 By the looks of the weather map tonight on TV, a good lot of you now know what it is like to live in New England in the winter! I hope you all came through the intense weather unharmed, and also those of you out on the Coast where terrible things also happened as we entered the New Year. The only station logged here as the result of the intense Mid-West cold was WAMJ-1580, ex-WJVA, South Bend, Ind. on NM 1/11, on AN with storm news, school closings, traffic bulletins, etc. The Cuban AMers have undergone a radical change - I don't hear any of 'em on 550, 570, 590, 640, 720, or 780 these mornings. A new one started up on 1160 with the AN EE transmission formerly carried on 600 kHz, but now 1160 is SS too - no EE "service" seems to be emanating from "The Pearl of the Antilles" at this time. It sounds to me as if there is someone on 1380 about 100 cycles off frequency during the wee hours - I hear a sound like a 100 cycle hum on that spot every AM, and the stations heard there are WBNX, WBBX, and CFDA. Is one of these slightly off frequency? TA's have been coming in these early mornings of January, but not very strong - one new logging is "Radio Two", Droitwich, England, on 693 around 1:30am. I've been hearing a lot of WR0D-1340, HJAS-1400, WMYB-1450, & WJNO-1230 during my 1-3 am daily DX stints. Provincetown's new FM, WMYR-91.9, should be testing by the time this appears in print. Send reports to them, Box 82, Provincetown, 02657, to my attention, enclosing return postage, for your verie!

 A big welcome to Rick Evans as the new editor of EDX. My first report ever to IRCA some ten years ago was to CDXR when Rick was the editor in East Chicago, Ind. Remember? (Weren't you living on Lella St. in Villa Park, Ill. at the time, Karl--ice) Not much biking done at all in December, didn't hear the KBYE-890 test (only tried for a few minutes) and didn't stay up for the KADE-1190 test. - I did hear another welcome catch in WYVZ-970 Portland, Maine on the morning of 1/4, State #49 here, only Alaska remains. The last new state heard here was Hawaii (KORL-650) in January, 1975. A few other new stations heard at sunset the first half of January, the most notable being KATO-1070, check CDXR (whose editor supplied the WYVZ tip) for details. Only a few veries this season, it's getting tougher to get reports for new stations and to get the stations to answer; v/l KTVN-1470 WSRQ-1560 KXOL-1360 KEES-1430 KMD-1550 KSGM-980 KAMW-1370 KSIB-1520 WBEV-1430 WHEO-1270 KHND-1540-DX and finally a very friendly letter from KGN0-1370. 73.

 In addition, C-1 programming was monitored on 531 540 567 585 639 651 662 675 756 777 801 837 864 873 946 981 995 1017 1026 1035 1053 1107 1161 1206 1215 1260 1287 1300 1341 1350 1359 1400 1453 1535, and C-2 programs on 531 603 610 630 688 720 856 1044 1089 1098 1107 1116 1175 1305 1476 1587. As I have noted before, these are not all fulltime C1 or C2 frequencies, and in fact, very few of them are.

FERC does not attempt to indicate the location of the provincial stations since realistically, who really knows where they are. In some instances, they have indicated provincial programming but have indicated location by calling it a "relay station."
