Greetings fellow DX'ers! Well, it sure is good to be back again. I've been so doggone busy working full time and attending college at nights that 've had very little time to DX. Due to this lack of time, I can no longer be membership chairman for N.Y. I would like to wish my successor, Howie Modell good luck. We'll catch up to those Californians one of these days, hi Howie! I received my copy of VJ's log in the mail recently. What a difference! It's much more accurate than White's log. I did, however, find an error in Jone's log which I think should be brought to the attention of IRCA members. In the 1964 edition, VJ has WFYI-1520 (Mineola, N.Y.) listed as 50 kw. that is temporarily operating with 250 watts. This isn't so. I know one of the engineers and he told me that the FCC had issued them a construction permit for 50 kw. facilities. For some reason, the management decided to continue with their present 10 kw. facilities even though FCC issued a permit for higher power. In other words, WFYI is currently broadcasting with 10,000 watts on 1520 kc. and will continue so. One of WFYI's fine engineers, Al Lush, gave me a complete tour of the station. Their main xr is a 10 kw. RCA, Model BTA10H. They also have a Gates 250 watt auxiliary xr, which they use in emergencies. Just outside of WFYI's xr building are 3 160' towers that are directional southeastward. They cover all of Long Island, southern Conn. and Southern N.J. throughout their broadcast day. Sometimes at sunset (when they s/off) WFYI's signal skips down to Delaware and Virginia. If anyone receives WFYI, they can send their report to: Al Lush, Eng. Dept., WFYI Radio, Roosevelt Field, Garden City, L.I., N.Y. He'll be glad to QSL. Until next report, 73's and great DX. P.S. Dave put me down for A SACCA log.

- 850 XEZF Mexicali, MEXICO is an easy logging here on Sunday AMs with s/on at 0700. Very good signal on 9/13. (BN) Heard very well in the daytime with nice slow ID at 1500 on 10/3. (DE) (Confirmation of this location and power was received from NNRC member Riley Sundstrom. Tnx Riley - ed)
 YNAV Managua, NICARAGUA was heard fair with 0300 s/off in Spanish on 10/4. Gave location, frequency, and ended with NA. Country #16 heard. (DE)
- 860 XEMO Tijuana, MEXICO has 65% religious programming. Rest is classical music. (JA)
 XENL Monterrey, MEXICO was heard on 9/22 with clear AN program with KONO off the air. (BN)
- 872 EAJ 101 Zaragoza, SPAIN is heard now and then. Logged on 9/24 at 2000; late for Spain. (JAP)

- 940 KAHU Waipahu, HAWAII. Was this the station in Japanese at 0335 on 9/28 ? (DE) (Sounds likely, Don, although a 0300 s/off was listed last time. - ed)
- 950 XEGM Tijuana, MEXICO is in well most days; in Spanish. (DE)
- 965 YNLU Managua, NICARAGUA finally verified with the help of Larry Godwin. V/1 is from E. Arguello O., Jefe Serv. Periodisticos. QRA is: Apartado Postal 848. (ELK)
- 998 Kishinev, MOLDAVIAN SSR. Strong. Relaying Radio Moscow in English. Positive ID and Radio Moscow IS. Held for one hour steady from 2000-2100 on 9/26. Hit S 7½ peaks. (RH) (See 935 kcs.. Positive city ID, Bob ? - ed)
- 1000 1 ZD Tauranga, NEW ZEALAND was heard above KTOK and XEOY for a few minutes on 10/2 and 10/3 around 0400. (KGS)

These counts are from the Zurich Observatory, and are taken from the bulletin of the Newark News Radio Club. It would appear that if these predictions are borne out this season will be the last one in which a declining sunspot count will be experienced until the next cycle's downswing. The predicted low of "7" is not as low as was predicted earlier either. If the count does indeed begin to swing back up again at the beginning of next year we will probably experience declining conditions on the broadcast band, so get those stations now.
