

From 5:00 p.m. till 2:00 a.m. the following morning Columbia programs are beamed to all Latin America in both Spanish and Portuguese. News, cultural and sports features are emphasized; musical and dramatic shows, many of which are rebroadcast on standard wave by Columbia's 112 affiliated stations in Latin America, round out the entertainment schedule.

News in eight languages – plus more than 2³/₄ hours of entertainment for American troops and other English-speaking listeners abroad is directed seven days a week to Europe, Africa, the Near East and Asia by the CBS Shortwave Department. Daily programs are retransmitted by Radio Luxembourg, Radio Bari, Radio Rome, Radio Naples, Radio Palermo, Radio Florence, The Voice of America in North Africa (formerly known as Radio Algiers) and The United Nations' Network.

For more than a year, CBS has been operating at Delano, California the two new 50 kw, transmitters (KCBA and KCBF) and also the giant 200 kw. transmitter, KCBR, all equipped with a system of highly directional antennas. These transmitters provide a West Coast originating base for programs serving our troops and our allies in the Pacific and in carrying out the program of the occupation of Japan and the former Japanese-held territories.

Languages used on the West Coast transmissions include Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Malayan, Dutch and English.

SPECIAL BROADCASTS: SPRING, 1946

Listed here is a representative group of special CBS broadcasts under two general categories:

1. Sustaining broadcasts of distinctive program value.

2. Programs of public significance arranged by the CBS Talks Department. These broadcasts are scheduled on a week to week, day to day, and even, on occasion, hour to hour basis. This flexibility helps to sharpen the broadcasts from the point of view of public service and timeliness.

NOTABLE BROADCASTS:

As the pressures of rising costs and wages threatened to crack price ceilings Columbia brought to its microphones representatives of the Administration and the country's manufacturers to explain their viewpoints. On APRIL 8 Economic Stabilizer Chester Bowles and four other government officials urged that consumers help *Hold the Line*. Then on APRIL 16 the National Association of Manufacturers asked listeners to focus their attention on the supply of goods and sponsored a *Roll Call of Production*, conducted by Dr. Ralph Robey.

APRIL 21. Columbia marked the first peaceful Easter Sunday in seven years with three hours of special early morning programs, picking up five sunrise services from coast to coast - from the Moravian Cemetery in Winston Salem, N.C.; Hines Hospital, Hines, Ill.; Arlington (Va.) National Cemetery; Forest Lawn Park, Glendale, Cal.; and the Garden of the Gods, Colorado Springs, Colo.

APRIL 25. On the first anniversary of the United Nations charter the Independent Citizens Committee of Arts, Sciences, and Professions sponsored Norman Corwin's special broadcast *The Year One*, presenting Secretary General Trygve Lie and five Security Council delegates: Heuri Bonnet, France; Edward R. Stettinius, United States; Andrei A. Gromyko, Russia; Sir Alexander Cadogan, England; Dr. Quo Tai-Chi, China.

MAY 28. As Joint Army-Navy Task Force One steamed toward the Bikini Atoll. Commanding

Vice Admiral W. H. P. Blandy appealed to the nation from his flagship to listen to Columbia's unprecedented special program. Operation Crossroads. In the hour that followed listeners heard a dramatic life-and-death discussion of the question: "How can the peoples of the world use their sovereignty to insure humanity's survival and civilization's progress in the atomic age?" From the auditorium of the Library of Congress listeners heard CBS interlocutor Robert Trout and 21 representative Americans. known and unknown, including: the tail-gunner of the B-29 that bombed Hiroshima, Professor Albert Einstein, Commander Harold E. Stassen, a Minneapolis woman who lost three sons in the war, Mrs. Wendell Willkie, and a Texas farmer. They heard, in short, a memorable inquiry into the costs and methods of making atomic energy an instrument for building a new world, instead of a weapon for mankind's annihilation.

CBS TELEVISION

On April 19 a series of colored motion pictures funneled into a coaxial cable on the 10th floor of CBS headquarters in New York, and headed south. Three-thousandths of a second later the same pictures—still bright, clear, and beautiful reappeared on a television screen four floors below.

In the meantime they had traveled by cable to the network's television studios at Grand Central Station, from there to the A. T. & T. building on the Avenue of the Americas, and thence to Washington via Philadelphia and Baltimore. Retrac-

ing the coaxial path, the pictures sped back to New York and to Columbia's ultrahigh-frequency transmitter W2XCS in the Chrysler Building which returned them, airborne, to the receiver at CBS.

In the meantime, too, the pictures had:



- 1. Demonstrated that today's coaxial cable system *can* carry television programs in full and vivid color.
- 2. Matched every step involved in network television.
- Proved that color networks can be formed as rapidly as black-and-white networks.
- 4. Eliminated the last major objection to the workability of color television as a network service.

After a two-month lapse to adjust its transmitter to a new frequency channel, Columbia's black-and-white television station WCBW-NY is back on the air (channel 2, 54-60 megacycles) with a basic five-day, Wednesday-through-Sunday schedule. On Thursday, Saturday, and Sunday WCBW presents a series of live programs, beginning at 8:15 p.m. EDT. Wednesday and Friday: films at 8:15 p.m. or remote pickups in the afternoon or evening.






