No real good DX around this way owing to high local noise, with only our regular stations of KOMA, KPOL (1540), KFBK-1530, KTRH-740, and of course, XERF Del Rio coming in with signals as good as a local station 100 miles north of here (3ZB Christchurch) (1100-10 kw.) and a few strays like last evening (local) when KYOS was heard with good strength signing off at 0230. 11/7 ZCO Nuka a'lofa, Tonga, 1030 kc. blocking out WBZ Boston during our early evening. Intend trying to get a few more stations today, 11/9 (time 9 minutes past midnight as I write this) when most of our blocked channels are cleared by your big 24 hour boys signing off giving us a chance on clearer channels. It's a lot easier for us to listen as it is 5 p.m. NZST Monday when it is Midnight EST Monday and aren't so liable to doze off on the job. Who can help me with daily figures on QRN levels as I'm trying to see if there is a full cycle in the noise level increases decreases corresponding to the passage of the moon through the "solar-wind" which from figures I'm getting from NZers seems to show. Predictions from these say that a peak will be evident from about 11/16 to 11/23 and between 12/14 and 12/21 but cannot get an overall picture without some readings from the U.S. So, if anyone can help, would be appreciated. Only one QSL card lately, from WKY Okla. City, 930 kc. Local weather is sunny with 60° to 80° daily, light winds.

Greetings, peoples. CX seem to be pointing to a very good season so far. Africans and South Europeans have been heard here since September. I Have never heard TA's here before mid-December. The Northern Europeans will probably be good this winter after the hours of darkness become long enough to make a path. The TA's that have been making the scene are Senegal-764, RCP-782, 3AM2-1466, RNE-683. Now to a few things on sun spots. ..There is no sure way of telling how high the peak will be, as thell year cycles follow no set pattern. The count seems to rise sharply to its peak and descend slowly to the minimum. The increase in the sunspot count does not mean that it will kaput BCB dx; there will be good DX in the high count years also. The sunspot count can vary considerably frmm day to day, as the sun rotates on its axis. There seems to be a delay of about 3 days from the time something happens on the sun and when its affect on reception is shown on this planet. Thus, if we each had a way of taking our own sunspot count, we could make a fair prediction of openings. Such a count is not hard to make, if you can focus an image of the sun on a screen. More on that at a later date.

- 746 ???? An UnID station was heard to s/on at 2230 with Arabic programming. Definitely Middle East, and probably Syria with boosted power. (RFS)
- 750 JOIB Sapporo, JAPAN is in strong most every morning starting at 0330, over WSB most of the time. Very clear on MM. Power ? (TAM) (10 kws. - ed)
- HJDK Medellin, COLOMBIA was drowning out WSB on 11/9 from 2335-2400. Faded for IDs, as "La Voz de Antioquia". (RJS)
- 755 Timisoara, ROMANIA is in well nightly past 2230 with a man and a woman talking. (RFS)
- 760 XEABC Los Reyes, MEXICO has s/off MMs at 0300; s/on 0500 local time. (0600 EST ? - ed) Coyoacan seems to be the announced location. (RFS) "Radio ABC" is said so fast, and often. Dominant here from sunset on. (RJS)
- 764 Baghdad, IRAQ has an excellent signal (considering) most evenings past 2220. ID's with a woman over "Greensleeves". First Asian; reported ! (RFS)
- Dakar, SENEGAL was in briefly on 11/5 at 0200 with an IS then a man speaking in French. Not enough to warrant a report. (RHM)

- 773 Cairo, EGYPT/UAR puts in a tremendous signal daily from 1700-1940 s/off. Parallels 818 kcs.. ID's on the quarter hour usually with a fanfare. Report sent out. (RFS)
- 775 TIW San Jose, COSTA RICA, "Radio City" is believed to be the station heard here very briefly on 11/9 at 2333. Hard to get away from KOB, but it didn't sound like any local Mexican. (RJS) (This call, Randy. - ed)

- 800 PJB Bonaire, NETHERLANDS ANTILLES sent a QSL folder thanking me for my report of 9/27. Not a QSL as to form, but I'm sure it's the same others are receiving. (RHM) (I did, Roy, but it DOES say "QSL" on the cover - ed)
- 810 YVLP Valencia, VENEZUELA sent a v/1 for my report of last December. Thanks to Larry ! QRA is: Girardot y Montes de Oca, Valencia. V/s is Eva de Nunez, Sec.. Sent two postcards and many decals. Venezuelan #31 here. Evening schedule is listed as: MON-SAT: 1930 "Venezuela Canta Asi"; 2000 "Voces y Guitarras"; 2030 "Estudio Musical 810"; 2200 "Estampa Portenas"; 2030-2330 Romantic music: SUNDAY: 1730 "64 Musical"; 1830 "Via Musical 810"; 1930-2130 "Un Domingo Distinto". (ELK)
- 818 Andorra-la-Vieille, ANDORRA, "Radio des Vallees" was noted // "Radio Monte Carlo" around 0100. Announces as "Radio Monte Carlo et Radio de Vallees". (RFS)
- 820 HJED Cali, COLOMBIA was heard very strong on 11/8 from 0300-0330 with "Una Voz en el Camino" and IDs as "La Voz del Rio Cauca". Good any AM except MM. Never verified last years report. (DJ)
- 827 -SWF- Freiburg, WEST GERMANY is noted early AMs, especially MMs. (RFS)
- 830 JOBB Osaka, JAPAN was noted on 11/9. Had trouble, but was definitely they. (R)
- 840 JCQK Niigata, JAPAN was in the clear on the AM of 11/9 until 0500, parallel to 670 kcs.. (RJS) Fair to good signal with some fading on 11/10 from 0303-0415. (KGS)

- ???? An UnID Spanish speaking station was noted here at 0453 on 11/9. I have HJCE s/on as 0430 in the log; does this check Ed ? Rates a look on 11/16. (RJS) (No s/on info here, Randy, but have been AN at times. - ed)
- 895 OBX 4 X Lima, PERU, "Radio El Sol" is apparently the station logged here on 11/5 at 0000 with LA music and soft voiced announcer. Left the air at 0006. Bothered by severe WLS QRM. (DJ)
- 908 Baghdad, IRAQ is very good past 2215 most nights. Separate programming from 764 kcs., and has more talk. Heavy QRM from YVRQ. (RFS)
- 917 Lourenco Marquea, MOZAMBIQUE. The schedule of the "B" program on this frequency is now: 1000-2400. (WRTVH)
- 950 JOKR Tokyo, JAPAN had trouble making it through the hash on 11/9. Was good at 0445. (RJS)
- 953 Brno, CZECHOSLOVAKIA is excellent at 2230 s/on and after. (RFS)
- 985 "Radio Invicta", INTERNATIONAL WATERS has been heard on this frequency on several occasions. (Nominally 980 kcs.) (SCDX)

1375 -RTF- ST PIERRE & MIQUELON was apparently the French speaking station logged weakly and intermittently on 11/11 from 1951-2010. (ELK)

1420 XEXX Tijuana, MEXICO was heard with a clear call letter ID at 0353. (DLR)

1425 YNBZ (...?), NICARAGUA, "Radio Universidad de las Altas" is excellent all evening to 0100. Mostly music. (RFS)

1430 XEOX Ciudad Obregon, MEXICO was heard with an ID at 0045 on 11/5. (RJS)

1439 Marnach, LUXEMBOURG dominated 1440 kcs. for a good half hour around 1930 on 11/8. (RFS)

1475 4 VPE Port-au-Prince, HAITI, "La Voix des Antilles" is now heard well early evenings. (RFS)

1495 "Radio Caroline II", INTERNATIONAL WATERS is heard well even through WMBM, past 2400 with popular music. (RFS)

1500 HJZH Envigado, COLOMBIA, "La Voz Katia" was very loud and dominant on their AN schedule on 11/9. (RFS)

1502 "Radio Rag Calling" was run by the students of Newcastle University from a ship outside the Tyne mouth. It broadcast publicity for their rag week, but also music and News bulletins. Schedule was 1400-1700 on this frequency and on 1448 kcs. (That is 200 and 207 meters. - ed) Probably off the air now. (SCDX)

1510 "Radio Caroline North", INTERNATIONAL WATERS has been heard testing on this frequency at the end of their scheduled programming. (SCDX)

1515 YN.. Leon, NICARAGUA, "Radio Progreso" is a new station being heard well in the evenings. Mimics the pre-Castro style programming of station CMBC. (RFS)

1527 HON Colon, PANAMA, "Radio Aeropuerto" is now drifting to way over here from 1500 kcs.. (RFS)

1560 XE.. (...?), MEXICO. An UnID station was noted running late on 11/8 with a live program. It was fairly strong from 0330-0400, and had a s/off at about 0410. The modulation sounded so phoney that I'd almost believe it was some kind of harmonic. Didn't XERMK in Ciudad Satellite run late a few times last year ? (DJ)

1570 XEAE Ciudad Acuna, MEXICO now has XERF style country and western record promotions etc., all in English. It was heard this way on 11/6 at 2100 and still seems to s/off at 2202. Maybe it's just a matter of time until they're AN. (DJ)

1575 TI.. Palmares, COSTA RICA, "Radio Columbia - Canal 6". Who's "Canal 5" ? (RFS)

1580 HJAY Galapa, COLOMBIA, "La Voz de la Cordialidad" is now AN. (RFS)

XEDM Hermosillo, MEXICO is good after 0100 here, but KBGO is also very strong. (DLR)

1590 JOUB Akita, JAPAN (And/or JOGB in Kumamoto). Such good reception when other channels are weak on 11/9 probably indicates that I heard both stations at once. Also no complete fades and a little echoing were noted. NHK Second Network. Competition from a DU station at 0600 with time tones. (5 MV ?) (KGS)

1596 HJZT Armenia, COLOMBIA, "Radio Ciudad Milagro" is here now from 1600 kcs.. (RFS)/

ODDS N ENDS

"The United Republic of Tanganyika and Zanzibar formally notified the United Nations today that its name has been changed to the United Republic of Tanzania". (UPI report published in the CLEVELAND PRESS on 11/5)

"Leaders of seven British Caribbean islands have decided to join in a federation to be known as The West Indies. At a meeting which ended over the weekend, the leaders of Antigua, Barbados, Dominica, Montserrat, St. Lucia, St. Kitts and St. Vincent agreed to band together in a federation which will have independence from the start. All seven islands were members of the first West Indies Federation which broke up in 1962 when first Jamaica and then Trinidad and Tobago decided to seek independence on their own." (AP report in the CLEVELAND PRESS on 11/5)

Remember that there will be a foreign contest this year. Although the rules haven't been completed as yet, don't let this stop you from logging any DX as the starting date will be retroactive to around the beginning of September.

The first of the IRCA foreign DXs has been lined up by Larry Godwin. It will be over station YVQB in Cumana, Venezuela on 1020 kcs.. The date will be December 1, and the time is scheduled to be from 0330-0430.

Also note that other foreign DXs have been lined up by other clubs from stations PJC 7 in Willemstad, Curacao, NETHERLANDS ANTILLES on 1500 kcs. and from YNOL in Managua, NICARAGUA on 828 kcs.. These three should make fine opportunities for fattening your logs !

*** COUNTRY OF THE MONTH ***

JAPAN would seem to be the one deserving this honor this month with many stations being reported. Probably the best bets are: JOBK-670 kcs. in Osaka; JOIB-750 kcs. in Sapporo; JOBB-830 kcs. in Osaka; and JOOR-1210 kcs. in Tokyo. Other stations being heard have been: JOIU on 780 kcs.; JOQK on 840 kcs.; JOLB on 870 kcs.; JOPK on 880 kcs.; JOKR on 950 kcs.; and JOHB on 1090 kcs.. Although this country can hardly be considered an easy one to log by Eastern DXers it should be noted that some of these stations are on frequencies which could allow for their reception, particularly on Monday mornings.
