Greetings from member number 107 or 108. Dave Anderson and I sent our money at the same time so we don't know who the first Saskatchewan member is. I have been DXing on the BCB for a little over a year and have heard 156 stations. In the last couple of weeks I have received 15 verifications, bringing the total up to 16. It may not be many, but I've just started to send reception reports. Most of my veries are from local stations. I have received verifications from North Dakota, Montana, Iowa, Nebraska, Colorado, and Texas. You will probably have a little difficulty locating Carnduff so I'll give you the location. Carnduff is 20 miles from the Man. border and 12 miles from the U.S. border. If any of you are ever around here be sure and drop in at the Canadian Pacific Railway station so we can boast about our DX. My dad is the CPR agent and we live in the residence at the station. Greetings, everyone, from the great Stampede City! As member #127 I am your fourth or fifth Alberta member. I have been DXing for about 3 years and now have a Halli-crafters S-38B. On the ECB I have heard 216 stations in 5 countries, with four countries verified. The latest country verified is Venezuela (YVLX-560). YVLX, by the way, uses 100kw/50kw, with a 24-hour directional pattern favouring east and west. I have a total of 91 veries so far, including these recent ones: KIRO, WGN, KOFA, WHAM, VOA-1180, WBEM, KLCB, KFYR, CKLG, CHAB, CFJC, CBW, KNBR, CKSW, WLS KTOE, KFI, CJOR, KVI, CBU, CJOB, KAYE, and WFAA. Two recent MMs have netted me some goodies. Some of the younger members should read and heed some of those suggestions. To those members who believe that return postage should not be sent to a station when asking for a verie, might I suggest that they try to place themselves in the position of the personnel of the station. Many CE's do a multitude of jobs, part-time announcers, salesmen, etc. Most stations DO verify if the report is verifiable, plainly written, and written with the idea of giving the station absolute proof that their station was heard. One should realize that the stations are really doing the DKer a favor, since in most cases our reports are of little or no value to them, unless it happens to be a new station testing or an old station testing new equipment. If any of you feel that it is not necessary to send postage, please do not try to influence others since there is no easier way to kill the hobby than to advocate that because stations are worth millions, they should verify our reports, whether or not we send postage. Try to remember that radio stations sell time, not letterheads or QSL cards for a four or five cent stamp. Just one v/l received: GKGY-920 Saulte Ste. Marie, Ont. for #61 from Ont. for 63 reports. Of course it will increase interference but unless the DX is within the envelopes of the extremely high signal level he should be able to reduce it to a low level. The broadcasting industry will not hold back to satisfy a few mis-informed DXers, and by complaining to the FCC or our Congressmen we would only rouse opposition in the industry to our hobby. I doubt also that it would be economically feasible to operate a super-power station at all hours. Most would operate a super power station a few hours a day and then back to about 50kw. Also, after giving the matter some thought, I find myself in agreement with Deaver and now say "Keep the IRCA a BCB club only." If someone wants an all-band club, join the WNRG and leave this club to those who joined it to get good BCB news only. I have seen the bulletins of several clubs which are all band. In general the size of each bulletin is about the size of an IRCA bulletin but the info is divided among several bands and therefore none are better than mediocre. Let us not kill the goose that laid the golden egg. Greetings! First, would like to add my name to those requesting copy of SACCA log; like others, any and all help possible in identifying IAs is most valuable. Latest information here on my "Canadian mystery" of 1206.5 kc/s is that it may be GPFM Puntza Mountain, B.C., a RCAF station, 50 watts, licensed to 1230 kc/s. This station may be a "drifter" as heard what I took to be same station just last evening (8/8) on about 1204.5 kc/s! I could get no ID on this trip, and they did not s/off at 0200 this particular night. I don't know how late they ran, as my tape was set to turn off at 0210 after some 3 hours of logging. Still a good many unanswered reports out from what I'll now call "last season," but have learned long ago that this is just one of the things we have to learn to live with in this hobby. Am busy adding more "L" antennas on the "farm"; think I'll have 8 various long "L"s operatable for the coming season, plus the very high "FL" dipole. Lengths of "L"s vary from about 75' to 250' or so. Have also spent a great deal of time adjusting my time switches to a finer degree of accuracy to try to cut the actual time necessary for monitoring tapes. My key clocks are a Tork 15' unit, and an Aemco 15' unit. Also have a Tork variable hourly unit, as well as a pair of single cycle clocks. Recorders at this time number three, being an older Crescent that is "lame," but so far I've been able to keep it kicking; a Wollensak M500; and a quite new Silvertone 3 speed. 3-3/4 IPS is used for all monitoring purposes, while 7 1/2 IPS is used for all taped reports (and, one track only). 1. This season's domestic contests will begin on September 1, 1964 at 12:01 A.M. local time and will end on July 15, 1965 at 11:59 P.M. local time. Stations must be logged between the above dates and must be verified by 8/15/65 to count.
 - A. Two stations from each of the 50 states, D.C. and each Province of Canada will be eligible. The first station from each state or Province will count ONE point; The second station will count THREE points, for a total of four points from each state or province;
 - B. Any Domestic Special TEST or DX for the IRCA will count an additional THREE points. This station may also be counted for the first or second station in that state or province.
2. All members of the IRCA are eligible. Entry fee is 25¢ and must be sent to your contest manager, ERNEST J. WESOLOWSKI, 1416 PASADENA AVE., OMAHA, NEBR. 68107 before 11/1/64.
3. Final Standings will be announced at the annual IRCA convention in 1965.
4. No station may be reverified for this contest unless it is a DX Special for the club.
5. The contest manager will issue the standings regularly in DX MONITOR. He also has the right to reject any station a member might enter in error. The contest manager's decisions will be final. Any questions of the contest manager must be accompanied with return postage if contestant requires an answer.
6. List of entries must include CALL LETTERS, FREQUENCY, LOCATION, DATES HEARD AND VERIFIED, AND THE VERIE SIGNERS' NAME. EACH Person should report his additions at least every TWO months. Do not send veries unless requested to do so.
7. Prizes will be awarded to at least the first four winners. Prizes will be dependent on the number of entries. This year there are two mystery stations worth 100 letterheads to the first DXer who verifies one of them. Only one person may win this prize. So send your station entries in often.
8. All stations used for this contest must be logged within a ten-mile radius from the contestant's home address in his city.
9. The person in First Place in this contest may not take first place prize in the #2 Letterama contest. If so, he will become second place winner in that contest.

Contest #2---Letterama

- The letterama contest will begin and end the same dates and times as contest #1.
- a. Stations eligible for LETTERAMA are all stations in the 50 states, D.C. and Canada.
 - b. There shall be NO bonus points given for IRCA specials or completed tiers.
 - c. The important thing to keep in mind is that the THIRD LETTER of the U.S. and Canadian calls are the determining letters. For instance, in WCBA, the B is the determining letter; in CKWS, W is the determining letter. The object of the contest is to build up tiers and obtain as many points as possible. A tier is completed by obtaining a verification from 26 stations representing each letter of the alphabet. One must work to complete his first tier by obtaining a U.S. or Canadian verie for each letter of the alphabet. When one completes the first tier in any order, he proceeds to the second tier, etc. Remember that K, W. or C calls can be mixed for each and every tier; such as for A one might use WCAB, for B, WLB^J, and for C, KFCB, etc. But remember, if a dxer has received veries from WCAB and CBA, for example, he must wait until the first tier is completed before the other A verie can be counted for the second tier. So, it is easily seen that one stacks up points fast when tiers are completed. ONE point for each verie.
 - d. Rules #2-9 in the contest #1 shall also apply to this contest. GOOD LUCK TO ALL!
