Alzira Vargas do Amaral Peixoto, daughter of Brazil's President Getulio Vargas, was reported in Portuguese by Luis Lopez Correa, of CBS's foreign language staff, in a short-wave broadcast over Columbia's international station WCAB, and beamed toward Latin America. 1:45–2:00. 2:00–2:15 p.m.

APRIL 12: Ted Husing took his CBS microphone to the Jamaica track for the opening of the 1941 metropolitan racing season. Assisted by Jimmy Dolan, he gave the CBS audience a running description of the Paumonok Handicap, feature race of the first day's program, 4:15–4:30 p.m.

APRIL 19: Major activity at the California Institute of Technology—much of it concerned with problems of national defense—was described in seven pickups from the famous West Coast institution during a Columbia network broadcast. 2:00–2:30 p.m.

APRIL 19: Thirty-fourth annual running of the Excelsior Handicap at Jamaica was described for CBS listeners by Ted Husing, assisted by Jimmy Dolan. 4:30–4:45 p.m.

APRIL 20: The first description of what would be done in America if real enemy aircraft approached was brought Columbia's listeners in an extraordinary broadcast in which Secretary of War Henry L. Stimson spoke and CBS announcers John Charles Dayly and Bob Trout described the first demonstration of the new civilian aircraft warning program. The exclusive CBS broadcast originated at Mitchel Field, Long Island, 5:15–5:30 p.m.

APRIL 22: Senator Harry F. Byrd of Virginia told the CBS audience of his state's Garden Club Tour, this year held for the benefit of Bundles for Britain. Senator Byrd described the itinerary and highlighted features of the tour, 10:15–10:30 p.m.

april 24: CBS covered the Chrysler dealers' presentation of a giant medium armor plate tank to the U. S. Army. The tank, first produced in Chrysler's arsenal in Detroit, was presented to the government as a gift of the Chrysler distributors. K. T. Keller. president of the Chrysler Corporation, and Major General C. M. Wesson were among the army and automotive officials who spoke during the broadcast, which originated inside the huge arsenal, 11:00–11:15 a.m.

APRIL 25: Lord Halifax, British Ambassador to the United States, was heard by Columbia's coast-to-coast audience speaking at a meeting of the Atlanta Bar Association, 10:30–11:00 p.m.

APRIL 26: For the tenth year, Ted Husing brought the CBS audience a trackside account of the Penn Relays at Franklin Field. Philadelphia. Assisted by Jimmy Dolan. Husing described feature races from the infield where he got the best possible view

of the runners, 4:30-5:00, 5:40-5:50 p.m.

april 27: Keynote speaker at a meeting under auspices of United China Relief, Inc., former Ambassador William C. Bullitt delivered an address on "The Battle for Democracy in Asia," broadcast over the CBS network from Constitution Hall in Washington, 10:30–11:00 p.m.


