C. Alan Taylor, 939 North Eastern Avenue, Indianapolis, Indiana 46201

First of all, clear channel stations are designed to provide reliable radio service to large rural regions which normally would have no service, and to small towns that cannot support their own station. Picture the regions in the west and in the prairies that would have no reliable service without KFI-640 or KSL-1160, to name two. Obviously, the stronger the signal fed to these stations, the better the service will be, thus justifying stations in excess of 50 kw. We know of the numerous stations (clear-channel) in the east that cannot provide reliable service to the west with 50 kw. So, if stations located in the west were placed on these channels, they could provide excellent service. FCC plans call for the secondary station to protect the coverage area of the original clear channel station by means of highly-directional antennae. This would eliminate interference to the dominant station. The dominant station would not construct directional antennae to protect the secondary station's coverage area. But it would be far enough away that the dominant station's signal would be weak and easily overridden in the area to be covered. Thus we can see that there would be no important interference.
