Hi gang! Greetings from Lima, and thanks very much for the letters, Bill, Dave, and Don. So far, so good on the trip, though we are a few days behind schedule. In Tumbes, Peru, I stopped by "Radio Nacional" (1160 kcs.) and found that was the station I heard back on 6/15 with s/on at 0600 EST. I spoke with the announcer whose voice appeared on my tape. Then in Trujillo, I picked up a verie from OAX2Q-1210 for my 4th Peruvian. The Pan-Am Highway in Peru is mostly paved, but the materials they use are of inferior quality, for the roads are generally rough. In Chimbote, I found out there are 2 new stations: "Radio Sudamericana" and "Radio Interamericana". The former could not tell me what frequency it uses, and the latter has no telephone. Also, "Radio Chimbote" doesn't know its frequency either, but I presume it's still on 690 kcs. See DXWW for other information. We will be in Santiago around 12/15, then can be contacted at the Embassy in Buenos Aires. Merry Christmas to all and see you in San Diego! 73.

Puerto Rico was also being heard WKFE was coming in at s/on 0458 in English. Switched to SS after opening announcement. It was blocked out at 0501 by WYOU also on 1550. At 0608 WOAI-1200 was logged in the clear from one of our locals with the last of the night at 7:30 being XETRA on 690. Had a bit of a loaf on 11/29 with only CHUB on 1570 (Wot's happened to XERF)? An attempt at KSL's distant listener contest at 0537. PJB was logged over LYZ at 0406 and WDAS at 0314 on 1480. Last night (local) a little better. XEDM-1580 at 0330. KAFY on 550 at 0316, at 0330 3 stations were busy fighting it out on 1390 but managed to identify WPLM and KCBC before 0409 when another go at Canada was successfully logging CFGN on 1060. CFUN on 1410 at 0830. Receivers in use were Eddystone 840A 7 tubes and an antique Philips circa 1938 with 5 tubes. On our first section of 7 hours of testing, we received over 200 phone calls and gave away 15 prizes to people who came to the station. Regular programming is planned for the 5th of December. Enough about the tone...when a DXer buys a new RX, he is maily interested in the sensitivity. Well, this baby has plenty of that too. I have some photos of the RX. If any of you would like to see what it looks like, drop me a few lines and I'll be glad to send you a photo. When it comes to RX's I always say "All: The way with RCA", hi. DX is improving day by day as the WX gets coler. CFCF-600 drowns out local WICC every night. They can be heard best between 2100 and 2300. On 930 kcs., WBEN (upstate in Buffalo) and CFBC (St. John, N.B) have been heavily QRM ing semi-local WPAT. WPAT's XR is just across the river in NJ, a few miles from my house. Some other stations recently logged were WGTO-540, CBT-540, w/heavy QRM from XEWA (hi Jose), CBW-990 w/a strong signal, and WNOR-1230. In the foreign dept., CMBC-690 and CMCA-830 both Cubans were heard. See DXWW for more details. I've been trying to log some stations 'way out yonder in the far west but no luck. Merry Christmas! That's more than I can say for my DX. One station heard in a week is certainly not my record. WAUX in Waukesha, Wisc. brought my total stations heard to 230. I've often heard that snowstorms produce static electricity but I always thought the static electricity wouldn't be noticable. A couple of days ago, I discovered that there is a fair amount of static electricity produced. I was listening to my radio before going to bed. Whenever I heard a pop in the speaker, I thought I could hear a snap near me. The plates on my capacitor of the the antenna tuner were arcing. The antenna tuner is connected between the antenna terminal and ground of my receiver so it acts like a lightning arrester. I didn't realize this until I saw the capacitor plates arcing. In the morning, the plates were still arcing. Sometimes, they arced at the rate of about 1 spark per second. I don't suppose an antenna tuner will improve reception as much on a good receiver as on a cheaper receiver like my Heathkit GR-91. On many stations that come in at about S-5 I can boost the signal strength to at least 20 db over S-9. If you want results like that build an antenna tuner...it's easy. Connect one lead from the tuner to the antenna terminal of your radio. Connect the other lead the ground terminal. If, like mine, your receiver has 3 terminals, connect the lead that goes to the ant. terminal to the terminal on your receiver used for longwire ant. It may take quite a bit of experimenting to get the right-sized coil and variable capacitor. I used a capacitor out of an old broadcast band receiver. I experimented with various coils out of old receivers until I found the best one. Don't put it off... do it now...you'll be glad you did. I got the idea for the tuner from Electronics Illustrated Magazine. Actually, it was supposed to be a wave trap but it turned out to be a combination wave trap and antenna tuner. I never use it as a wave trap. I thought reception was super last week. Today stations are coming in with much stronger signals than I have ever received them. One more thing about the ant. tuner...it works best on frequencies up to 980 kcs. It helps less on higher frequencies. At first, it didn't work at all on higher frequencies. It works as a wave trap on any freq. Sorry if I have made this too long. This forumula started out to be short. MERRY CHRISTMAS!

- 840 HJBI Santa Marta, COLOMBIA, "Ondas del Caribe" was heard with s/on (?)
announcements on 11/30 at 0505-0506. Then went into music. It was

- 840 HJBI (cont.) behind WHAS, but was easily logged as long as WHAS didn't play any music. (ELK)
- ???? An unidentified Spanish station was heard here with a fair signal on 11/14 from 0515 on. Not a Mexican or a Cuban. Much mention of "Colombia" at 0515 and 0530. What is it? (JH) (The above station is the only Colombian on this frequency, Jim, and their 10 kws. normally gets out pretty well. - ed)
- 850 KICY Nome, ALASKA was in on 11/1 with a good signal from 0450 on. New country for me. (JH) Sent a v/1 from Earl Swanson, CE at P. O. Box 303 in Nome for my 9/20 report. (KGS)
- 875 YNW 1 Leon, NICARAGUA. This relay of "Radio Mundial" was noted on 12/2 around 0030 with a nice signal. (ELK)
- 900 HCEV 5/ Cuenca, ECUADOR, "Ondas Azules" is scheduled from 0600-2300, but it will be AN on the AMs of 12/25 and 1/1, as well as during the carnival from 2/21 to 2/24. (LBG)
- 910 XEAO Mexicali, MEXICO runs to 0300. It is very strong here at night, so it should be an easy logging for western DXers. (BN)
- 920 HCGR 5 Riobamba, ECUADOR, "Radio Mundial" is here from 910 kcs.. Their schedule is 0700-2200, but they will be AN the AMs of 12/25 and 1/1. They also will DX for the IRCA on 1/1 from 0300-0400. (LBG)
- 990 KTRG Honolulu, HAWAII was heard for the first time on 11/26, and also on 11/27, at 0330 under CBW. (KGS)
- 995 HCEW 2 Guayaquil, ECUADOR, "Radio Suceso" was heard with a very nice signal, and a complete ID on 12/1 at 2345, as: "HCEW 2, Radio Suceso, 995 kilociclos, Onda Larga, 96.5 megaciclos, Frecuencia Modulada, con diez mil wattios de potencia ... desde Guayaquil, Ecuador." (ELK) Is now on the air with 10 kws., and has already received a report from Penna.. (LBG)
- 1000 #1 ZD Tauranga, NEW ZEALAND must surely have been the station heard here in English (Wishful thinking?) on 11/30 from 0436-0450. Too weak to ID, and the TT (KOMO?) here and the WINS "slopover" don't help. (ELK)
- HCRV 5 Cuenca, ECUADOR, "Radio Vision" is now operating here according to one of their announcers although both SACCA and WRTVH list it as 1005 kcs.. Their schedule is 0630-2300, but they will be AN the AMs of 12/25 and 1/1, as well as during the carnival from 2/21 to 2/24. (LBG)
- 1030 XEQR Mexico City, MEXICO, I believe, had a sign-on this SM at about 0505. No call was heard, but "Radio Centro" was noted. (DR)

- 1320 XEAI Mexico City, MEXICO was heard here for the first time in a long while on 11/29 at around 0150. Too much QSB and QRM for a report even though they were on top occasionally. (ELK)
- 1370 OAX 1 G Tumbes, PERU, "Radio Tumbes" is definitely here, ex-640 kcs.. Their schedule is 0730-2330. (LBG)
- 1390 JOJB Kanazawa, JAPAN was heard on 11/30 from 0345-0435, // 1370 kcs., but weak and fading and nowhere near the clarity. (KGS)
- ???? A "north-south" station was audible from 0359-0402 on 11/30 with an ID as "This is the (inter)national service of ...", then they had News in English. The voice sounded Canadian. It was very weak. Maybe CKLN, but the ID doesn't check. Anyone have any ideas ? Harmonic ? (KGS)
- 1445 HCSC 5 Riobamba, ECUADOR, "Radio Ruta" is probably here, but they announce as 1450 kcs.. Their schedule is 0800-2300, but they will be AN the AM of 1/1. (LBG)
- 1538 Mainflingen, WEST GERMANY, "Deutschlandfunk" sent an inspecific form letter to verify my reception of early November. European # 34. (ELK)
- 1540 OBX 1 B Tumbes, PERU, "La Voz de la Frontera" is here, ex-1450 kcs., per a station announcer. Their schedule is 0600-2300, but they will be on late the AMs of 12/25 and 1/1. (LBG)
- 1550 OAX 2 N Trujillo, PERU, "Ondas del Norte" is a new station here according to OAX 2 Q. (This is not official.) (LBG)
- 1570 XERF Ciudad Acuna, MEXICO was noted back in full swing tonight (12/1) ! (BN)
- 1580 HJAY Galapa, COLOMBIA, "La Voz de la Cordialidad" sent a nice v/1 and pennant for Colombian # 29 here. V/s is Carmen Rodriguez L., Secretaria. (My report was sent to the "Gerente".) Their address is: Apartado Aereo No. 27-02, BARRANQUILLA. They are affiliated with RCN. (ELK)

OFFICIAL 1964-1965 IRCA FOREIGN CONTEST RULES

- The contest is open to all members in good standing of the IRCA.
- The entry fee is 25¢. Entries will be accepted until December 31, 1964, or in the case of new members, thirty days within their date of membership.
- Contest dates: Loggings will be eligible from 0000 (local time) on Sept. 1, 1964 to 2400 (Local time) on June 30, 1965.
- Entries will be accepted until August 14, 1965.
- Station entries should consist of the following items:
 - Station call and slogan, if any
 - Frequency
 - Dates heard and verified
 - Verie signer, if any
- Although actual veries are not normally required to be submitted, the contest manager has the right to request for inspection the actual verie or a facsimile of it.
- The contest will consist of two leagues: an Eastern division consisting of all of the states east of the Mississippi River (Including Wisconsin); and a Western division consisting of all of the states west of the Mississippi River (Including Minnesota and Louisiana).
- Scores will be computed on the following basis:
(Distance points) X (Countries) X (Continents)
- One distance point will be awarded for every 1000 miles the station is from the contestant's location, or fraction thereof. (e.g. 3200 miles = 4 points)
- The contest manager will have the final word on all scoring.
- Countries will be those listed on the Official IRCA Countries List.
- Prizes will be announced later, but the first three leaders in each division will receive a prize.
- Winners will be announced at the 1965 IRCA Convention.
- No station may be re-verified for the purpose of this contest.
- If enough foreign members indicate a desire to join the contest a separate division will be set up for this purpose. A minimum of five members will be necessary for this purpose.
- Canadian members will be grouped as follows:
Eastern Division: Ontario and all provinces east of it.
Western Division: Manitoba and all provinces west of it.
