In its thirteenth consecutive year, the pulpit of Columbia's *Church of the Air* continues to be impartially available, twice each Sunday, to America's religious faiths. During the past year many of the services have originated at Army camps and Navy bases, with Chaplains of the uniformed forces officiating.

Rev. Glynn T. Settle conducts this program which features the renowned thirty-voice Wings Over Jordan Choir, religious talks, and Negro spirituals.

The fine old familiar hymns of all religious denominations are inspiringly sung by a male quartet. Each broadcast includes a brief reading from the Bible.

News in eight languages, plus more than four hours of entertainment for American troops abroad, is directed seven days a week to Europe. Africa, the Near East and Asia by the CBS Short Wave Department. This schedule is continuous, around the clock, for 24 hours a day. Five shows daily are now being retransmitted by Radio Algiers, and one show by Radio Naples, Italy. On December 31, 1943, CBS began operating two new 50,000-watt transmitters to Europe, WOOC and WOOW, making five transmitters beaming programs East. On May 1, 1944, CBS put into service still another 50,000-watt transmitter, WCBN, to both Europe and Latin America.

From late afternoon till 2:00 a.m. Columbia programs are beamed to all Latin America in both Spanish and Portuguese. News and news features are emphasized on these CBS broadcasts; elaborate musical and dramatic programs round out the entertainment schedule. Many of these programs are rebroadcast locally on standard wave by Columbia's 101 affiliated stations in Latin America.
