

World-wide news events are broadcast Monday through Friday by Alberto Zalamea, wellknown journalist and native of Colombia, (WCBX). Monday through Friday by Adriano A. Rubio (WCAB).

Mr. Roberto Unanue tells the Latin American republics the news about their own Latin American neighbors.

Luis Correa and Luis Jatoba. native Brazilian journalists, report the news each day.

The latest news of the theater, motion pictures, fashions and personalities of Broadway is reported in Spanish by Carmen Castelo.

José Santos Quijano is heard each Friday in a quarter-hour digest of cultural news of special interest to South American listeners.


