Even if you do not know if the check is regular, if you have heard it only once, please note it and send me the details. The IRCA membership can and should be the principle source of our f/c information. Remember, it's your list, so let's keep it tops! I would like to sincerely thank all those who sent me their lists of checks this year, including many of our newer members who are anxious to help out in this special project. Next year's list will be compiled in Berkeley, California, where I will be studying at the Univ. of Calif. beginning next June. I found this years convention most enjoyable though only 8 were in attendance. Visits to WALA-1410, WKRK-710, and WMOE-1550 were interesting, especially the latter. They on the air any day now. They have been testing, but GE Joe Wharton cannot, he says, schedule a test for us. Their 50 dw XR has been used previously at KWKH & KGBT. Mr. Wharton has put some 30 stations on the air, including 6 of the 9 Shreveport stations, and more recently WJAQ-1550. WMOE is to be mostly cw, with several hours of religious programming, a la XERF, whom, incidentally, WMOE is affiliated with. XERF is managed by the Universal BC Co of Shreveport, of which the Springhill, La. BC Co, WMOE licensee, is part. Wolfman Jack, we were told, is Bob Smith, a product of Shreveport radio, and also manager of XERF. The station has never put out 250 kw because of power shortage; their generators haven't ever gone over 187 kw, and usually runs 170 kw. XERF is 20 miles out in the desert, almost inaccessible, and under armed guard at all times. There is currently a serious battle among 3 labor unions involving XERF, and whichever one is "in" at the time must protect itself & the station from snipers who are hired by the other 2. Wolfman himself has been shot at several times, and his program is on tape because most mornings bullets keep him from getting to the station safely. Paul Kallinger's whereabouts are unknown; he has left WCKY & KXEL. Mr. Wharton promised veries (Box 1402 mobile) when he catches up with his work involved in getting WMOE on the air.
