News in twelve languages - a comprehensive schedule of forty-four fifteen-minute periods per day, three hundred and eight per weekis now directed to shortwave listeners in Europe, Africa, and the Near East by Columbia's international station, WCBX, and the new CBS fifty-kilowatt transmitter, WCRC. The seven-day-a-week. "around the clock" schedule begins at midnight in New York and ends in the late afternoon, which is from dawn to late evening in Europe. The languages include English, French, Italian, German, Spanish, Portuguese, Polish, Serbo-Croatian, Dutch, Swedish, Arabic, and Turkish. A staff of fifty persons is required to build these broadcasts. all news stemming from a central news room located in newly-constructed quarters in the CBS Studio Building. All the news services and facilities available to the network itself have been installed there.


