## NRCI Name Change

In the April 7th issue of the NRCI bulletin "DX News", it was suggested that the official club name be changed. Reasons for this proposal were presented in detail on the front page. It was also suggested that the name for the NRCI become "International Radio Club", or "IROCI". However, we have just learned that there is a club in Sweden with this same name, and rather than duplicate it, we feel it would be best to change it in some way, or create a completely new name. Two names have been suggested: "International Radio Club of America (Inc.)", or IRCA, and "International Broadcast Listeners", or "IBL". These two appear on the enclosed ballot, with the name "National Radio Club, Inc.". Also, the ballot is provided with a blank space for a write-in name, and if 1/3 of the ballots received contain a name written in this space (no matter how many different names are written in), then a new balloting will be called for in May. This is a matter of extreme importance to your club, so please return the enclosed ballots by the May 12th deadline. The results will be announced in the May 19th bulletin.

## DX Show from HOXO in Panamá

NRCI member David Gleason has arranged a special NRCI DX test from station HOXO on 760 kcs. in Panamá City, Panamá, for MMs May 4 and May 11. The station will test from 0300 to 0330 EST; the slogan is "La Voz del Istmo", or "The Voice of the Isthmus". HOXO's manager, Ben Cummings, will be at the mike, and will feature organ and instrumental group interpretations of hymns and perhaps a march or two. Several portions of tone are planned to help HOXO break through the Cuban. Interesting info on HOXO will round out these fine programs. IDs will be in EE and SS, with most talk in EE. HOXO, which is a ministry of the World Radio Missionary Fellowship, operators of HCJB, is supported by contributions, so DXers might consider a little donation when sending reports, with Panamá stamps or IRCs, to Ben Cummings, HOXO, La Voz del Istmo, Apartado 3269, Panamá, República de Panamá.

That takes care of loggings, DX mail: 4/1 v/1 WTPP-1150 Tampa, Fla. for #99 from Fla. 4/2 v/1 WCLS-1580 Columbus, Georgia for 2nd RS rpt. They were AN in 63 but verie says s/on is now 0500, but no s/off given, verie #88 from Georgia. Have now received the first two bulletins of the NRCL, and I feel the club is off to a good start. If all of us keep pitching away, we'll do okay. I have only two veries to report this time, a QSL card from Egypt with 818 kc/s. freq. marked in gives me my 81st bcb country. Note the '64 WRH shows this station as BATRA II instead of the old Cairo V and the power is now up to 400kw. My other verie which was my 2083rd bcb station verified was from WENB on 1000 kc/s. in answer to my follow up report for their DX of '63. Pulled myself out of bed at 3:30 AM on 3/30 but did not find a trace of HIBZ thru the mass of QRM on 1340 kc/s. Back in the late 40s and early 50s I spent many an hour DXing the GRAVEYARD freqs, and while they were cluttered even then, it was possible to pull in some good DX from time to time. I've pulled out the log here and since I have a few lines remaining, will reminisce a bit about the good old GRAVEYARD DX. On 1230 kc/s. I verified 28 stations with the best being CJBQ Ontario & WKVM in P.R. 1240 kc/s. shows QSLs from 64 stations which include ZEM Bermuda (before the 1230kc. days), XEEN Chihuahua, KWJB Arizona, KRNO California, KPHE Wyoming, KSLV Colorado. On 1340 kcs we have 79 stations confirmed, XEAA Baja California (heard many a time), WSTA Virgin Isl. CJOB Manitoba, KCNA, KNOG, & KCLS all Arizona, KGLN Colorado, KIOR California, KJAM Utah, KRSD S.D. and KAPA & KPKW in Washington state. 1400 kc/s. shows 53 veries, KCHS N.M., KKII California which stated "Your report is the first received here from the East Coast"--that was back in '49. KOKO Colorado, KHEL N.H., and KNAK Utah head the list. Tuning up to 1450 kc/s. we find 69 stations QSLd--CFAB N.S. WGBY Guantanamo 50w., KAMP Arizona, KPHG Colorado, KOAT & KLMX in NH, & a recent one from '62 in CHEF Quebec. Up on 1490 kc/s the log shows 53 stations verified--CKEN N.S., CFRC Ont. with 100 w. CHOX Havana (heard many a time in the early 50s), MIDD P.R. and KJLK Calif. Have 130 stations with 250 watts or less scattered on other channels. One of my favorites on misc. channels would be CBH then 100w. on 1330 kc/s. Many of these stations have probably changed call, frequency, or been deleted. Gosh I sound like an old timer and I'm only 35, hi! Though I must admit I'm getting too old for early AM DX. Keep up the good NRCL.

I am now without a receiver of any type. My Grunow which was serving as a standby when my Zenith went out is not working properly so I have just about given up hope for DXing this Spring. When I can save some money I will try to have the Zenith repaired. I sure miss BCB DXing. Mort Meehan and Ted Palmer--trix for letters and card. To Ted and George and Steve Junak--I will prepare tapes for you right away. Trx Bob Coomler for the nice letter. Bob tells me that Tom Colthurst has given up DXing. Does anyone know if this is so? I haven't heard from him or Randy S. in many moons. I will be reporting each week now even if I don't do any DX. And who knows, I might just break down and take the Zenith to be repaired and get a loan to pay for it. 73 for this week.

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There has been a good deal of reaction supporting a domestic supremacy ratings for those who do not indulge in foreign DX. However, we would have to decide how to list the entrants--should it be by states and provinces, or by total veries. If the first method was used, there might be many tied for certain positions. Let us know how you think this should be done!!!







As a special feature this week, primarily for the newer NRCLers but which also might be of help to older more experienced members, a list of stations in states which are difficult for DXers in various areas of the countries. It is our hope that this list of tips will help you to log some new states this fall, and maybe even yet this summer. For those of you in the East, here are the best ways to log the western states:

California: There are many stations here that can be heard well, but the best are the non-directional stations on clear channels, such as KFTI-640 L.A. which can be heard on an AN sked and on HM before an 0300 s/off. The only interference should be the Cuban, which is generally off from about 0000-0430 at least. Also, KNBR-680 San Francisco can be heard quite well on HMs from around 0200 to an 0400 s/off. Then, KGBS-1020 L.A. can be heard fairly well on a HM from 0000-0500 AN with WKA off the air. All of these will verify reception reports.

Nevada: The best bet for a Nevadan is KENO-1460 Las Vegas, which can be heard at times on a HM from 0200 to 0300 s/off with rr programming. Also, this station has a regular frequency check with tone on the fourth Monday of each month from 0300 to 0330. Another possibility is KRAM-920 Las Vegas, which is sometimes in the clear from 0330 to 0400 s/off on a HM.

Oregon: Very difficult, and is best heard on a DX program, hi. KEX-1190 can be heard faintly in rare instances around 0200-0230 if KLIF & KRDS are off or weak. KMED-1440 Medford can be heard at times on their s/off HM at 0304, but although they are non-directional, KPRO or KCOY is usually heard then. Then, KAST-1370 can be heard under good conditions from 0230-0300 s/off on a HM with only KEEN on, but their antenna is very directional against the East.

Washington: KOMO-1000 Seattle can be heard on a HM around 0200 with the right cx; however, a better possibility would be KGA-1510 Spokane, which is generally in well after WLAC & KMOR s/off at 0100. A non-D from Washington is KXLY-920 Spokane also, which is often heard around 0200 on RS HMs, but they change their sked often.

Idaho: Very difficult--best bet is perhaps a D-X from KGGI-1140 Boise--they hold them often during the winter months. Consult Larry Godwin's f/c list, to be issued this September. For RS, KTFI is the best, sometimes heard after KBOH's 0100 s/off if CHAT is not strong and the Cuban ditto.

Montana: Many Montana stations have r/x, so consult Larry Godwin's f/c list for the time of one which we'll sure will get through. Also, KMOH-560 Great Falls can be heard AN HMs with rr programming. Then, KXLF-1370 Butte is heard frequently on HMs from around 0130 to 0200 with rr programming also.

Utah: KSL is undoubtedly the best, from Salt Lake City, on a clear frequency, 1160, and AN except SMs. The only interference should come from WJVA or Radio Americas, or maybe an 1150 station, all of which are off HMs except for WCOP. Another chance is KLLI-910 or KCPX-1320 both Salt Lake City, which are usually AN.

Colorado: KOA-850 is on until 0205 every day, and ought to make it into most areas of the U.S. If you can't get them, try KDMN-950 Denver on HM from 0300-0400--they are usually the only station on the frequency.

Arizona: Two high-powered Arizona stations have been heard occasionally on SSS in the east, KXND-1580 Tempe and KFLE-1550 Tucson. However, a better opportunity might be KJAR-620 which signs off at 0200 HMs, or KCLS-600 s/off 0205 HMs. Then, on 1060, HMs KUPD Tempe is the only station on, and despite their low (500w) power, they get out very well. Also there are a number of r/x that can be heard.

New Mexico: KOB-770 Albuquerque has been getting out well recently--they s/off all days at 0205, HMs this is with WABC off. Also, KGGI, KBTI, and KRZY have r/x and are heard widely.

North Dakota: Several stations, such as KILQ-1440, KNOX-1310, and KUTP-1550 have r/x; KILQ can be heard sometimes on a HM at s/off at 0105. Also, KBOH-1270 Mandan is heard well from around 0145-0200 s/off on a HM.

South Dakota: r/x by KUSD-690, KBRK-1430, KARR-1420, etc. get out well; also, KSOO-1170 s/off at 0100 is heard at times w/WJVA silent.

British Columbia: Not a state, but the easiest here is CBU-690 Vancouver on AN HM or at least until 0300. Then, CKLG-730 is AN weekdays on a very clear fc., and CKTX is AN weekdays and many times on HM too.



Alberta: CKCL-1140 Calgary is NSP and in well MMs at times (even tho beamed N) after the others have signed off. CJOC-1220 Lethbridge can be heard fair some mornings at around 0200. CHEC-1090 can also be heard around that time on a MM if XERB is either off or weak. CFGN-1060 is in well at times around 0200 on a MM w/WNOE+IRCV off.

For Westerners, here are a couple of tips on loggings the Eastern States:

Maine: WJAB Westbrook can be heard rarely around 0430 s/on in the fall and spring months w/DST in effect. Their s/on has been as early as 0400, too, w/rr programming. WBSI-600's r/c can be heard as far west as the middlewest, but not much further.

Vermont: Well.....? WHJB-1000 w/DST on, s/on around 0500 rarely. If you hear one, let us know, hi.

New Hampshire: As bad as Vt., almost--but, WFEA-1370 might be heard at 0530 s/on in Sept. & Oct. and possibly May, with only WHI & WGIC on. However, this is unfortunately the clearest it usually gets.

Connecticut: If you can catch KRID off NSP (it's happened this year already) you can snag WVIC-1080 Hartford signing on at 0500 with a strong signal usually. Little else gets out widely. Sometimes WNLC-1510 is AN w/c/w but is highly directional. WPOP-1410 is a possibility, sometimes signing on a relatively clear fc. at 0500, sometimes at 0455 w/SSB.

Rhode Island: Again very difficult, but best bet is WJAR-920 Providence to sign on at 0530 and pull thru the others in Sept. or Oct., or WEAN-790 s/on at 0500, but the frequency is much more cluttered. Another chance is WPRO-630 s/on around 0500, but often earlier, at 0430, and they have been known to be AN-MM. 630 is the clearest it's been in years, with only CFEO on AN-MM.

Massachusetts: WBZ, Boston, 1030, natch, on all night every day except MM, and if you have QRM problems, try MM s/on at 0500.

New Jersey: Well, there's not much--they're lucky to get out to Illinois, hi. WPAT-930 is NSP but what to do w/WKY-KHJ? They have soft cl mx & show tunes. Also, WEPG-1450 is NSP and might be heard MMs under freak Cx.

Delaware: Same as New Jersey, but WDEL-1150 Wilmington seems to have a DX program each year, and it got out fairly well this year. Look for it again next winter!

Maryland: WHI-1370 Braddock Heights often signs on early on a clear fc. around 0430 or 0445 and runs cw IDs at times. WBAL-1090 Baltimore is a good possibility signing on at 0500 on a clear channel.

West Virginia: WJVA-1170 Wheeling, s/on 0500, WCYR-1270 s/on 0400, and WKAZ-950 s/on 0500 are usually heard well in the West on any MM.

South Carolina: WQOK-1440 Greenville s/on 0500 can be heard on MMs, and they test frequently prior to s/on time. Also, on MMs WGUS-1380 can be heard from North Augusta at an early 0430 s/on, sometimes earlier. WUUU-1260 s/on 0505 has been heard on the WC several MMs.

North Carolina: Several stations in this state can be heard signing on each MM at or around 0500--WBT-1110, WPTF-680, WIRC-630, WTOB & WLOS-1380, etc.

Wisconsin: WKBH-1410 LaCrosse can be heard around 0600 on s/on, as well as WBAY-1360. Other possibilities include WKOW-1070 s/on around then, NSP WETP-1250, and WOKY-920 s/on.

Mississippi: WOKJ-1590 is heard widely as they s/on MMs around 0600, or WDSK-1410 Cleveland, which s/on at 0444 on SMs. A number of Mississippians have r/x.

Alabama: Many r/x here which can get out to the WC; Also, many Alabamans can be heard topping their channels on s/ons starting around 0600.

All the other Eastern states have either a 50 kilowatt station or a high-powered outlet on a clear channel frequency. If you find any errors or have any additions for this list (and there are undoubtedly some) feel free to send them in and we can add them as time and space permit. Look for a similar listing within the foreign section of the bulletin concerning the countries of the world. The IA countries will come first, then the Caribbean area, and then the TAs and TPs. So, we hope that we have helped some of you log a new state or two, and at least some new stations.
