EE-880 at 0455, 1YC? Or WCBS? YVQQ-770 o/WABC at 0505-0511, "Radio Puerto La Cruz," U.S. records on 730 from 0520-0531 tuneout, missed an ID, maybe Trinidad. Unk LA on 810 at 0510 o/WGY briefly, unID LA-854 at 0549, only there a minute and NOISE on 850, up to 995 for SS there, NOISE on 990 a minute later. At 0555 went up to 1375, unID IA there, also on 1325, sounding like FF, by 0606 the NOISE was on all bands, plus my clock radio and transistor, meaning that it's of an external source. San Diego has quite a history of this interference usually all in the early morning. It sounds like a dozen neon lights, a power saw, and an electric mixer all going at once. I. GENERAL POLICY CONCERNING THE CONTENT OF THE THREE DX MONITOR SECTIONS

A. "DX WORLD WIDE" shall contain

1. Reports from members concerning their foreign DX activity, relating
 - a. The times, dates, locations, frequencies, etc. of the foreign stations they hear (foreign shall be defined as other than the US and Canada)
 - b. Any other information obtained from verifications, or from any other source, such as QRAs, signers, skeds, station lists, etc.
2. Any information procured by the editor which in his judgment is valuable and useful to the foreign DXer.
3. The listing "DX RECORDS" supplied by that editor. The DXWW editor shall type this listing or delegate the responsibility for typing it.
4. The periodical standings in the annual IRCA Foreign Contest as provided by the contest manager.

B. "DOMESTIC TIP INDEX" shall contain

1. One or two line tips from members concerning domestic (US & Canada) stations which will conceivably lead a member to log them, i.e. information which is not elsewhere readily available, such as the following
 - a. unusual sign-on and sign-off times
 - b. unlisted frequency checks
 - c. new AN or other new skeds
 - d. late tips such as upcoming ETPs, DXes, and the like
2. All regular frequency checks heard and reported by members as an aid to the compiler of the annual IRCA Frequency Check List.

C. "DX FORUM" shall contain

1. Any information about domestic stations such as
 - a. DX by dateline, listing times, frequencies, signal strengths, types of programming, and related remarks
 - b. Information relating to verifications received, etc.
2. Any information on foreign stations as listed above for domestics, but it is preferred that such material be sent to the DXWW Editor.
3. Any discussion on
 - a. DX equipment
 - b. Conditions
 - c. the club

D. CONCERNING the size of columns and amount of material to be submitted

1. DXWW--there is no limit to the size of the column and no limit placed on the amount of material any member may submit so long as it meets the specifications listed in (II).
2. DTI--same as for DXWW
3. DX FORUM--there is no limit to the size of this column although there are certain restrictions placed on the amount of material any individual may submit to any particular issue--cf. (II).

II. POLICIES OF THE INDIVIDUAL EDITORS

A. DXWW & DTI Editors

1. Reports may be cut or individual items deleted when in the editor's judgment the information in them is
 - a. unduly repetitive
 - b. worthless
2. Reports may be disregarded if in the editors judgment they are illegible
3. Reports or individual items may be held over if the editor has no way of including them without going over to another page he has no way to fill.

B. DX FORUM Editor

1. The editor shall be able to omit
 - a. Any statement made in a language other than English, which is, in the editor's judgment
 1. of excessive length
 2. of an esoteric nature
 3. meaningless
 - b. Any statement made with the obvious intent to slander, or which is in the editor's judgment detrimental to
 1. any IRCA member
 2. the IRCA
 3. the IRCA policies

IRCA EDITORIAL POLICY, continued

- c. Profanity or otherwise improper language
- d. Any statement which is obviously irrelevant, in the editor's judgment,
 - 1. to DX and allied topics
 - 2. to the club
- 2. The editor shall be able to cut reports after thirty lines (1/2 page) when in his judgment
 - a. They do not contain pertinent DX information
 - b. They jeopardize the bulletin's staying within the 10 sheet postal weight limit (does not hold when bulletin is already over 10 sheets)
 The above rules are to be strictly enforced
- 3. Reports will be disregarded if
 - a. A member submits more than one report per issue without instructions to destroy one or hold one over.
 - b. A report in the editor's judgment is illegible
- 4. The editor shall be able to rephrase reports when in his judgment it is in the best interests of the column.

C. GENERAL REGARDING ALL EDITORS

- 1. The editors shall have the authority to determine the format of their columns.
- 2. The editors shall be able to add remarks when they are asked for by a member or when they will otherwise be pertinent
- 3. The editors shall refrain from making personal or pointed comments, or remarks which are not pertinent to the columns
- 4. The editors shall have sole authority over "filler" material used at the end of pages or columns.

III. NOTES

- A. Thus a number of powers are specifically delegated to the editors, but this does not necessarily mean that they need be always exercised.
- B. These powers are so considerable that their success and value will depend on the editor's wisdom in exercising them in accordance with the democratic tradition espoused by the IRCA.
- C. If a member feels that he has been unfairly censored, he should bring the matter before the Board of Directors. The board will then render a decision supporting either the member or the editor. Thus the editor will be responsible for his actions to the membership.

The following proposals to the IRCA Board of Directors were approved by a unanimous vote of 5-0 of Messrs. Gleason, Erickson, John, Johnson, and Krejny:

- 1. IRCA Official 1965 Convention Site of San Diego
- 2. IRCA Official Editorial Policy, reprinted above
- 3. IRCA Official Countries List, printed in the foreign section
- 4. IRCA Official 1965 Foreign DX Contest, also printed in DXWW

IT'S OFFICIAL!!

Yes, the one and only IRCA Convention for 1965 will be held in San Diego, California. The official chairman for this, our 2nd annual convention, is Randy Seaver, 2119 30th Street, San Diego, California, 92104. The official dates are August 20th through 23rd. This date was chosen because school in most areas will not yet have started, and the heavy Labor day crowds and traffic can be avoided. This is the first ECU convention in the United States ever to be held West of Denver, and promises to be one of the highest attended as well with the large number of Californians in the IRCA. Convention plans are already well under way and an organization meeting was held last week. San Diego has much to offer in climate and recreational facilities, not to mention nearby attractions such as Mexico. The guys in SD are already working hard lining up station tours (KOGO-600 is a near certainty) and other features which will be of interest to DXers, so be sure and make plans to be among those convening in San Diego in 1965!!

- 625 TIRICA San Jose, COSTA RICA was in here with S 9 signals on 1/11 at 0606. My second Costa Rican. (DS)
- 630 4 QN Townsville, AUSTRALIA verified my tentative report of 11/23; reception at 0454-0455. They said I was listening to "Country Party Policy Speech, Air Publicity". Aussie #3 verified here from Aussie state #3. Very happy about this one. Oceania now stands at 14/13. (FM)
- 640 ???? CMQ evidently isn't the only SS station here. There is one under it every night. Any ideas ? (MM) (Possibly HBJB-Santa Marta or HOK-Colon -ed)
- 645 HOS 22 Panama City, PANAMA, "Radio Mia" was heard on 1/8 from 2330-0002 s/off, about S 3 with slight QRM from CMQ. (PB)
- 647 -BBC- Crowborough, ENGLAND was almost certainly the UnID BBC station heard here on 12/14. Heard on 12/21 from 0140-0200A with "English By Radio" at 0145. Report out, and I'm hoping for a verie. (FM)
- 665 Vilnius, LITHUANIAN SSR was logged on 12/28 from 2330. Fine signal; tape off. (RHM)
- 670 ???? An LA mess here on 1/11. Some station announced as "Radio Tumbos (or Rumbos)" around 0450, and another after 0500 with "Nuevo Reloj" announcements. Who ? (DS) (YVLL-Caracas-"Radio Rumbos" is your first. - ed)
- 674 -RTF- Marseille, FRANCE verified by letter in English (My first such from the RTF). V/s is J. Giraud, L'Ingenieur en Chef Regional. Address in the WRTVH-1964 is correct, except "Ray" instead of "Ray". France #6. (ELK)
- 678 YND Managua, NICARAGUA was heard very clear announcing as "Radio Union" from 0602-0605+ on 12/14. Much needed country. (DB)
- 680 WAPA San Juan, PUERTO RICO was heard here for my first Puerto Rican. Very good signal from 0445-0451 on 12/14. (DB) Was finally heard at s/on and after with S 7 signals on 1/11 from 0500-0514. Country #27. (DS)
???? An unknown SS station was heard here on 1/11 at 0609. Audio was terrible; sounded like the announcer was talking into an echo chamber. Don't think it's a Colombian, but who knows ? (DS)
- 685 TGRT Guatemala City, GUATEMALA, "Radio Fabulosa" was heard with very strong signals on 1/9 (My first foreign DX of the year !) from 1900-2200. IDed on the ½ hour as: "Radio Fabulosa; primera en noticias, primera en reportas, primera en musica, Radio Fabulosa (?) en Guatemala, America Centro." (FM) (Yes, this city is correct, Frank. - ed)

HJCU Bogota, COLOMBIA, "Radio Tricolor" was heard at 0616 on 1/11 with an excellent signal. (DS)
???? US pop records and English talk was heard here on 1/11 from 0520-0531. Faded in and out. Possible ID of: "... independent state of ..."
Suspect Trinidad. (RJS) (Sounds likely, Randy - ed)
- 750 -JBC- Port Maria, JAMAICA was heard on 12/28 for my first Jamaican. Report

- 750 -JBC- Port Maria, JAMAICA (cont.) sent despite comments that they don't verify. Logged from 0447-0452. (DB)
JOIB Sapporo, JAPAN was heard for my first Japanese station on 12/28 from 0456-0504. Report sent. (DB)
- 760 CB 76 Santiago, CHILE verified with an attractive QSL card for my report of last May. Many thanks to LBG for this one ! Country #32. (DJ)
???? A SS station is heard here weakly under WJR every night. Any ideas - definitely NOT Cuba. (MM) (XEABC, HJAJ, or YSKL ? - ed)
- 764 -SBC- Sottens, SWITZERLAND was heard with ID at 0115 on 12/21 and on top of Senegal until 0130. New country for me, and their verie took only 6 days to arrive here ! V/s is J. P. Meroz, le Director, and they use very thin stationary ! (FM)
- 770 YVQQ Puerto la Cruz, VENEZUELA, "Radio Puerto la Cruz" was "bombing" in over WABC at 0505 and on. ID around 0510. (RJS) Was noted on 1/11 at 0516 with a fantastic signal. Oh for a tape recorder ! (DS)
- 775 ???? An unknown station was heard here on 1/11 from 0455-0515 playing US records; one of which was "There's A Star Spangled Banner Waving Somewhere" ! News in English at around 0514. Believe this is Caribbean, and strongly suspect PJA-8. I see the WRTVH-1964 lists a 0430 s/on. Too much WABC ! (ELK)
- 780 4 YA & YVOD This is an interesting frequency ! I had what I'm sure was 4 YA at 0440 then tuned back at 0457 to find what turred out to be YVOD, "Ecos del Torbes". ID at 0535. - 880 TGJ Guatemala City, GUATEMALA was logged here on 11/22 with a very good signal despite heavy WCBS QRM. Report out. (DB) ???? An unknown SS station was noted here on 1/11 at 0525. Too early for TGJ. Maybe the new Peruvian ? (DS) (Possibly YVKV, Dan. - ed)
- 885 Plymouth, MONTSERRAT was heard with religious (?) music at 0526. A garbled ID was noted at 0530 then into US pop music, but not R & R. Seems fantastic that the power is only 250 watts as their signal on 1/11 was excellent ! Maybe a power increase ? (DS) (I doubt it. - ed)
- 890 YVLW Valencia, VENEZUELA, "Radio America" was logged again on 1/11 from 0522-0542 for a report. They never answered my last one of 12/63. News program. Good signal. (ELK) Was heard with "Radio America" ID at 0535 with an excellent signal - another tape prospect ! (DS)
- 900 XEW Mexico City, MEXICO was logged on MM 1/11 under heavy CJBR QRM. They were strong at times. (MM) ???? An UnID LA station was heard here on 1/11 at 0412. Colombians were hot this MM; HJEY ? (RJS)
- 910 ???? An UnID LA station was noted here on 1/11 at 0412; mentioned Colombia about 4 times until KDEO turned back on at 0415 ruining it and the station on 900 kcs.. HJDO ? (RJS)
- 944 -RTF- Toulouse, FRANCE was heard at 0022 on 12/28. I think this is the station in French at this time. (FM) (Undoubtedly - ed)
- 995 HCEW 2 Guayaquil, ECUADOR, "Radio Suceso" was logged here at room level on 1/6 from 2200-2315 with Latin music. Clear call letter ID and slogan IDs, so a tape report was sent via registered mail. Their signal was much improved over November-December when barely the language could be ascertained. (DJ) ???? An UnID LA station was noted here on 1/11 at 0550. Hopefully "Radio Suceso". NOISE struck at 0552. (RJS)
- 1007 -NRU- Hilversum, NETHERLANDS verified by personal letter and QSL folder. V/s is A. P. Kraan, De Chef van de Afd. Bedrijfsbureau, Stichting Nederlandsche Radio Unie. He noted that their transmitters were designed for a 200 km. coverage area, yet because reception was so poor at times a network of auxiliary regional AM transmitters and an FM network were created. On the other hand, he noted that they receive reports of reception from Europe and "around Christmas" from North America ! (ELK)
- 1020 CMBN Santa Fe, CUBA was logged on 1/11 at 0000 even with KDKA. A young woman IDed as: "Transmite CMBN, La Voz de la Isla de Pinos" after 15+ minutes of continuous instrumental Latin music. KGBS's s/on at 0001 "killed" them. Reported. (DJ)
- 1035 4 VEF Cap Haitien, HAITI sent a nice v/q with a program schedule and religious information for my report of 12/13. Country-#7 verified. I'm surprised they verified as my report was sent to the wrong call (4 VE). Their

- 1035 4 VEF Cap Haitien, HAITI (cont.) other outlets are: 4 VEH; 4 VE; 4 VSO; and 4 VEJ. (DR)
 ???? A very weak station is noted here. It was in the clear on 1/11 at 0015 until KDKA came on with a transmitter check. Haiti ? (MM)
- 1040 KHVH Honolulu, HAWAII was logged from 0400-0430 on 1/10. S 7 at times. Taped ID at 0400 for a report. News, Sports and Weather followed. My 4th. from the farthest state. (PB) Was like a semi-local at 0335 on 1/10. No chance for "Radio Tupi" as Peking was about even around 0440. (RJS)
- PRG 2 Sao Paulo, BRAZIL, "Radio Tupi" was heard with an S 6 signal on 1/10 at 0521. Glad to get this one. Tried for a long time ! Country #26. (DS)
- 1043 -DDR- Dresden, EAST GERMANY was heard on 12/27 at 0200. Quite good with what appeared to be a religious program ! New report. (RHM) Was heard for nearly a full hour with Church services in German, I think, from 0140-0230 on 12/27. NDR-1586 kcs. was also coming in with good volume at the time. QRM at times from KHVH on 1040 kcs. which was coming in with oddly unsteady signals and very strong at times. (FM)
- 1050 XED Mexicali, MEXICO was logged at s/on, 0756, on 1/20. Report out. (DB)
- 1090 KHAI Honolulu, HAWAII was heard at 0405 on 1/10 even with an UnID station. Good Hawaii morning. (RJS)
- 1097 ???? "Radio Sistema", SPAIN. My mystery station was heard again on 1/11 from 0203-0235. Seemed to ID with this slogan. Typically, each song would be introduced by a man and a woman after a few bars had been played. There seemed to be another Spaniard in back of them also. (ELK)
- 1110 YVNN Punto Fijo, VENEZUELA was heard on 1/11 at 0629 with an S 9 signal. A nice surprise ! (DS) (This is the correct location, Dan. They are an affiliate of "Radio Rumbos" in Caracas. - ed)
- 1165 "Radio Americas", SWAN ISLAND is noted in the clear on MMs after 0030 or so. They're amazingly strong at times ! (MM) Currently operates from 0500-0800 and 1700-0200 on weekdays. All Spanish. (WRTVH)
- 1175 YSCB San Salvador, EL SALVADOR was heard on 1/7 from 2015-2030 about S 4 at best. (PB) Was probably the station heard here on 1/12 from 2049-2110. Very good signal on peaks, but very deep fades. (ELK)
- 1178 Horby, SWEDEN was heard on 12/27 from 0215-0225 at fair level with WHAM off the air. (RHM)
- 1180 PRE 3 Rio de Janeiro, BRAZIL, "Radio Globo" is believed to have been the station logged weakly here on 1/10 from 0311-0320. Poor quality, but it sounded more like Portuguese than Spanish. (ELK)
- 1190 XEWK Guadalajara, MEXICO was nabbed on 1/11 at 0000. Seemed to be // 900 kcs. then. I was more interested in 1195 kcs., so I didn't stay. (RJS)
- 1195 TICA Puntarenas, COSTA RICA was heard on 1/7 from 2040-2050. Not real good. (PB)
 ???? An UnID LA station was noted here on 1/11, and it seemed to sign off right after 0000. TICA ? (RJS) (Sounds likely. - ed)
- 1196 -VOA- Munich, WEST GERMANY was heard for the first time on 1/11 from 0145-0230. Much QRM from 1200 kcs. Cuban and not enough to report. This is a new country for me. (PB)
- 1210 HJFF Pereira, COLOMBIA was heard on 1/4 dominating the frequency when WCAU wasn't testing. About S 7. Could be heard behind WCAU's OC. (PB) Was logged on 12/14 for my third Colombian this season from 0225-0247. Report out as they asked for them. Doubt if I'll get a verie after reading other reports. (DB)
- 1220 HJAV Monteria, COLOMBIA, "Radio Cordobesa" was heard at s/on at 0417 on 1/9. Very good signal - S 9 and over. Believe they gave two frequencies, but I'm not sure as it was all Greek to me (as usual) ! Taped report sent for another try at Colombia. (PB)
- 1223 "Radio Sistema", SPAIN I give up ! I thought I had a station ID on my 1097 kcs. mystery but obviously it's a net ID as I heard one here too ! Same type of programming if not indeed parallel. Odd, as EBU lists REM stations here but none on 1097 kcs. ! New network ? (ELK)

- 1235 ZBM 1 Hamilton, BERMUDA was heard with an ID on 12/28 at 0235 as "This is the Bermuda Broadcasting Co. broadcasting on a frequency of 1235 and 1340 kilocycles." (FM)
- 1250 Khabarovsk, ASIATIC SFSR was heard with "Radio Moscow" type chimes many MMs at 0430. (BL)
- 1270 KNDI Honolulu, HAWAII was finally logged on 1/10 at their 0400 s/off. Hawaii #12 heard. I'm still looking for KZOO ! (RJS)
- 1286 Prague, CZECHOSLOVAKIA broadcasts in German to Germany from 1400-1430, 1500-1530 and 1600-1630. They broadcast in German to Austria from 1315-1400. (SCDX)
- 1295 -BBC- Crowborough, ENGLAND was logged easily on 1/10 from 0158-0200 in English. No programming followed but their carrier remained on the air. Tuned out at 0203, but again heard them from 0217-0230 s/off in French and English. WERE was, of course, not on at this time ! (ELK)
- 1325 ???? An UnID LA station was noted here on 1/11 at 0556. It sounded more French than Spanish. Louder than 1375 kcs.. I'll guess Haiti, but wait to confirm. (RJS)
- 1340 ???? Who is the Mexican in // with XESM on 1470 kcs. ? They were heard on 1/11 from 0250-0310. (DE)
- 1375 ???? An UnID LA station was heard here too at 0555 and again at 0615 on 1/11. Weaker than 1325 kcs.. Costa Rica ? (RJS)
- 1466 3 AM 2 Monte Carlo, MONACO, "Radio Monte Carlo" was logged on the AM of 1/7 in French with popular music. Best from 0100-0130 but nothing reportable. Hets were noted on many TA frequencies that AM but nothing would break. (DJ) Sent a QSL card to verify my report of 11/30. My first TA verie, and they also were my first heard ! Regular since. (PB)
- 1480 WMDD Fajardo, PUERTO RICO sent a QSL card to verify my reception of their 11/16 DX program. The v/s is C. Soto Perez, C/E. (ELK)
- 1495 "Radio Caroline South", INTERNATIONAL WATERS was logged for a report from 0245-0310 on 1/11. Fairly good at times, but severe KSTP QRM occasionally. (ELK)
- 1505 ???? The evening of 1/11 was a good one for UnID LAs ! Another one was heard here from 1951-2005. Had a "Cerveza Avila" ad; now if I could only remember where I've heard that before ! This may be HON, which some have reported drifting here. (ELK)
- 1520 "Radio Caroline North", INTERNATIONAL WATERS was heard from 0315-0326 on 1/11 with such good signals that KYMN was pushed underneath ! However, they faded at 0326 and KYMN took over for the rest of the morning. I'm very happy about this one as this was probably my most wanted station in the world to hear ! I got enough for a report and am hoping for a verie (and bumper stickers !). (FM) Was in with a very good signal on 1/11 at 0305. Checked them after losing "Radio Caroline South". A rooster crowing time signal and "The Yawn (?) Show" were noted besides a "Radio Caroline" ID. (ELK)
- ???? An unknown SS station in Mexico (probably) was noted on 1/11 at 0524 with an ID that sounded like "Radio Sinoacan". Rather a jumbled mess here so anything is possible, hi ! (DS) (How about HJLS, "Radio Popayan" as a possibility ? Listen for CARACOL IDs which it may broadcast. - ed)
- 1530 ???? An unknown SS station was heard here on 1/11 under KGBT during its DX at 0429-0430; maybe XESD, but nothing else listed here in DXWW since April 7 ! (DS) (Heard weakly here too, Dan. I believe this was HIB(D)L in Santo Domingo. - ed)
- 1546 ???? A moderately strong carrier was noted here on 1/10 at around 0237, but I was unable to raise any modulation. BBC ? (ELK)
- 1570 XERF ? Ciudad Acuna, MEXICO was caught very weakly under CFOR. They came on top at times. (MM)
- 1572 HIAJ Santo Domingo, DOMINICAN REPUBLIC, "Radio Union" is believed to have been the station noted here (First time this season) on 1/11 and 1/12 around 1900. Good signal on 1/12; readily separable from CFOR. (ELK)
- 1579 ???? Another UnID LA station (distinct from 1572 kcs.) was heard on 1/11

- 1579 ???? (cont.) around 1945. Too weak and too close to 1580 kcs. to permit an identification. (ELK)
- 1590 JOGB Kumamoto, JAPAN sent an excellent hand-written v/1 from NHK's Kumamoto Regional Central Station for my 11/9 reception. "It is marvelous that the wave of JOGB bounded away to you in La Jolla." Also sent a history pamphlet on NHK. (KGS)
- XEHC Ensenada, MEXICO is a real rare station here! They were heard at s/off on 1/10 at 0158 with a "Radio Bahia" ID. I saw their studios while in Mexico over the Christmas holidays. Sorta crowded, hi! (DS)
- 1612 RAB Rabinal, GUATEMALA is a regular here at nights, DS. They are my most consistent Guatemalan except for TGJ. (DR)
- INTERNATIONAL WATERS A station, probably "Radio Atlanta", was heard on 1558 kcs., using a Northern Ireland accent on 12/19 at 1830 and around mid-day in Ireland. (SCDX)
- "Radio Shannon" from the coster D. S. Viking has been heard on 1439 kcs. signing off at 0725. Heard weakly and sporadically. (SCDX)
- "Radio Invicta" has been noted IDing as "Britain's First Allnight Radio Station". (SCDX)
- Both of the "Radio Caroline" stations are scheduled to operate from 0100-1500, but the North station still tests on 1510 kcs. after normal hours. (SCDX)
- "Radio London" is now being noted on approximately 1129-1130 kcs.. (SCDX)
- ANGOLA The latest schedule for "Emissora Oficial de Angola" (In Portuguese) is: 0100-0400 (Sunday 0500) on 872 and 1295 kcs.; 0500-0600 on 1295 kcs. (Sunday also on 872 kcs.); 0600-1210 on 1295 kcs.; and 1210-1900 on both 872 and 1295 kcs.. (WRTVH)
- ARGENTINA This country used to maintain Summer Time (EST + 2 hours) all year long, but in April 1964 they switched back to the same time as Chile uses (EST + 1 hour). Now, Argentina maintains DST only during its Summer or October 15 through April 15 (approximately). Chile does not use DST. (LBG)
- NICARAGUA The address for YNQ, "La Voz de la Victoria" is Apartado 147 in Managua. (SCDX) (SACCA lists this station on 1100 kcs., with a power of 750 watts. - ed)
