Also, glad to see the tips on writing better reports, which I am now trying to heed. Up til then, my reports had consisted of 50% or so song titles, and now I find out stations can't even check this! Before I joined the IRCA, I hadn't even heard of sending return postage, yet believe it or not, without that & with the lists of song titles I sent, my verie return was 77%. Since I have started sending return postage, verie return (including reports sent out before joining) has risen to 81%. I'd like to hear from any electronics expert who can explain the following: I've been DXing with a 9-transistor portable and a 5-tube table radio. Both have directional (somewhat) antennas. This is why "tentatives" should be frowned upon, because they can (and do, sometimes) result in invalid veries. Oh, note Matt Zahner's article on BCB DX in the new Radio-Electronics. Guess I'll have to write an article now, it looks like everybody else is doing it! C.M. Stanbury really started something, huh? 73.

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New CBC Radio For Alberta

October 1, 1964 saw two new CBC transmitters hit the air in Alberta. The old Alberta outlets of CBX, Lacombe, 1010 kc. (50 kw.) and CBXA Edmonton, 740 kc. (200 watts) were replaced with two ultra-modern 50 kw. transmitters in Edmonton and Calgary. The old 1010 spot of CBX was taken over by CBR, in Calgary, whose 50 kw. transmitter is located at the outlying town of Shepard. CBX moved to 740 kc. with a new transmitter in Edmonton, Alberta. CBXA, the old Edmonton outlet, was permanently shut down, as was the old La-Combe installation. CFAC, which was Calgary's CBC affiliate before the change, resumed it's independent rock-and-roll programming. CBR & CBX will confirm correct reports readily, and program reports may be sent simply to the correct city. V/s for CBR is L. C. Bailey, Technical Director. (submitted by Mike Wilson)

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Last minute FCC Bulletin from Broadcasting

KFMB San Diego, California has been granted permission to move from 540 kc. to 760 kc. fulltime with 5kw. The station is a full time Class II station and will occupy the clear channel frequency where WJR, Detroit, has reigned supreme for many years. The frequency is one of 13 clear channels that the FCC has marked for duplication. But the decision to move KFMB is an outgrowth of the U.S.-Mexico Radio Agreement of 1961. Mexico under the agreement pre-empted Class 1-A operation on 540 kc., the frequency now held by KFMB. As a result, the FCC was obliged to find a new frequency for the station. KFMB filed for 760 kc. in 1961 and after a long fight with WJR, will finally make the move. Now is the time to log KGU before this switch is made!

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CHQR, "Quality Radio"

On November 17, after several days of 24 hour testing, Calgary, Alberta's new relaxed sound hit the air officially. CHQR, at 810 kos., 10 kw. is Southern Alberta's first station programming classical music and semi-classical exclusively. Production Mgr., Wilf Semnett, states that CHQR will have a minimum of commercials and talks, with mostly music. One departure from this standard will be nightly "Forum" program in which listeners telephone in to a studio panel. A maximum of 9 commercials per hour will be featured. CHQR is Calgary's first independent new station for 37 years, bringing the local total to 5 AM stations. (CHAR, CFAC, CBR, CFCN, and CKXL). CHQR has a daytime pattern with a radius of nearly 200 miles. The pattern is slightly elongated to the north and south. Transmitting is via a remote transmitter and a four-antenna array. Chief Engineer is Mel Hoyme and address is 1030 4th St., S.W., Calgary, Alta. (submitted by Mike Wilson)

SCOTCH RADIO?

A company has been formed in Edinburgh, Scotland to operate a chain of commercial radio broadcasting stations on the Broadcast Band. Options have been taken already on studio space in buildings in Glasgow, Aberdeen, Edinburgh and Dundee. The company is prepared to spend 560,000 dollars to put this network on the air. Time is estimated to cost \$16.80 per minute U.S. money on the stations. Now all that's left is for the group to obtain permission from the British authorities to go into operation. Perhaps the pirate stations in European waters will force the different governments to allow commercial radio broadcasting yet.

I didn't find any stations that throw the reports in the waste basket when they are received. I was interviewed over the air twice, in Venezuela (YVQQ-670 and R. Sucre-1020) and R. Tiempo-1200 ran a brief news item on our visit. It's been a very enjoyable trip from the standpoint of station visits...."
