News and news features in eight languages occupy the major portion of the CBS program schedule beamed to Europe, Africa, the Near East and Asia. The European schedule includes entertainment and cultural programs produced in English for English-speaking listeners and U.S. military and government personnel abroad, as well as daily programs of American music broadcast in French and Italian.

For more than a year, CBS has been operating at Delano, California the two new 50 kw transmitters (KCBA and KCBF) and also the giant 200 kw, transmitter, KCBR, all equipped with a system of highly directional antennas. These transmitters provide a West Coast originating base for programs serving troops in the Pacific and in carrying out the program of the occupation of Japan and the former Japanese-held territories.

Languages used on the West Coast transmissions include Chinese, Siamese, Korean. Malayan, Dutch and English.

SPECIAL BROADCASTS: FALL, 1946

Listed here are a representative group of special CBS broadcasts under two general categories:

- 1. Sustaining broadcasts of distinctive program value.
- 2. Programs of public significance arranged by the CBS Talks Department. These broadcasts are scheduled on a week to week, day to day, and even, on occasion, hour to hour basis. This flexibility helps to sharpen the broadcasts from the point of view of public service and timeliness.

NOTABLE BROADCASTS:

SEPTEMBER 22 and 29. For an hour and a half on each of these two Sundays, in a special program titled Stars in the Afternoon, CBS introduced the major entertainment shows scheduled for its 1946-47 season. On both occasions part of a huge cast gathered in New York, part in Hollywood, and the spotlight moved from coast to coast as the drama unfolded. In the first program the central parts were played by Frank Sinatra and Dinah Shore; in the second by Ozzie and Harriet Nelson.

OCTOBER 16. On the night following the Nuremberg dawn that ended the lives of the ten remaining leaders of Nazi Germany, Columbia presented a special documentary program, The Empty Noose. Recalling some of the origins of the Second World War and the reasons for the war crimes trials, the program dramatized five episodes in the careers of key Nazi leaders. The program's theme and title suggested the essential implication of the Nuremberg trials: that similar punishment awaits the leaders of any future resurgence of fascism.

OCTOBER 23. On the occasion of the opening session of the United Nations General Assembly at Flushing Meadows, CBS broadcast President Truman's welcoming address. Then as the ceremonies continued. UN reporter Larry Lesueur calledon five other Columbia newsmen to comment on the President's speech and to

help explain the problems and legislative machinery of the General Assembly.

NOVEMBER 5. After several preliminary reports through the early evening, at 10:30 p.m. EST Columbia's news staff took over the remainder of the Election Night schedule to continue a running commentary on the progress of voting returns until 2 a.m. Approximately every half-hour Robert Trout summed up national trends; in the intervals between his reports six others—Ned Calmer, Charles Collingwood, John Daly, Douglas Edwards, Bill Henry, and Quincy Howe—took turns analyzing regional returns in detail.

NOVEMBER 12, 19, and 26. On the first of these three Tuesdays (6:15-6:30 p.m. EST) an eminent biometrician. Dr. E. M. Jellinck, spoke on "A National Problem" and thus introduced a special 13-week CBS series of discussions on You and Alcohol. Dr. Jellinek is director of the Section on Alcohol Studies of the Laboratory of Applied Physiology at Yale University. He was followed on November 19 by Dr. Henry W. Newman, of the Stanford University Medical School, and on the 26th by Dr. Carney Landis of the New York State Psychiatric Institute. As the series progresses in later weeks, ten more authoritative voices from many professions will continue to explore the facts about alcohol and develop other social, medical, religious, and governmental aspects of the problem.

NOVEMBER 9. JAN MASARYK. Foreign Minister of Czechoslovakia and son of the founder of the Czechoslovakian Republic, spoke on "The People's Movement in Support of the United Nations": 10:45-11:00 p.m. EST.

NOVEMBER 12. DONALD RUSSELL, Assistant Secretary of State, explained a recent act of Congress designed "to improve, strengthen, and expand the Foreign Service": 2:45-3:00 p.m. EST.

CBS TELEVISION

Columbia's steady development of the television art was given impetus in recent weeks by the following:

ber 9th the Federal Communications Commission will begin hearings on Columbia's proposal that commercial standards be established for ultra high frequency color television. The CBS petition said, in part:

"Color television in the ultra high frequencies is an advanced form of television, is technically feasible, and is an ontstanding improvement...(it) is capable of rendering a truly nationwide and competitive television service—not possible on the lower frequencies because of the smaller number of channels...The greater appeal of color and ghost-free images will accelerate development of a television andience..."

those dodgers. The Brooklyn Baseball Club has assigned to CBS the first exclusive long-term television rights to a major league team's schedule. Beginning with the 1947 season, Columbia will scout the Dodgers in Spring training in Havana for color and background material and will broadcast the team's home games. In announcing the agreement, Frank Stanton, CBS president, said:

"The addition of these baseball games to our schedule, which already includes a large number of television broadcasts of Madison Square Garden events, certainly assures CBS a dominant position in television sports programming."

NEW CALL. On November 2, the same day WABC became WCBS, Columbia's New York television station, WCBW, also changed its call letters, to: WCBS-TV.

RATE CARD. A new WCBS-TV rate card lists current charges for studio facilities, film service, time signals, and weather reports. With 15 minutes of studio time at \$60 and air time still free, this card is not only useful now but will certainly be something to show your grandchildren.
