In this program, selected by the BBC for rebroadcast in England, Milton Bacon, a great story teller, brings to life the legends and lost heroes of obscure American towns. The favorite folk songs of each region are sung by the Cross-Roads Troubadours quartet.

This is a five-a-week series of simple human dramas that portray the life of an average American family during wartime; a fortifying picture of America.

In March 1943 this program received the George Foster Peabody Radio Award for "outstanding entertainment in drama." Each week's dramatization gives a vivid account of the experiences of men in America's fighting forces.

Lindsay MacHarrie, chief of the radio section of the American Red Cross in London, interviews American Service men in the British Isles. Families of these men are notified in time to hear the broadcasts.

CBS correspondents in London report the human interest stories of a people only 20 minutes by air from the enemy.

This program presents a review and summary of the most vital news of the week and dramatizes it for the American civilian and the American in the armed forces.

This series features pick-ups from training and war production centers. The development of a branch of the armed service or a war industry is given through interviews. Music is usually provided by a military band.

These concerts will feature not only organ concertos by the classic masters, such as Handel, Mozart, Bach and Purcell, but also compositions specially written for the series by contemporary American composers, among them Hanson. Harris, Piston and Sowerby. Assisting artists will be the Fiedler Sinfonietta and the Stradivarius Quartet.


