Treasure State DX includes many nostalgic loggings: KATI-1400 is a regular under KARR at 0730 s/on, all Omaha stations except one have been logged as KFAB is regular, WOW and KOIL semi-regular, KOOO-1420 logged 10/24, KOWH-660 logged 10/20 (also at s/on as was KOOO), and KRCE-1560 the same morning as KOWH. KRCE badly cut up by KWCO. That takes care of all my hometown stations but KBON. Other DX worth mentioning: CBA-1070 after KNX s/off on 10/26 and the KISM-DX received weakly but clearly the same morning. My log is full of other entries since this a new DX location, but none of them are unusual. Washington stations were easily heard during Daylight Savings Time. KOOO was first report I sent out since last fall. Also have noted KYMN-1520 starting to bother KOMA around sunrise, and logged KORL-650 on 9/14. The antenna is still strung around the pad but I finally talked the landlady into letting me put up an outside one along with a ham verticle. Daytime DX hears only 15 stations; five local, 3 Wyoming, 2 Sask. and the rest Montana. CBK-540 is the farthest daytime regular. The CE at KOOK isn't anti-DX or anything as he even went so far as to print up form letters for veries. But the reason KOOK hasn't verified for two years is because the CE got disgusted with the quality of the reports. Since taking over these chores, I can see why as only 3 of the reports received since I started at KOOK are of any quality. Of course half are from non-club members, but surprisingly many DXers in the IRCA and NRC send out pretty lousy reports. Most of these are from beginners so are excusable, but I think a small campaign should be waged with newcomers to help them learn how to write reception reports...like maybe it would help if J. Tucker's comments were printed more often or sent separate to new members. (in the process, Murray, ed.) Personally, I don't need too much information, just enuf to prove it was KOOK (more than an ID and record titles) but what really seems strange is the fact that reception details are left out of many "reception reports". Two sentences and an S-meter reading doesn't seem to be enough, and this is one fault I find with report forms I've seen some clubs using. That's about all from the Big Sky Country...wonder if there are any active or inactive-but-equipped hams in the club? I'd like to set up some skeds if so. 73.

I think I heard the Cuban National Anthem (or whatever that thing is that Radio Habana plays at ID time) but I could get no ID. They also have chimes for ID between records (most voaal w/guitar). This has been bugging me for a few weeks now. (Gary--what time did you hear them? YVOB Radio Sucre in Cumana, Venezuela is hrd here in Denver in the evening at times fairly strong and would fit the programming you describe. Address Changes:

It is current policy to hold all bulletins for a member once one has been returned, until the member's correct address is received. It is the member's obligation to supply his address, and is not HQ's job to track it down.

For our many new members who have joined since this list was originally printed in last April, here is a list of the various radio logs which can be purchased to help with your DXing.

The best all-around log for the domestic DXer is the Vane A. Jones Log, which is published yearly. It contains all stations in the Northern Hemisphere by call, frequency, and by state-province, etc. The log also gives listings for FM & TV. The log is in a handy booklet form and in the past has been shown to be the most accurate domestic log available. The price of the log is \$1.95 and it can be obtained in most electronics stores which carry the Howard W. Sams Photofact Publications (or ordered thru these stores)--the catalog number of the log is RSG-2. Also, you can send the money to Vane Jones at 2525 East 36th Street, Indianapolis, Indiana. The 1964 issue is the current one, but the 1965 issue should be out sometime early in 1965. Another log for the domestic DXer is the White's Log which is included as a supplement in some Scientific Experimenter magazines, which cost 75¢ on newsstands. This log is not always known for its accuracy. Another log is the Broadcasting Yearbook published by the editors of Broadcasting Magazine. It contains lists of stations by frequency, call, and location. It also contains information about stations such as address, date first went on the air, personnel, etc. The cost is \$5.00 and should be sent to "Broadcasting Publications, Inc., 1735 DeSales St., N.W., Washington, D.C.

For the foreign DXer there are a number of logs, but none will be in itself sufficient. The most complete foreign log is the World Radio and TV Handbook published in Denmark. The 1965 issue will be coming out near the first of the year and the IRCA will have a special offer to IRCA members in connection with this issue--watch for details soon as to how you can get yours at a reduced price. If you want the 1964 issue you can send to Gilfer Associates, Box 239, Park Ridge, New Jersey. The log contains all the broadcasting stations of the world from long wave to short wave, listed by countries. The information includes schedules, personnel, and program characteristics, etc. and this log is indispensable for the foreign DXer. Another foreign log is the SACCA Log (stands for South American, Caribbean, and Central American) and it will contain all stations south of the US border with Mexico. This log is published by member Dave Gleason of Quito, Ecuador, and it is at the printer's in Quito now. As soon as it is ready for mailing, Dave will inform us through the bulletin. The price has yet to be officially determined but we believe it will be about \$2.00. This log is available to IRCA members only. The PAL Log (stands for Pacific-Asian Log) is a log published by the New Zealand Radio DX Club. The address there is P.O. Box 1356, Christchurch, New Zealand. Watch for an announcement about this log soon, or write to them for information.

For those of you who have been wondering what happened to the IRCA Charter Membership Certificates, we assure you that they are being formulated at long last and we hope that they will shortly be in the hands of the members who have contributed to the club shortly.

There will be a get-together of Omaha, Nebraska and Council Bluffs, Iowa area IRCA members on November 23th, which is a Saturday. The meeting will be held in the middle of the Missouri River bridge. Anyone who can afford the toll is invited.

It has been noticed recently that a lot of DXers are not sending out reports that are sufficient for verification of reception. Realizing that there are many DXers who have just begun DXing in our club, it was felt that an article on what type of reports SHOULD be sent to stations. The following is from member, Phil Robbins, who is with KOMA in Oklahoma City.

+++++
 In many of America's larger radio stations, your letter of reception is turned over to the Public Relations or the Promotion Departments. This is one reason that yours truly has become associated with answering hundreds of these reports a week. As Promotion Department Director at K O M A, I see fifty or more reports a week. I have saved a few of the choice reports that were not verified. Here is an example which should make the reason obvious.

9:01 PM Music-Four Seasons

9:02 Ends

9:02 Man said they were in the blueroom (?)

9:04 end

9:04 music

9:06 commercial

(No return postage enclosed)

9:08 joke

9:08 Music..A Cousin of Mine

Or this one is common: "I picked up your stations on the standard wave length and I picked up your station for the first time at 7:30 PDT. The Oregon City station on the same frequency kept fading out that night so it enabled me to listen to your station.

(Naturally, no return postage)

Or this one: "Dear Sirs, Please verify my reception of your station with a DX card, or a short note". (what report? no return postage).

Ridiculous? We get a flood of these every week. Out of the average fifty letters we receive, only half, at most, ever hit the return mails. You won't catch me shouting names, but one or two every week are from IRCA or NRC members. Many with no postage. Others without even a report!!

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 Now, we realize, having been young in the hobby once ourselves that many DXers do not realize what is required by radio stations for reception reports. Therefore, here is another letter received here at HQ this month. This from Ernie Wesolowski in Omaha.

 From the inception of the IRCA, I have been on the membership committee. About once a month, Radio Station KFAB-1110 here in Omaha has been one of the major sources of reception reports of which your name and addresses have been discovered. I would like to inform many of our members of a more specific way of requesting a verification. From the many reports that I now have from KFAB, about 10% are considered by me to be worthy of a verification. There are letters that mention all about the music but nothing about announcements. One example of a post card received: "Gentlemen, I am applying for verification of reception of your station, KFAB, 1110, 1-16-64 at my location". Name and address given plus type of receiver. From the above, there is no time given, no material of programming, no conditions of reception, and in checking the date find it 6 months old. The card is dated July for reception in January. Furthermore, no return postage! All are not this bad, however!!!

Here, now, is a suggested form you may use: Address the letter to the C.E. In the letter, state 1st the call letters, the full time segment in the time zone of the station. Do not use GMT unless it is a foreign station. List the exact frequency, not simply about 1110. For the program material, list each announcement or ID on a separate line, with the exact time along the left margin. Get the complete name of the advertiser, the ID word for word, as much as possible, any addresses or phone numbers given. List the Weather forecast at the proper times, giving only the present temp. Do not list song titles of songs, as the station in most cases does not keep track of them in their log. List any time the XR should go off, or any Open Carrier, with no modulation, etc.

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 This letter will be continued on the following page. Incidentally, a special letter of this type will now be prepared and sent out to all new members as they join in order for them to get the full benefits out of the hobby.

The following could be used as an example of the program material used:

10:58 CST Local KFAB news reported by announcer named Walt.
 10:59:40 Weather forecast. 59°
 10:59:55 Station ID, "KFAB in Omaha, Nebraska now joining the NBC Network at 11 O'clock"
 11:00 NBC news on the hour.
 11:05 Local programming, music recorded, instrumental.
 11:07:45 Commercial: H.P. Smith Fords at 50th & L Sts.
 11:08:45 Time and temperature by announcer.
 11:09 Public Service Announcement for U.S. Air Forces.

Below this state the name and model of your receiver, how many tubes, signal strength and % of readability. Your antenna length, interference heard, and weather conditions at your location, such as 20 degrees and partly cloudy. Make a few remarks and request a verification of reception. PRINT your name and address so the station can read it!!! And very important, INCLUDE RETURN POSTAGE. For your records, make a carbon copy of each report so that a follow-up letter can be sent after three months if they have not verified. This time send it to the G.M.

Now, an excerpt from John Tucker's letter printed in a DX MONITOR last spring:
 (John is with KWSL in Grand Junction, Colorado, and a long-time Chief Engineer.)

"The program log of a station is designed to do two things: to instruct the man on duty as to his schedule of activities and to disclose to the management and the FCC exactly what was broadcast and at what time. The log specifies times as entered by the man on duty when broadcast. The log will reveal times of beginning and end of a broadcast such as a record show, news, etc. If the entire program is sponsored by one firm, the log will indicate this fact. If several advertisers are featured with spots, this is also noted in the log. Also logged are times of station breaks at hour and half-hour. Station promotional announcements usually using only call letters may or may not be recorded in the log. Individual records played do not appear on station logs.

A DX report should cover at least 15 minutes for an engineer to be truly satisfied although he may often verify a shorter segment if he is satisfied you are working under severe circumstances, i.e. if you hear a few clear ID's plus a commercial whose sponsor you can identify, you will probably get a verification. A DX report should definitely contain the following:

- The times of each item reported, stated in standard time of the zone in which the station heard is located such as WABC in EST. The exception, of course, is DST.
- The call letters, town, and slogan (if any), exactly as you hear them.
- The announcer's name if given.
- Any and all commercials heard, with emphasis on reporting name of sponsor (more emphasis on the fact you heard Aspen Motor Company rather than a Ford Dealer).

Some local names may be hard to catch so report names as they sound.

- Be exact and brief. Engineers, managers, and others are doing you a favor, so give enough information that they won't actually have to check logs but can do it from memory.
- BE FAST!! Get the report out at once. In my case, I carry a heavy work load, I refuse to dig out last month's log to verify a late-mailed report. It is a good rule with me that reports must be post-marked within 24 hours of reception. (Sundays and holidays excepted). In other words, if you are not interested enough to mail promptly, we are not interested in answering and may just drop it in the waste basket.
- Always include return postage.

Engineers are flattered when you address your letter to them and will probably reply promptly. However, personnel changes are frequent, so merely use C.E. in the address.

So, Let's all heed the remarks in the letters on these two pages. Your chances of building your verie totals are much greater when you send out good reports. Remember, a Radio Station does the dxer a favor when sending a letter of verification. They do not have to do this. A reception report, in most cases, is of little value to a station, so try to make your reports as complete as possible. Try to make it as simple for a station to reply to you as possible. A SASE is very helpful. OK, fellows, good DX!

- 566 Athlone, IRELAND was heard on 10/31 with light music to 1830; then with News until their 1835 s/off with the National Anthem. (JAP)
- 575 TIJC San Jose, COSTA RICA was readable with popular music and ads on 10/31 at 2115. (JAP)
- 593 -RTM- Oujda, MOROCCO was noted on 10/31 at 1840 with Arabic chanting and music. This one has been fairly regular lately. (JAP)
- 595 TGY ? Guatemala City, GUATEMALA. I believe this is the LA station heard here from 2300 on 10/30 to well past 0100 on 10/31. Will check some more. (CMS) (They're listed to 580 kcs. now, Stan - ed)
- 629 -RTT- ? Tunis, TUNISIA. A TA was heard to s/off at 1730 on Sunday 11/1. Should be this one but will have to check more. (CMS)
- 635 -KCBC- Pyongyang, NORTH KOREA was heard on 10/26 at 0332. Good signals and not Russia, but only North Korea - oh well, hi ! (DS)
- 647 -BBC- Crowborough, ENGLAND was heard in Polish to 2330 on 10/30. (JAP) Heard with ID at 0110 on 10/31 as "London Calling Europe", and giving MW frequency and SW bands. Quite clear reception. Tape off. (RHM) (Think this should be the location Joe and Roy; at least off the verie received last year for reception period almost identical to Roy's. Let me know if the BBC says Daventry, Roy. - ed)
- 650 KORL Honolulu, HAWAII. Why do I always hear KORL with such poor quality despite the good strength (muddy sound) ? Heard with WSM on 10/29 from 0320-0415. Veried on 11/2. V/s is Frank Fitch, C/E. (KGS)
- 652.5 ???? Some English speaking station (Not an English accent) was heard here on 11/2 at 2318-2321 fade-out. KORL drifting ? Any ideas ? (DS)
- 656 Murmansk, RUSSIAN SFSR. Typical "Radio Moscow" with man and woman announcers on 10/31 from 0001 on. YSS heterodyne too much earlier. (RHM)
- 660 XERPM Mexico City, MEXICO was heard at very high level on 10/24 from 2225-0013. Frequent slogan IDs. (MW) Was fair to good on 10/30 from 0000-0035. (KGS)
- 665 CSA 2 Lisbon, PORTUGAL was every bit as good as WNBC (audio) at 1845 on 10/31. (JAP)
- Vilnius, LITHUANIAN SSR was apparently in // 656 kcs., although weaker. Heard on 10/31 from 0000-0030. (RHM)
- ???? Somebody here with Slavic songs and music. Weak. Heard on 10/31 at 2130. Vilnius ? (JAP) (See above, Joe - ed)
- 674 -RTF- Marseille, FRANCE was noted with popular music and French on 10/30 at 0030. (JAP)
- 685 TGRT Guatemala City, GUATEMALA. Finally got around to reporting this one, mainly due to fine US music on 10/31 at 2145. (JAP) Heard on 11/1 from 0052-0117. Very strong. ID as "Radio Fabulosa" or "Radio Fabulosa, primera en noticias." Mentioned complete coverage of US elections on 11/3. Phone 6542, hi ! Reported. (DJ)
- 700 ???? An oriental station was heard here well over WLW at 0627 on 10/26. March music - possibly Peking. (KGS)
- 701 -RTM- Sebba-Aioun, MOROCCO. Heard French here on 11/1 from 1748-1755 during a good opening. Undoubtedly this station. Happy to catch it, but all but unreadable due to severe WLW QRM. (ELK)
- 720 CM.. Colon, CUBA is strong most evenings under and over WGN, but usually distorted. (MW) C. Alan Taylor suggests the obvious - they have NO call. Are other Cubans going to follow this trend ? (DE)
- 730 XEX Mexico City, MEXICO was heard in Spanish on 10/21 at 2359, but it was distorted by CKLG. (MW)
- 750 JOIB Sapporo, JAPAN. Second network of NHK is often excellent; especially 10/31 and 11/1 in // JOBB on 830 kcs.. (KGS)
- 760 -VOA- SOUTH VIETNAM verified reception of 10/19 with a QSL card specifying "Vietnam-760 kcs." only. Second only to Kunming, China as my most westerly verie ! (RHM)
- XEABC Los Reyes, MEXICO was logged on 11/1 at 0217 under WJR, and on 11/2 over Cuba at 0147. Common ID "A-B-C" (DJ) Confirmation of this station's

- 760 XEABC Los Reyes, MEXICO (cont.) location comes from an ELECTRONICS ILLUSTRATED reader. (CMS)
- 764 Baghdad, IRAQ was audible on 10/31. This isn't new, but anytime Iraq makes it into the Great Lakes I think it's news ! (I agreee, I wish they'd move down another lake, hi ! - ed) Seemed to s/on at 2200 with the carrier on at least 1/2 hour earlier. Didn't stick too close because of what was happening on 773 kcs. ! (CMS) Heard with Arabic music and chanting from 2210 to 2235 fade-out on 10/31. How to verify ? (JAP) (Are they as bad as Agadir, Joe ? - ed)
- SBC- Sottens, SWITZERLAND was logged with popular music on 10/30 from 0030-0055, when they were messed up by the s/on IS of "Radio Senegal". (JAP)
- Dakar, SENEGAL was apparently the TA tuning with music prior to s/on on 10/31 from 0045-0055, but it faded before s/on at 0100. Did not verify my report of last Spring, so I'm anxious for another shot at this African ! (RHM)
- 770 YVQQ Puerto la Cruz, VENEZUELA sent a v/l signed by Rodolfo E. Fuentes, Director. Thanks to Larry Godwin for this my 29th. Venezuelan ! QRA is listed as: Apartado 4082 although the letter came in a YVQZ envelope. (ELK)
- 773 Zahedan, IRAN was logged on 10/31 at 2200 s/on. Weak but readable. Almost blew this one mistaking it for Cairo. ! (CMS) (Was it this low, Stan ? WRTH says 777 kcs. and EBU says 776 kcs. - ed)
- Cairo, EGYPT/UAR was heard with s/on at 2300 on 10/31 with Big Ben type chimes and a clock striking six. (JAP) Was strong on 10/31 at 2300 s/on. (This is Sunday their time.) First logged on 10/30 at 1840. (CMS)
- 775 TIW San Jose, COSTA RICA was logged with LA programs on 10/31 at 2245 while waiting for Cairo. (JAP)
- 782 ???? An UnID TA was noted here quite early on 10/30. Definite carrier, but too much WBBM to make anything out. (RHM)
- 795 Black Rock, BARBADOS was noted on 11/3 around 2100 with US election returns. Best evening level ever noted, but unneeded. (RHM)
- 800 PJB Bonaire, NETHERLANDS ANTILLES was very strong in here the last two nights in a row. Was overriding CKLW both nights, in Portugese. Logged at 0606 both nights with S 8-9 signal. Country heard # 4. (BT) Was heard in Portugese and Spanish on 10/25 at 0402-0435. IDed as "Radio Trans-Mundial". Very strong. (MW) Heard call letter ID at 0430 on 10/23 in Spanish, with CKLW QRM. (DR) Blush !! Heard under XELO on 10/31 from 2215-2300 with English religious schedule. Where to report ? Bonaire, New Jersey, or Holland ? (Have heard of veries each way, Dal. Mine came via Bonaire. - ed) Fine ID in English then English programming from 0530 on 10/31. Strong !! (RHM)
- KINY Juneau, ALASKA puts in a local like signal every night here; sometimes as early as 0100. Verie is a green card loaded with info about the station. V/s is Jim Baillie. (BT)
- ???? An unknown oriental station was heard here on 11/1 at 0430. Quite possibly North Korea - they're all over ! (RJS)
- 818 Andorra-la-Vieille, ANDORRA, "Andorra Number One". I still think that this station was relaying "Radio Monte Carlo" when I logged them on 9/15. Sent my report there, and they promptly verified but with an unspecific card. Logged again on 10/17 at 1945 so reported directly to Andorra this time. (CMS)
- 830 JOBB Osaka, JAPAN was heard as well as or better than JOIB-750 kcs. on 10/31 and 11/1 from 0320-0430. WCCO gave periodic QRM. (KGS)
- CMCA Havana, CUBA. Their English RS was logged on 11/2 under WCCO from 2330 on. (DJ)
- ???? An UnID oriental station was heard at 0900 on 11/4. Had 3 beeps and a tone like "Radio Pyongyang". (JW)
- 836 -RTF- Nancy, FRANCE was noted for the first time this Fall on 10/30 around 2400. (RHM)

- 840 TGE ? Guatemala City, GUATEMALA, "Radio Emperador" was logged on 10/31 at 0045. (CMS)
- 850 KICY Nome, ALASKA was heard quite clear with a fair signal on 10/31 and 11/1 at 0400. Second time logged this season. (KGS)
- ???? A Spanish speaking station was logged on 11/2 from 0242-0255 with commercial programming and it seemed to ID as "Radio Mejoral" not "Continental" which would be YNAV. (DJ)
- 870 JOLB Fukuoka, JAPAN was presumably the Japanese station heard here on 11/1 from 0440-0445. (RJS)
- 872 EAJ 101 Zaragoza, SPAIN has been the most consistent Spaniard lately. Heard with Andalusian music on 10/28 at 2115. ID by man at 2135. (JAP)
- 885 Plymouth, MONTSERRAT was logged on 10/14 at about 2100 s/off. (CMS) Very nice v/l received from Christine A. Carty for country # 53. Schedule is the same as listed in DXWW, September 29 except add SATURDAY 1230-1300, and change SUNDAY to 1530-1845. Address and other info also as listed in that issue. (ELK)
- 917 -RNE- Arganda, SPAIN was logged with a fair signal on 11/1 from 1817-1835. News or Commentary until 1832, then classical music. (ELK)
- 999 XECL Mexicali, MEXICO was noted here on 10/31 at 0055 in Spanish "murdering" XEOY on 1000 kcs.. Back on 990 kcs. on 11/1. (DJ)
- 1000 1 ZD Tauranga, NEW ZEALAND was heard several nights when KOMO TT was off, but no ID yet. (DE)
- 1020 2 KY Canberra, AUSTRALIA was cutting through WBZ/CBR QRM on 10/25 at 0450 with News. First DU of the season here. Strong signal, but faded rapidly. (MW)
- 1030 XEQR Mexico City, MEXICO was logged at 2109 on 10/23 with WBZ, as "Radio Centro" and ABC network theme. (DR)
- 1035 4 VEF Cap Haitien, HAITI was heard at s/off on 11/4 around 0005 after US election returns broadcast. As good a level as I've ever heard ! (RHM)
- 1040 KHVH Honolulu, HAWAII. Three stations loud (KHVH-WHO-Peking) at 0445 on 11/2. First time for KHVH. (KGS)
- Peking, CHINA pinned the S meter on 10/31 with a signal in excess of 40 Db over S 9. Program was a woman announcer talking with another woman. Country heard # 5. (BT)
- ???? An unknown, seemingly Spanish, station heard at s/on here at 0300 on 10/25 but it also might have been KHVH, since it was very weak. Radio Tupi ? (RJS) (S/on, Randy ? See last week's column. Definitely heard them at around 0150. - ed)
- 1043 DDR I Dresden, EAST GERMANY was the strongest TA on the evening of 10/30. Already reported. (RHM) What a signal ! Often S 9, and to heck with WHO ! Mixed music type show with a lot of Billy Vaughan sounding records and the ubiquitous "Beer Barrel Polka". Heard on 10/31 from 2002-2035. Classical music after 2030. (ELK)
- 1100 HJAT Barranquilla, COLOMBIA, "Radio Reloj de Barranquilla" was noted with an easy ID at 0400 on 10/25. Very loud at times. Perfectly readable from 0315-0400. Did they up power ? (RJS) (Not as far as I know, Randy. Still 1 kw., I think. - ed)
- ???? One of the two Colombian "Radio Reloj" stations was heard here on 11/2 from 0010-0041 until KFAX s/on. Mentioned "Caracol" net - does this narrow it down ? (DJ) (No, but HJAT is by far the stronger here normally, Dal, and note Randy's report above. - ed)
- 1106 ???? An UnID TA was heard on 10/30 around 2300. Probably AFN but I couldn't boost it to readability. (RHM)
- 1120 YVMF Maracaibo, VENEZUELA. A QSL card was received from "Ondas del Lago" thanks to Larry Godwin. QRA is Apartado 261. Unsigned. (DJ)
- 1125 TISRHB San Jose, COSTA RICA was heard on 11/2 from 2257-2305. Fair with "Radio Popular" IDs, few commercials, mostly music. (DJ)
- 1140 XEMR Monterrey, MEXICO is heard nightly here. WRVA interferes some. (DR)
- 1178 -VOA- Okinawa, RYUKYU ISLANDS was easily logged from 0710-0830 on 10/26. Some English until 0730, then ID. Oriental languages after 0730. WHAM interferes before 0700. (KGS)

- 1180 PRE 3 Rio de Janeiro, BRAZIL, "Radio Globo" was logged on 11/1 at 0300 s/on with 3 tones. Had Portugese music and News. Faded out by 0315. (DJ)
- 1189 HJCT Barranquilla, COLOMBIA, "La Voz de la Costa" was definitely IDed on 11/2 at 2133 with full ID. This is my UnID of October 27. (ELK)
- 1196 -VOA- Munich, WEST GERMANY was the first TA to show on the evening of 10/30, the usual "tip-off" to such activity. (RHM)
- 1200 YVOZ Caracas, VENEZUELA, "Radiotiempo" sent a v/1 signed by Roberto Vazquez, Director. QRA is Apartado 3333. Thanks to Larry for this one also ! (ELK)
- 1210 JOOR Osaka, JAPAN was heard with WCAU at 0540 on 10/26. WCAU was louder but was easily looped out. "Mainichi" ID at 0600. (KGS)
- 1214 -BBC- Westerglen, SCOTLAND verifies with a "London Calling" QSL. The frequency was filled in. (RHM)
- 1250 "Radio Moscow" Far East and Southeast Asia service traded with KTW from 0415-0545 on 11/1. "Radio Moscow" IS every ½ hour. Various oriental languages used. (KGS) Heard with oriental programming on 11/2. No ID. (DE)
- 1370 ???? What gives here ? On 11/2 at 0400 two stations, one definitely Japanese, the other possibly oriental also. No NHK pips on the hour, just a single tone. One station had a play the other a musical format. No English newscast as heard last year on JOKD. How about it West Coasters ? (DJ)
- 1430 XEOX Ciudad Obregon, MEXICO was heard under KARM on 10/24 at 0100. (KGS)
- 1470 XEAU Tijuana, MEXICO was heard in the clear SM 11/1 from 0234-0245 with a musical program in English. IDs as "Radio Acuna". (DJ)
- 1475 Vienna, AUSTRIA was heard with News commentary in German at 2345 on 10/31. Local WMMW, one mile away, came on at 0000 with test. Pffft ! (JAP)
- 1510 ???? (...?), JAPAN. At least one of the weak NHK relays was heard with fair signals from 0315-0430 on 11/2. Muffled ID suggests more than one // relay heard. Rest of program clear. Strongest listed is only 1 kw.. (KGS)
- 1538 Mainflingen, WEST GERMANY, "Deutschlandfunk" was presumably the TA heard here with a good jazz show from 1818-1851 on 10/31. Fine signal. (ELK)
- 1550 XEBG Tijuana, MEXICO is a regular here after stateside s/off's on 1550 and 1540 kcs. (KXEL) SM. S/off on 10/11 was at 0306. (MW)
- 1570 XEAE Ciudad Acuna, MEXICO is heard virtually every night at S 9 until 2202 s/off. Reported - before too many of you have the chance, hi ! (DJ)
- 1580 XEDM Hermosillo, MEXICO had an audio test on 10/10 at 0340. (MW)
- ???? An UnID Spanish speaking station was here under XEDM for a few moments on 10/28 at 0055. Never strong. (MW)
- 1594 ISLE OF MAN, "Radio Manx" officially applied on 9/25 for a MW frequency. Are now using this frequency and announcing as "Radio Manx on 188". Sked is from 0300-0900 Mon-Sat and 0400-1000 Sun. Also has tests between 0900-1300. In October had tests from 0300-0500 & 0700-0900. (KB)
- 1605 RAB Rabinal, GUATEMALA. POPULAR ELECTRONICS says this station is only 1200 watts ! Slow morse code ID at 0415 on 10/23 repeating "RAB". (DR)
