The morning of Saturday the 7th was not completely lost, though, as WBER-950 was heard on ET with c/w music and frequent IDs 2:05-2:15. Since March 1, I've heard the following: Sun March 1 was surprised to hear WINU-1510 s/on 7:15, signal pretty good till 7:30. Verie back Friday. I get about one chance a week to try SSS DX, and March 1 was one of those chances. As a result I heard WKCE & WDEH, both on 800. Many thanks to all those persons who have come together and set the wheels moving on this great new club, the NRCI. I have joined the NRCI to further my knowledge in the great hobby of Radio DXing, and to receive information from others interested, through the use of a democratic government. This new club has much interest behind it, and I wish everyone the greatest success in the hobby. I am 23 and work day hours. My DXing is now done only on the weekends and on MM. I have logged 1130 stations and have 730 veries, giving me a 64% verie count. Heard and verified 44 states, D.C., and have 17 countries heard, with 12 verified. I started DXing in November of '58. Have a National NC-183D (17 tubes) receiver; two tape recorders; two antennas, a 180' rhombic and a 100' inverted "L." My DX den is in the bedroom, with the receiver alongside the bed for easy DXing in those late hours, hi. Late veries include: CJIC, JTIJ--both QSLs. Have had a report out to CAIRO V on 818 kc/s. since December 4th, but it looks as though I'll have to send a follow up on this one. CFSE on 1425 was logged on their DX show on 12/8/63 and I now have this 50 watter verified. This was the 23rd station on the BCB with 100 watts or less to verify, and joins such other stations as AHD-22 watts, AGE-50 watts, and WGBY-50 watts.
