Here is a brief resume of station visits thus far: GUATEMALA: TGRT-680 (R. Fabulosa) has a very attractive QSL card, address is Via 6, 3-79, Z-4, Guatemala City. Plans to again use 685 kc. at night in near future and broadcasts late Saturday nights. TGK-1100 is no longer (was R. Latina), is now Radio Isthmania, still 1100 kc. with religious programs. R. Emperador is affiliated with R. Mundial (700) with studios of both now located at 6a Av. 2-80, Z-7, Guatemala City. TGUX-1020 has new studios, Dave Thomas, the previous v/s died in January. El Salvador: Will visit San Salvador stations on return trip; YSLA-890 Santa Ana is affiliated with YSKL network. HONDURAS: HRN-670 and HRN-860 are affiliated and will verify (see v/s column). HRN plans freq. move to about 880 within one year. HROM-845 went bankrupt and changed to HRSP-835, R. Isthmania, which also went bankrupt. The latter has been bought by R. COSTA RICA: TIRU-1505 Liberia went bankrupt & no chance to f/up there. TIRG-1325 Liberia (R. Columbia network) extremely friendly and interested, as was TIGEC-1000 San Ramon. TIMAR-1375 is no longer, but has moved to San Isidro (formerly in Meridia). In San Jose, R. Atenea 975 is affiliated with La Voz de America-900, though they have separate studios. R. Being a new member, I want to tell you a little about myself. I went to Electrical Vocational H.S. and after graduation, got a job as a maintenance electricians helper in a factory. Being dissatisfied with this job after only two weeks, I joined the union, and started as an apprentice for a contractor. After my apprenticeship, I was offered the opportunity to become maintenance at a large Catholic institution for 90% of the union scale. Although the pay is 10% less, the job is more secure and has many fringe benefits. I am married and have a small daughter. I have a 1963 Rambler Ambassador which is the worst car I have ever owned. I have no dx to report, but would like to make a few remarks about some opinions presented in the last bulletin by Ron Schatz, which to me seem curious, to say the least. Ron feels that the Denver members who now attend to the club's administrative duties have too much power and constitute an NRC-like oligarchy. This is, ironically enough, true, but also unavoidable. Democratic constitutions do not spring from some mysterious source to have organizations grow, in turn, about them. Rather, someone or some group must create an organization with intention to turn it over to some form of government or other. In this case, the Denver group which founded the IRCA intends to turn the club over to a democratic constitutional government, and this is being done. We can hardly afford to be rash in the framing of a document which will regulate our club government indefinitely in the future. Were the Denver members secretly conspiring to form a dictatorship, would we have voted on anything? Obviously not. We have just elected five representatives whose immediate action will be to perfect and approve a constitution for the club, and when it is ratified our long-sought democratic government will be realized. But until then, unless we wish to cease functioning as a club, we must operate under some sort of provisional government. If I remember correctly, the provisional government and the resolution to form a democratic government were formulated last February by a unanimous vote of the six DXers who then comprised the IRCA's total membership. Another thing, concerning the statement, "what right have a few, elected or not, to decide and dictate for the rest of us...". For that matter, then, what right had the representatives to the Constitutional Convention in 1789 to decide what the nature of the U.S. constitution would be? The geography of the country, and of this club, necessarily prevented their governments' constituents from convening to discuss and act on matters. Thus we have been forced to elect representatives, in whom we willfully vest the power to act in our behalf. Although I believe the membership will have to ratify a constitution, it would be impossible for it to effectively vote on every matter concerning our proposed constitution. Hence representation. Each member has the opportunity to communicate with his elected representation and make his wishes known. What do you advocate, Ron, the overthrow of the legally elected representatives? I regret taking your space but I thought these views should be challenged. 73.
