News, cultural and sports features are emphasized; musical and dramatic shows, many of which are rebroadcast on standard wave by Columbia's 109 affiliated stations in Latin America, round out the entertainment schedule.

News in eight languages—plus more than 2% hours of entertainment for American troops abroad is directed seven days a week to Europe, Africa, the Near East and Asia by the CBS Shortwave Department. Daily programs are retransmitted by Radio Luxembourg, Radio Bari, Radio Rome, Radio Naples, Radio Palermo, Radio Florence, The Voice of America in North Africa (formerly known as Radio Algiers) and The United Nations' Network.

For more than a year, CBS has been operating at Delano, California the two new 50 kw. transmitters (KCBA and KCBF) and also the giant 200 kw. transmitter, KCBR, all equipped with a system of highly directional antennas. These transmitters provide a West Coast originating base for programs serving our troops and our allies in the Pacific and in carrying out the program of the occupation of Japan and the former Japanese-held territories.

Languages used on the West Coast transmissions include Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Malayan, Dutch and English.

# SPECIAL BROADCASTS: FALL, 1945

From the CBS Vine Street Playhouse in Hollywood the second act of Stars in the Afternoon was broadcast at 3 p.m. EST, again inviting the nation to a brilliant radio season by spotlighting the CBS programs originating in Hollywood. William N. Robson directed, with the Screen Guild Orchestra and 34 famous stars of screen and radio.

OCTOBER 26. From 6:30 a.m. to 12:00 midnight October 28. CBS devoted 10<sup>1</sup><sub>2</sub> hours to tributes to the U. S. Navy, highlighted by a full hour program from Hollywood featuring EDWARD G. ROBINSON, JOHN GARFIELD, RONALD REAGAN, PAT O'BRIEN and other stars in a pageant of dramatic moments in the war. NOVEMBER 4 to 10. National Radio Week marked radio's 25th anniversary. CBS devoted 11½ hours of sustaining programs to commemorating the industry's first quarter-century. Highlights were NORMAN CORWIN'S "Seems Radio Is Here to Stay," first broadcast on April 24, 1939, now brought up to date. NOVEMBER 10 at 10:45 p.m. EST Herbert C. Hoover paid tribute to radio's service to the people of the U. S.
