CBS TELEVISION

Three notable events have marked the progress of CBS Television during the past three months.

- 1. On June 11 WCBW, the CBS television station in New York, announced the addition of 3,000 square feet of floor space and undertook extensive alterations of its premises in Grand Central Terminal to permit greatly expanded operations. WCBW maintains the largest television studios in the country.
- 2. Col. Lawrence W. Lowman, CBS Vice President on leave of absence with the armed forces, returned to Columbia on July 1st as Vice President in Charge of Television.
- 3. On July 16, CBS television facilities were made available to network clients on "a working partnership" basis for testing, developing, and broadcasting commercial video programs. The invitation to join in this experiment called it "a plan which should greatly speed the day of effective commercial television."

WCBW is now on the air every Monday, Tuesday and Thursday evenings starting at 8 o'clock. Highlights of the programs are:

News, analyses and news features, reported by the WCBW news staff. (3 times a week) The Missus Goes A-Shopping, an audience participation program with John Reed King, adapted from the WABC program of the same title. (Once a week)

Sports. Amateur boxing and wrestling matches. (Once a week)

The World We Live In. The contemporary world scene, with live dramatization woven around Encyclopedia Britannica films. (Twice each month)

There Ought To Be a Law. Impromptu discussions of youthful interests by 30 selected high school students formed into a "senate." (Twice each month)

Dramatic programs, comedy and mystery. (Once each month)

The Doctor Reports. Dramatic presentations of the fight for health. (Once each month)

Special Events. Documentary reports, interviews, dramatizations, rising out of the war, domestic and international affairs, presented as news develops.
