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SACCA LOG!!!!

The SACCA log has been sent to the printer and the first copies are expected by Jan. 1. They will be sent out by air mail, and the cost is \$2.00 per copy, owing to a recent change in postal rates here. The log is printed on good paper. Stations are listed by frequency, and include splits and regular known drifters. All stations in the Western Hemisphere except those in Canada and U.S.A. are listed. The method for ordering is as follows: Send a check, M.O. or cash to Club Headquarters in Denver, and then submit a report to the DX Forum in which you state that payment has been made to HQ. This way, I know who to send the logs to, and it produces a few Formulas in the process. Sent by air, the log should be in your hands (provided you buy one) within 4 days after I receive DX Monitor. In the Western Hemisphere, only IRCA members may purchase the SACCA log. Other co-operating clubs are NZDXL, MWC, and ARC.

Listened off and on from 0027-0305. (ELK) I got a carrier here but no modulation. My loop only goes down to 630 kcs., but that will be fixed soon. I hope the February DX comes in well ! Marv Robbins heard this one. (DJ)
- 630 LS 5 Buenos Aires, ARGENTINA, "Radio Rivadavia" was hopefully the weak LA station heard here on 1/18 from 0307-0342. Latin music and man and woman announcers. I believe this must have been they as I heard "Mar del Plata" mentioned a couple of times. No IDs noted unfortunately. Supposed to be AN per WRTVH. Taped tentative report sent. (ELK)
- 640 CMQ Havana, CUBA is usually the dominant signal on this frequency here. Heard irregularly at SSS; more steadily later in the evening. (MS)
- 650 HJKH Bogota, COLOMBIA, "La Voz Amiga" finally IDed at 2231 on 1/19. (RJS)
- 655 YSS San Salvador, EL SALVADOR, "Radio Nacional" was good on 1/19 from 2300-2400. (RJS)
- 670 HRN Tegucigalpa, HONDURAS. I'm still looking for an ID here, but this station is probably the one heard every night around 2300. XETRA and KNBR cause havoc here. (RJS)
- 674 El Beida, LIBYA. The Libyan Broadcasting Service operates here with 100 kws. now. (WRTVH)
- 750 HJDK Medellin, COLOMBIA, "La-Voz de Antioquia" was in beautifully on 1/19 over WSB and an UnID LA station. IDed at 2301. Anybody know when "Radiolandia" and "Estacion X" go off ? (RJS)
- JBC- Port Maria, JAMAICA was heard in English with s/on at 0444 on MMs. Has not verified for the past 5 years. (EJW)
- 764 Dakar, SENEGAL sent a nice blue and yellow QSL card for my 12/25 taped report. Did verify Senegal II on 764 kcs. with 200 kws.. Address is Radio Senegal, B. P. 1765, Dakar. All in French, and first African. (EJW)
- 780 ZBVI Roadtown, Tortola, BRITISH VIRGIN ISLANDS. A CP has been given to Mr. Colley B. Gay for a new 10 kw. outlet here. To broadcast in English and will carry 1½ hours of BBC programs. This info was heard over WSM direct from the owner. (EJW)
- 800 PJB Bonaire, NETHERLANDS ANTILLES. Another unspecific QSL ! They were specific on their SW QSL, I wonder why not for BC ? (SGS)
- 820 YVSH Upata, VENEZUELA, "Radio Guayana" verified my reception of last month with a very pleasant letter signed by Sr. Rafael Farrera, Director-Gerente. Their address is Calle Miranda 2-1 in Upata. The broadcast I heard was a test. Venezuelan # 32 here. Interestingly enough, their official stamp has an apparent error in it, as it says YVHS while the stationary and all logs show YVSH. They are affiliated with the "Radio Continente" Network. (ELK)
- 828 YNOL Managua, NICARAGUA. "Ondas del Luz" was in good on 1/19 at 2225. (RJS)
- 830 LV 9 Salta, ARGENTINA is almost positively the deep LA logged here on 1/18 from 0440-0450. Fair signal, but verified last season. (ELK)
- 850 YNAV Managua, NICARAGUA. I broke down and reported "Radio Continental" on 1/18 from 0230-0330 s/off with "Taps". They mentioned at 0258 a "Radio El Mundo" on 1060 kcs. in Managua. Who, Ed ? (DJ) (Nothing listed here, Dal. - ed)
- 860 HCDG 1 Quito, ECUADOR, "Radio Ecuatoriana" was almost certainly the station heard with the N. A. at 0459½-0501 on 1/18. ID followed as: "Esta es

- 860 HCDG 1 Quito, ECUADOR (cont.) la programacion cultural de Radio Ecuatoriana (?) desde ...", then a woman said: "Transmitiendo por ... 860 kilociclos, Onda Larga." I think that a program of classical music heard on this frequency from 0449-0459½ may also have been this station. (ELK)
- 870 ???? I subdued English speaking station, probably WHOA in San Juan, was noted here on SM 1/17 strong through the jammer at 0300-0315 with an all News program. KAIM should be programming religious material. Both unneeded anyway. (DJ)
- ???? On 1/17 at 0250 I heard a rough pulsating note with another note held underneath. Sounds kinda like some SW jammers I've heard. WWL off. Taped. (SGS) (This is apparently Cuba's answer to WWL's VOA programming, Doc. They obviously didn't realize that WWL was off, hi! - ed)
- 900 XEW Mexico City, MEXICO was heard at about 2300. Although I did not get the call letters, I believe this was the station I heard. All in Spanish, but I noted a Pepsi-Cola commercial. I was wondering if anybody else heard this station? (CB) (Quite regular here, Chuck. - ed)
- 950 LR 3 Buenos Aires, ARGENTINA, "Radio Belgrano" was probably the UnID LA station I noted here with a News or commentary program on 1/18 from 0359-0411 when WPET signed on. Very deep fades but fairly good strength on peaks. Heavy QRM from KIMN until its sign-off, and KRSI was noted all the while. (ELK)
- 995 HCEW 2 Guayaquil, ECUADOR, "Radio Suceso" verified with a long letter from Alfonso Escobar R., Coordinator General my report of 1/7. My 33rd. country! They also sent a pennant. (DJ)
- 1025 TIAC San Jose, COSTA RICA, "Radio Fides" was good on 1/19 from 2230-2300. (RJC)
- 1030 XEQR Mexico City, MEXICO was heard on 1/18 from 0013-0030 with R 5, S 6 signals. IDed as "Radio Centro" many times. Taped. (SGS)
- 1050 XEG Monterrey, MEXICO was still heard at 2000 on 12/22 with strong signals. Received a card in 1963. V/s is Teofilo Bichara, Manager. (BK)
- Bissau, PORTUGUESE GUINEA, "Emisora da Guine" operates here with 5 kws. from 1300-1900. (WRTVH)
- 1097 ???? (Reference DXNW 1/19. Also 1223 kcs.) "Radiosistema" is a new morning program broadcast over the stations in the REM, CES, CAR, and COPE networks. The SER Network has their own "Matinal Cadena SER" program. The latter is on the air from 0200-0400. I have no data on "Radiosistema" but it seems logical that they also start at 0200. EAK 2, "Radio Vida - Radio Popular de Sevilla" is the station most often heard on this frequency in Sweden. (LAR)
- 1104 ???? (Reference DXNW 12/22) Nothing is noted on this frequency in Sweden. On 1106 kcs. we hear EFJ 56, "Radio Juventud de Malaga". EBU also mentions EFJ 19 in Murcia has moved here from 1115 kcs., however I believe Malaga is the one mostly heard. I cannot tell if one of these stations may have been off frequency that morning. (LAR)
- 1129.5 "Radio London", INTERNATIONAL WATERS moved to this frequency a week ago, and now can be heard with very good signals. They broadcast from 0100-1600. In a letter from the station I was informed that they have a 50 kw. RCA transmitter, but their present output is only 17 kws.. The ship is located 3 miles off the East Anglia coast at Frinton (i.e. the same location as "Radio Caroline" on 1495 kcs.). Their address is Radlon (Sales) Ltd., 17 Curzon Street, London W 1. (LAR)
- 1140 CB 114 Santiago, CHILE, "Radio Corporacion" was possibly noted here on 1/18 at 0055. I'm not too sure, and will go through the tape again. (SGS)
- 1150 XEJP Mexico City, MEXICO was logged on 1/17 with an R 5, S 6 signal. They IDed as "Radio Variedades" many times from 0245-0300. There was some QRM from WCOP. Taped. (SGS)
- 1170 WLEO Ponce, PUERTO RICO is believed to have been the Spanish station heard here on 1/18 at around 0435 listing many Puerto Rican cities. (ELK)
- 1180 PRE 3 Rio de Janeiro, BRAZIL was sent a taped report via registered Airmail for my SM 1/17 reception from 0300 (s/on)-0330. If you need Brazil (as I do) try this one as they have verified better in the past than

- 1180 PRE 3 Rio de Janeiro, BRAZIL (cont.) has PRG 2 on 1040 kcs.. (DJ)
 ???? Who was the soft voiced station (male announcer) heard from 0305-0330 occasionally QRMing PRE 3 above ? They seemed more like Portuguese than Spanish. (DJ) (Don't know of any other Brazilians here, Dal, but both HIBE and HJGK are possibilities. - ed)
- 1195 ???? An unidentified station, possibly TICA-Puntarenas, was noted here on 1/19 at 2355. Hard to separate. (RJS)
- 1200 ???? Who dat with the ticking in Spanish ? It was noted on 1/18 at 0130 with an R 3, S 2 signal. Like to drive a person crazy ! Think he's a Cuban. Taped. (SGS) (The best available information indicates that it's CMDD in Bayamo. "Reloj Nacional". - ed)
- 1220 XEB Mexico City, MEXICO was heard well on MM 1/4 at 0300. (MS) Was noted on 1/18 at 0110 with an R 5, S 7 signal. Taped. (SGS)
- 1223 ???? (Reference DXWW 1/19. Also 1097 kcs.) I dare say you heard EFE 23, "La Voz de Guipuzcoa" in San Sebastian. This station has been travelling around the band a lot during the past years, but has always been heard with good signals. Now it's not heard here in Sweden due to Falun, but I think it may be in other parts of the world. Another station listed here is EFE 50 in Barcelona. (LAR) (Thanks for your help with these, Lars. - ed)
- 1240 ???? (Reference DXWW 1/12) This sounds like a Pyongyang ID, but I hear that the NHK has much the same type. (RJS)
- 1270 XEAZ Tijuana, MEXICO was logged on MM 1/18 from 0210-0225 and reported. Conditions were so bad there was nothing else to do, hi ! (DJ)
- 1425 KBIC ? Thule, GREENLAND (I'm not sure of the call letters, if they even use them.) This AFRS station was logged here from 0550-0705 with a Rock & Roll show. IDed as "Top of the World Radio Thule". (BL)
- 1505 TIRU San Jose, COSTA RICA, "Radio Norte" was noted with a beautiful signal for about 2 minutes on 1/19 at 2230. (RJS) (Did you hear any IDs, Randy ? The "Radio Norte" heard on this frequency last season was located in Liberia (Costa Rica that is, hi !), and there seems to be some question as to whether or not this station is still on the air. Also, they apparently never used the call "TIRU", and quite possibly this station was not even officially licensed. Note the comments in DXWW 9/29 page 4. - ed)
- 1511 Berlin, EAST GERMANY, "Radio Berlin International" has a new French program called "Rendezvous Nocturne" from 1845-1915. (SCDX)
- 1594 "Manx Radio", ISLE OF MAN has News five minutes before each hour. They verify by letter (Address as listed in DXWW 1/5 - ed). The manager is Mr. J. R. Grierson. Note that this station is not a "pirate", but is properly licensed. (WRTVH)
- 1608 EPO El Paso, COLOMBIA was heard at the same time as RAB (see below) on 1/4. They should be a good bet as are many of the other beacon stations. (MS)
- 1612 RAB Rabinal, GUATEMALA was noted on 1/17 and 1/18 AN with R 5, S 4 signals, pretty steady. These CW beacons can be extremely useful in determining how conditions are. I also recommend WNU, WCC and KPH all around 2040 kcs.. They are located in New Orleans, Chatham and Los Angeles respectively, and are on slightly different frequencies. They are better indicators as there are so many stations on the BC band that one can seldom really determine how conditions are. (SGS) Was noted in on 1/10 at 0240 with good CW IDs heard every 10 seconds. SINPC 33223. Other beacons were heard too but not IDed. This is my first Guatemalan, and at 1200 watts, my best LA 1 (HD) was heard very well on 1/4 with constant Morse Code. IDed around 0300. Should this be put into my MW log ? (MS) (Strictly a personal opinion, Mike, but I don't count them in my BCB log, as their basic purpose is obviously quite different. There is no official IRCA position on this matter, although a proposal to limit the official IRCA frequency coverage to 525-1605 kcs., if passed, would obviously eliminate these

- 1612 RAB Rabinal, GUATEMALA (cont.) stations as far as the Club is concerned. Lacking any clear Club opinion on this matter I will continue to list these stations as they are reported. - ed)
 - INDIA The Indian government has decided to build a 1000 kw. MW station in Calcutta to help counter Chinese propaganda. This decision reverse a previous one to build two SW transmitters to serve this same purpose. (WRTVH)
 - MONTSERRAT "Radio Antilles" operates on 926 kcs. with 200 kws., and 740 kcs. with 20 kws.. Their schedule is 0500-2300 in English, French, Spanish and Portuguese. (WRTVH-1965) (I was struck by a full page advertisement for this station. Although not specifically mentioned, I assume that these are only projected facilities as surely 200 kws. on a split frequency wouldn't go unnoticed, hi ! Keep a listen for possible test broadcasts ! - ed)
 - NORTH VIETNAM Hanoi now broadcasts in English on 1200 kcs. from 2330-2345, 0500-0530, 0830-0900 and 1030-1100. They broadcast in French from 2315-2330, 0600-0630 and 0900-0930. (SCDX)
