News, News Features and Entertainment Beamed to The Network of the Americas In: SPANISH PORTUGUESE In its thirteenth consecutive year, the pulpit of Columbia's *Church of the Air* continues to be impartially available, twice each Sunday, to America's religious faiths. During the past year many of the services have originated at Army camps and Navy bases, with Chaplains of the uniformed forces officiating.

This program of religious talks and spirituals presents outstanding Negro leaders in all fields of endeavor. Rev. Glenn T. Settle conducts the program, which features the renowned thirtyvoice Wings Over Jordan Choir.

The fine old familiar hymns of all religious denominations, inspiringly sung by a male quartet. Each broadcast includes a brief reading from the Bible.

News in eight languages, plus more than four hours of entertainment for American troops abroad, is directed seven days a week to Europe, Africa, the Near East and Asia by the CBS Short Wave Department. This schedule is continuous, around the clock, for 24 hours a day. Five shows daily are now being retransmitted by Radio Algiers, and one show by Radio Bari, Italy. On December 31, 1943, CBS began operating two new 50,000-watt transmitters to Europe, WOOC and WOOW, making five transmitters beaming programs East. On March 1, 1944, CBS will inaugurate service on still another 50,000-watt transmitter, WCBN, to both Europe and Latin America.

From late afternoon till 2:00 a.m. Columbia programs are beamed to all Latin America in both Spanish and Portuguese. News and news commentaries are featured on these CBS broadcasts; elaborate musical and dramatic programs round out the entertainment schedule. Many of these programs are rebroadcast locally on standard wave by Columbia's 97 affiliated stations in Latin America.

In its thirteenth consecutive year, the pulpit of Columbia's *Church of the Air* continues to be impartially available, twice each Sunday, to America's religious faiths. During the past year many of the services have originated at Army camps and Navy bases, with Chaplains of the uniformed forces officiating.

Rev. Glynn T. Settle conducts this program which features the renowned thirty-voice Wings Over Jordan Choir, religious talks, and Negro spirituals.

The fine old familiar hymns of all religious denominations are inspiringly sung by a male quartet. Each broadcast includes a brief reading from the Bible.

News in eight languages, plus more than four hours of entertainment for American troops abroad, is directed seven days a week to Europe. Africa, the Near East and Asia by the CBS Short Wave Department. This schedule is continuous, around the clock, for 24 hours a day. Five shows daily are now being retransmitted by Radio Algiers, and one show by Radio Naples, Italy. On December 31, 1943, CBS began operating two new 50,000-watt transmitters to Europe, WOOC and WOOW, making five transmitters beaming programs East. On May 1, 1944, CBS put into service still another 50,000-watt transmitter, WCBN, to both Europe and Latin America.

From late afternoon till 2:00 a.m. Columbia programs are beamed to all Latin America in both Spanish and Portuguese. News and news features are emphasized on these CBS broadcasts; elaborate musical and dramatic programs round out the entertainment schedule. Many of these programs are rebroadcast locally on standard wave by Columbia's 101 affiliated stations in Latin America.

News, News Features and Entertainment Beamed Overseas In: ENGLISH FRENCH ITALIAN GERMAN POLISH SERBO-CROATIAN DUTCH CZECH In its thirteenth consecutive year, the pulpit of Columbia's *Church of the Air* continues to be impartially available, twice each Sunday, to America's religious faiths. During the past

year many of the services have originated at Army camps and Navy bases, with Chaplains of the uniformed forces officiating.

Rev. Glynn T. Settle conducts this program which features the renowned thirty-voice Wings Over Jordan Choir and Negro spirituals.

The fine old familiar hymns of all religious denominations are inspiringly sung by a male quartet. Each broadcast includes a brief reading from the Bible.

From late afternoon till 2:00 a.m. Columbia programs are beamed to all Latin America in both Spanish and Portuguese. News. cultural and sports features are emphasized on these CBS broadcasts; elaborate musical and dramatic programs round out the entertainment schedule. Many of these programs are rebroadcast locally on standard wave by Columbia's 111 affiliated stations in Latin America.

News in eight languages, plus more than four hours of entertainment for American troops abroad, is directed seven days a week to Europe, Africa, the Near East and Asia by the CBS Short Wave Department. This schedule is continuous, around the clock, for 24 hours a day. Five shows daily are now being retransmitted by Radio Algiers, and one show by Radio Naples, Italy. On December 31, 1943, CBS began operating two new 50,000-watt transmitters to Europe, WOOC and WOOW, making five transmitters beaming programs East. On May 1, 1944, CBS put into service s'ill another 50,000-watt transmitter, WCBN, to both Europe and Latin America.







In its thirteenth consecutive year, the pulpit of Columbia's Church of the Air continues to be impartially available, twice each Sunday, to America's religious faiths. During the past year many of the services have originated at Army camps and Navy bases, with Chaplains of the uniformed forces officiating.

This program features the renowned thirtyvoice Wings Over Jordan Choir singing spirituals and gospel songs. Rev. Glenn T. Settle also conducts responsive bible reading and delivers a brief inspirational talk.

From 11:45 a.m. till 2:00 a.m. the following morning Columbia programs are beamed to all Latin America in both Spanish and Portuguese. News, cultural and sports features are emphasized on these CBS broadcasts; elaborate musical and dramatic programs round out the entertainment schedule. Many of these programs are rebroadcast locally on standard wave by Columbia's 111 affiliated stations in Latin America.

News in eight languages, plus more than four hours of entertainment for American troops abroad, is directed seven days a week to Europe, Africa, the Near East and Asia by the CBS Short Wave Department. This schedule is continuous, around the clock, for 24 hours a day. Five shows daily are now being retransmitted by Radio Algiers, and one show by Radio Naples, Italy. On December 31, 1943, CBS began operating two new 50,000-watt transmitters to Europe, WOOC and WOOW, making five transmitters beaming programs East, with one transmitter loaned for special code transmissions. On May 1, 1944, CBS put into service still another 50,000-watt transmitter, WCBN, to both Europe and Latin America.

CBS TELEVISION

Since May 5, 1944, CBS' Television Station, WCBW-NY has televised twice weekly on Thursdays and Fridays a two-honr live-talent program, between 8 and 10 p.m. These programs have been developed on an experimental and sustaining basis, and recently have followed a basic pattern, consisting of the following elements:

News and News Analysis—a 15-minute period during which Everett Holles. CBS Assistant Director of News Broadcasts reports and analyzes the news against a background of visual devices including maps, animations. photographs and other visualizations.

Opinions on Trial, a 45-minute period devoted to the dramatized discussion of controversial issues, presented as a courtroom scene with Judge, Counsel and Opposing Witnesses. The television home audience constitutes the jury and are asked to mail in their verdict.

They Were There, a 15-minute interview program bringing before the television camera men and women in military and civilian war service to describe their experiences.

Documentary Film. The second hour opens

each night with a telecast of documentary or other films.

The Missus Goes A-Shopping. The successful CBS audience-participation program adapted for television. 30 minutes.

Will You Remember? The popular radio vocalist Miss Vera Massey in a 15-minute songsoliloquy.

At Home. A half-hour musical-variety program set in the informal background of a living room and containing interludes of songs and dancing.

This pattern is supplemented each week with experiments in adapting various types of radio programs to television, with special events dictated by the news of the day, and with dramatic and educational features.
