I did try to get a field-strength reading on 3LO-770 on the station's Nems-Clarke 120-D, but KOB had their carrier on and I couldn't loop them out enough to get an accurate reading. The Nems-Clarke is a pretty good DX machine. Anyway, it rained today (4/18) and of course it threw KACY's 4-tower array off-pattern, and that reminded me to remind you-alls to keep an eye on weather conditions in cities with needed stations with DA--rain and its consequent moist ground upsets directional antenna patterns and said station may put out more power in your direction for a day or so. Oh, KACY does not verify, so if you need a KACY verie, send me a decent report. If you can't get enough material for a decent log, forget it. Don't waste my time and yours. Your best bet is SSS, because we only radiate 25 watts north and east on night pattern, the rest goes due west. Larry, where's the tape you were going to send? 73.

The big news the big news this time is the logging of HOXO-760 on their DX of 5/11. There was plenty of QRM from CHCD along with static, but got enough for a report. On the domestic scene I'm still plucking away at daylight reception as there are a number nearby stations not yet in the log here. 1590 has accounted for most of my DX with reports going to WETT Ocean City, Md.; WEEZ Chester, Pa.; WJSO Jonesboro, Tenn; and WISZ Glen Burnie, Md. The other station reported was WKYE Bristol, Tenn. on 1550. One of my favorite bands is FM and yet it is the most frustrating. During the past few years FM DXing has been increasingly difficult in this area. With new locals coming on the air, adding to their schedules and obtaining more power. As many of the D.C. area stations have their transmitters in the NW Md. suburbs (WWDC is only $\frac{1}{2}$ mile away), not only is there a band full of locals and semi-locals, but also a mass of pesty images. Even with the selective and sensitive Scott 310C FM tuner, I seem to be all but handcuffed when it comes to daylight and evening DX. Enjoying FM the way I do, and wishing to keep on with that phase of DX, I drew a circle of 50 miles in radius of the D.C. Md. suburbs. Obtained a Blaupunkt FM car radio and a Gonset FM (halo) antenna. Quite a bit of my mobile DXing is from the nearby mountains in Md. as altitude above average terrain is important. The Chesapeake Bay area has also been an important factor in FM DX here. Stations especially to the NE just seem to glide down the water. From these locations I escape QRM and nasty images; however, I am still within the contour of the D.C. locals. This past weekend (5/9) took a DX trip to the Md. mountains near Blue Ridge Summit, Pa. While stations were audible as far as Pittsburgh and Buffalo, the new ones heard not too far in distance. Had some good catches none the less. One of the top receptions was WTBO Cumberland, Md. 106.1 mc/s. with 61ar, but their antenna is -135 ft. below average terrain making it a good catch at 70 miles. Another interesting station was WGHY Tyrone, Pa. (on Rattlesnake Mountain) on 101.1 mc/s through WWDC. All band veries are now at 4339 stations, 275 from 24 states on FM, and 2088 from 81 countries on BCB. See you next time.

Hi gang! The membership is really growing! Thanks to mem-captains like Don Erickson, we have very close to 100 members now, and are sure to have 150 by the start of the DX season next Fall. I just got a call from Mike Worst last night about the new IRCA countries list. Mike is really doing some research into this problem, and I think we'll have some excellent proposals concerning the list to present to the new board of directors. I sure enjoyed talking to Mike and Len last week, too, and was glad to learn that they have some new prospective members in the Seattle area. Well, most of my DX since the last issue has been foreign and appears in the DXNW, but I would like to comment on the excellent conditions we have experienced here at sunrise. Around 0600 EST the stations in the mid-West have faded out and leave a number of clear channels open for DX from two areas: The South Pacific and the western coast of South America. Australians are often strong and the best ones seem to be on 700 and 770 kcs, and two NZ stations (760 and 780) are usually readable at s/off at 0623. So far the only two countries in SA I've heard at sunrise are Ecuador (HGJB-700) and Chile (CB66-660 and CB76-760), but I'm wondering if the Bolivian on 1020 might come in at 0600 s/on sometime. Sunrise CX should continue to improve through mid-June. I imagine everybody realizes by now that WIAQ-670 is now a competitor of WLS. When I first heard R&R on 670 one evening, I thought it must be a foreign station! I can remember when WLS used to be the "Prairie Farmer Station," though, hi. I received a very disappointing letter from Radio Moscow this week concerning my tentative reports of 548 and 656 kcs. The letter read: "We listened to the tape but the reception was so bad that it was absolutely impossible to understand what the program was about. It must be so as the stations you recorded are medium-wave ones and cannot be heard in your country." (Underlining added by yours truly). I promptly replied saying that several DXers on the west coast have BCB outlets verified; I also enclosed a recent copy of our fine DXNW section. The IRCA correspondent in Chile, Cesar R. Quiroga, will be arriving in Boulder the 17th and will be staying with Barbara and me for awhile. He is presently employed by CB66-660 in Santiago and is coming to the USA to live. I'm afraid we won't be able to make the convention in Mobile this year since we will graduate August 22 and plan to leave for SA immediately afterwards. Until next issue, 73.

From Your IRCA Industry Advisor

As was stated in the April 28th, 1964 issue of DX News, John Tucker, the Chief Engineer of KSNO, has consented to be the IRCA's Industry Advisor. In serving in this capacity, John will endeavor to answer questions from the members concerning the viewpoint of the broadcasting industry, and will serve as the IRCA's official link to this industry. From time to time articles written by John will be printed in DX News for the information and perhaps "enlightenment" of the members. Such an article follows, being part of a letter in response to IRCA member Terry Steeden concerning various questions which he posed to our Industry Advisor. It is felt that the information here will be of great use to the members, since the questions Terry asked are applicable to the entire club.

"Dear Terry, Thank you for your letter of May 8, 1964 and for the questions it posed....."

"The program log of a station is designed to do two things: to instruct the man on duty as to his schedule of activities and to disclose to the management and to the FCC exactly what was broadcast and at what time. The log specifies a time as scheduled by the traffic department and the actual time of broadcast as entered by the man on duty. The log will reveal the actual time of the beginning and end of a broadcast such as a record show, the news, etc. If the entire program is sponsored by one firm, the log will indicate this fact. If several advertisers' spots come within the program, i.e. spot announcements in the body of a record show, the time of broadcast of each spot is entered in the log. Also logged are the times of station breaks occurring close to the hour and half-hour. A true station break (identification) contains both the call letters and licensed city. Station promotional announcements may contain only the call letters and may or may not be logged.

"Individual records played do NOT appear on station logs

"A DX report should cover at least 15 minutes for an engineer to truly be satisfied, although he may often verify a shorter segment if he is satisfied you are working under severe circumstances, i.e. if you hear a few clear IDs of a station on 1400 kc/s. plus a commercial whose sponsor you can definitely report, then you will probably get a verification. A DX report should definitely contain the following:

- a) The times of each item reported, stated in standard time of the zone in which the station is located (WABC New York City, N.Y. should be reported in Eastern Standard Time; KSNO Aspen, Colorado should be reported in Mountain Standard Time) EXCEPT if the station is announcing Daylight Savings Time; in this case state this as part of your report.
- b) The call letters, town, and slogan (if any), exactly as you hear them.
- c) The announcer's name, if he gives it.
- d) Any and all commercials heard, with emphasis on reporting the name of the sponsor (more emphasis on the fact you heard Aspen Motor Company rather than a Ford Commercial). Some local names may be hard to catch: report "Burganovitch Creamery spot for cottage cheese."
- e) Be exact and brief. Engineers, managers, and others are doing you a favor, so give enough information that they won't actually have to check the logs but can do it from memory.
- f) BE FAST!! Get that report out at once. In my case, because I carry a heavy work load, I refuse to dig out last month's logs to verify a late-mailed report. It is a good rule with me that DX reports must be postmarked within 24 hours of the reported reception (Sundays and holidays excepted). In other words, if you are not interested enough to mail promptly, we are not interested in answering and may just drop your report in the waste basket.
- g) ALWAYS include reply postage.

"Engineers are flattered when you address your letter to them and will probably reply promptly. However, personnel changes are frequent, so merely use "Chief Engineer in the address.

"As a last item, never verify a station just because the call letters change. At such a time everyone at the station is likely to be much too busy to write. However, do verify new facilities as quickly as possible because then the interest in your report is at its maximum.

"I do hope that this letter answers your questions. Thank you for the opportunity of making these views public.

** COUNTRY OF THE MONTH **

GUATEMALA: The easiest Guatemalan station for those an appreciable distance from WCBS, WLS, and WWL is TGJ on 880 Kc. in Guatemala City. They broadcast in Spanish using the slogan "Radio Nuevo Mundo", and can be heard well many evenings around 2300. This station usually verifies with a QSL card. Possibilities for listeners further east include TGXA on 1040 Kc., and TGN on 720 Kc. (Recently they have been drifting to 718 Kc.), which use the slogans "Radio Centro Musical" and "Radio Cultural" respectively. These two can be heard when conditions to Latin America are good. Note also that TGY, "Radio Progreso" in Guatemala City has just recently been reported on 742 Kc.. Other stations which are reported on a more less regular basis are: TGBOL on 560 Kc.; TGO on 800 Kc.; TGUX on 1020 Kc.; TGT on 1140 Kc.; and TGED on 1200 Kc..
