Now that I've made this stupid challenge, I'll have to do all I can so I don't make a fool of myself. I hope everyone does the same. The only veries since last report are from WSM and KOMA. This is my 2nd report to the Forum since leaving the states. I'm currently in Coro, Venezuela, but may be reached at the above address through 11/26 or so; then c/o US Embassy in Santiago, Chile through 12/12. We had a rough time getting the Jeep through to Colombia and I missed out on seeing many stations, but have luck in other areas. To report: PANAMA: I visited Radio Mia-645, a very unusual station with most of its programs of public service nature. At Radio Aeropuerto, I found out the 550, 1140 and 1500 kcs. outlets are // and AN; also, the 640 kc. outlet is often // after midnight LT. Ecos de la Montana-840 kcs. in Chiriqui is affiliated with R. Aeropuerto and reports can be sent to Panama City. Sorry, Ed, Chitre was too far off our route. COLOMBIA: We have visited only Cartagena, Baranquilla and Santa Marta so far; we'll pass through Bogota, Medellin, etc. on the way to Ecuador later. We were so tied up with importation problems that I only had time to visit Radio Kalamary in Baranquilla, now on 1040 kcs. HJAZ-1060 is affiliated with HJAN-720, and HJAO-1250. Valledupar has a new station on 1490 kcs., HJNS with slogan something like "Radio Guatapuri". VENEZUELA: In Maracaibo, YVMF-1120 really rolled out the red carpet for us; they have a QSL card. YVMB-800 (Ecos del Zulia) went bankrupt, and I believe Ed Krejny and I got the last 2 veries the station will issue. YVMX-1030 was quite friendly and welcomes reports, as does YVND-970. The old Maracaibo outlet on 730 kcs. is no longer, having been taken over by R. Mundo on 740 kcs. (Manager promised to send you a verie, Kermit) YVMD-1150 (R. Mara) a small outlet and not friendly, though I left your report, Ed. R. Mundo was recently seized by a Communist rebel group and now every Maracaibo station has an armed guard on duty. I hope to visit many more stations in Venezuela in the next few days. So far I haven't lined up any dx shows, but will concentrate on this aspect south of Colombia, where the catches are a bit rarer and where I have fewer reports to f/up. Incidentally, Trans-World Radio (800) has fantastic signals throughout the Colombian and Venezuelan coasts in the daytime, but the station is silent most of the day. Reception of US stations is poor, at least on my transistor portable. Strongest signals are from WCBS-880, WINZ-940, WLAC-1510 and WCKY-1530. See v/s list for personnel I visited in the above-mentioned stations. Good luck to all, and viva IRCA!

Greetings! First, apologies are due for missing the last few issues. We have been having a lot of problems with the station, and have consequently delayed air date to (tentatively) the 7 of November. We have moved our studios to a new location, and were joined in moving by Radio Ecuatoriana, which occupies the floor below us in a brand new ultra-modern building on the north side of the center. The transmitter site is almost ready now, and we are only lacking the beacon lights to begin raising the tower. For those who have written for or about surveys, please be patient...we can not issue one 'til we hit the air. And, to change the subject to DX (which is what this whole thing should be about, anyhow), I can only say what a DX location this is! On MM, 10/26, I heard 6 continents within 4 hours. I logged 25 Europeans, as well as 3 Africans for a real surprise. RTF from Bordeaux on 1205 was stronger than I ever heard it in the USA! One interesting thing is that no fading was noticed on any of the stations. Also, noted Japan, Hawaii, and New Zealand, but with no great quantities of stations. On that same night, there was an almost complete blackout of US stations with the exception of Florida ones. ZNS was beautiful in the evening, but such regulars as WCKY and KYOK were not heard. And no Mexicans were heard. Wierd conditions, no? I had gotten up that night for the DX specials, and did not hear a one. But the foreign stuff made up for it! I am planning to specialize in US stations, as they normally cover the dial at night. I hear more TT's here than in Cleveland...so with a little patience and persistence, I may again get my verie total to my Cleveland final total of over 2100. Incidentally, I have moved to a new apartment far from the local transmitters, and have put up a provisional antenna about 30 feet long and 8 feet high. Oh, the reason for moving into a new apartment is that I got married, thus joining the apparently fast growing group of IRCAers making similar steps. Sometime ago, I submitted a taped report to CBC/Vancouver on one of their ANers logged here on 740 kc/s; This particular tape included ID's of CBL and CBC/Vancouver at about the same level, one immediately after the other, thus presenting rather unusual proof of frequency. Letter from CBC/Vancouver reads in part, as follows: "I feel that it is impossible for you to identify any one of our six low power relays on 740 kc. located in the province of British Columbia. We cannot say that because one station is closer than another, it is the one being received. We have found that in some locations the transmission range is very much better than from another". This from C.M. Wilson, Asst. to B.C. Regional Engineer... Well, I acknowledge that Mr. Wilson's point is well taken but this appears to be a policy change on the part of CBC/Vancouver as in the past they have generally been willing to verify reception of the closest of any relay station on frequencies where more than one operates. I oppose unequivocally the formation of an affiliation between IRCA and any FM institution, or the inclusion of such an institution into the IRCA. Occasionally, I do some FM DX, but I wish to keep it separate from BCB CX. Therefore, should I desire to have a bulletin containing FM, I may join the NNRC. But I want to see the name IRCA only in connection with BCB, nothing, absolutely nothing else. Notice, however, that if the membership should vote for such an affiliation, or extension, in the majority, I shall not leave for a veribial Australia. Rather, I will then support such an inclusion. But til such a vote, no! Second, a merger with the NRC would be out of the question. They will be annexed to us, on our terms, or no unification should come about. - 830 JOBB Osaka, JAPAN was heard with a fair signal on 10/26 at 0345. (DE)
- 834 -BHBS- Belize, BRITISH HONDURAS has a 2230 s/off as this country has returned to winter time which is ½ hour behind EST. (JLK)
- 854 OAX 4 A Lima, PERU, "Radio Nacional" was heard on 10/25 at 2315 with an opera. (DE)
- 900 HCRJ 1 Quito, ECUADOR, "Radio Gemas" is now on with 1200 watts. Schedule is: 0550-0010; QRA is Casilla 1409. Programs "soap operas". (SACCA)
- 935 Agadir, MOROCCO was noted on 10/26 at their 0130 s/on. (DFG) Was heard on 10/23 at 1857 with a poor signal. (JLK)
- RNE- Barcelona, SPAIN was presumably the Spanish station noted here on 10/25 at around 1900. Too weak to ID completely. (ELK)
- 944 -RTF- Toulouse, FRANCE was noted with a poor signal on 10/26 at 0050. (DFG)
- 953 ???? An unidentified station was heard with s/on at 2230 on 10/25. Used 6 time pips (?) with a harp or guitar IS. Syria ? Help ! (RH)
- EAJ 29 Madrid, SPAIN was heard with the best signal ever on 10/30 from 1848-1850 and also from 1920-1927. (ELK) Heard poorly on 10/26 at 0025. (DFG)
- 970 YVND Maracaibo, VENEZUELA, "Radio Catatumbo" sent a v/1 for my reception of August 1963. QRA is: Calle 77 (5 de julio), No. 16-77. V/s is Jesus Villalobos Salas, Jefe de Produccion y Trafico. Thanks to Larry Godwin for this one also ! (ELK)
- 985 OBX 4 J Lima, PERU, "Radio Expreso" was heard on 10/25 at 2305 with a good signal. Plays middle of the road LA music, and uses a chime before each time check. (DFG)
- 995 HCEW 2 Guayaquil, ECUADOR, "Radio Suceso" is here from 1510 kcs.. (SACCA)
- 998 ???? UnID station with music program noted here MM 10/26 at 0030. Andorra ? (D)
- 1005 HCGH 1 Quito, ECUADOR, "Radio Tarqui" apparently alternates operation on this frequency and 995 kcs.. (SACCA)
- 1015 YSC San Salvador, EL SALVADOR was heard with a very good signal on 10/26 from 2055-2105. (ELK)
- 1025 TIAC San Jose, COSTA RICA, "Radio Fides" was in with a fine signal on 10/26 from 2045-2050 with classical music. (ELK)
- 1030 ???? An UnID oriental station was heard on 10/29 at 0930 with a fairly good signal. All talk, and very fast. I'm 95% sure it's NOT Japanese, and 80% certain it's NOT Chinese or Korean. The antenna used was not the one which usually peaks China/Korea/Japan as a rule. Have tapes - need an oriental language expert ! (RHM)
- YVMX Maracaibo, VENEZUELA, "Radio Calendario" sent a nice v/1 for my reception of last August (1963). QRA is: Apartado Correo 789. If my Spanish is correct, this station changed frequency to 1020 kcs. on October 22, the day my letter was written. Thanks to Larry Godwin for this one also. Venezuelan # 28. (ELK)
- 1040 PRG 2 Sao Paulo, BRAZIL, "Radio Tupi" was noted with a fine signal on 10/25 around 0150. (ELK)
- 1050 HCLV 1 Quito, ECUADOR, "Radio Mil VEINTE" is now using this frequency. (SACCA)
- 1106 SPAIN. A station was heard at 1625 on 10/25. Up to S 7 on peaks, but no ID heard. (RH)
- 1133 Zagreb, YUGOSLAVIA was apparently AN with "flood watch" on 10/27. Logged with classical music and reports. One hour report sent. (JAP) Had a fantastic S 9 + 10db signal on peaks on 10/25. Held from 1700-2300. Was never heard above S 5 prior to this ! Positive ID ten times. (RH)
- UnID strong carrier noted here at 0040 on MM 10/26. Probably Zagreb. (DFG)
- 1187 ???? UnID station heard here on 10/26 at 0020 with a talk program. Sounded like an exercise program I once heard on "Radio Tunisia". At 0022 an opera came on. Hungary ? (DFG)
- 1196 -VOA- Munich, WEST GERMANY was logged with an S 8 signal at s/on at 2200 on 10/25. (RH) An UnID English speaking station was heard here on MM 10/26, at 0025. US accent, so probably VOA. (DFG)
- 1200 YVOZ Caracas, VENEZUELA, "Radiotiempo" was noted at s/on at 0427 with the National Anthem on 10/26. (ELK)

- 1205 -RTF- Bordeaux, FRANCE was heard on 10/18 at 0030. Good signal with little WOI trouble. (JLK) Heard with an S 9 signal on MM 10/26 at 0035 with a talk program. Never heard this well in Cleveland, and Quito is several thousand miles further from France I (DFG)
- 1214 -BBC- ? Brookmans Park, ENGLAND (?) A weak station was heard here on 10/18 from 0000-0030. Perhaps this one. (JLK) Light popular music was heard here on 10/26 at 0045. - 1235 HJLO Cali, COLOMBIA, "Radio Calidad" is here from 1230 kcs.. (SACCA)
- 1270 KBYR Anchorage, ALASKA was noted on 10/25 with 0500 s/off. Not new here, but not often heard. (RHM)
- 1322 HJHY Sincelejo, COLOMBIA, "Transmisora Sucre" is the station here. Affiliated with RCN. Ex-1330 kcs., and ex-"Radio Morrosquillo". (SACCA)
- 1338 HJFE Pereira, COLOMBIA, "La Voz de Pereira" is drifting to here. (SACCA)

- 1466 3 AM 2 Monte Carlo, MONACO was heard at 0117 on 10/26 with familiar man and woman announcers alternating and popular music. (DFG) Was logged on 10/18 at 0000 with a good signal. (JLK)
- 1502 ???? An UnID station, with classical music, was heard here on 10/26 at 0040. Who? Doesn't seem to check with the "Radio Warsaw" schedule. (DFG)
- 1505 HJHX Floridablanca, COLOMBIA, "La Voz Panamericana" is drifting here from 1510 kcs.. Heard s/off at 2345 with the National Anthems (excerpts) of all of the LA countries, saying "La Voz Panamericana" serves all of the Americas! (With 1 kw. - sure!) Interesting! (DFG)
- HON Colon, PANAMA, "Radio Aeropuerto" is drifting here from 1500 kcs.. Noted on MM 10/26 at 0045. (DFG)
- 1511 Berlin, EAST GERMANY, "Radio Berlin International" now uses this frequency instead of 1133 kcs. for its European service at 1415-1540. Uses 1430 kcs. from 1600-1830, as before. (SCDX)
- 1538 Mainflingen, WEST GERMANY, "Deutschlandfunk" has a French transmission from 1630-1700. (SCDX)
- 1540 ZNS Nassau, BAHAMA ISLANDS was heard on 10/25 at 2400 with the Weather. Good signal. S/off with "God Save The Queen" followed. (DFG)
- 1554 -RTF- Nice, FRANCE was logged on 10/18 at 0000. Very good signal, better than 3 AM 2 on 1466 kcs.. (JLK) Noted with a poor signal here on 10/26 at 0045, with music. (DFG)
- 1555 HCTR 3 El Guabo, ECUADOR, "La Voz del Guabo" is a new station here. Operates with 500 watts. (SACCA)
- 1570 XEAE Ciudad Acuna, MEXICO was heard on this frequency announcing as: "Radio Centro, la estacion de mil watos efectivo de la antena." Lists show XEAE on 1600 kcs. with 5 kws., so they may be taking advantage of XERF being temporarily off the air, but it appears more likely that XERF is extinct. (JLK)
- 1575 HCAP 1 Quito, ECUADOR, "Radio Novedades". This station, ex-1570 kcs., ex-"Radio Amazonas", is now on the air. (SACCA)
- 1580 HJAY Galapa, COLOMBIA, "La Voz de la Cordialidad" was heard on 10/26 at 0015. Undoubtedly runs late on weekends. (DFG)

1594 ISLE OF MAN, "Radio Manx" is reported as having been heard testing on this frequency with 50 watts. Schedule is given as: 0300-0500, and 0700-0900. (MW ? - ed) (SCDX)

"PIRATES" "Radio City" tested its new 1 kw. transmitter from October 5-7 on 1034 kcs., with the old transmitter in // on 1529 kcs. (Also reported on 1523 kcs.). Suggested frequency is 1020 kcs.. Present schedule is: 0500-1300 (Or 1400). Soon to be extended to 1600. (SCDX)

"Radio Invicta" (980 kcs.) now operates from 1800-1200, but plans 24 hour service. Power, now 1 kw., is to be raised to 4-6 kws.. New QRA is: 35, Bouverie Square, Folkestone, Kent. (SCDX)

"Radio Caroline North" (1520 kcs.) is now on from 0100-1600. "Radio Caroline South" (1495 kcs.) is now on from 0100-1500. (SCDX)

ALBANIA "Radio Tirana", 1088 kcs., now has a German program from 1530-1600 and 1630-1700; Italian from 1300-1330 and 1600-1630; Bulgarian from 1200-1230; Hungarian from 1300-1330 and 1500-1530; and Russian from 1400-1430. (SCDX)
