News in eight languages — plus more than 23/4 hours of entertainment for American troops abroad is directed seven days a week to Europe, Africa, the Near East and Asia by the CBS Shortwave Department. Daily programs are retransmitted by Radio Luxembourg, Radio Bari, Radio Rome, Radio Naples, Radio Palermo, Radio Florence, The Voice of America in North Africa (formerly known as Radio Algiers) and The United Nations' Network.

For more than a year, CBS has been operating at Delano, California the two new 50 kw. transmitters (KCBA and KCBF) and also the giant 200 kw. transmitter, KCBR, all equipped with a system of highly directional antennas. These transmitters provide a West Coast originating base for programs serving our troops and our allies in the Pacific and in carrying out the program of the occupation of Japan and the former Japanese-held territories.

Languages used on the West Coast transmissions include Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Malayan, Dutch and English.

SPECIAL BROADCASTS: WINTER, 1945-46

Listed here are a representative group of special CBS broadcasts under two general categories:

- 1. Sustaining broadcasts of distinctive program value.
- 2. Programs of public significance arranged by the CBS Talks Department. These broadcasts are scheduled on a week to week, day to day, and even, on occasion,

hour to hour basis. This flexibility helps to sharpen the broadcasts from the point of view of public service and timeliness.

NOTABLE BROADCASTS:

P. Reuther, vice president of UAW and Dr. Alfred P. Haake, consulting economist to General Motors, discussed their problems over People's Platform. A week later, on the same program, Leon Henderson and Ralph W. Robey supported opposing positions and the following week, Congressmen Francis Case (R. South Dakota) and Hugh Delacey (D. Washington) expressed different opinions, These six speakers gave new insight into the nation's tangled labor and industrial picture.

Two premiere performances marked musical milestones over CBS during the winter. On Sunday, January 27, Igor Stravinsky conducted the New York Philharmonic-Symphony Orchestra in a program devoted entirely to his works and featuring the first public performance of the new Symphony in 3 Movements. On February 9, The Philadelphia Orchestra under Eugene Ormandy played for the first time the Third Concerto for piano and orchestra by the Hungarian composer Bela Bartok, with Gyorgy Sandor as soloist. Bartok was at work on this concerto at the time of his death. The work was completed by his pupil. Tibor Serly.

JANUARY 30. CBS listeners heard the sounds of man's first contact with substance beyond the earth. When Army engineers at Belmar, N. J. on January 26 heard radar impulses reflected

from the moon, a CBS recorder caught it, preserved the occasion for a *Feature Story* broadcast.

years the Columbia Workshop returned to the air in the first of a regular weekly series. Its purpose, as always, is to add new dimensions to radio expression. Its by-product is superlative entertainment. Norman Corwin, the Workshop's most distinguished alumnus, directed the first program.

CBS TELEVISION

By now approximately 1000 business and industrial leaders, engineers, editors, radio critics and reporters have seen the first preview of CBS color television pictures broadcast on a commercial transmitter in the ultra high frequencies.

For twenty thrilling minutes they watched, on a new high frequency television receiver designed and made by CBS engineers, a football game, a horse race, a lotus blossom, a sleek negligee, a volcano in cruption—all in brilliant realistic color.

They recalled that CBS first proposed the probability of high frequency color television back in April, 1944. They recalled the first demonstration broadcast last October before members of the Federal Communications Commission. Now they have seen for themselves one of the bright and useful scientific miracles of our time.

Basing its estimate on the remarkable rate of technical accomplishment since V-J day, CBS believes that with the entire industry putting its shoulder to the wheel, ultra high frequency color television can be made available to the public early next year.



News in eight languages—plus more than 23/4 hours of entertainment for American troops and other English-speaking listeners abroad is directed seven days a week to Europe, Africa, the Near East and Asia by the CBS Shortwave Department. Daily programs are retransmitted by Radio Luxembourg, Radio Bari, Radio Rome, Radio Naples, Radio Palermo, Radio Florence, The Voice of America in North Africa (formerly known as Radio Algiers) and The United Nations' Network.

For more than a year, CBS has been operating at Delano, California the two new 50 kw. transmitters (KCBA and KCBF) and also the giant 200 kw. transmitter, KCBR, all equipped with a system of highly directional antennas. These transmitters provide a West Coast originating base for programs serving our troops and our allies in the Pacific and in carrying out the program of the occupation of Japan and the former Japanese-held territories.

Languages used on the West Coast transmissions include Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Malayan, Dutch and English.

SPECIAL BROADCASTS: SPRING, 1946

Listed here is a representative group of special CBS broadcasts under two general categories:

- 1. Sustaining broadcasts of distinctive program value.
- 2. Programs of public significance arranged by the CBS Talks Department. These broadcasts are scheduled on a week to week, day to day, and even, on occasion, hour to hour basis. This flexibility helps to sharpen the broadcasts from the point of view of public service and timeliness.

NOTABLE BROADCASTS:

As the pressures of rising costs and wages threatened to crack price ceilings Columbia brought to its microphones representatives of the Administration and the country's manufacturers to explain their viewpoints. On APRIL 8 Economic Stabilizer Chester Bowles and four other government officials urged that consumers help Hold the Line. Then on APRIL 16 the National Association of Manufacturers asked listeners to focus their attention on the supply of goods and sponsored a Roll Call of Production, conducted by Dr. Ralph Robey.

APRIL 21. Columbia marked the first peaceful Easter Sunday in seven years with three hours of special early morning programs, picking up five sunrise services from coast to coast—from the Moravian Cemetery in Winston Salem, N.C.; Hines Hospital, Hines, Ill.; Arlington (Va.) National Cemetery; Forest Lawn Park, Glendale, Cal.; and the Garden of the Gods, Colorado Springs, Colo.

APRIL 25. On the first anniversary of the United Nations charter the Independent Citizens Committee of Arts, Sciences, and Professions sponsored Norman Corwin's special broadcast *The Year One*, presenting Secretary General Trygve Lie and five Security Council delegates: Heuri Bonnet, France; Edward R. Stettinius, United States; Andrei A. Gromyko, Russia; Sir Alexander Cadogan, England; Dr. Quo Tai-Chi, China.

MAY 28. As Joint Army Navy Task Force One steamed toward the Bikini Atoll. Commanding

Vice Admiral W. H. P. Blandy appealed to the nation from his flagship to listen to Columbia's unprecedented special program. Operation Crossroads. In the hour that followed listeners heard a dramatic life-and-death discussion of the question: "How can the peoples of the world use their sovereignty to insure humanity's survival and civilization's progress in the atomic age?" From the auditorium of the Library of Congress listeners heard CBS interlocutor Robert Trout and 21 representative Americans. known and unknown, including: the tail-gunner of the B-29 that bombed Hiroshima, Professor Albert Einstein, Commander Harold E. Stassen, a Minneapolis woman who lost three sons in the war, Mrs. Wendell Willkie, and a Texas farmer. They heard, in short, a memorable inquiry into the costs and methods of making atomic energy an instrument for building a new world, instead of a weapon for mankind's annihilation.

CBS TELEVISION

On April 19 a series of colored motion pictures funneled into a coaxial cable on the 10th floor of CBS headquarters in New York, and headed south. Three-thousandths of a second later the same pictures—still bright, clear, and beautiful—reappeared on a television screen four floors below.

In the meantime they had traveled by cable to the network's television studios at Grand Central Station, from there to the A. T. & T. building on the Avenue of the Americas, and thence to Washington via Philadelphia and Baltimore. Retrac-

ing the coaxial path, the pictures sped back to New York and to Columbia's ultrahigh-frequency transmitter W2XCS in the Chrysler Building which returned them, airborne, to the receiver at CBS.

In the meantime, too, the pictures had:



- 1. Demonstrated that today's coaxial cable system can carry television programs in full and vivid color.
- 2. Matched every step involved in network television.
- 3. Proved that color networks can be formed as rapidly as black-and-white networks.
- 4. Eliminated the last major objection to the workability of color television as a network service.

After a two-month lapse to adjust its transmitter to a new frequency channel, Columbia's black-and-white television station WCBW-NY is back on the air (channel 2, 54-60 megacycles) with a basic five-day, Wednesday-through-Sunday schedule. On Thursday, Saturday, and Sunday WCBW presents a series of live programs, beginning at 8:15 p.m. EDT. Wednesday and Friday: films at 8:15 p.m. or remote pickups in the afternoon or evening.

News and news features in eight languages occupy the major portion of the CBS program schedule beamed to Europe, Africa, the Near East and Asia. The European schedule includes entertainment and cultural programs produced in English for English-speaking listeners and U.S. military and government personnel abroad, as well as daily programs of American music broadcast in French and Italian.

For more than a year, CBS has been operating at Delano, California the two new 50 kw. transmitters (KCBA and KCBF) and also the giant 200 kw. transmitter, KCBR, all equipped with a system of highly directional antennas. These transmitters provide a West Coast originating base for programs serving troops in the Pacific and in carrying out the program of the occupation of Japan and the former Japanese-held territories.

Languages used on the West Coast transmissions include Chinese, Siamese, Korean, Malayan, Dutch and English.

SPECIAL BROADCASTS: SUMMER, 1946

Listed here are a representative group of special CBS broadcasts under two general categories:

News and news features in eight languages occupy the major portion of the CBS program schedule beamed to Europe, Africa, the Near East and Asia. The European schedule includes entertainment and cultural programs produced in English for English-speaking listeners and U.S. military and government personnel abroad, as well as daily programs of American music broadcast in French and Italian.

For more than a year, CBS has been operating at Delano, California the two new 50 kw transmitters (KCBA and KCBF) and also the giant 200 kw, transmitter, KCBR, all equipped with a system of highly directional antennas. These transmitters provide a West Coast originating base for programs serving troops in the Pacific and in carrying out the program of the occupation of Japan and the former Japanese-held territories.

Languages used on the West Coast transmissions include Chinese, Siamese, Korean. Malayan, Dutch and English.

SPECIAL BROADCASTS: FALL, 1946

Listed here are a representative group of special CBS broadcasts under two general categories:

- 1. Sustaining broadcasts of distinctive program value.
- 2. Programs of public significance arranged by the CBS Talks Department. These broadcasts are scheduled on a week to week, day to day, and even, on occasion, hour to hour basis. This flexibility helps to sharpen the broadcasts from the point of view of public service and timeliness.

NOTABLE BROADCASTS:

SEPTEMBER 22 and 29. For an hour and a half on each of these two Sundays, in a special program titled Stars in the Afternoon, CBS introduced the major entertainment shows scheduled for its 1946-47 season. On both occasions part of a huge cast gathered in New York, part in Hollywood, and the spotlight moved from coast to coast as the drama unfolded. In the first program the central parts were played by Frank Sinatra and Dinah Shore; in the second by Ozzie and Harriet Nelson.

OCTOBER 16. On the night following the Nuremberg dawn that ended the lives of the ten remaining leaders of Nazi Germany, Columbia presented a special documentary program, The Empty Noose. Recalling some of the origins of the Second World War and the reasons for the war crimes trials, the program dramatized five episodes in the careers of key Nazi leaders. The program's theme and title suggested the essential implication of the Nuremberg trials: that similar punishment awaits the leaders of any future resurgence of fascism.

OCTOBER 23. On the occasion of the opening session of the United Nations General Assembly at Flushing Meadows, CBS broadcast President Truman's welcoming address. Then as the ceremonies continued. UN reporter Larry Lesueur calledon five other Columbia newsmen to comment on the President's speech and to

help explain the problems and legislative machinery of the General Assembly.

NOVEMBER 5. After several preliminary reports through the early evening, at 10:30 p.m. EST Columbia's news staff took over the remainder of the Election Night schedule to continue a running commentary on the progress of voting returns until 2 a.m. Approximately every half-hour Robert Trout summed up national trends; in the intervals between his reports six others—Ned Calmer, Charles Collingwood, John Daly, Douglas Edwards, Bill Henry, and Quincy Howe—took turns analyzing regional returns in detail.

NOVEMBER 12, 19, and 26. On the first of these three Tuesdays (6:15-6:30 p.m. EST) an eminent biometrician. Dr. E. M. Jellinck, spoke on "A National Problem" and thus introduced a special 13-week CBS series of discussions on You and Alcohol. Dr. Jellinek is director of the Section on Alcohol Studies of the Laboratory of Applied Physiology at Yale University. He was followed on November 19 by Dr. Henry W. Newman, of the Stanford University Medical School, and on the 26th by Dr. Carney Landis of the New York State Psychiatric Institute. As the series progresses in later weeks, ten more authoritative voices from many professions will continue to explore the facts about alcohol and develop other social, medical, religious, and governmental aspects of the problem.

"Color television in the ultra high frequencies is an advanced form of television, is technically feasible, and is an ontstanding improvement...(it) is capable of rendering a truly nationwide and competitive television service—not possible on the lower frequencies because of the smaller number of channels...The greater appeal of color and ghost-free images will accelerate development of a television andience..."

Beginning with the 1947 season, Columbia will scout the Dodgers in Spring training in Havana for color and background material and will broadcast the team's home games. In announcing the agreement, Frank Stanton, CBS president, said:

"The addition of these baseball games to our schedule, which already includes a large number of television broadcasts of Madison Square Garden events, certainly assures CBS a dominant position in television sports programming."

NEW CALL. On November 2, the same day WABC became WCBS, Columbia's New York television station, WCBW, also changed its call letters, to: WCBS-TV.

RATE CARD. A new WCBS-TV rate card lists current charges for studio facilities, film service, time signals, and weather reports. With 15 minutes of studio time at \$60 and air time still free, this card is not only useful now but will certainly be something to show your grandchildren.
